PROCEEDINGS.

LaGrange, Lenoir County, N. C.
October 10th, 1929. . .

At 10 A' M. the Bear Creek Missionary Baptist Association met in its forty-seventh annual session with Ebenezer Baptist Church, Rev. A. A. Smith, Moderator, presiding.

Devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. H. B Joyner and Bro. Henry Draughn. Rev. Joyner lined hymn No. 375. Bro. Draughn read 1st King 17th 1 to 16. Prayer by Rev. Joyner. The Rev. offered thanks for past blessings and plead for the presence of the Holy Spirit. He prayed that harmony and peace would prevail. Second selection, "I am thinking today of that beautiful land." Rev. A. A. Smith, the Moderator, in a few but timely remarks declared the Association open and ready for the transaction of its business. The pastor of the Church, Rev. R. W. Prof. Smith, Principal of the Graded School, now gave us some very timely and encouraging remarks. The Prof. further assured us that the children and parents welcomed us.

Rev. U. G. Moye in a very timely manner accepted the welcome.

Rev. O. M. James and Rev. U. G. Moye lifted a collection amounting to \$12.50.

Rev. C. C. Crawford now sang, "I want to be a Christian in my heart."

Rev. C. C. Somerville was introduced to preach the Missionary sermon of the Association, associated by Rev. C. C. Crawford who further favored

us with one of his spirituals.

Rev. Somerville after a few preliminaries reviewing some of our past hospitalities selected for a text 2nd Peter 4th chapter 13th verse. Discussed under the subject: The Come Back Man. Dr. Somerville held us spell bound with his eloquence. Didn't our hearts burn while he talked with us by the way.

A further collection was raised for the church amounting to \$5-00.

Homes were assigned. We adjourned by benediction.

FRIDAY MORNING SESSION.

Rev. A. A. Smith in a very timely way introduced Dr. Cartwright to the Association. The Doctor gave us a splendid address. He urged that we as Baptists co-operate, come together, that we may better understand ourselves.

He urged us to come to Charlotte to the Baptist State Convention beginning October 29. The Doctor's address was inspiring and helpful.

Rev. G. A. Mial sang, "Since Jesus came in my heart."

The Moderator commented on the address and urged that we attend the Baptist Convention.

Rev. C. C. Somerville and Rev. G. A. Mials further spoke on the President's address.

Mrs. T. T. Williams and Mrs. M. M. Kornegay were asked to lift a collection. After some remarks by Mrs. Kornegay, County Supervisor of Wayne County, urging full school attendance and co-operation on the part of parents and ministers.

Amount collected \$5.35.

We adjourned for dinner.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION.

Rev. C. C. Gillette and Rev. E. D. Joyner conducted the praise services. Rev. Gillette led with a song and read the 15th chapter of the Psalm. Prayer by Rev. Joyner. The Reverend plead for mercy and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Second selection 375.

Bro. Starr Hicks, one of the leading Laymen of the F. W. Baptist Church was introduced and made some very timely and helpful remarks.

Bro. H. C. Carroll reported \$9.25 for the Sunday School Convention. The same was turned over to Bro. B. B. Best, Treasurer of the Convention.

The Committee on New Churches made their report.

CONSTITUTION OF THE BEAR CREEK MISSIONARY BAPTIST
ASSOCIATION.

Article 1. This body shall be known as the Bear Creek Missionary Baptist Association.

Art. 2. The object of the Association shall be to promote Christ's Kingdom among men, and the means of accomplishing this shall be in strict conformity to the New Testament. Pastors should encourage Christian Education to assist in the Home and Foreign Missions and to do all in their power for the support of an active prayer meeting and Sunday school in all churches and in every way possible strive to conform to the teaching of the word of God.

Art. 3. This Association shall be composed of Messengers, Pastors and Deacons chosen by the churches they represent. Each church is entitled to three delegates who shall be in good standing in the churches they represent. All ordained ministers belonging to this Association shall pay \$2.00 annually; Licentiate Ministers \$1.00 annually; Ordained Deacons 50 cents annually, to maintain their membership. Ministers who are not members of this Association may become members by bringing a letter of recommendation from the Association from whence they came and the payment of \$2 down and \$2.00 annually thereafter; said monies to maintain a superannuated fund. All disabled ministers and deacons shall be paid annually.

