CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I This body shall be known as the Wake Baptist Association.

ARTICLE II The object of this Association shall be the promotion of Christ's Kingdom among men, and the means of accomplishing this shall be in strict conformity with the New Testament.

ARTICLE III This Association shall be composed of Delegates chosen by the Churches connected with it, each church being entitled to at least one delegate, and one delegate for each hundred members of the churches connected with this body shall be considered members of this Association. Ex-officers and members who are not in charge of or connected with churches within the bounds of this Association

who present testimonials of good standing may become annual members by the payment of \$1.00.

ARTICLE IV The delegates of each church shall bear a letter certifying their appointment giving an account of the condition of the church, and a statement of all funds contributed for benevolent purposes during the year.

ARTICLE V The Officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Vice Moderator, Clerk, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, Auditor, and Historian.

Section 1. The Boards of the Association shall be an Executive consisting of twelve members; including the officers of the Association, a Ministerial Board; also such committees as may be authorized by the Association.

ARTICLE VI The Officers and the Board Members shall be elected at the Annual Meeting of the Association.

Section 1. The Members of the Executive Board shall assume their duties at the close of the Annual Meeting.

Section 2. The Ministerial Board Members shall serve as occasion may require.

ARTICE VII The Moderator shall open all meetings punctually, and preside during the deliberation of the body; enforce the observance of the constitution, decide all questions of order; giving his opinion concerning any subject under discussion after others have spoken or when called upon, and give casting vote in the event of a tie.

ARTICLE VIII The Vice Moderator shall discharge the duties of he Moderator in his absence.

ARTICLE IX The Clerk shall keep a record of the Proceedings of the Association; superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes; keep on file the printed minutes and other important papers of the Association.

ARTICLE X The Treasurer shall receive all money contributed by the member churches, make disbursements as authorized by the Association. He shall not pay any order on the Treasurer except it be signed by the Moderator and Clerk. He shall make his annual report to the Association.

ARTICLE XI The Auditor shall audit the Treasuer's book and attest his annual report to the Association.

ARTICLE XII The Corresponding Secretary, as di-

rected by the Moderator shall communicate with the churches and serve as the Secretary of the Ministerial Board.

ARTICLE XIII The Historian shall collect facts of interest of the Association and member churches and make a report to each annual meeting of the Association.

ARTICLE XIV Any Baptist Church or organization seeking membership in this Association must present a petition to the Association in session through delegates appointed for that purpose.

Section 1. Upon reception of such Church or organization the Moderator shall extend to the delegates the right-hand of fellowship, on behalf of the Association. This Association shall not maintain the fellowship with any Church or organization that is not in Gospel order.

ARTICLE XV The Association shall meet on Wednesday and Thursday before the Third Sunday in August each year with the Church or Institute which invites it unless otherwise designated by the Executive Board.

ARTICLE XVI We shall withdraw the right hand of fellowship from any minister who walks disorderly or contrary to the Gospel rule.

ARTICLE XVII Each Church connected with the Association may continue its membership by supporting this Constitution.

ARTICLE XVIII The Wake Baptist Sunday School Convention, the Wake Baptist Missionary Union, the Woman's Auxiliary and the Ministers' and Deacons' Union are auxiliaries of the Association.

ARTICLE XIX There shall be a Ministers' and Deacons' Union as an Auxiliary of the Parent Body of the Wake Baptist Association.

Section 1. The object of the Ministers' and Deacons' Union shal be primarily to better acquaint Ministers and Deacons also other members of the Baptist Denomination with the Christian Way of Life.

Section 2. The Officers of the Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall be primarily to better acquaint Ministers and Dea-Treasurer.

Section 3. The officers of the said Minister' and Deacons' Union shall be elected at each annual session of the Wake Association.

- Section 4. Ministers, Deacons and Members of the Churches of the Association in good and regular standing, and supporting the objectives of the Association, shall be counted members of the Union.
- Section 5. A free will offering will be given in the Ministers' and Deacons' Union by each member to help spread the gospel and its teachings.
- Secton 6. The Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall submit a written report to each Annual Session, of its programs, activities and funds.
- Section 7. The Association shall provide necessary funds to lawfully and reasonably support the said Union Programs as directed by the Parent Body.
- Section 8. The Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall meet each fifth Saturday and Sunday unless otherwise advised by the Association.
- ARTICLE XX The object of the Auxiliary shall be to aid the Association in the extension of Christ's Kingdom.
- Section 1. The Officers of the Auxiliary shall be President, Vice President, Recording Secretary and Treasurer of each department.
- Section 2. All officers of the Auxiliary shall be elected annually.
- Section 3. All moneys collected by the Auxiliary shall be turned over to the Finance Committee of the Association in session and a receipt taken for the same.
- Section 4. All reasonable expense of the Auxiliary shall be paid by the Association.
- Section 5. The time of meeting of the Auxiliary shall be simultaneous with the meeting of the Association.

BY-LAWS

- ARTICLE XXI This Constitution may be amended at any Session of the Association by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.
- Section 1. Schools, Societies and Individuals shall be acknowledged in the minutes of the Association.

