We, your committee on Obituary, beg leave to make the following report: Whereas it has pleased Almighty God in his Allwise Providence to remove from our midst our beloved Bro W Leak, therefore be it

Resolved, That this Association express its sincere sorrow in the great bereavement sustained, not only to the family but to the brotherhood at large; and while we feel keenly the sad bereavement and loss which falls on us, yet we bow in humble submission to the will, the love and the wisdom of God our Heavenly Father. Rev W Leak, who has gone to his reward, was one of the foremost leaders and founders of this Association. Report of committee on Temperance :—

Whereas, we see the great need of Temperance and the harm of intemperance in our State, especially among our people. We feel as a band of christian leaders that we should hold high the royal banner of temperance.

Resolved that we recommend total abstinence from all use of intoxicating drinks, and thank God for the spread of temperance among the brethren throughout the Association for the spread of the temperance cause and the movement that is prevailing not

only in our Association but throughout the country in driving from the midst of our boys and girls the demon of strong drink that our homes may be made happy.

Resolved 2nd, That in our opinion the use of intoxicating drinks as a beverage, and also the manufacture and sale of the same for that purpose, are contrary to christian morals, injurious to personal piety, and a hinderance to the Gospel. Therefore persons so using, making or selling are thereby disqualified for membership in this Association.

Resolved 3rd, That we emphatically discountenance and condemn the practice of intemperance of speech and members of frequenting theatres and other similar places of amusement, as inconsistent with a christian's profession, detrimental to personal piety, and pernicious in the influence of its example on others.

The Association assembled at 11 o'clock. A large crowd gathered to hear the Missionary sermon—Revs W P Perkins and P J Ewing. Sung hymn No. 987. Rev Perkins read 7th chap. of Revelations. Prayer was led by Rev P R Tyson. Second hymn 986. Rev Perkins selected for his text Revelations 7:19 v. Subject: And he stood before the throne, &c. Rev W P Perkins preached a soul-stirring and heart-felt sermon, which was enjoyed by the Association at large. Closed with a few brief remarks by Rev P J Ewing. Collection \$5.15. Sung doxology. Benediction by Rev P J Ewing.

EDUCATION.

Ministerial Education is a matter that every minister of God should prayerfully seek after; expounding and reaching success by preaching the word of God. This qualification is sadly needed in most of us as ministers of his word. The Apostles are by some called ignorant men, but they wrote the Holy Scriptures, the Gospel and the Law of the New Testament; a responsibility that the most learned of our day or any other age would tremble and faint before daring to do. Let us not attempt to hide here, but do like Solomon of old; first seek and ask of God wisdom and knowledge. Our ministers are the true and logical leaders of our people and churches. Yea, of civilized and christianized people the world over, to lead everybody. We need special preparation and qualification; then let every minister of God do all in his power to get knowledge and wisdom. Let our churches who must depend on these as leaders, do all they can to help them to become able ministers through the study of the word. Let our women be missionaries and raise money for the old ministers and poor churches, with the help of the pastor. Let our pastors and brethren raise the money for ministerial education, girl's education, State and Foreign Missions and the Associational fund. We urge upon all our ministers and delegates to do all in their power to promote good and well equipped public schools and academies, wherever possible, upon our young men the importance of crafty hand and a scientific mind. We are not willing to help any minister who is not willing to help himself. Let each father and mother see to

it that a certain per cent of their earnings be laid aside for the purpose of educating and elevating their children that they may stand up for their rights, race and country.

Resolved that the ministers and delegates of the Association do earnestly endorse every effort put forth for the education of our race. We will pledge ourselves annually certain amounts for education.

RULES OF DECORUM.

1. This Association shall be opened with devotional services conducted by the Moderator or some one appointed by him.

2. The minutes of previous meeting shall be read, corrected and adopted.

3. No brother shall be interrupted when speaking unless his remarks be foreign to the subject under discussion. Any brother may, on the point of order, or the Moderator may call him to the proposition under debate.

4. When a member is called to order by the Moderator he shall take his seat until it is determined by the Moderator whether he is in order or not. Said member may appeal from the decision of the Moderator to the decision of the Association.

5h. No member shall be allowed to go to sleep or spit on the floor or whisper in the session room.

6. No member shall be allowed to leave the house without the permission of the Moderator.

N. B.—The Missionary Women of Yadkin Philadelphia Association will make their report on Saturday at 2 p. m.

CONSTITUTION.

Article 1. This Association shall be known as the Yadkin Philadelphia Missionary Baptist Association of North Carolina.

Art. 2. This Association shall be composed of regular Baptist Churches, ministers and delegates in good standing, and in full practice of the doctrine and practice of the faith, discipline and ordinances of the regular denominations.

