## CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I This body shall be known as the Wake Baptist Association, and adjoining counties.

ARTICLE II The objective of this Association shall be the promotion of Christ Kingdom among men, and the means of accomplishing this shall be in strict conformity with the New Testament.

ARTICLE III This Association shall be composed of Delegates chosen by the Churches connected with it, each church being entitled to at least one delegate, and one delegate for each hundred members of the church connected with his body shall be considered member of this Association. Ex-officers and members who are not in charge of or connected with churches within the bounds of this Association who present testimonials of good standing may become annual members by the payment of \$1.00.

ARTICLE IV The delegates of each church shall bear a letter certifying their appointment giving an account of the condition of the church and a statement of all funds contributed for benevolent purposes during the year.

ARTICLE V The Officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Vice Moderator, Clerk, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, Auditor, and Historian.

Section 1. The Boards of the Association shall be an Executive consisting of twelve members; including the officer of the Association, a Ministerial Board also such committees as may be authorized by the Association.

ARTICLE VI The Officers and the Board Members shall be elected at the Annual Meeting of the Association.

Section 1. The Members of the Executive Board shall assume their duties at the close of the Annual Meeting.

Section 2. The Ministerial Board Members shall serve as occasions may require.

Section 3. Tenure of three years for Moderator may be re-elected upon  $\frac{2}{3}$  of the delegates present.

ARTICLE VII The Moderator shall open all meetings punctually, and preside during the deliberation of the body; enforce the observance of the constitution, decide all questions of order, giving his opinion concerning any subject under discussion after others have spoken or when called upon, and give casting vote in the event of a tie.

ARTICLE VIII The Vice Moderator shall discharge the duties of the Moderator in his absence.

ARTICLE IX The Clerk shall keep a record of the Proceedings of the Association; superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes; keep on file the printed minutes and other important papers of the Association.

ARTICLE X The Treasurer shall receive all money contributed by the member churches, make disbursements as authorized by the Association. He shall not pay any order on the Treasurer except it be signed by the Moderator and Clerk. He shall make his annual report to the Association.

ARTICLE XI The Auditor shall audit the Treasurer's books and attest his annual report to the Association.

ARTICLE XII The Corresponding Secretary, as directed by the Moderator shall communicate with the churches and serve as the Secretary of the Ministerial Board.

ARTICLE XIII The Historian shall collect facts of interest of the Association and member churches and make a report to each annual meeting of the Association.

ARTICLE XIV Any Baptist Church or organization seeking membership in this Association must present a petition to the Association in session through delegates appointed for that purpose.

Section 1. Upon reception of such Church or organization the Moderator shall extend to the delegates the right hand of fellowship, on behalf of the Association. This Association shall not maintain the fellowship with any Church or organization that is not in Gospel order.

ARTICLE XV The Association shall meet on Wednesday and Thursday before the Third Sunday in August each year with the Church or Institute which invites it unless otherwise designated by the Executive Board.

ARTICLE XVI We shall withdraw the right hand of fellowship from any minister who walks disorderly or contrary to the Gospel rule.

ARTICLE XVII Each Church connected with the Association may continue its membership by supporting this Constitution.

ARTICLE XVIII The Wake Baptist Sunday School Convention and the Union of the Wake Association Union, the Woman's Auxiliary are auxiliaries of the Association.

ARTICLE XIX There shall be an Association and Auxiliary of the Parent Body of the Wake Baptist Association.

Section 1. The objective of the Association shall be primarily to better acquaint Ministers and Deacons also other members of the Baptist Denomination with the Christian Way of Life.

Section 2. The Officers of the Association shall be President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer.

Section 3. The officers of the said Association shall be elected at each annual session of the Wake Association.

Section 4. Ministers, Deacons, and Members of the Churches of the Association good and regular standing, and supporting the objectives of the Association, shall be counted members of the Union.

Section 5. A free will offering will be given in the Union of the Deacons' Union by each member to help spread the gospel and its teachings.

Section 6. The Minister's and Deacons' Union shall submit a written report to each Annual Session, of its program, activities and funds.

Section 7. The Association shall provide necessary funds to lawfully and reasonably support the said Union Programs as directed by the Parent body.

Section 8. The Minister's and Deacons' Union shall meet each fifth Saturday and Sunday unless otherwise advised by the Association.

ARTICLE XX The objective of the Auxiliary shall be to aid the Association in the extension of Christ's Kingdom.

Section 1. The Officers of the Auxiliary shall be President, Vice President, Recording Secretary, and Treasurer of each department.

Section 2. All officers of the Auxiliary shall be elected annually.

