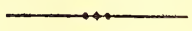

PROCEEDINGS.

A request from Galilee church, asking the Association for assistance to the amount of thirty dollars, was ordered to be recorded.

The Committee on Hours of Meeting reported the following:

Meet at 9 a. m., adjourn at 12½ p. m.; meet at 2 p. m., adjourn at pleasure. Adopted.

At 5 o'clock the services closed after singing the doxology and receiving the benediction.

SECOND DAY—FORENOON SESSION.

Met on time. Moderator in the chair. Devotional exercises conducted by Rev. P. T. Hall. Minutes of the previous forenoon and afternoon sessions were read and approved.

On motion, the following were appointed a Committee on Grievances: Toney Burns, Calvin Powell and A. B. Fleming.

The following resolution, by J. S. Lea, was adopted:

Resolved, That all resolutions be referred to the Committee on Resolutions.

The Committee on Grievances made their report, which was adopted. (See report).

The following resolution, by N. F. Roberts, was adopted:

WHEREAS, There appears to be a decrease in the amount of funds sent to the Association for Missionary and Educational work, therefore,
Resolved, That a committee of five be appointed on Ways and Means.

In accordance with the above resolution the following were appointed: N. F. Roberts, George W. Perry, William Perry, A. Harris and A. W. Smith.

On motion, the following were appointed a Committee on Ordination: W. A. Green, G. W. Harris, H. Pair, N. F. Roberts, T. B. Edwards.

On motion, the following were appointed a Committee on Place of the next annual session of the Association: Toney Burns, David Martin, Henry L. Joyner, Samuel Clemons, A. W. Smith, Henry Turner and Edmund Perry.

On motion, the following were appointed a Committee on Temperance: N. F. Roberts, A. B. Fleming, Fenner Terrell, J. S. Lea and W. C. Hines.

The following visiting brethren were invited to seats in the Association, and upon invitation gave encouraging addresses: J. C. Fowler, John Griffin, A. J. White, E. F. Wilder and J. C. White.

On motion, a collection was taken for the benefit of Gethsemane church. Seven dollars and sixty-five cents were contributed.

Adjourned with prayer by J. S. Lea.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Met as ordered. Moderator in the chair, who also conducted devotional exercises.

On motion, the following were appointed a Committee on Officers: P. T. Hall, R. Shepard, J. C. Barker, Jeremiah Smith and Daniel Tucker.

On motion, the following were appointed on Sunday School Work: G. W. Perry, Caesar Johnson, N. F. Roberts, J. H. Smith and Louis Alston.

The Committee on Resolutions made their report.

On motion, the report was adopted. (See report.)

The Committee on Place of next annual session of the Association reported.

On motion, the report was adopted.

A letter from the Sisters' Home Mission Society at Rolesville, containing two dollars for Home Mission work, was read to the Association and adopted.

Thereupon the following resolutions, by J. S. Lea, were read:

WHEREAS, The report of the Sisters' Home Mission Society of Rolesville shows an indefatigable zeal on their part in instituting and sustaining such a noble enterprise, therefore,

Resolved. That we return words of cheer and encouragement to these noble workers.

Resolved. That we express our profound gratefulness and assure our hearty endorsement to all similar organizations.

Resolved. That we recommend such steps to be an exemplar to all our churches.

Adopted.

The Committee on Officers for the ensuing year made their report.

On motion, the report was adopted. (See report.)

The Treasurer made his report.

On motion, the report was adopted.

Adjourned with prayer by N. F. Roberts.

 THIRD DAY—FORENOON SESSION.

Met pursuant to adjournment. Moderator in the chair. Devotional exercises conducted by Rev. N. F. Roberts. Prayer by Rev. P. T. Hall. Minutes of the previous session read and approved.

The Committee on Finance made their report.

On motion, the report was adopted.

The following resolution by John M. Beckwith, was read and adopted :

WHEREAS, To promote and advance the cause of Mission Work should be one of the greatest objects of this Association, therefore,

Resolved, 1st. That a Home Mission Board of seven members be appointed whose duties shall be to take under consideration the Home Mission work of this Association.

2d. That a Foreign Mission Board of seven members be appointed, whose duties shall be to take in charge the Foreign Mission work of this Association.

