COURSE OF STUDY FOR THOSE HAVING THE MINISTRY IN VIEW

Reading, writing, arithmetic, United States history, general history, geography, and Scripture geography, theology, systematic theology (Pendleton), The Church (Harvey) Deaconship (Howell), Church Discipline (Hiscox), Homiletics (Broadus), History of the Baptist Denomination.

The course of study was adopted unanimously by the Association, and the churches are requested to license no person who cannot pass a creditable examination on reading, writing, the fundamental principles of arithmetic, grammar and geography, and to ordain no person who cannot pass a satisfactory examination on the entire course.

CONSTITUTION

Article I. This body shall be known as the "Wake Baptist Association."

Art. II. The object of this Association shall be the promotion of Christ's Kingdom among men, and the means of accomplishing this shall be in strict conformity with the New Testament.

Art. III. This Association shall be composed of delegates chosen by the churches connected with it, each church being entitled to at least one delegate, and the one delegate for each hundred members or fraction thereof. Ministers who are members of the churches connected with this body shall be considered members of the Association ex officio, and ministers who are not in charge or connected with churches within the bounds of this Association, who present testimonials of good standing in the Baptist denomination, may become members of this Association by payment of \$1 annually. *Provided*, ministers who aided in the organization of this Association shall be considered members so long as they are in good standing in the Baptist denomination; also any layman in good standing in the Baptist church may become an annual member by the payment of \$1.00.

Art. IV. The delegate from each church shall bear a letter certifying their appointment, giving an account of the condition of the church, and a statement of all funds contributed for benevolent purposes during the year.

Art. V. The officers of this body shall be a Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, Auditor and a Statistician, whose duties shall be such as are generally performed by such officers. In addition there shall be appointed a Home Mission Board, Foreign Mission Board, Educational Board, Sunday School Board, and an Executive Board, which latter shall have charge of the work of the Association during the interim of its annual session, and three members of the Executive Board shall constitute a quorum, and the officers of the body shall be ex officio members. The other boards shall have supervision of the work of the Association along their several lines, subject to the Executive Board and the Association, and shall so organize the territory of the Association as to accomplish the best results, but not contrary to the Executive Board of the Association.

Art. VI. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside during the deliberations of the body, to enforce an observance of the Constitution, preserve the decorum, appoint committees, decide all ques-

tions of order, give his opinion concerning any subject under discussion after others have spoken or when called upon, and give the casting vote of a tie.

Art. VII. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to report the proceedings of each annual session and superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes among the churches.

Art. VIII. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds sent up by the churches or collected during the session of this body, and disburse the same for the purpose for which they were sent or collected. He shall not pay any order on the Treasurer except it is signed by the Moderator and the Clerk of the Association subject to the provisions in the By-Laws.

Art. IX. Any church desiring to become a member of this body shall present her petition at an annual session of the Association through delegates appointed for that purpose, and if the Association shall consent to receive her the Moderator shall extend to the delegate the right hand of fellowship.

Art. X. This Association shall not maintain fellowship with any church that does not preserve Gospel order.

Art. XI. This Association may invite visiting brethren to seats and extend to them all privileges of the body save that of voting. The Association shall meet on Wednesday before the third Sabbath in August at such place as the Association may select.

Art. XII. All ministers composing the Association shall hold three ministerial meetings a year in such places as the brethren may designate.

Art. XIII. We will receive no ministers into this Association but those who have a good moral character.

Art. XIV. Any Baptist Sunday School or Missionary Society within the bounds of this Association may become a member of this Association by sending voluntary contributions. Each shall be entitled to one delegate.

Art. XV. We will withdraw the right hand of fellowship from every minister who walks disorderly and contrary to the Gospel rule.

Art. XVI. Each church connected with this Association can continue its membership by supporting this Constitution.

Art. XVII. By appointment of the Association there shall be preached during each session an introductory sermon.

Art. XVIII. This Constitution may be amended at any annual session by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. Schools, societies and individuals shall be acknowledged in the Minutes of the Association.

Sec. 2. Before the final adjournment of the Association all the funds, notes, etc., shall be counted by the Finance Committee and

Treasurer. The Treasurer shall give the Finance Committee a receipt for the amount placed in his hands.

Sec. 3. The Treasurer shall pay out no money except on order written by the Clerk and signed by the Moderator.

