

### FIRST DAY — MORNING SESSION.

The Tenth Annual Session of the North Carolina Conference of The Pentecostal Holiness Church met at Falcon, N. C., No-

vember 25, 1920, at 9 A. M.

### REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON HOME AND FOREIGN MISSIONS

We, your Committee on Missions, realizing the great importance of the subject assigned to us, after prayer respectfully submit the following report:

The last commandment of the great Head of the Church is to spread the gospel to all the world in its Pentecostal fulness, not

forgetting that divine healing is in the atonement.

We as The Pentecostal Holiness Church are called in these latter days to share in this glorious privilege of sending this gospel to those who are in heathen darkness.

Being convinced that there are vast districts in our own land without the full gospel crying for help, as well as the millions in foreign lands, we should endeavor to rise to the possibilities in our reach through Christ Jesus to proclaim these glorious truths.

In order to accomplish this we would suggest that our people, and especially the preachers, get a full view of the spiritual conditions surrounding their churches, as well as the great harvest fields in the regions beyond. We can not intelligently pray until we get a vision of the present existing conditions at home and abroad, as Ezekiel did of the valley of dry bones.

We recommend that each church without a missionary society would speedily organize such and subscribe for The Missionary Review, as well as the others which are already organized. Prayer for foreign missions should be habitual and regular, which is the key to all spiritual success.

Systematic giving is the Bible standard for all gospel work, therefore, it would be very inconsistent to give spasmodically and expect the work to be successful.

In view of the liberal offerings and pledges made during the preceding conferences and camp meetings, toward the building of the missionary home in China, it behooves this Conference to follow their worthy example. Let earnest prayer be made in private and in public by all Christians for the success of this great work entrusted to us, so we need not be ashamed at the Lord's coming. each of his members, and especially their children.

We highly recommend the books published by The Pentecostal Publishing Co., also The Advocate and The Evangel, which are excellent, not only for the mature, but also for children.

Most other organizations are very zealous concerning what the members read, and this is an admirable point. How much more should we who have received the great Truth of Pentecost be zealous on this point.

We urge all our members to avoid all the literature of the socalled Christian Scientists, Finished Work of Calvary, Seventh Day Adventists, Russellites, and such like, which not only poison the mind, but corrupt the character, and drown men in perdition. As other conferences have taken up offerings for the Editor of The Advocate, who has labored so faithfully in the discharge of his duty, we recommend that this Conference do likewise as a thank-offering.

Also that every member in the bounds of this Conference lend every possible effort in the support of The Advocate and the increase of its subscriptions. "God helps only those who help themselves," is an old adage that can be proven in this connection.

#### REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC MORALS.

We, your Committee on Public Morals, recommend that the members of this Pentecostal Holiness Church and Conference abstain from all the prevailing sins of the age, such as strong drink, indecent dress, such as low necks, short sleeves and skirts, jewelry, feathers and flowers, shadow dresses, and all immodest dress. That our members adorn themselves as becometh holiness. That all abstain from backbiting, or speaking against our brother or sister in their absence, or doing anything that would have a tendency to hurt their influence.

We also ask that our preachers and mission workers be careful how they conduct themselves about the opposite sex, so as to keep off reproach.

We also ask our holiness people to abstain from handling tobacco in any shape or form, such as raising, curing, selling, or handling in any way this defiling weed.

We also ask our people to abstain from drinking pop, cider, and soft drinks, which have a tendency to evil.

We also ask our people to stay away from shows, fairs and ball grounds, that the world may see the humble life of Jesus in us.

We consider all the above are prevailing sins of the age, therefore be it resolved:

1. That we seek to maintain a chaste and virtuous relation to the Christ and God we serve by refusing to affiliate with anything that has the appearance of sin: 2. That all the members of this Conference walk uprightly before God and man, that the outside world may see the humble life of Jesus in us.

3. That all our holiness people unite their prayers, money and means to help this wide world to get the gospel and have on the

wedding robe at His coming.

Report of Committee on Resolutions called for.

#### REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS.

Whereas the Word of God (2 Corinthians 6:14), teaches us that we should not be unequally yoked together: Be it resolved, that we instruct our ministers through our discipline not to unite a sinner and a Christian in the holy bonds of matrimony.