3d. That Churches, Sabbath Schools, Home and Foreign Mission Societies, raising or collecting funds for Home and Foreign Mission work be recommended to forward the same to the respective Mission Boards of this Association, and that said money be appropriated to the objects for which sent.

On motion, the following resolution, by J. S. Lea, was adopted :

Resolved, That Rev. J. Perry preach the Introductory sermon, Elder William A. Green preach the Doctrinal sermon and Prof. N. F. Roberts preach the Educational sermon at the next annual session of this Association.

On motion, the Clerk was allowed ten dollars for preparing the minutes for the press.

On motion, the Clerk was ordered to have 1,200 copies of the minutes printed and distributed.

On motion, \$10 was given to Galilee church.

The Committee on Temperance made their report.

On motion, the report was adopted.

The following resolution, by L. T. Mial, was read and adopted :

WHEREAS, The *African Expositor* is the pioneer of the Missionary Baptist denomination, therefore,

Resolved, That all ministers and delegates belonging to this Association subscribe themselves and then encourage others to do likewise.

On motion, the Moderator appointed the following brethren as delegates to represent the Association in the Baptist State Convention, viz: Revs. W. A. Green, P. T. Hall, G. W. Perry, T. B. Edwards and G. W. Harris.

Rev. Malphis Freeman, of the white Baptist church, was invited to a seat, and addressed the Association in way of encouragement.

The Committee on Ordination made their report.

On motion, the report was adopted.

The following resolution, by C. Johnson, was adopted :

Resolved, That the clerk be allowed six dollars for recording the minutes, and the moderator six dollars for presiding over the deliberations of this Association.

A petition from Friendship Chapel, asking a loan of \$30 until the next annual session of the Association, was read ; and, on motion, the Association agreed to grant the loan, by the same being properly secured.

On motion, a collection was taken for the benefit of the American Baptist Publication Society. One dollar and fifty-two cents was realized.

Adjourned. Prayer by G. W. Harris.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Assembled on time. Moderator in the char.

Devotional exercises conducted by the Moderator. Prayer by the Clerk.

Minutes of the last session read and approved.

On motion, the Moderator was unanimously elected a delegate to the Baptist State Convention.

On motion, the following were elected and constituted an Executive Board : A. B. Fleming, G. W. Harris and G. W. Perry.

On motion, that no bond or other security offered for money be accepted by the Executive Board unless the same is approved by the Moderator and signed by the Clerk of the Association.

The following resolution, by J. S. Lea, was unanimously adopted :

WHEREAS, The ministers and delegates have been so cordially received and entertained by the members and friends of Gethsemane church, therefore,

Resolved, That we tender our thanks to members and friends of the church and community for the kind reception and hospitable treatment given us during the sitting of the present session of the Association.

On motion, the Association adjourned. Benediction by the Moderator.

APPENDIX.

REPORT ON RESOLUTIONS.

We, your Committee on Resolutions, beg leave to report that we endorse and recommend the passage of the following resolutions :

I.

WHEREAS. It is the object of this Association to extend the work of the Master's Kingdom, by the diffusion of a knowledge of His word ; and, whereas, a religious institution is the strength of the Baptist denomination of the State ; and, whereas, the Northern friends have given means sufficient to establish Shaw University, the property of which is valued at \$115,000, all of which is paid for ; and, whereas, in many sections of our country the denomination is suffering for want of qualified leaders ; therefore,

Resolved 1st, That the Wake Baptist Association donate a sum of money which shall be designated by a vote of the Association.

Resolved 2nd, That this money shall be for the ministerial education of those of our denomination attending said institution for the work of the Gospel ministry, and that said sum shall be as large as possible.

Resolved 3rd, That we recommend all of our young men who feel that they are called to any Christian work to enter our institution at Raleigh, and there prepare themselves for such a work. J. S. LEA.

II.

WHEREAS, It is important and necessary that the Sabbath Schools connected with the churches of this Association be encouraged to aid in the promotion of the Master's cause ; and, whereas, it is essential that the statistics of the Sabbath Schools be collected and published in the minutes of the Association ; therefore,

Resolved, That hereafter each delegate to this Association solicit a fund from each Sabbath School, in aid of the benevolent objects of the Association, and that said funds be entered on the minutes to the credit of the Sabbath Schools. JNO. M. BECKWITH.

III.

