#### DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Drexel, N. C., Sept. 30th, 1938.

The Mountain and Catawba Missionary Baptist Association convened with the Mt. Zion Baptist Church, in its Sixty-Eighth Annual Session, opened by singing Hymn 222. Prayer was offered by Rev. Shade, song by Rev. F. D. Young, "Nearer My God to Thee." Rev. M. C. Williams read for Scripture Lesson the Twenty-third Psalm. Prayer was then offered by Deacon Logan Camp. The praise services were very inspiring. hour arrived for the introductory sermon. The Moderator, W. S. Sherrill, came forward and presented Rev. D. W. Rutherford to preach the introductory sermon, assisted by Rev. M. M. Murrill; Scripture lesson taken from the Gospel of St. Luke, 4th Chapter, 16-24. Rev. T. H. Thomas offered prayer. Second selection, Hymn 561. Rev. Rutherford chose for his text: St. Luke 4th chapter, 16th verse. Subject, "Habits and Mastery of Them." Said he: "Christian men and women should have the habits of loving, habits of living virtuous lives, habits of truthfulness, habits of decision." The message was enjoyed very much. Rev. #### FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

Barbour read for the Scripture Lesson a part of the 8th chapter of Paul's letter to the Romans. Prayer was offered by Deacon William Stevenson. After the lovely praise service, the Vice-Moderator, J. W. Caldwell, presented the Moderator, Rev. W. S. Sherrill, for the annual address. The address was very timely and was much enjoyed. A motion was made, and prevailed, that the address appear on the face of the minutes. Next came the Topic. Sanctification was opened briefly by Rev. D. W. Rutherford. It was very much enjoyed. U., Mr. Carl Hawkins; welcome on behalf of Mission Circle, Mrs. Sarah Johnson; welcome on behalf of the community, Rev. S. E. Duncan; welcome on behalf of the churches, Rev. J. C. Brewer; a hearty response on behalf of the Association, Dr. R. C. lames. 8:30, the Moderator presented Rev. J. H. Clanton, of Raleigh, to preach the Educational Sermon, accompanied by Rev. O. L. Sherrill and Rev. T. R. Rucker, who lined hymn 22. Scripture lesson found Mark 6:30-56. Music by Mt. Zion choir. The speaker chose for his text: St. Mark's Gospel, 6th chapter, 48-50. Subject: "The Contrary Winds the Medium to Success." The message was very ably delivered. Leading points in the Christian life are the winds of opposition. If we will succeed we must fight to overcome the only medium to success. The message was much enjoyed.

Harper was then presented on the subject, "Faith, Its Aim, Its Attitude." cussed briefly, he said: "Faith—its aim is to establish belief; its attitude is to save—the invisible substance from which all good comes." At 9:40, Prof. H. C. Goore took charge of the Bible discussion. Subject: "The Unified Church Program." Ministers' group collection, \$1.26; Deacon's group, discussed by Deacon C. E. Graham, accompanied by Rev. R. Allen, who lined Hymn 22. "O, for a Heart to Praise My God." Rev. Graham, Pastor of Davidsonville Baptist came forward and chose for his text, 1st Sam., 17th chapter, verse 45; subject: "Whatever You Do, Let's Do It In the Name of the Lord." He brought to us a burning message, which was very much enjoyed. Rev. M. W. Hollan, one of the old ministers of the Association was present and gave us some timely remarks. A collection was then taken for Superannuated Ministers. Amount received, \$2.40.

# SATURDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

Devotion worship was conducted by Rev. Odell Daniel and Rev. W. G. McLain. Scripture Lesson was taken from the 23rd Division of Psalms. Prayer by Rev. Daniel. Song, "Take Me Through." After the lovely praise service, the Moderator presented Rev. F. K. Young, to discuss the subject, "What Baptists Believe and Practice." He spoke very briefly and stressed the point that Baptists believe in one Faith, one Lord, and one Baptism. Rev. J. W. study of it. The hour having arrived for the Doctrinal Sermon, Rev. G. W. Campbell filled the stand, assisted by Rev. J. W. Hairston. Rev. Campbell chose for his text, Daniel 2:44; Matt. 6:18; subject: "The Security of the Church;" theme, "The Church Will Live On Forever." The sermon was very timely and was enjoyed by all. The Association was then favored with an address by Mrs. L. A.
