

Proceedings.

The United Baptist Association met in its fourth annual session with the Liberty Grove church, October 15th, 1863. The Introductory sermon was preached by Elder Isaac Oxford from Revelations 2: 17.

After a short recess the Association was called to order by the Moderator of last year. Praver by Elder James McNeal.

Letters from nine churches were presented and read.

Elected Elder Smith Furguson, Moderator, and R. L. Steele, Clerk. Invited corresponding messengers, when Elder J. W. Ayers cane forward with a letter and package of Minutes from the Roan Mountain Association; Elders R. H. Moody and E. A. Pot, from the Catawba Biver Association, and a parcel of Minutes from the Yadkin Association, but no messengers; all of whom received the right hand of fellowship and took seats with us:

Appointed the delegates of Liberty Grove church, a committee on Devotional Exercises who appoint to preach to-morrow Elders Green, McNeal and Ayers.

Appointed Brethren J. T. Shell and John Watts a committee on Finance, who made the following

Appointed Elders Isaac Oxford, James Reed, J. B. Green, James McNeal and J. T. Shell, with the Aloderator and Clerk, a committee on Arrangement, corresponding messengers included.

On motion, adjourned until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock. Prayer by Elder J. W. Ayers.

FRIDAY, Oct. 16th, 1863.

Met according to adjournment. Elder J. B. Green led in prayer in behalf of our country and the success of our cause.

Called the Roll of Delegates.

Read and corrected minutes of yesterday.

Called on committee of Arrangement which reported and was discharged.

Read Rules of Decorum.

Appointed Elders I. Oxford and James Reed a committee on Resolutions.

Called on the Treasurer who reported satisfactorily. [See report in Appendix.]

Called on corresponding messengers to sister Associations and delegates to the Western Convention, who reported and were discharged.

Appointed correspondents as follows: To the Catawba River Association, Elders I. Oxford, J. B. Green and R. M. Steele, which will convene on Friday before the 2d Lord's day, in October, 1864, with the Long Creek Church, Gaston county, N. C. To the Roan Mountain Association, Elders James McNeal, Isaae Oxford, James Reed and Bro. James Eller, which will meet with the Pleasant Grove church, Yaneey county, N. C., on Friday, before 2d Lord's day, m September, 1864, 8 miles north-east from Burnsville. To the Yadkin Association, Elder S. P. Smith, which will meet with the Fork church, Davie county, N. C. on Friday before the 1st Lord's day in October, 1864. To the Lehanon Association, Elders R Gentry, A. Johnston and S. Trivet. To the Jefferson Association, R. Gentry, A. Johnston and S. Trivet. To the Baptist State Convention, Elders James McNeal, James Reed, Isaac Oxford and R. L. Steele.

On motion, the following churches were stricken from our roll of churches viz: Mt. Zion, Walnut Grove, Beaver Creck, Lewis Fork, Pilgrim, Antioch and Macedonia, they being members of the Lewis Fork Association.

Took under consideration the churches which asked for indulgence for twelve months, when New Hope, Taylor Spring and Taylorsville satisfied the Association of their innocence of the charge made against them. Withdrew from King's Creek church.

Took up the query from Sardis ehureh when the following was adopted: "We think it not expedient to answer it in its present form."

Took up the letter from the aggrieved party of Fishing Creek, when a special committee consisting of Elders R. H. Moody, E. A. Poe, J. W. Ayers, James Reed and I Oxford to report on to-morrow morning.

On motion, adjourned until to morrow morning 9 o'clock. Prayer by Elder R. H. Moody.

SATURDAY, Oct. 17th, 1863.

Met according to adjournment. Prayer by Elder R. II. Moody. Read and corrected minutes of yesterday.

Took up the unfinished business of yesterday, when the committee made their report, which was adopted. (See Appendix A.)

The Moderator announced the following standing committees : On Temperance-Brother Peter Eller.

On Sabbaths Schools-Elder Isaae Oxford.



On Periodicals—Elder J. Reed.

On Missions-Elder J. MeNeil.

On Colportage-Brother J. T. Shell.

On Education-Elder R. L. Steele,

The standing committees of last year made their reports, which . were read and adopted. (See Appendix.)

Appointed the Clerk to superintend the printing of minutes and that he have \$45 worth printed and distribute them, and he be allowed \$15 for his services.

Called on the committee on Resolutions, who submitted their report which was adopted. (See Appendix.)

The Committee on Devotional Exercises reported for Sabbath, 1st. Elder R. H. Moody to preach a Denominational sermon; -2d., Elder E. A. Poe a Missionary sermon, after which a collection will be taken for Army Colportage; Elder J. Reed to close.

Appointed Elder James McNeil Missionary to ride in the bounds of this Association twelve months, and agree to pay him eight hundred dollars, or in that proportion for what time he may ride, when the following pledges were made for his support: Elder I. Oxford, \$10 paid; Elder J. Reed, \$15; Elder J. H. West, \$10; Elder J. B. Green, \$20 paid; Brother B. Watt, \$10; Elder R. L. Steele, \$10 paid; Elder R. H. Moody, \$10 paid; Elder E. A. Poe, \$10 paid.

The Association then raised \$20, for Foreign Missions by the following: I. Oxford, \$2; J. B. Green, \$1; J. Reed, \$1; E. A. Poe, \$5; J. Eller, \$1; H. Curtis, \$1; B. Watts, \$1; J. H. West, \$1; S. Furguson, \$1; R. L. Stec'c, \$1; R. C. Harrington, \$1; J. Watts, \$1; S. Danner, \$1; E. C. Oxford, \$1; J. W. West, \$1.

Appointed the next Association to be held with the New Hopechurch, Wilks county, N. C., ten miles North-west from Wilksboro to commence on Friday before the 3rd Lord's day in October, 1864.

Elder James Reed to preach the Introductory sermon, Elder R. L. Steele his alternate.

On motion, adjourned until the time and place appointed. Prayer by Elder James Reed.
