CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I This body shall be known as the Wake Baptist Association.

ARTICLE II The object of this Association shall be the promotion of Christ's Kingdom among men, and the means of accomplishing this shall be in strict conformity with the New Testament.

ARTICLE III This Association shall be composed of Delegates chosen by the Churches connected with it, each church being entitled to at least one delegate, and one delegate for each hundred members of the churches connected with this body shall be considered members of this Association. Ex-officers and members who are not in charge of or connected with churches within the bounds of this Association who present testimonials of good standing may become annual members by the payment of \$1.00.

ARTICLE IV The delegates of each church shall bear a letter certifying their appointment giving an account of the condition of the church, and a statement of all funds contributed for benevolent purposes during the year.

ARTICLE V The Officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Vice Moderator, Clerk, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, Auditor, and Historian.

Section 1. The Boards of the Association shall be an Executive consisting of twelve members; including the officers of the Association, a Ministerial Board; also such committees as may be authorized by the Association.

ARTICLE VI The Officers and the Board Members shall be elected at the Annual meeting of the Association.

Section 1. The Members of the Executive Board shall assume their duties at the close of the Annual Meeting.

Section 2. The Ministerial Board Members shall serve as occasion may require.

ARTICLE VII The Moderator shall open all meetings punctually, and preside during the deliberation of the body; enforce the observance of the constitution, decide all questions of order; giving his opinion concerning any subject under discussion after others have spoken or when called upon, and give casting vote in the event of a tie.

ARTICLE VIII The Vice Moderator shall discharge the duties of the Moderator in his absence.

ARTICLE IX The Clerk shall keep a record of the Proceedings of the Association; superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes; keep on file the printed minutes and other important papers of the Association.

ARTICLE X The Treasurer shall receive all money contributed by the member churches, make disbursements as authorized by the Association. He shall not pay any order on the Treasurer except it be signed by the Moderator and Clerk. He shall make his annual report to the Association.

ARTICLE XI The Auditor shall audit the Treasurer's book and attest his annual report to the Association.

ARTICLE XII The Corresponding Secretary, as directed by the Moderator shall communicate with the churches and serve as the secretary of the Ministerial Board.

ARTICLE XIII The Historian shall collect facts of interest of the Association and member churches and make a report to each annual meeting of the Association.

ARTICLE XIV Any Baptist Church or organization seeking membership in this Association must present a petition to the Association in session through delegates appointed for that purpose.

Section 1. Upon reception of such Church or organization the Moderator shall extend to the delegates the right-hand of fellowship, on behalf of the Association. This Association shall not maintain the fellowship with any Church or organization that is not in Gospel order.

ARTICLE XV The Association shall meet on Wednesday and Thursday before the Third Sunday in August each year with the Church or Institute which invites it unless otherwise designated by the Executive Board.

ARTICLE XVI We shall withdraw the right hand of fellowship from any minister who walks disorderly or contrary to the Gospel rule.

ARTICLE XVII Each Church connected with the Association may continue its membership by supporting this Constitution.

ARTICLE XVIII The Wake Baptist Sunday School Convention, the Wake Baptist Missionary Union, the Woman's Auxiliary and the Ministers' and Deacons' Union are auxiliaries of the Association.

ARTICLE XIX There shall be a Ministers' and Deacons' Union as an Auxiliary of the Parent Body of the Wake Baptist Association.

Section 1. The object of the Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall be primarily to better acquaint Ministers and Deacons also other members of the Baptist Denomination with the Christian Way of Life.

- Section 2. The Officers of the Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer.
- Section 3. The officers of the said Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall be elected at each annual session of the Wake Association.
- Section 4. Ministers, Deacons and Members of the Churches of the Association in good and regular standing, and supporting the objectives of the Association, shall be counted members of the Union.
- Section 5. A free will offering will be given in the Ministers' and Deacons' Union by each member to help spread the gospel and its teachings.
- Section 6. The Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall submit a written report to each Annual Session, of its programs, activities and funds.
- Section 7. The Association shall provide necessary funds to lawfully and reasonably support the said Union Programs as directed by the Parent Body.
- Section 8. The Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall meet each fifth Saturday and Sunday unless otherwise advised by the Association.
- ARTICLE XX The object of the Auxiliary shall be to aid the Association in the extension of Christ's Kingdom.
- Section 1. The Officers of the Auxiliary shall be President, Vice President, Recording Secretary and Treasurer of each department.
 - Section 2. All officers of the Auxiliary shall be elected annually.
- Section 3. All moneys collected by the Auxiliary shall be turned over to the Finance Committee of the Association in session and a receipt taken for the same.
- Section 4. All reasonable expenses of the Auxiliary shall be paid by the Association.
- Section 5. The time of meeting of the Auxiliary shall be simultaneous with the meeting of the Association.