Sec. 4. After the expenses of the Association shall have been paid the remaining Associational funds shall be applied to such purposes as the Association may direct. The Executive Board shall execute plans adopted by the Association.

Sec. 5. The Auditor shall audit the accounts of the Treasurer and make annual reports to the Association.

Sec. 6. The duties of the Boards provided for in this Constitution shall be such as are usually performed by such boards in other similar bodies.

MODERATOR'S RECOMMENDATIONS

1. That our associational finance be raised and paid as outlined in our State budget plan, based on the per capita of the church's membership.

2. In view of the fact that so many of our churches are rural, and so few have but one Sunday in the month for preaching, and that as a natural result our young people are not actively engaged in real church work, we hereby appeal to the officials of such churches to make an earnest effort to hold at least two regular preaching services per month, and increase same as conditions warrant.

(a) Further, that the officers and members of such churches increase their monthly contributions and pay them so that the pastor who undertakes to put on the extra Sunday shall receive adequate support.

(b) That the pastor at some convenient time teach his church membership the "Doctrine and Articles of Faith." Such may be procured, condensed in a little book, for less than ten cents.

3. That each pastor take the time and pains to organize in his church or churches a B. Y. P. U., and put the same into the hands of a strong Christian man or woman who will act as supervisor and encourage regular weekly meetings at the church.

PROCEEDINGS

In the Jones Hill Baptist Church, near Spring Hope, N. C., of which Rev. G. W. Todd is pastor, the Wake Baptist Association began its sixty-first annual session August 17, 1927, with Rev. M. W. Williams, the Moderator, presiding.

Praise service commenced at 10 o'clock a.m., conducted by Revs. E. Wimberly and C. C. Clark. Song No. 704 in the Baptist Hymn Book was lined by Brother Wimberly. Proverbs, chapter three, was read for a Scripture lesson by Brother Clark, following which the Rev. B. F. Jordan led in prayer.

Subsequent to the inspirational prayer and praise service the Committee on Hours of Meeting was named. (See list of committees.) Song, "I am Thine, O Lord," was very beautifully sung by the audience as the Rev. B. F. Jordan, pastor of the First Baptist Church, Wilson, N. C., ascended the rostrum to preach the annual sermon. The Moderator then presented Brother Jordan, who chose for a text Exodus' 33:14. Theme, "God's Rest and Presence." Three points were stressed: (1) Journey, (2) Rest, (3) Presence. "God's people are traveling to a land of glory and infinite delight," declared the speaker. "Our rest here is only temporary, but the rest beyond this vale of tears with God is permanent—yea, eternal. The presence of God was and is divine with His people. So prayer is a necessary element in order to realize the abiding presence of the Almighty God." The speaker closed his sane, doctrinal and comprehensive message.

Following the message the congregation sang, harmoniously, "I am Leaning on Jesus."

Rev. G. W. Todd, the church pastor, in fitting words, made the entire delegation welcome.

The response to the address of welcome was intelligently and timely made by the Rev. M. L. Dawson, pastor of the Wakefield Baptist Church.

The Committee on Hours of Meeting having returned, asked for the floor and submitted its report. (See report.) Adopted.

The hour having arrived for the annual address of the Moderator, the Rev. M. W. Williams, the vice-moderator, Rev. B. F.

Jordan, was called to the chair. Afterwards he presented the Moderator to the audience to make his annual address. The message was strong, advisable and baptistic in every particular.

A motion prevailed that a committee on the Moderator's address be named. (See committee list.)

The following committees were then appointed: Finance, Credentials, Reception of New Churches, Resolutions, Obituary, Place of Next Meeting, and Moderator's Address.

Bros. L. E. Johnson and W. B. S. Harris then came forward and asked for a collection, which amounted to the sum of \$7.00.

Benediction by Dr. J. H. Moore.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon session commenced at 2 o'clock, conducted by Dr. L. T. Christmas and the Rev. W. T. Farror. Song, "Must Jesus Bear the Cross Alone" was lined by Brother Farror (found as No. 562 in the Baptist Hymn Book). Romans, the twelfth chapter, was read as a Scripture lesson by Brother Farror. A fervent prayer was offered by Brother Christmas.