Section 2. Before the final adjustment of the Association all the funds notes, and etc., shall be counted by the Finance Committee and Treasurer. The Treasurer shall give the Finance Committee a receipt for the amount placed in his hands.

Section 3. The Treasurer shall pay out no money except on order written by the Clerk and signed by the Moderator and Clerk.

Section 4. After the expenses of the Association have been paid the remaining funds shall be applied to such purposes as the Association may direct. The Executive Board shall execute plans adopted by the Association.

Section 5. The Auditor shall audit the accounts of the Treasurer and make annual report to the Association.

Section 6. The duties of the Board provides for the Constitution shall be such as are usually performed by such boards in other similar bodies.

PROCEEDINGS

The Ninety-Eighth Annual Session of the Wake Baptist Association and the Forty-Sixth Annual Session of the Woman's Auxiliary met with the Baptist Grove Church, near Raleigh, North Carolina, August 12, 13, 1964, The Reverend Wm. A. Perry, Pastor; Dr. George S. Stokes, Moderator; The Reverend C. C. Jones, A.B., Clerk.

WEDNESDAY MORNING SESSION

Devotions were conducted by The Reverend W. A. Morgan and Deacon Ollie Bridges. The Association was highlighted by good spiritual singing by the congregation.

The hour arrived for the Pastor's Welcome Greetings. The Reverend W. A. Perry came forward and gave a hearty welcome.

He had us to know when we came on the grounds, we were in a community of Christian atmosphere and brotherly love.

Deacon Robert Wilder gave the response to the Pastor's Welcome Address. He told us we must be Christians and good stewards of Christ. He also stated that the Association must set the rote for church loyalty.

The Acting Moderator gave away for expressions from the delegates. The enrollment of messengers and appointment of committees.

The Associational Choir gave music, "I Am Going Up to Heaven to Get My Reward."

In the absence of the Reverend D. N. Howard, his son-inlaw was asked to discuss the theme, "Christian Growth." The speaker spoke forcefully.

MODERATOR'S ADDRESS CHRISTIAN GROWTH

Christian growth in the first place is contingent upon a strong and abiding faith in the Almighty God through Jesus Christ, the source of Christianity.

We quote, "Strong son of God, immortal love whom we that have not seen thy face, by faith and faith alone embrace,

believing where we cannot prove," unquote. To doubt the power of God paralizes the believer's ability to win the battle against the forces of evil. The disciples' attempt to cast the devil out of a man at the foot of the mountain failed because of lack of faith. The Master came down to them and said, "Oh ye of little faith." Let us pray: Lord increase our faith.

In these perilious times we Christians need to confess our sins of ignorance, prejudice and hate, become willing to make whatever restriction and take whatever steps necessary to insure the enjoyment of the personal dignity divinely bestowed upon each human being. Along with faith, may I urge us to read good books and work together the goal of Peace on earth and good will toward all men.

In the second place, Christian growth depends upon the never failing word of God. "Ye shall know the truth and the truth will make you free." "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." Feed on God's word for proper and upright Christian growth. Bacon has well said, "Reading maketh a full man."

Christian growth rests on the pillow of prayer. "Men ought always pray and not faint." Luke 18:1. Dr. Harry Emerson Fosdick says "Prayer is an inner reaching up and out to a source higher and mightier than human beings."

The human lungs exact the oxygen from the air that passes to them. That process is vital for the maintenance of life. So also prayer is the Christian's vital breath. The power that moves heavy burdens when all others fail is prayer. Take your burdens to the Lord and leave them there. See the Master in dark Gethsemane. The burdens of a sin smitten world, and facing the agonizing pain of death, He falls on his knees in prayer to his Father, God. That communion with God enabled Jesus to be sympathetic with his sleeping disciples. Today, prayer makes us fit for service if we will use that medium. Prayer makes a way for deliverance. Moses, leading more than one quarter of a million people toward Caanon became puzzled at the Red Sea. He called on God for help. The waters divided, a way was made for God's people to go forward. God will make a way for you through prayer.

Today, the mighty forces of hatred, prejudice and every conceivable ill will are trying to overcome right and right-eousness. But the person who trusts in God will some day overcome.

Love for humanity is vitally important for Christian growth. "Thou shall love thy neighbor as thyself," Jesus declared. On this commandment hangs the law of love. God made everybody. We disapprove of some people's ways but the person is the workmanship of God and is to be loved and treated as a human being.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. That all Christians strive to make all people of the world Christians.
- 2. That a Constitutional Committee be named to study the Constitution of this body and report at the next Annual Meeting, 1965.
- 3. That a Historical Commission be named, headed by Reverend Trotter, to contact the churches for their subscription in making the history of this Association, in order that a publication may be ready at the centennial session of this Association. This Commission will function along with the historian. The Chairman of the Commission will name his co-members.
- 4. That this body will represent in the Lott Carey Convention at Pittsburgh, to the strength of its ability.
- 5. That every citizen strive to go to the polls and vote in November for such persons that would serve in official capacities the best interest of all the people.

Thank you for your cooperation in exceeding the goal required by this organization in helping Shaw University pay off its indebtedness.

We thank the official staff, pastors, churches and all concerned in helping to extend the borders of the Kingdom of God through this Association.

I am praying that the richest blessing of God may abide with you.