WHEREAS, It is the duty of every person, both old and young, to attend the Sabbath School ; therefore,

Resolved, That every church have an adult Bible class for the benefit of the older people. A. W. CRENSHAW.

IV.

WHEREAS, The American Baptist Publication Society has supplied the State with a Missionary for a number of years, paying his salary and expenses, and,

WHEREAS, Said Society in its liberality has done so much for the benefit of churches and Sabbath schools of our denomination, therefore,

Resolved 2nd, That we express our profound gratefulness to said Society and do promise to do our best toward sustaining said Society.

Resolved 2d, That we contribute something for the appointment of an additional missionary for our State to assist in carrying forward the noble work promulgated by said Society. J. S. LEA.

V.

WHEREAS, Our churches are often imposed upon by persons who claim that they have been licensed by some church, therefore,

Resolved, That hereafter all licenses granted shall be in printed form, and to be valid for twelve months, and said license can be obtained from the Ministers' Board.

REPORT ON WAYS AND MEANS.

REPORT ON TEMPERANCE.

We, your Committee on Temperance, beg leave to submit the following report:

WHEREAS, Spirituous liquors used as a beverage are destructive to the mental, physical and moral qualities of mankind, antagonistic to the growth and spread of the Gospel and a violation of the teachings of God's word; therefore,

Resolved 1st, That the duty of pastors to inculcate principles of temperance in their members, and to exact of them a constant sober deportment, is unavoidable and indispensable.

Resolved 2d, That this Association discountenance any minister or member who uses intoxicating drinks as a beverage.

Resolved 3d, That this Association recognize no applicant for ordination who is addicted to the use of intoxicating liquors.

Resolved 4th, That every pastor belonging to this Association preach a temperance sermon at least once a year and deliver temperance lectures as often as practicable, and in every laudible way labor to exterminate the great evil of intemperance from our country.

M. C. Ransom, Secretary, and Bro. T. Burns, Treasurer. Rev. George W. Perry was elected missionary for five months, with a salary of twenty (\$20) dollars per month.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I. This body shall be denominated and known as the "WAKE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION."

ART. II. The object of this Association shall be the promotion of Christ's Kingdom among men; and the means of accomplishing this shall be in strict conformity to the New Testament.

ART. III. This Association shall be composed of delegates chosen by the churches connected with it—each church being entitled to two or more delegates. Ministers who are members of the churches connected with this body shall be considered members of the Association, *ex-officio*.

ART. IV. The delegates from each church shall bear a letter certifying their appointment, giving an account of the condition of the church, and a statement of all funds contributed for benevolent purposes during the year.

ART. V. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer, who shall be chosen annually, and shall continue in office until their successors are elected.

ART. VI. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside during the deliberations of the body, to enforce an observance of the Constitution, preserve decorum, appoint committees, decide all questions of order, give his opinion concerning any subject under discussion after others have spoken, or when called upon, and give the casting vote in case of a tie.

ART. VII. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to record the proceedings of each annual session, and superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes among the churches.

ART. VIII. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds sent up by the churches, or collected during the session of this body, and disburse the same for the purposes for which they were sent or collected. He shall make an annual report to the Association. He shall not recognize any order drawn on the Treasury except it is signed by the Moderator and the Clerk of the Association.

ART. IX. Any church desiring to become a member of this body shall present her petition at an annual session of the Association, through delegates appointed for that purpose, and if the Association shall consent to receive her, the Moderator shall extend to the delegates the right hand of fellowship.

ART. X. The Association shall not maintain fellowship with any church or churches that neglect to preserve gospel order.

ART. XI. The Association may invite visiting brethren to seats, and extend to them all the privileges of the body, save that of voting.

ART. XII. The annual session of this body shall commence on Wednesday before the third Sabbath in August, at such place as the Association may select.

ART. XIII. The ministers composing the Association shall hold three ministerial meetings a year, in such places as brethren may designate.

ART. XIV. We will receive no minister into this Association but those who have good moral characters.

ART. XV. We will withdraw the right hand of fellowship from every minister who walks disorderly and contrary to the Gospel rule.

ART. XVI. The churches connected with this Association may continue their membership by paying three cents annually upon the head of each member to be represented in the Association.

ART. XVII. By appointment of the Association, there shall be preached during each annual session an Introductory Sermon.

ART. XVIII. This Constitution may be amended at any annual session, by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.