Art. 3. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Secretary, Cor. Sec., Treasurer, Auditor and Executive Board. Their duties respectively shall be such as are commonly exercised by these officers until their successors are chosen.

Art. 4. The object of this Association shall be to build up Baptist churches in its bounds, foster the educational and spiritual

work of its members, and co-operate with the State Convention in doing home mission work, and thus help take the world for Christ.

Art. 5. This Association shall meet annually, and shall be composed of not more than three delegates from each church, with a letter containing 10 cents per capita of its membership, and giving condition of the church and the membership of the church. The said meeting shall convene on Thursday at 11 a. m., before the 2nd Sabbath in October, with an annual sermon, and continue until the business of the Association is completed.

Art. 6. All visiting ministers who are in good standing in their churches, and corresponding delegates shall be welcome to a seat among us to give counsel, but not to vote. Voting shall be done only by the delegates and ministers of the Association.

Art. 7. Any church of this body that is corrupt in practice of doctrine, after steps have been taken to reclaim her, and she persists in her course, shall no longer be a member of this body, and the reason in full shall be published in the minutes. Furthermore any church failing to be represented by letter or delegate for two successive years, shall be subjected to a suitable admonition, and if she neglects to attend the 3rd year, she shall be dropped from the Association.

Art. 8. No difficulty existing between churches or in a church shall be heard by this body until gospel steps have been taken outside of this body to settle the difficulty.

Art. 9. The Scriptures, or the Word of God, shall be a sufficient rule of faith, doctrine, practice, etc., of this Association and the traditions of men, when they have neither precept nor example in the Scriptures to justify them, shall not be received.

Art. 10. The rules and orders in the Baptist Church Directory shall govern the deliberations of this body.

Art 11. The qualification and duty of the Association Treasurer. He must be able to read and write and own real estate in double the value of the amount of money that he receives. He must also give security in double the amount of money that he receives. He shall hold all money and notes given to him by the Association, and shall pay out the same at any time by order of the Executive Board, signed by the Moderator, Secretary and Auditor.

Art. 12. This Constitution may be amended at any annual session by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.

RESOLUTIONS.

Section 1. That each school connected with this Convention shall have an intelligent Supt., a reading man.

2. We recommend that each school shall have religious and educated teachers.

3. We recommend that each Supt. shall keep and report to the school the money used and for what purpose each quarter.

4. We recommend that each school shall secure its literature from the American Baptist Publication Society, 1420 Chesnut St. Philadelphia, Pa.

5. That each Supt. meet at each annual meeting to defend its cause.

6. That each pastor preach quarterly a sermon for the Sunday School.

7. That each Sunday School hold a devotional sermon once a month with the children.

8. That all delegates and members of the Convention shall pay 10 cents for their absence and slowness during the session without a lawful excuse.

9. Furthermore, we recommend that this Convention shall have missionary cards headed, and that these cards be issued one to every female missionary in the field by the Secretary.

CONSTITUTION.

Article 1. The name of this body shall be the Yadkin Philadelphia Missionary Baptist Sunday School Convention.

Art. 2. The object of this Convention shall be to establish and improve Baptist Sunday Schools in all the churches and destitute neighborhoods throughout the bounds of the Yadkin Philadelphia Association; to awaken a general interest in the religious education of both old and young; to improve the literary training of the young men and women, and co-operate with the Baptist State S. S. Convention in doing educational and missionary work, and also the Lot Cary Foreign Mission Convention in doing Foreign Mission work.

Art. 3. The officers of this Convention shall be a President, Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Auditor, Treasurer, and a Board of Managers. No one shall be an officer of the Convention unless he be at the time of his election a member of and in good standing in some Baptist church. No one shall be a delegate to this Convention who is not a member of a Missionary Baptist Sunday School.

Art. 4. The Convention shall meet annually on Friday before the 2nd Sunday in September at 10 a. m. at such places as may be agreed upon.

Art. 5. Each school belonging to the Convention shall contribute annually the sum of 5 cents per scholar and be allowed representation by any number of messengers, not exceeding three. New schools may be represented upon the same terms.

Art. 6. This Constitution may be altered or amended by a vote of two-thirds of the members present at any annual meeting.

Art. 7. No delegate or Supt. shall be allowed to be on the ground near the church during the time of service.

Art. 8. Any church of this body that is corrupt in practice or doctrine, after steps have been taken to reclaim her, and she persist in her course, shall no longer be a member of this body, and the reasons in full shall be published in the Minutes. Furthermore, any church failing to be represented by letter or delegate two successive years, shall be subjected to suitable admonition, and if she neglects to attend the 3rd year, she shall be dropped from the Association.
