THIRD DAY—MORNING SESSION.

Convention met and opened by singing "I belong to Jesus", followed by reading a lesson from the second chapter of the Acts, by Bro. Butler, and prayer by Bro. A. B. Causey.

Pledges were taken for paying off the indebtedness on Kinston church to the amount of \$38.50.

A collection was taken for our Superintendent, Bro. Butler, to help towards his travelling expenses, amounting to \$10.05.

Twenty-five dollars, in cash and pledges, was raised on the indebtedness of the church at Duke.

The committee reported concerning the applicants for the ministry, and requested them to study more carefully such subjects as Justification, Regeneration, the Second Coming of Jesus, etc., that they may be better prepared to teach others the Word of God; and committee further recommended:

1st. That Mission Workers License be granted to the following: Joseph Edwards, T. M. Bizzell, J. S. Bunn, J. H. Capps.

2nd. That Local Preachers License be given to E. H. Snead, G. W. Spence and Nathan Tyson.

3rd. That Certificates of Ordination be granted to the following brethren: C. A. Hamilton, T. W. Siler, G. W. Stanley.

The ordination services followed.

Just here sister E. Maie Law, a Mission Worker in China, was received into this Convention; also, Bro. J. O. Lehman, who is in Africa.

At this time Bro. McIntosh was asked to bring the mission work at Sai-Nam, China, before the Convention, which he did in a very encouraging manner.

Upon suggestion of Bro. Taylor it is decided that the Committee on Missions consider the work in China, and report just after dinner.

Convention adjourned to meet at 2 o'clock p. m.

THIRD DAY—EVENING SESSION.

Convention met according to the usual order and opened by singing "We will sing His praise", after which prayer was offered by Bro. T. W. Siler.

Bro. Siler's church, Sanford, was admitted into this Convention. Report of Committee on Missions was read and adopted.

REPORT.

We, your Committee on Missions, beg to submit the following report:

We recommend that each pastor organize a missionary society in each of his churches, and insist that his members join the same for the promotion of the mission work, both Home and Foreign.

We recommend further, that this Convention appoint a Mission Board who shall use the money sent in from the various societies for the support of Sai-Nam Pentecostal Holiness Mission, sister E. Maie Law. Bro. Joseph Hunter and wife, and Bro. J. H. King; and after these have been supported, do what we can for Home Missions.

We further recommend that this Convention take the following mission points under our care as places worthy of our help and prayers: Hickory Creek and Clinton.

Several talks were made concerning the mission work and the money now on hand.

On motion by Bro. Sellars, it was voted that the mission money now on hand be turned over to Bro. G. F. Taylor, Secretary and Treasurer of Mission Board, to pay off Bro. McIntosh's indebtedness and the expenses at Sai-Nam, as the Board may see fit. Amount on hand \$103.50.

At this time sister J. M. Weeks made a touching talk on the mission work in Clinton, N. C., and an offering was made to her for the support of this mission, amounting to \$8.25.

The committee, which was appointed at our last Annual Convention to look after the work at Goldsboro, reported that no money was left over from the sale of the property at that place.

It was voted that our next Annual Convention meet in Clinton, N. C., on Tuesday after the third Sunday in November, 1912.

The Secretary was paid ten dollars for his services.

The Secretary shall have one thousand minutes printed and distribute among the churches.

A rising vote of thanks was tendered towards the people of this place for their kindness and hospitality in caring for this Convention.
