PROCEEDINGS

Forty-ninth annual session of the Yadkin-Philadelphia Baptist Association held with Mt. Nebo Baptist Church, Waxhaw, N. C., Thursday before the second Sunday in October, 1922—Oct. 5th.

The Association met on the above named date and

in the Waxhaw Baptist Church.

The house was called to order by the former Moderator, Rev. Dr. Allen, D. D., about 12:30 p. m.

The gentleman assigned to preach the opening sermon being absent, Rev A C McLendon and Bro H C Carpenter

were selected to preach the annual sermon.

Bro H C Carpenter introduced the service by using hymn "I love thy kingdom Lord, the house of thine abode," &c. Bro A C McLendon read the 3rd chapter 1st Epistle of John. Rev Threadgill led in prayer. 2nd hymn No. 628 was lined by Bro Carpenter. The Moderator introduced the speaker—A C McLendon. Rev. McLendon took for a text Matt. 22:42. His outline: "What think ye of Christ, whose son is he." Rev McLendon preached a very helpful, inspiring sermon to all who heard it.

H C Carpenter lined "must Jesus bear the cross alone," etc., after which read the text with some very strong

temarks. Rev S S Thomas led in prayer.

While Rev P F Long chanted a sweeter peace by name "Blessed Jesus guide me," &c., H C Watkins and White Barringer came forward and lifted a collection amounting to \$7.00. The Association adjourned for dinner.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

Thursday afternoon session the Association assembled promply at 2:30 p. m., the Moderator presiding in the chair. Praise services were conducted by Rev J C Massey, C C Craig. Rev Massey lined hymn No. 800. C C Craig read the 23 Division of Psalms. Bro S S Craig led

On motion the Moderator's annual address go in the hands of a committee, and be put in the minutes in honor to his former service.

The Association adjourned. Sung doxology. Benediction by Rev A C McLendon.

THURSDAY NIGHT SESSION

Promptly at 7:30 p. m., the Association re-assembled with the Moderator presiding. Time of preaching having arrived, Rev J W Hawkins ascended the rostrum, accompanied by Rev C A Threadgill. Rev Threadgill introduced the service, using hymn No. 800. Rev J W Hawkins read 16th chapter St. Mark. Rev P F Long led in prayer. Second selection No. 762. The Moderator, Rev W G Flake introduced the speaker, Rev J W Hawkins to preach a doctrinal sermon. Rev Hawkins chose his text from the above named book, 11:30. His outline: The baptism of John—was it from heaven or of men? Rev Hawkins preached a live, long sermon with great impression on all who heard it.

Rev R H L Crockett closed the services with a fervent prayer; after which a collection was taken, amounting to \$7.00, followed with a welcome address by Rev S W Fulwood, the pastor of the Presbyterian Church. In the absence of the pastor of the church, in which we are now convened, the extended welcome was injoyed by the delegation largely. Rev Dr. Allen in a very delightful manner and way, accepted the address of welcome.

Rev Vanputten was extended a seat of welcome with us. He came forward and spoke good words of encouragement. His words were enjoyed. The Association adjourned. Sung doxology, and benediction by Rev S S Thomas.

FRIDAY MORNING SESSION

At 9:30 the Moderator called the house to order. Praise services were conducted by Rev C H Pemberton and B C Crawford. B C Crawford lined hymn No. 228. Rev C H Pemberton read 7th chapter of St. Mark. After some strong comments on the lesson, Rev L T Allen led in prayer. The Moderator then declared the house ready

for business. The minutes of Thursday's session were read and approved. On motion a contribution be extended to Rev Dr. Allen, in honor for former services. Motion was adopted.

The devotional committee made the following report: RHL Crockett to fill the stand at 11 o'clock a. m., accompanied by Rev P F Long. The Association then adjourned for 10 minutes. At 11 a.m., Rev PF Long asascended the pulpit, accompanied by Rev C H Pemberton in lieu of R H L Crocket. Rev C H Pemberton introduced the services by using hymn No. 231. Rev L T Allen led in prayer. Hymn No. 715. The Moderator introduced the speaker in the person of Rev P F Long. Rev Long chose his text from the 1st book of Exodus 4:2. His outline: What is that in thine hand? Subject used: What you got. Rev Long preached a spirited heart-felt sermon, and was highly enjoyed by all who heard it. Rev Pembertion sang "On Jordans stormy banks I stand," &c. Rev W H Horne led in prayer. Rev W H Horne and W M Richardson came forward and lifted a collection amounting to \$5.00; after which Rev P F Maloy came forward and spoke to the Association in regard to his line of books for sale, &c.

Rev J W Hawkins made remarks in regard to the ladies of Piney Grove prepairing dinner, &c. The Association adjourned. Doxology. Benediction by Rev P F Long.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

At 2 p. m. the Association re-assembled, with the Moderator presiding. Praise services were conducted by Revs L T Allen and C C Craig. C C Craig lined hymn No. 762. L T Allen read the 8th chapter St. Matt. J T Tyson led in prayer. Moderator pronounced the house open and ready for business. Then Rev P F Maloy came before the Association to speak in regard to the Linwood School and grounds. Rev Maloy said great things in his lecture, and was highly enjoyed by the Association at large.

The devotional committee reported the following: Rev W H Horne filled the stand at 7:30 p. m., accompanied by J C Massey. The Association adjourned. Sung doxology. Benediction by the Moderator.

