CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

To Be Observed in Each Christian Church of the Eastern Atlantic Christian Conference Year of 1939

We, your Committee on Resolutions, realizing the great need of more finance, and whereas there seems to be so little or no interest on the part of those who are responsible to collect Conference dues; and whereas, the Eastern Atlantic Christian Conference does have a constitution that gives sufficient and legal power for collection of such dues; and whereas, the pastor of the church is the only agent of the Conference, through whom the Conference can speak; be it resolved,

First: That the Constitution of the Conference and By-Laws shall be printed in the minutes, and that on the front pages for the year 1939. Be it resolved further that any pastor failing to execute these orders, and shall not bring up at least enough Conference Assessment to represent 50 percent of his membership in any one year, unless it be because of his physical illness and around his own church, floods, fire, or windstorm has caused hinderance, he shall be charged out of his personal salary the amount of Conference Assessment that shall represent 50 percent of his membership. Keeping in mind at all times that each and every lawful excuse that may present itself that is justifiable to the Conference may be drawn through a committee known as a trial jury, making whatever recommendation they may think best, and reporting to the Annual Conference which is then in session.

This resolution now becomes an amendment to the Constitution this 5th day of November A. D., 1938, 11:40 A. M. Eastern Standard time, in the town of Pamlico, N. C., Pamlico County, and in the State of North Carolina.

And be it further resolved that the President, Rev. F. A. Hargett, shall have the authority to execute these orders to the very best of his ability.

Pamlico, N. C., November 2-6, 1938.

FIRST DAY-MORNING SESSION-11 A.M.

The Eastern Atlantic Christian Conference met at Galilee Christian Church, Rev. J. H. Mann, Pastor, Pamlico, N. C., on the above mentioned date with the President, Rev. F. A. Hargett, presiding. Devotionals were conducted by Rev. J. R. Howard. Hymn 177, "How Sweet the Name of Jesus' Sound," C. M., was sung for opening. Rev. J. H. Smith read the 136th Psalms for the opening lesson, after which Bro. J. Miller offered prayer. Hymn No. 12, C. M., was lined and led by Rev. J. R. Howard. FORTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL SESSION EASTERN ATLANTIC SUNDAY SCHOOL CONVENTION

PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL ADDRESS

I would like to offer the following suggestions: First, start now training your smallest youth to work with you through some financial system; second, let the schools as a whole rally to the unions that your school can be represented with the \$5.00 each year, and if possible appropriate some finance to assist your general superintendent and your president to assist the schools that are not working with the unions and get them working.

I hope that you will consider these suggestions. We hope to see the convention marching on.