Following the singing of song, "Blest Be the Tie that Binds," etc., by the congregation, Dr. J. H. Moore, State Secretary of Missions, was introduced by the Moderator to the audience. Dr. Moore used as a theme, "The Church and Her Mission." The church was established on the principles embodied in the words of the Master, "On this rock I will build my church." As outlined by Dr. Moore, the church is a body of baptized believers, whose duty it is to save souls and lead them into service for the Master. "Soul-saving once a year is not enough," said the man of God. "Every Sunday at each service of the church we should make an earnest effort to bring souls to the Lord." Having named and spoken briefly on the two ordinances of the church, Baptism and the Lord's Supper, the speaker outlined the three-fold office of the pastor, namely: (1) Pastor when he is preaching, (2) elder when he is duly honored, (3) bishop when he is overseeing the flock. Drawing near the close, the deacon was not left unmentioned. "The deacons are servants for the church and not bosses," sounded the speaker. "They are

to cooperate with the pastor in helping to put forward God's program."

The speaker having closed his comprehensive message and very impressive address, the congregation very touchingly sang, "Now Wash Me and I Shall be Whiter Than Snow."

Miss Captola Wilson, representing the Woman's Home and Foreign Mission Convention of North Carolina, was introduced to the audience and made some encouraging and timely remarks.

The joint session of the Association and the Woman's Auxiliary was then begun, with Mrs. B. E. Barrett, the Auxiliary's President, presiding. The interest of the Association proper was swung, for an hour and fifteen minutes, to the gratifying and inspirational program of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Reëntering the chair, the Moderator presented Rev. G. A. Mial, of Raleigh, N. C., to speak in behalf of the *Union Reformer*. Brother Mial made a strong appeal to his hearers, calling upon them to subscribe to the paper, read, thereby becoming better informed. Following some announcements, Brother Mial pronounced the benediction.

THURSDAY MORNING SESSION

On Thursday morning, August 18, 1927, between the hours of 10 and 10:30 o'clock, an inspirational praise service was conducted by Revs. O. G. Watkins and G. A. Mial. Song, "Down at the Cross," was led by Brother Mial. Subsequently Rev. Watkins read the fifty-first Psalm, and then offered prayer.

A spiritual was sung by the audience.

The Foreign Mission field was discussed by Rev. E. Wimberly. The speaker urged the people to strongly support the forty or more workers on the foreign field under the Baptist flag for Christ. Dr. N. F. Roberts also made some helpful remarks on the subject. "Know the missionaries, their names, aims, purposes, and needs," declared Dr. Roberts. In closing his remarks the speaker paid high tribute of praise to the work done by the Woman's Auxiliary in bringing in so many beautiful and well prepared garments for the purpose of sending them to the children on the foreign field.

Revs. M. L. Dawson and J. C. Jeffries made some remarks.

Dr. A. W. Pegues, Dean of the Divinity School, Shaw University, Raleigh, was then presented to the house and spoke authentically on Christian Education. In part the speaker said, "Christian Education is putting into the heart the principles of Jesus. Religion comes by training. When the germ of righteousness is once planted into the heart we must nurse it and train it in the way that it must go." Special emphasis was placed on the Home and Sunday school. "The pastor's business is to inspire the young people, give the vision so that they will readily lay hold on the teachings of Jesus Christ." At the close of the able message, the congregation, large as it was, joined in singing, "Draw Me Nearer, Blessed Lord."

Dr. S. L. McDowell, pastor of the White Rock Baptist Church, Durham, N. C., came to the floor and spoke on the subject, "The Sunday school and those responsible for its success." Among the many striking and noteworthy expressions made by the speaker, stress was placed on the following points: Team-work in the Sunday school, Community Interest, and Evangelism. Long live Dr. McDowell.

An offering was taken by the ushers to the amount of \$18.65.

The following named persons were introduced to the house as visitors: Mr. P. A. Richardson, Grand Endowment Secretary of the Order of Odd Fellows, Nashville, N. C.; Mr. Berry O'Kelly, Method, N. C.; Rev. Davis, Rev. H. G. Pope, Mr. J. T. Tonny, Spring Hope undertaker, and Revs. S. Davis, E. M. Saunders and G. H. Peace. Some short and suitable remarks were made by the visitors.

Preceding the benediction by Rev. L. A. Brooks, Rev. S. A. Todd pledged himself to do more work in bringing the young people into the Christian church for service.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

Praise service began at 2 o'clock, conducted by Revs. Phil Hedgepeth and A. M. Wiggins. After singing, "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name," lined by Brother Wiggins, seven verses of the seventh chapter of Joshua were read for a Scripture lesson by Brother Hedgepeth. He then led in prayer.

