CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I. This body shall be known as The Wake Baptist Association.

ART. II. The object of this Association shall be the promotion of Christ's kingdom among men, and the means of accomplishing this shall be in strict conformity with the New Testament.

ART. III. This Association shall be composed of delegates chosen by churches connected with it, each church being entitled to at least one delegate, and then one delegate for each hundred members or fraction thereof. Ministers who are members of the churches connected with this body shall be considered members of the Association *ex officio*; and ministers who are not in charge of, or connected by membership with, churches within the bounds of this Association, and who present testimonials of good standing in the Baptist denomination, may become members of this Association by the payment of one dollar annually; *provided*, ministers who aided in the organization of this Association shall be considered members, so long as they are in good standing in the Baptist denomination.

ART. IV. The delegates from each church shall bear a letter certifying their appointment, giving an account of the condition of the church, and a statement of all funds contributed for benevolent purposes during the year.

ART. V. The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer and Auditor, who shall be elected annually by the Association. In addition to these, there shall be appointed annually by the Moderator an Executive Board of seven, an Educational Board of five, a Home Mission of five, and a Foreign Board of five members.

ART. VI. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside during the deliberations of the body, to enforce an observance of the Constitution, preserve decorum, appoint committees, decide all questions of order, give his opinion concerning any subject under discussion, after others have spoken, or when called upon, and give the casting vote in case of a tie.

ART. VII. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to record the proceedings of each annual session, and superintend the printing and distribution of the Minutes among the churches.

ART. VIII. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds sent up by the churches or collected during the session of this body, and disburse the same for the purpose for which they were sent or collected. He shall not pay any order drawn on the treasury except it is signed by the Moderator and the Clerk of the Association, subject to the provisions in the By-Laws.

ART. IX. Any church desiring to become a member of this body shall present her petition at an annual session of the Association, through delegates appointed for that purpose; and if the Association shall consent to receive her the Moderator shall extend to the delegates the right hand of fellowship.

ART. X. This Association shall not maintain fellowship with any churches that neglect to preserve gospel order.

ART. XI. The Association may invite visiting brethren to seats, and extend to them all the privileges of the body save that of voting.

ART. XII. The annual session of this body shall commence on Wednesday before the third Sabbath in August, at such place as the Association may select.

ART. XIII. All ministers composing the Association shall hold three ministerial meetings a year, in such places as the brethren may designate.

ART. XIV. We will receive no ministers into this Association but those who have a good moral character.

ART. XV. Any Baptist Sunday-school or Missionary Society within the bounds of this Association may become a member of the Association by sending voluntary contributions. Each shall be entitled to one delegate.

ART. XVI. We will withdrawn the right hand of fellowship from every minister who walks disorderly and contrary to the gospel rule.

ART. XVII. Each church connected with this Association can continue its membership by supporting this Constitution.

ART. XVIII. By appointment of the Association, there shall be preached during each annual session an Introductory Sermon.

ART. XIX. This Constitution may be amended at any annual session by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.

ART. XX. Each church belonging to this Association shall send three cents per member represented to each annual session for the Association funds.

BY-LAWS.

SECTION 1. All moneys sent from churches, Sunday-schools, societies and individuals shall be acknowledged in the Minutes of the Association.

SEC. 2. Before the final adjournment of the Association all the funds, notes, etc., shall be counted by the Finance Committee and Treasurer. The Treasurer shall give the Finance Committee a receipt for the amount placed in his hands.

SEC. 3. The Treasurer, before receiving any funds from the Association, shall give a justified bond for a sum double the amount of that which may come into his hands, for the faithful performance of the duties of his office.

SEC. 4. No Missionary or agent of this Association shall be Treasurer.

SEC. 5. The Treasurer shall pay out no money except upon an order written by the Clerk and signed by the Moderator.

SEC. 6. After the expenses of the Association shall have been paid, the remaining Associational funds shall be applied to such purposes as the Association shall direct. The Executive Board shall execute the plans adopted by the Association.