BYLAWS

- Article XXI This Constitution may be amended at any Session of the Association by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.
- Section 1. Schools, Societies and Individuals shall be acknowledged in the minutes of the Association.
- Section 2. Before the final adjustment of the Association all the funds notes, and etc., shall be counted by the Finance Committee and

Treasurer. The Treasurer shall give the Finance Committee a receipt for the amount placed in his hands.

- Section 3. The Treasurer shall pay out no money except on order written by the Clerk and signed by the Moderator and Clerk.
- Section 4. After the expense of the Association have been paid the remaining funds shall be applied to such purposes as the Association may direct. The Executive Board shall execute plans adpoted by the Association.
- Section 5. The Auditor shall audit the accounts of the Treasurer and make annual report to the Association.
- Section 6. The duties of the Board provided for the Constitution shall be such as are usually performed by such boards in other similar bodies.

The Ninety-Seventh Annual Session of the Wake Baptist Association and the Forty-Fifth Annual Session of the Woman's Auxiliary met with the Pilot Baptist Church, Pilot, North Carolina, August 14-15, 1963.

WEDNESDAY MORNING SESSION

The Woman's Auxiliary met with the Association 10:00 A.M. for the devotion led by Reverends W. E. Edgerton and B. H. Closs. The Auxiliary joined the devotion and listened to the Welcome Address given by the pastor, Reverend Vick Alston and the response by Professor Joseph Walters, and appointment of Committees.

At 10:35 A.M., the Woman's Auxiliary hour began with Mrs. Edith Trice, president, presiding. The song, "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms," was sung after which "Echoes from the field" was heard. The following sisters brought greetings from their local "Missionary Circles."

Mrs. Lizzie B. Askew of the Wakefield Baptist Church reported that the mission work of the church was doing fine in carrying out the commission of spreading the "Good News." Visiting the sick; contributing food, clothing and money. Ministering to the unsaved, encouraging them to accept Christ.

Mrs. Chavis brought greetings from Bethlehem Baptist Church. She urged that the Mission Circles cooperate more in teaching the word of God and have more faith in him.

There were many other expressions. All reported spiritual developmen and asking progress for stronger circles.

After Echoes from the Field came the President's Message. Mrs. Edith M. Trice was introduced and presented by Mrs. M. N. Perry, the Past President of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Mrs. Trice began her message by stating her willingness to do all in her power to be successful in the capacity as president. She made it clear that the Juniors should be given a chance to work with the Seniors if they do not have a separate organization. The message was inspirational, dynamic and spiritully delivered..

Song

At this time Mrs. Lizzie B. Askew was presented. Mrs. Askew stated that she had served the Auxiliary for more than twenty-five years and that while she had enjoyed the work she felt that a younger person should fill her place. She asked the Committee on Organization not to consider her name for Secretary. At this time Reverend H. B. Perry, Pastor of Mount Bright Baptist Church, Hillsboro, North Carolina, offered a motion that since Mrs. Askew and Mrs. M. N. Perry had rendered many years of loyal and untiring service that something tangible should be given them in recognition of the service rendered. The motion met with a second, voted and carried.

Reverend H. B. Perry from Mount Bright Baptist Church delivered the Annual Sermon. He chose his text from St. Luke the 11th chapter and the 11th verse. In his sermon he made it plain that we as Christians do not reverence the house of God, in that we talk too much and keep too much noise. He also stated we should be careful how we treat our fellowmen.

The sermon was inspirational and spiritually delivered.

AFTERNOON SESSION — AUGUST 13, 1963

2:00 P.M.

The Auxiliary reassembled to join the brethren. Devotional services were led by Reverend Davis and Reverend Wright. After the devotional services were over, the Moderator, Dr. G. S. Stokes, came before the organizations to deliver his address.

He first stated that we need to dedicate our lives to God that we might be able to stand. He urged each Senior Auxiliary to begin working. He maintained that women preachers were not Baptist Doctrine. He recommended:

- 1. Churches should strive to make all men Christians.
- Each church use qualified members to teach in the Training Department.
- 3. Put in office qualified members to work in the church.
- 4. Encourage students to attend Shaw University.
- 5. Encourage Finance for Christian Education.
- 6. Line up with the pastor's program.
- 7. Abide by the Baptist Covenant and teach the Principles involved.
- 8. Wake Association give financial aid to needy churches.

- 9. Churches give their pastors vacations with pay that they may go away and rest.
- Association elect a Historical Committee to record events that have occurred through the years.

The address was delivered in excellency.

Reverend S. L. Suitt of Olive Branch gave some high points on "Teaching the Needs of the Missionary Baptist Doctrine and Practices in a Modern World." He stated that we have God as our Supreme Healer and we as Christians call on Him to relieve us. He further emphasized the Holy Spirit emboding the individuals.

Mr. J. T. Jiles came before the house to discuss the same subject. He urged all to do away with hate, malace and a life of "Happy Being"; study and practice the Covenant; and let love rule out hate.
