M. McNeill to use brandy on honey. Had a hard MEM cague on the day at J.4. Johnson's store and took only two small drinks, which made me feel very bad, but I did not believe it was drunkenes.

The time at Lillington, only took one drink, which I threw up in a very short time, only a few moments. I lost the use of myself for about fifteen minuets, don't call it drunkenes, but believe it was the effects of spirits on the constitution. I acknowledge that Iam very sorry for any wrong conduct with either of the occaisons, hope the church will forgive- promise not to so any move.

The subject of calling a Pastor for the year, I87I was taken up, which resulted in the selection of Elder W.H.Franks. The Sec'ty was ordered to prepare a statistical letter to send up to the annual conference to be held at Union, Halifax County Virginia.

Home Ciming and Dedication

On the fourth Sunday in September (27) 1953, we had a wonderful day at the church. A homecoming and dedication service was held. 