SEC. 7. The Treasurer shall turn over to his successor all funds, notes, books and papers belonging to the Association as soon as his successor shall give bond as specified in the above section.

SEC. 8. Should the newly-elected Treasurer in any case fail to qualify, the Finance Committee shall retain the funds and be held responsible for the same till a Treasurer is elected or the Executive Board shall qualify.

SEC. 9. The Auditor shall audit the accounts of the Treasurer and make annual reports to the Association.

SEC. 10. The duties of the boards provided for in the Constitution shall be such as are usually performed by such boards in other similar boards.

Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, Grammar, United States History, General History, Geography, and Scripture Geography, Theology, Systematic Theology, Pendleton ; The Church, Harvey ; Deaconship, Howell ; Church Discipline, Hiscox ; Homiletics, Broadus ; History of the Baptist Denomination.

The course of study was adopted unanimously by the Association, and the churches are requested to license no person who cannot pass a creditable examination on reading, writing, the fundamental principles of Arithmetic, grammar and geography ; and to ordain no person who cannot pass a satisfactory examination on the entire course.

Proceedings.

HOLLY SPRING'S N. C., Aug. 14, 1901.

The Wake Baptist Association met with the Holly Springs Baptist church, Wednesday, August 14, 1901.

The meeting was called to order by Rev. J. J. Worlds, Moderator, at 10 o'clock, A. M.

Devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. H. T. Cook, assisted by Rev. A. B. Vincent. Hymn 562, "Must Jesus bear the cross alone," was sung. Brother Vincent offered fervent prayer and read John 15 chapter and commented on several verses. Brother J. T. Thompson offered prayer, Brother Cook and others made appropriate remarks expressing their gratitude to God for the blessings received during the associational year.

Rev. M. F. Jones, the pastor of the Holly Springs church, delivered the address of welcome. He took pleasure in welcoming the association because it is composed of Christian men; because the association will be helpful to the church and community; because it will build up the church spiritually.

In the absence of Rev. N. W. Watkins, Brother Charles Cardwell responded with appropriate remarks.

The moderator, Rev. J. J. Worlds, delivered his annual address. The speaker said, thirty-five years ago, he was here in the organization. He saw only two brethren, Rev. C. Johnson and Dr. A. Shepard, who were in that meeting. Brother World's theme was Christian Unity. The address was well prepared, and full of good suggestions and sound advice.

Messengers were enrolled.

The hour for the annual sermon having arrived Dr. J. A. Whitted and Rev. J. Perry were invited to the pulpit. Hymn 718 was sung. Dr. Whitted read a Scripture lesson from Revelations 22 chapter. Rev. James Perry offered prayer.

Hymn 875, "Arm of the Lord, awake, etc.," was sung. The moderator introduced Dr. A. Shepard who was appointed to preach the annual sermon.

Brother Shepard chose Psalm 28: 7 as a text. "The Lord is my strength, etc.," Subject, "The Lord acknowledged."

- (5) We should praise the Lord with song, in the family, in the church.

The sermon was an inspiration. "Oh! How happy are they who their Saviour obey," etc, was sung, being led by Rev. R. Shepard.

Rev W. A. Jones led in prayer.

Dr. Whitted spoke of the duty of giving as one the purposes for which we met in these sessions and then lifted a collection for the objects of the association. Amount \$7.50.

The moderator in closing the morning session called attention to the fact that two members of this association—Dr. J. A. Whitted and Dr. S. N. Vass—have been honored with the degree of Doctor of Divinity since the last annual meeting.

Benediction was given by Dr. A. Shepard.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Met at 1: 30. Devotional exercises were conducted by Brothers R. J. Lacy and W. A. Jones. The minutes of the morning session were read and approved. Brother Hopkins of Atlanta, Ga., was introduced to the association and made remarks.

Reception of New churches—Rev. E. Rice, Charles Harris, A. L. Banks.

