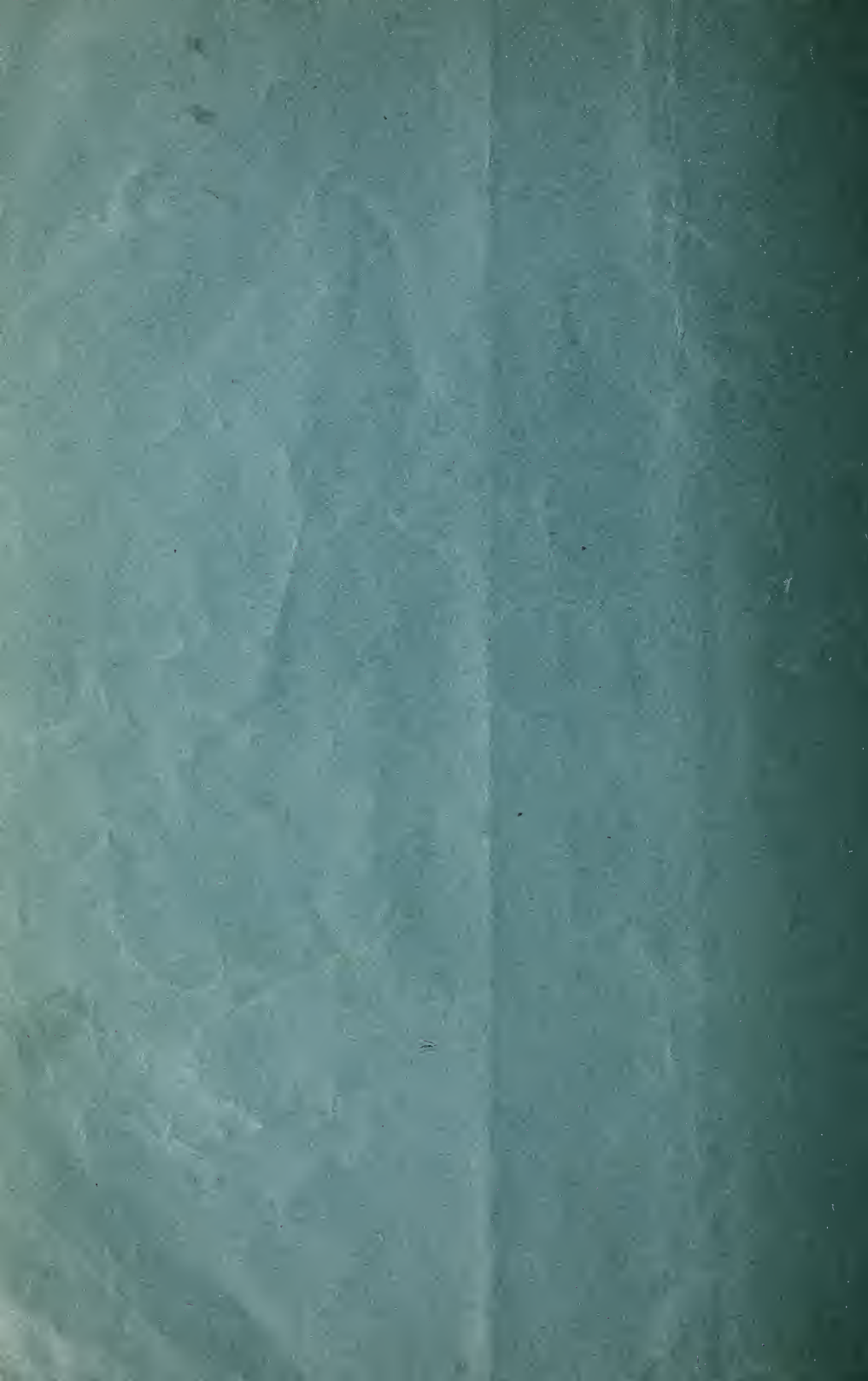

# PROCEEDINGS.

## FIRST DAY—MORNING SESSION.

The thirteenth Annual Convention of The Pentecostal Holiness church of North Carolina met in Durham, N. C., on Tuesday morning, Nov. 19th, 1912, at 11 o'clock, (having been delayed one hour on account of the fire which had just destroyed the hall where the Convention was to be held.)

Bro. H. R. Martin makes the confession required by the Official Board, and asks forgiveness of the Convention, after which the Convention unanimously passed upon his character.

The power of God fell and there was great joy among the members of the Convention.

The character of Bro. J. O. Lehman and Sister E. Maie Law, two of our missionaries, was passed at this time.

As Bro. J. A. Culbreth was called home, Bro. T. J. McIntosh was elected to fill his place on the committee on Missions, and Bro. A. G. Canada to take his place on the Committee on Books and Periodicals.

Bro. S. D. Page gave the Convention several good and timely suggestions along the line of our attitude towards one another, as preachers, and gave us some sound advice with regard to meeting our financial obligations, and standing against the false doctrines in the land.

Bro. Britton and others also made us good talks along various lines.

A collection was taken for Bro. G. F. Taylor, who suffered injury from the fire, amounting to \$21.65.

#### REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON BOOKS AND PERIODICALS.

The Apostolic injunction to Timothy to give attendance to reading and study, is specially applicable to the ministry and membership of the Pentecostal Holiness church at this juncture of our progress.

We therefore recommend to same:

First. The careful and prayerful study of the Word of God, in order to learn its truths and teaching, that we may be sound in doctrine and faith.

Second. Since many unscriptural and false doctrines are being taught and disseminated in the Pentecostal movement at this time, we deem it a necessity to do our utmost to circulate sound and wholesome literature among our own people. The Apostolic Evangel and a few like Periodicals being sound in faith and scriptural in tone, we respectfully urge our pastors and evangelists to do their utmost to extend their circulation.

Third. Books like those edited by G. F. Taylor, Wesley D. Myland, N. J. Holmes, John Bunyan, J. H. King and others, are worthy of careful perusal, and should be extensively read by our people.

#### REPORT ON MISSIONS.

The duty, privilege and honor of disseminating the truth of the gospel to all the nations of the world, is given to the church of the gospel age, and this trust has been committed to us by the Head of the Church. The Hebrew race did not have this trust and honor, neither did Christ bestow it



upon his disciples during his earthly ministry. Just as he was departing from the earth, he commanded His disciples to go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature, or make disciples to his name, among all the nations of the earth.

The Pentecostal Baptism of the Holy Spirit marvelously emphasized this emphatic "Go ye" and by His inspiration the early church fulfilled the command, and in these days of his last outpouring we are under the same obligation, and profess to have the same power and inspiration for this world-wide spread of truth.

In view of this fact and our profession, we submit the following for consideration and acceptance:

1. That we as a church pray, preach and write, and give more for the spread of gospel truth in foreign lands.

2. That each church within this Convention be urged to organize a missionary society where none exists at the present time, and urge each member to attend and support the same.

3. We recommend that the name of Henry C. King, missionary to Liberia, West Africa, be placed on the list of those to be supported by the funds of this Convention, in harmony with the action of the Convention at Kingston, November, 1910.

4. That Amos Bradley and wife, Effie Bradley, having been duly examined by the Mission Boards, and found to be sound in faith, and in the doctrines of the Pentecostal Holiness Church, were accepted by the Board of the Convention, and are hereby recommended as missionaries worthy of our support.

5. We also suggest the advisability of creating a General Board of Missions for the entire church at the next session of the General Convention, which convenes in January, 1913, and that Boards of the various Conventions co-operate with this Board in the prosecution of the work of missions throughout the world.