Art. 4. The delegates from each church shall present a letter certifying their appointments, and also stating the condition of their church.

Art. 5. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, a Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer, and an Executive Board of seven members, and shall continue in office until their successors are elected.

Art. 6. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside during the deliberation of this body; in observance of the Constitution preserve order, decide all questions, give his opinion concerning any subject under discussion, after those wishing to speak shall have spoken, or when called upon to give the casting vote in case of a tie.

Art. 7. It shall be the duty of the Assistant Moderator to assume the duties of the Moderator in his absence.

Art. 8. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to record the proceedings of each annual session. The Clerk, Corresponding Secretary and Moderator to compose the printing committee and to superintend the printing of the Minutes and distribute them among the churches in ninety days.

Art. 9. It shall be the duty of the Corresponding Secretary to keep correspondence with the various bodies representing the object of the Association, and shall keep a faithful register of all ordained ministers and historical events of the Association, and make report to each annual session, and assist the Clerk.

Art. 10. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds sent up from the churches or collected during the session of this body and disburse the same as ordered by the Association, when drawn by the Clerk and signed by the Moderator. He shall also make to the Association an annual report of the condition of the treasury. He shall give good security.

Art. 11. The Executive Board may meet when it is necessary and do business for the Association of any of its churches, and the church or Association calling for the Board shall defray the expenses of the Board and in no wise attempt to interfere with the business of any church unless called for by the church.

Art. 12. Any church desiring to connect herself with this body shall present a petition at an annual session, through a delegate appointed for that

purpose and if received the presiding officer shall extend the right hand of fellowship.

Art. 13. This Association shall not maintain fellowship with any of the churches that neglect to preserve Gospel order. Churches may continue their fellowship by contributing twenty-five (25c.) cents per member as representative fee in the Association.

Art. 14. The Association may invite brethren to seats, and extend to them all the privileges of this body, except that of voting.

Art. 15. This body shall hold its session annually and at such time and place as it may select.

Art. 16. By appointment of the Association there shall be preached at each annual session an Introductory, Missionary, and Doctrinal sermon during the session, directed by the Chair.

Art. 17. Messengers to the Association shall bring 25 cents for Educational purposes.

Art. 18. The Association will not recognize the ordination of any minister in its bounds unless done by the Association while in session or the Executive Board.

Art. 19. This Constitution may be amended at any annual session by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.

Art. 20. It shall be the duty of the Trustees of the Association and Directory Board of the Sunday School Convention to have full control of the legal business of the Association coming under their supervision.

Section 2. The Board of Trustees shall consist of seven members whose term of office shall be fixed by the Association and they shall meet as often as they find it necessary.

AMENDMENT.

All monies raised during the year between the sittings of the Association by the Sunday School Convention, Home Mission Convention, Eastern and Western Unions, and from various sources, be represented at the Association and turned in to Associational Treasurer.

Art. 21. That there be an amendment to the effect that all churches be urged to give each fifth Sunday in the interest of the Unions.

Annual fee of Deacons shall be 20 cents quarterly to the Union.

RULES OF ORDER.

1. Each session of this Association shall be opened with religious exercises, to be conducted by the Moderator, or such other person as he may designate.

2. At each daily session the names of delegates, shall be called and the proceedings of the previous session read before entering upon the business of the day-

3. The members shall exhibit towards the officers and each other that courtesy which belongs to Christians.

4. No member shall speak more than twice on the same subject, nor longer than five minutes at a time, without permission from the body-

5. Any member desiring to speak shall arise and address the Moderator.

6. All motions which meet a second shall be definitely stated by the Moderator before being discussed.

7. When a subject is under discussion no motion or proposition shall be in order except to adjourn, to lay on the table, to amend or postpone indefinitely.

8. After a vote is decided, any member having voted in the majority may move to reconsider.

9. The Association shall reserve the right to determine what questions shall be admitted to its consideration-

10. No member shall present himself during the session without permission from the Moderator.

11. These rules may be amended at any regular session by a majority of the members present.