Committee on Examination of Licensed Ministers—Rev. A. B. Vincent, Dr. A. Shepard, Rev. W. A. Jones, Rev. H. Pair, Rev. C. H. Williamson.

Report of Missionary Societies. Wake Baptist Missionary Union was represented by sister Cornelia Morgan.

St. Mathew's Home Mission Society, was represented by Sister Zilphia Hunter.

The Subject—"Missionary Societies, their relation to the churches," was discussed by Rev. G. W. Perry and Rev. M. F. Jones and Dr. S. N. Vass. The conclusion was that Missionary Societies and other organizations in the church are not independent of the church but grow out of the church and are aids to the church in doing her work, in giving each member something to do.

Brothers I. C. Jeffreys, J. T. Thompson and H. T. Cook spoke on the same subject. The Executive Board

made its report which was adopted. Rev. Joseph Perry was appointed to preach at 8 o'clock in case Brother Price did not arrive.

Dr. J. A. Whitted addressed the Association on The Baptist Sentinel.

Brother Charles Cardwell lifted a collection for the Association. Amount \$1.50.

Benediction by Dr. Whitted.

NIGHT SESSION.

The Association met at 8 o'clock. Praise meeting was conducted by Brother I. C. Jeffreys. Many spiritual hymns were sung, fervent prayer offered, and helpful remarks made by different brethren.

The moderator announced that the hour had arrived for a sermon by Rev. A. T. Price.

Rev. W. A. Jones announced hymn 503, "Come ye that love the Lord etc.," which was beautifully sung by the congregation. A scripture lesson from I John 3 chapter was read.

Dr. S. N. Vass, led in prayer. "Stand up, stand up for Jesus etc.," was sung.

Brother Price took for a text John 14 : 16 from which he preached a practical and soul stirring sermon.

At the conclusion of the sermon Rev. C. H. Williamson led in prayer. Rev. W. A. Jones raised a collection for the association. Amount \$2.37.

Benediction by Rev. A. T. Price.

THURSDAY MORNING.

Association was called to order at 9 o'clock. The praise service was held till 9 : 30, conducted by Rev. N. W. Watkins and Brother Garland Hinton.

At 9 : 30 the association went into business.

Minutes of previous sessions were read and approved. Brother I. C. Jeffreys was placed on the committee on Selection of Place in lieu of Brother Fleming.

Our mission work—What has been accomplished and the present needs, was discussed by Dr. J. A. Whitted.

The Home Mission Board reported through Rev. A. B. Vincent, Chairman.

The report was adopted:

The committee on resolutions made their report. Adopted. The report of Treasurer was read by the Secretary and adopted.

The committee on officers made their report which was adopted.

Our pulpits—How to make them a greater power was discussed by Rev. H. Pair and Rev. W. A. Jones.

The following points were presented and impressed:

1. Consecrated men
2. Men called of God.
3. Men who study and understand the word of God and are able to impart truth to others.—Trained men.

Our pulpits will increase in power, in proportion as they are filled with men who have the above qualifications.

Brother Hopkins addressed the Association and recommended some books which will help ministers in their work.

Rev. E. Rice took collection. Amount \$2.36.

Benediction by Rev. A. B. Vincent.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Met at 1: 30. Devotional exercises were conducted by Brother Garland Hintou.

The report of the committee on the Burnes Memorial was read and adopted.

Rev. M. W. Brown of the New Hope Association was introduced to the association and welcomed to a seat, also Rev. J. S. Miller, of the Methodist Church. Brother Brown brought greetings from the New Hope Association.

A letter from Brother I. W. Holden was read, stating, that he could not be present on account of sickness in his

family.. The association expressed its sympathy for Brother Holden.

Committee on Selection of Place made their report.
Adopted:

How to improve our Sunday Schools, was discussed by Rev. C. H. Williamson.

1. Improve one's self by studying the Bible.
2. By a close relation of the pastor with the Sunday-school.

"The American Baptist Publication Society: What it has done for the Denomination," Dr. S. N. Vass. They published denominational work, etc., Distributed 3600 copies of the Bible last year.

