Note

- 3rd. The property in view of purchase we recommend that it be bought.
- 4th. That this property be deeded to the Free Will Baptist Conference and the Holiness Convention of North Carolina.
- 5th. If said property fail to be used for rescue work on full gospel lines. It shall be sold at public auction and the trustees shall refund the money to the stockholders with increase or decrease.

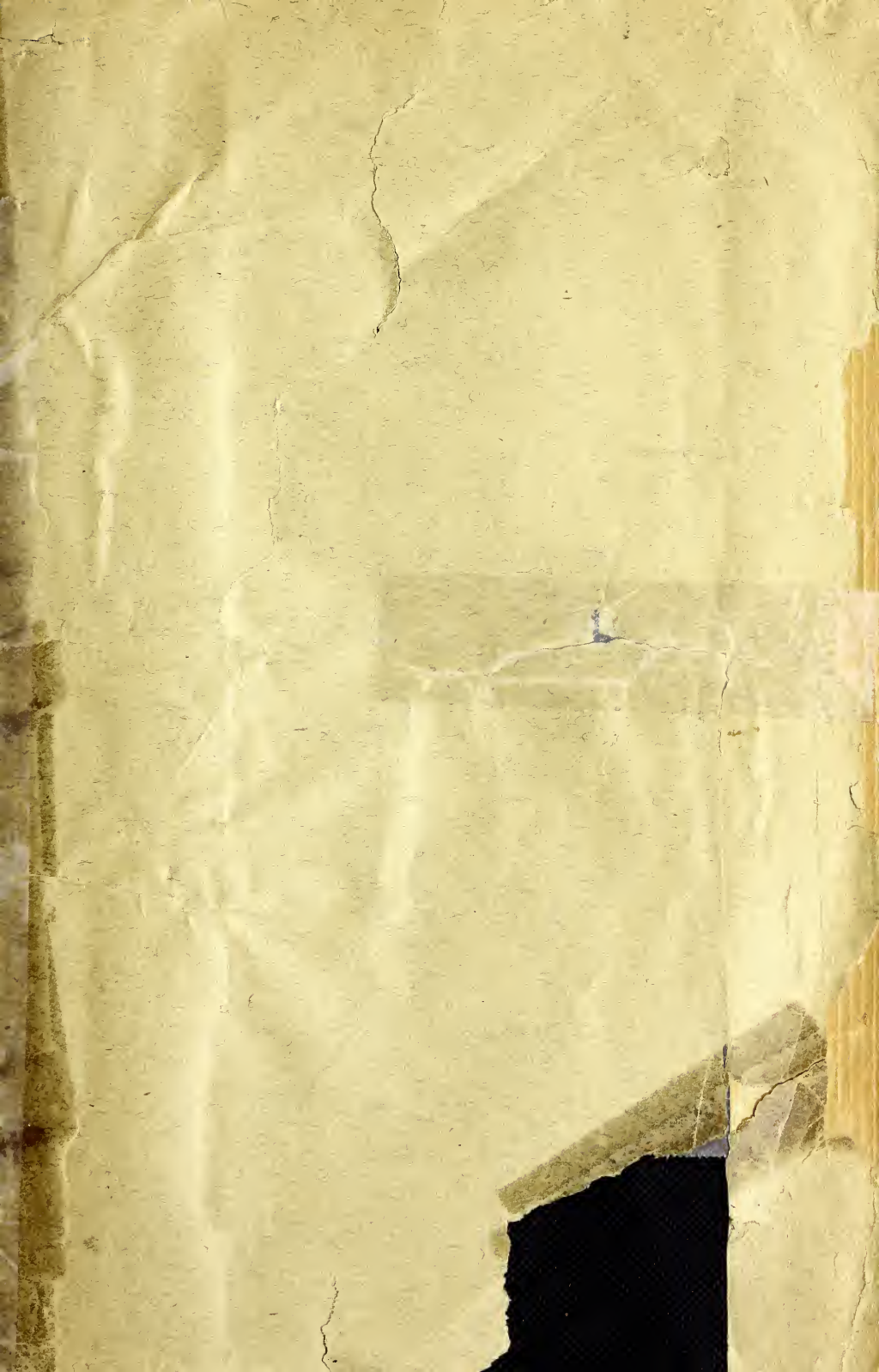