FRIDAY NIGHT SESSION

At 7:30 p. m., the Association re-assembled, with the Moderator presiding in the chair. Praise services were conducted by John Perry. Hymn No. 223 was sung. Bro S S Craig led in prayer. Second hymn No. 294. Rev W H Horne ascended the pulpit, accompanied by Rev L T Allen, who lined hymn No. 155. Rev W H Horne read 20th division of Psalms of David. Rev J W Hawkins led in prayer. The Moderator introduced the speaker in the person of Rev W H Horne. His text was taken from the 1st book of Joshua 1:2. "Arise and go over this Jordan," etc. Rev Horne preached a heartfelt, touching sermon, and was full of good thoughts, and made a great impression on all who heard it. Bros J W Perry and P L Tillman lifted a collection amounting to \$3.52. Sung doxology. Benediction by Rev W H Horne.

SATURDAY MORNING SESSION

At 9:30 the Moderator called the house to order. Praise services were conducted by Rev J W Hawkins and L M Dunlap. Rev Hawkins lined hymn No. 402. L M Dunlap read the 12th chapter Paul's letter to Hebrews. Rev J W Hawkins led in prayer. The Moderator declared the house ready for business. Minutes of Friday's session was read and approved.

After the Moderator asked the several committees to finish up their several works, the committees all retired, and after a long stay out, was ordered in, in order to adjourn for dinner. The committees came in and were seated. Rev T R Richardson lined hymn No. 522. Then read 7th chap. St. Matt. Prayer. A song was sung. Subject: "What are you doing in here without your garment on?" etc. Revs J C Massey and J W Lockhart took a collection, amounting to \$3.95. Sung doxology. Benediction by Rev T R Richardson.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

Promptly at 2 o'clock the Association re-assembled, with the Moderator in the chair. Praise services were conducted by Rev R W Alsobrooks. Sung "Must Jesus bear the cross alone and all the world go free," etc. kead the 13 chapter of Romans. Prof FM Fitch led in prayer. After which the Moderator arose and pronounced the house ready for business. Then he stated that Prof F M Fitch would have the attention of the Association for a short while to speak to us on Linwood school question. Prof F M Fitch said many good things in his lecture that made our hearts burn while he talked with us along the lines of the Linwood school, and what he said was highly endorsed; after which a committee was appointed to attend a meeting that was to meet in Charlotte on Tuesday, the 10th of October, 1922. Delegates: Revs W F Flake, S S Thomas, Dr Allen, J H Ingram, Miss Viola Craig.

SATURDAY NIGHT SESSION

At 8 P. M. the Association re-assembled, with Moderator presiding. Time for preaching having arrived, Revs C H Pemberton and H C Carpenter ascended the rostrum. Praise services were conducted by the Moderator, Singing "What are you doing in here without your garment on?" etc. Elder S S Bennett of the M E Zion Church led in prayer. After which the field missionary reported. He received on his commission \$4.00, which was devided between two—himself and sister Laura McLendon, On motion Bro H C Carpenter be our field missionary on this end of the field, and Bro B C Crawford on the west end. After which H C Carpenter lined hymn No. 402. The Moderator introduced Rev C H Pemberton, who chose for his text Isaiah 53. His outline: He shall see of the travel of his soul and shall be satisfied. Rev Pemberton preached a heart-felt sermon, and was enjoyed by all who heard it. Bro H C Carpenter sang "Must Jesus bear the cross alone and all the world go free," &c. Bro W S Caldwell led in prayer. Rev S S Bennett came forward and lifted a collection, amounting to \$10.00. This collection was given to the church as a contribution.

After which a vote of thanks was extended to the good people of Waxhaw and Piney Grove for their kindness and great care towards us while here in session.

The Association adjourned. Sung doxology. Bene-

diction by the Moderator.

SUNDAY MORNING

At 11:30 Rev Dr R Allen, D. D., ascended the rostrum, accompanied by Rev S S Thomas to preach the missionary sermon. Rev Thomas introduced the services by lining hymn No. 801. Rev J C Massey read 7th chapter St. Mark. Rev May Morrow led in prayer. Second hymn No. 800. Rev Dr. Allen chose his text Matt. 1:13. Subject: Straight is the gate and narrow the way, etc.

Dr R Allen preached a powerful sermon, and it made a deep impression on a large congregation. Rev S S Thomas closed with a few strong remarks. Rev Pemberton led in prayer. A collection was taken amounting to \$14.35. Sung doxology. Benediction by Rev.Dr.Allen.

CONSTITUTION.

- Article 1. This Association shall be known as the Yadkin Philadelphia Missionary Baptist Association of North Carolina.
- Art. 2nd. This Association shall be composed of regular Baptist churches, ministers and delegates in good standing and full practice of the doctrines and practices of the faith, discipline and ordinances of the regular denomination.
- Art. 3rd. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, Auditor and Executive Board. Their duties respectively shall be such as are commonly exercised by these officers until their successors are chosen.
- Art. 4th. The object of this Association shall be to build up Baptist churches in its bounds, foster the educational and spiritual work of its members, and to co-operate with the State Convention in doing home mission work and thus help take the world for Christ.
- Art. 5th. This Association shall meet annually, and shall be composed of not more than three delegates from each church, with a letter containing 10 cents per capita of its membership, and giving condition of the church and membership of the church. The said meeting shall convene on Thursday at 11 A. M., before the 2nd Sunday in October, with an annual sermon, and continue until the business of the Association is completed.
- Art. 6th. All visiting ministers who are in good standing in their churches, and corresponding delegates, shall be welcome to seats among us to give counsel but not vote. Voting shall be done only by the delegates and ministers of the Association.