Collection. Amount \$2.50.

Report of the Educational Board was read by Dr. J. A. Whitted. Brother Whitted followed with an able speech urging parents to give their children the right kind of education. Prof. Vincent followed in the same line of thought.

Brother Charles Cardwell, Brother H. T. Cook, Rev. G. W. Perry and N. F. Roberts spoke on the same subject. The committee on Examination of Licensed Ministers made their report. The report was adopted.

The committee on Temperance made their report. After remarks on the report by Miss Bettie E. Cook, Brother I. C. Jeffreys and Brother T. S. Stokes, the report was adopted.

Benediction by Rev. C. H. Williamson.

NIGHT SESSION.

Met at 8:15. Praise service was conducted by Rev. S. H. Hockaday.

The opening prayer was made by Brother T. S. Stokes. The committee on Finance made their report. Adopted.

The Orphan Asylum—Its needs, was presented by Rev. R. Shepard, the Superintendent.

Rev. A. B. Vincent spoke on the work of the Asylum

and urged the brethren and sisters to help support this noble Institution.

Rev. C. H. Williamson lifted a collection of \$6.02 for the Asylum.

Resolutions of thanks were read by Miss Bettie E. Cook and adopted.

N. F. Roberts, Rev. J. J. Worlds were elected delegates to the State Convention.

Rev. A. B. Vincent, Rev. C. H. Williamson were elected to the Lott Carey Foreign Mission Convention.

The matter of expenses of delegates to the Lott Carey Convention was referred to the Executive Board.

“Blest be the tie that binds, etc.,” was heartily sung, and the association adjourned with benediction by N. F. Roberts.

REPORT ON HOME MISSION.

We your committe of the Home Mission Board beg leave to make the following recommendations in the interest of the work during the next Associational year.

FIRST:—That each church through its officers or pastor is hereby requested to call on every membes to volunteer and pledge himself for missions, immediately after the adjournment of this Association, including home foreign, state, ministerial education, orphan children, weak churches, etc.

SECOND:—That when each member has been solicited and voluntarily pledged for each department of the work as set forth by the State Convention that this money be collected through the pastor or some one approved by church and reported at next annual session of this Association ; and that all moneys be strictly applied to objects for which pledged and reported and published for the benefit of all concerned.

THIRD:—That special information and necessary instruction about needs of field and object for which money is raised be clearly and distinctly set before the churches through sermons, lectures, tracts or concerts as the pastor may deem best.

FOURTH :—That for the spiritual and intellectual development of each member of the church some special and worthy object be kept before the church at least each quarter and some work other than the improvement or erection of the home church, be kept before the membership all the time.

REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL BOARD.

We your Board on Education, make the following report: During the year your Board has aided three young

men in the Theological Department of Shaw University—

REPORT OF SUPT. OF ORPHAN ASYLUM. JULY 1ST 1900 TO JULY 1ST 1901.

To the Wake Baptist Association.

Dear Brethren: Through the mercies of Almighty God, we have been blest, through another year with such good things as he has seen fit to bestow upon us. During the past year we have had to refuse, as heretofore, many worthy applications for the admission of children into the Asylum, because we had neither the room nor the means for their support.

Our dormitories and our school rooms are full to their uttermost. We are anticipating the building of a dining hall, recitation rooms and chapel, sometime in the near future.

We humbly thank you for the contribution which you have so charitably bestowed upon this Institution, and whatever you may be led to give us in the future will be prayerfully received, and rightly applied.

No. of children in the Asylum 135. During the past year we raised on our farm 95½ bushels of corn: 126 bushels of wheat; 172 gal. of molasses; 150 bushels sweet potatoes; 15 stacks of fodder; 11 bales of cotton: Oats we did not stack them. We also raised peas, etc. We have 5 horses and 1 mule, 7 head of cattle, 31 head of hogs.