The Associational Treasurer, Dr. A. W. Pegues, submitted his report. (See report.) Adopted. Seemingly the various committees were then ready to submit reports, and so the following reported: Committee on Officers, Committee on Temperance, Committee on Resolutions, Committee on Moderator's Address, and the committees on Finance and Obituary.

The Moderator ruled that hereafter only those ministers and deacons who die being members of churches belonging to the Association at the time of their death shall be mentioned by the Committee on Obituary. The Committee on Place of Next Meeting submitted its report. (See reports.) All reports were ordered adopted.

The Woman's Auxiliary Committee came forward and made an excellent report, and expressed a willingness to continue to enhance the value of the Association. (See Finance Committee's report for money turned in.) Report adopted.

Rev. J. H. Williamson, of Louisburg, South Main Street Baptist Church, was here entered into the membership roll of

the Association by the presentation of the requirements of the body.

A letter was read by the clerk from Rev. John Ivey, Neuse, N. C., asking the brethren for aid. An offering of \$5.16 was taken for Brother Ivey and forwarded to him through the treasurer.

"Blest Be the Tie" was sung.

Rev. M. C. Ransom, pastor of the Olive Branch Church, Wake Forest, N. C., pronounced the benediction.

THE EXTRA SESSION

An informal, inspirational morning exercise of the extra session of the Wake Association was held in the Martin Street Baptist Church, Raleigh, N. C., Sunday, March 20, 1927. Service began at 10 o'clock, conducted by Revs. J. F. Haywood, and O. L. Pair. Following a Scriptural lesson, thirteen verses of the twelfth chapter of First Corinthians which was read by Brother Haywood, Rev. A. A. Morrissey offered prayer.

The Moderator made some remarks urging the brethren to strongly cooperate in putting forward the Master's work.

Echoes from the field were made by the following persons: Revs. A. A. Morrissey, H. H. Person, and Rev. G. A. Mial.

Mrs. B. E. Barrett, President of the Woman's Auxiliary, made some timely remarks along the line of Christian living.

Dr. J. H. Moore, the speaker on the program, ascended the rostrum, accompanied by Dr. A. W. Pegues. Subsequently the church choir rendered a beautiful selection, "Jesus Saves." Dr. Pegues, in able words, introduced the speaker, pointing to his ability and fitness by reason of his experience as pastor of some of the largest churches in the country. Dr. Moore chose for a text Psalm 24:1, "The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof." Subject, "Christian Stewardship." The message was arousing, condemning sin, and powerful enough to move the will to action.

Rev. John Dooze led in prayer at the close of the able message.

An offering of \$41.44 was taken by Rev. E. Wimberly.

Miss M. A. Burwell made an announcement of the Woman's Convention, following which the Committee on Finance was named as follows: Revs. A. A. Morrissey, J. F. Haywood, H. B. Cook, Bros. A. C. Parrish, Guyon Perry.

The roll of churches was called; response given.

Benediction by Rev. E. W. Moragne.

AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon service of the extra session was held in the auditorium of the First Baptist Church, Raleigh, N. C. Following the splendid praise service, led by Bros. M. L. Dawson and A. Horton, Dr. J. H. Moore presented "The Claims of Shaw University on Raleigh and Wake County" in well chosen and effective words.

The needs of Shaw University were spoken of and outlined by Dean W. S. Turner. In part he set forth the following: (1) Strength of teaching staff, (2) buildings more modern and comfortable, (3) the support of her Alumni, (4) the support of the Baptist constituency. "Our churches need the contribution of Shaw, and Shaw needs the contribution of the churches." (5) Shaw needs the support of the public at large.

Dr. J. L. Peacock, the President of Shaw, also made fitting remarks for the occasion. He stressed one ever memorable thing, among many others, "Christian teachers are the only desired and eligible persons to become instructors at Shaw University."

Rev. O. S. Bullock, D.D., and Dr. J. B. Davis, M.D., called for an offering, which amounted to the sum of \$101.69 for Shaw.

Roll call of churches was then conducted by the clerk. Responses were made by the different delegates.

Dr. Benjamin Brawley, of Shaw, came to the floor and made a brief yet very encouraging address.

The Shaw quartette rendered an acceptable selection.

Dr. A. W. Pegues pronounced the benediction.

The Ministerial Union is an Auxiliary of the Wake Baptist Association.