Resolved, that a rule be added to the General Rules of our discipline that none of our members be allowed to attend county fairs, State fairs, carnivals, moving picture shows, vaudeville shows, or circuses of any kind, or drink any Coca-Cola or any other dope of any kind, or alcohol as a beverage, or injection.

Resolved, that no member of our body shall be allowed to attend any worldly dance or amusement, baseball, horseracing, or

any other game of chance.

Resolved, that we request the General Conference to enact a law to the effect that hereafter no person shall be received into the membership of any local church or annual conference who has been divorced from a husband or wife, and remarried while their former companion is living; or who has married a divorced husband or wife. (Passed by four of the five on the Committee.)

Whereas, in the providence of God, the work of the General Superintendent of The Pentecostal Holiness Church has become so great as to be a burdensome task for one man, making it impossible for him to give his time to organizing new churches and conferences, as required in paragraph 3, page 19, of our discipline; and whereas, there seems to be every indication that, if Jesus tarries, this work will continue to greatly increase; and whereas, this Conference realizes the need of our ministerial leaders giving their time so far as possible to the spreading of Pentecostal holiness truth in the many new fields opening to us, and organizing new churches and conferences therein;

Therefore, be it resolved, that this Conference respectfully petition the next General Conference of The Pentecostal Holiness Church that: (1) Instead of electing one General Superintendent, they elect a Board of Superintendents, composed of any three ordained ministers whom they shall deem worthy of so sacred an office; (2) That the General Conference will require the three General Superintendents to meet as soon after their election as possible, and elect one of their number to be Chairman of the Board of Superintendents, and to so divide their work among themselves that two of their number shall divide as nearly equally as possible, the work in the United States between themselves, while the third member of the Board gives his entire time to the supervision and extension of the work outside the United States.

(3) That the General Conference will so amend the discipline as to make the General Superintendent having charge of the General Mission Board responsible for carrying out its directions, and also responsible for the general conduct of our mission work.

(4) That the General Conference will so amend the discipline as to abolish the office of Assistant General Superintendent, and instead thereof will provide that in case a General Superintendent shall for any cause be removed or become unable to fulfil his duties between the sessions of the General Conferences, the General Official Board shall meet as soon as possible after the vacancy, and elect some ordained minister as temporary General Superintendent, to serve till the next session of the General Conference.

(5) That the General Conference will instruct the Board of Superintendents to meet as often as may be necessary for the proper carrying on of their work, but in any case, at least once

a year.

(6) That the General Conference will so amend the discipline as to provide that any member of the church who shall be dissatisfied with any decision of a General Superintendent may have the right of appeal to the Board of Superintendents, the majority vote of which shall in any case be final, provided, that such right of appeal shall be limited to matters of law only, and shall not cover matters of fact.

That the General Conference enact a law requiring each local Conference to provide a pension for the maintenance of our superannuated ministers.

We recommend that the General Conference make requirements for license to preach to include a knowledge of the discipline, reciting the books of the Bible, and the reading the Bible through at least once. Also a knowledge of the catechism written by Rev. G. F. Taylor.

That the requirement for ordination include a course of study which shall be decided upon by the General Board. We suggest that it include the following:

An adequate knowledge of the Bible and fundamental truths held by the Church. They must read the Bible through at least three times. A thorough knowledge of the following: The discipline of the Church, Binneys' Theological Compend, some English Grammar; also any other books that shall be suggested or decided upon by said Board.

We recommend the adoption and publication of a church song book, the name to be The Pentecostal Hymnal.

We recommend that a time limit of four years be placed upon the pastor's stay upon a circuit of churches.

Report of Committee on Education called for.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION.

We do not think education to be the most important thing, yet we do believe that Christian education enables us to do more efficient work in every phase of God's work.

We do not endorse all the agencies and facilities of modern education, yet education is too important to be altogether ignored. We do not discount those who have been deprived of the privilege of obtaining this knowledge, yet we do know that ignorance has the tendency of limiting one's usefulness, and handicaps them in many ways. We believe that Christian education has a tendency to deepen our spirituality.

Viewing the text of the learned apostle, "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth," we believe it to be our duty to avail ourselves of the benefits of the institutions of learning that God has established in our midst.