Section 3. All moneys collected by the Auxiliary shall be turned over to the Finance Committee of the Association in session and a receipt taken for the same.

Section 4. All reasonable expense of the Auxiliary shall be paid by the Association.

Section 5. The time of meeting of the Auxiliary shall be simultaneous with the meeting of the Association.

## BYLAWS

ARTICLE XXI This Consitution may be amended if a notice is given one year prior to the annual session and then approved by  $\frac{2}{3}$  of the members present.

Section 1. Schools, Societies and Individuals shall be acknowledged in minutes of the Association.

Section 2. Before the final adjustment of the Association all the funds, notes and etc., shall be counted by the Finance Committee and a receipt for the amount placed in his hands.

Section 3. The Treasurer shall pay out no money except on order written by the Clerk and signed by the Moderator and Clerk.

4. We are grateful for the appointment to the leadership of Shaw University, Dr. Archie Hargrave whose life interest has reorganized our Divinity School at Shaw. We therefore, recommend that this Association set aside a Wake Baptist Association Ministerial Scholarship in addition to our annual support to Shaw University overall program, to train our much in demand ministers.

5. We also suggest that this Association elect and appoint to its Board of Directors or Executive Board — A Secretary of Educational Affairs whose responsibility shall be to aid our member churches to enlightening and give broader perspective within the scope of our opportunities now available with your support. We trust that these humble suggestions will claim your urgent consideration for action now!

Permit me now to make a partial report of the work done in this associational year and offer further suggestions in the form of:

#### RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Let every Christian person hold Jesus up, so that He will draw the world unto Him.
2. That Article XV of the Constitution be changed so as to read: The Wake Baptist Association will meet in Mid-Year Session on the 5th Sunday, and the Union meeting on Saturday before the 5th Sunday.
  - A. That the Annual Session of the Wake Baptist Association will convene on Saturday afternoon before the 5th Sunday, when those days come in the months of July, August, September or October.
3. That the Leadership Training Courses with the coalition of all member churches in the Association be approved. That each participating church will donate at the time and place the courses are taught, a reasonable sum of money, named by the committee of church pastors and deacons in that area, to help the instructors.
4. Other than the Mission offering given at the time of the regular worship service, that a special day be declared by each church, as the Association's Objectives Day. There upon urge each church member, 18 years of age and over, to give a minimum sum of \$2.00. Preferably, give as the Lord has prospered them.

Church members under 18 years of age give money as their parents or guardians allow them.
5. That all church pastors, deacons and trustees will engage the young men and women of your churches and use them in the Planning Board meetings, for the ongoing of Christ's Church.
6. Intellectual, moral and spiritual attainments are being realized through the Training Courses, and Classes humbly set-up under God, by your Association in the Union of the Association. I, therefore, urge each church of the Wake Association to allocate \$10.00 for the transportation of a group of young people of your church and community, to attend the Union meetings for training each 5th Saturday and Sunday during the year.
  - A. Each member church is strongly requested to name a Transportation Committee consisting of seven persons.

One male adult (deacon), one female adult; three young men and two young women. Let that committee raise the money among their church members and report the money realized, to their church in each business session.

- B. A deacon or any person going to the Union from your church community, may be used to carry some youths and adults too, to the Associational Union Training Course Classes.
7. In order to reach more people and cover more material to get information, I propose that the Training Classes in the Union of the Association meet for 45 minutes instruction each 5th Sunday morning just after Sunday School. The time lets say, 10:30 to 11:15 A. M. Classes are suspended (not held) when the Association convenes in Mid-Year and Annual Session on those Sundays.
- A. For instruction and the Instructors, use the detailed arrangements through the Executive Board.
8. The Woman's Auxiliary guided by the efficient President Mrs. Edith Trice and supported with able co-workers, is doing a marvelously good job. The senior and junior women in the local churches have redoubled their efforts in increased attendance and membership.
- Mission money brought to your Association, the amount has increased 75%.
- A. Pastor and all church workers will you help strongly the Mission cause in your churches and join me in striving more earnestly, to keep alive and make more meaningful, the B. T. U. in our churches?
9. The pastor and devout members of each church are sincerely asked to encourage worthy young men, to enter the Gospel Ministry of Jesus Christ. The Harvest is plentiful but the labors are few. Pray that the Lord of the harvest will send more labors into His harvest.
10. Blacks can get some of our wishes and needs met only through the ballot. People of God! Arise and shine everywhere. Especially in all churches of the Wake Association. See to it that every qualified person in your community registers and votes in every election in your communities for town, city, county, state and national.
11. That the tentative proposed budget for the Wake Association in 1972-1973 be as follows:
