#### COURSE OF STUDY FOR THOSE HAVING THE MINISTRY IN VIEW

Reading, writing, arithmetic, United States history, general history, geography, and Scripture geography, theology, systematic theology (Mullins), The Church (Harvey), Deaconship (Howell), Church Discipline (Hiscox), Homiletics (Broadus), History of the Baptist Denomination.

The course of study was adopted unanimously by the Association, and the churches are requested to license no person who cannot pass a creditable examination on reading, writing, the fundamental principles of arithmetic, grammar and geography, and to ordain no person who has not been before the Board of Examiners and recommended by them for ordination.

### CONSTITUTION

Article I. This body shall be known as the "Wake Baptist Association."

Art. II. The object of this Association shall be the promotion of Christ's Kingdom among men, and the means of accomplishing this shall be in strict conformity with the New Testament.

Art. III. This Association shall be composed of delegates chosen by the churches connected with it, each church being entitled to at least one delegate, and the one delegate for each hundred members or fraction thereof. Ministers who are members of the churches connected with this body shall be considered members of the Association *ex officio*, and ministers who are not in charge or connected with churches within the bounds of this Association, who present testimonials of good standing in the Baptist denomination, may become members of this Association by payment of \$1.00 annually. **Provided**, ministers who aided in the organization of this Association shall be considered members so long as they are in good standing in the Baptist denomination; also any layman in good standing in the Baptist church may become an annual member by the payment of \$1.00.

Art. IV. The delegates from each church shall bear a letter certifying their appointment, giving an account of the condition of the church, and a statement of all funds contributed for benevolent purposes during the year.

Art. V. The officers of this body shall be a Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, Auditor and a Statistician, whose duties shall be such as are generally performed by such officers. In addition there shall be appointed a Home Mission Board, Foreign Mission Board, Educational Board, Sunday School Board, and an Executive Board, which latter shall have charge of the work of the Association during the interim of its annual session, and three members of the Executive Board shall constitute a quorum, and the officers of the body shall be *ex officio* members. The other boards shall have supervision of the work of the Association along their several lines, subject to the Executive Board and the Association, and shall so organize the territory of the Association as to accomplish the best results, but not contrary to the Executive Board of the Association.

Art. VI. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside during the deliberations of the body, to enforce an observance of the Constitution, preserve the decorum, appoint committees, decide all questions of order, give his opinion concerning any subject under discussion after others have spoken or when called upon, and give the casting vote if a tie.

Art. VII. It shall be the duty of the clerk to report the proceedings of each annual session and superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes among the churches.

Art. VIII. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds sent up by the churches or collected during the session of this body, and disburse the same for the purpose for which they were sent or collected. He shall not pay any order on the Treasurer except it is signed by the Moderator and the Clerk of the Association subject to the provisions in the By-Laws.

Art. IX. Any church desiring to become a member of this body shall present her petition at an annual session of the Association through delegates appointed for that purpose, and if the Association shall consent to receive her the Moderator shall extend to the delegate the right hand of fellowship.

Art. X. This Association shall not maintain fellowship with any church that does not preserve Gospel order.

Art. XI. This Association may invite visiting brethren to seats and extend to them all privileges of the body save that of voting. The Association shall meet on Wednesday before the third Sabbath in August at such place as the Association may select.

Art. XII. All ministers composing the Association shall hold three ministerial meetings a year in such places as the brethren may designate.

Art. XIII. We will receive no ministers into this Association but those who have a good moral character.

Art. XIV. Any Baptist Sunday School or Missionary Society within the bounds of this Association may become a member of this Association by sending voluntary contributions. Each shall be entitled to one delegate.

Art. XV. We will withdraw the right hand of fellowship from every minister who walks disorderly and contrary to the Gospel rule.

Art. XVI. Each church connected with this Association can continue its membership by supporting this Constitution.

Art. XVII. By appointment of the Association there shall be preached during each session an introductory sermon.

Art. XVIII. This Constitution may be amended at any annual session by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.



**BY-LAWS**

Section 1. Schools, societies and individuals shall be acknowledged in the Minutes of the Association.

Sec. 2. Before the final adjournment of the Association all the funds, notes, etc., shall be counted by the Finance Committee and Treasurer. The Treasurer shall give the Finance Committee a receipt for the amount placed in his hands.

Sec. 3. The Treasurer shall pay out no money except on order written by the Clerk and signed by the Moderator.

Sec. 4. After the expenses of the Association shall have been paid the remaining Associational funds shall be applied to such purposes as the Association may direct. The Executive Board shall execute plans adopted by the Association.

Sec. 5. The Auditor shall audit the accounts of the Treasurer and make annual reports to the Association.

Sec. 6. The duties of the Boards provided for in the Constitution shall be such as are usually performed by such boards in other similar bodies.

## MODERATOR'S RECOMMENDATIONS

1. That each church of the Association have a Bible School of at least one week's length, presided over by such persons as the church may appoint, at the expense of the church.

2. That a Training Class be established for the instruction of church officers, to meet twice per year, to drill them in church duties, at the cost of those churches who institute the work.

3. That the standard be \$.60 per member per year for Missions and Christian Education.

4. That we endorse and support the President of Shaw, Dr. Wm. Stuart Nelson, in the work of the school.

5. That each minister pay one dollar per year for the support of our older ministers.

6. That the Teacher Training Course be adopted and put in vogue in our churches.

## PROCEEDINGS

The Sixty-Sixth Annual Session of the Wake Baptist Association met with the Felts Chapel Baptist Church, near Youngsville, N. C., August 17, 1932, at 10:00 o'clock a.m., with Rev. M. W. Williams, Moderator, presiding.

An impressive praise service was conducted by Rev. A. A. Morrissey and Bro. Robert Jones. Brother Jones read a part of the 13th chapter of I. Cor. following the singing of song No. 674 in the Baptist Hymn Book, lined by Rev. Morrissey. Then Brother Morrissey offered prayer.

The church pastor, Rev. P. H. Hedgepeth, was presented by the Moderator to give the Welcome Address to the delegates.

Dr. Geo. W. Moore, of Raleigh, gave the response in fitting words.

Following the naming of the Committee on Enrollment (See Com.), echoes from the field were heard from the following brethren representing their church: O. V. Carpenter, Friendship Chapel; B. Morgan, New Bethel; R. Haskin, First Baptist, Wilson; A. J. Hawkins, New Liberty; H. Cook, Felts Chapel; J. A. Perry, Riley Hill; J. D. Fryson, Mt. Zion, Raleigh; C. L. Perry, Jones Hill; E. W. Crudup, First Baptist, Raleigh; A. Hawkins, South Main St., Louisburg; C. V. King, Baptist Grove, J. H. Cook, First Baptist, Franklinton; Prof. H. Price, Martin Street, Raleigh; H. R. Snow, Springfield; D. Nicholson, Gethsemane; O. L. Bridges, Elevation; and Sister Allen, of White Oak. All reports gave testimony of some progress in Kingdom advancement through the church herein named.

Rev. B. F. Jordan, pastor First Baptist Church, Wilson, N. C., then ascended the rostrum to preach the Annual Sermon, accompanied by Dr. O. S. Bullock and Rev. D. P. Lewis.

The theme of Brother Jordan's message was, "God, the Refuge of His People," based on Psalms 46:1.

Subsequent the able message, song, "Amazing Grace" was sung by the congregation.

The Committees on Hours of Meeting and Finance, respectively, were appointed. (See Committee.)

An offering of \$6.05 was taken by Dr. J. B. Davis and Rev. Wm. Smith.

The report of the Committee on Hours of Meeting was then made. (See report.) Adopted.

The following visitors were then introduced to the House: Rev. Murphy, pastor First Baptist Church, Louisburg; Mrs. Geo. S. Stokes, Mrs. M. W. Williams, and Mrs. James Clark, of State Normal School, Elizabeth City, N. C.

### WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

Following an inspirational song service conducted by Rev. W. A. Perry and C. D. Jones, echoes from the field were continued and the following named persons appeared for their church: S. H. High, Wakefield; B. Hinton, Good Hope; Joseph Ray, New Providence; G. Gill, Wake Chapel; R. B. Mangum, Woodland Chapel; Rev. A. Horton, Mt. Pleasant (Wake); J. W. Crudup, Gethsemane; Irving Pulley, White Oak; Rev. W. C. Somerville, pastor, Wakefield; and Rev. C. D. Jones, St. Matthews.

“I Am Dwelling In Beulah Land,” was sung, led by Rev. P. H. Hedgepeth, following which the Moderator gave his annual message while Rev. B. F. Jordan, Vice-Moderator, presided. “What Hath God Wrought” was the theme of the message. Comprehensive and practical was the message of the Moderator.

Subsequent some favorable comment on the message by Drs. O. S. Bullock and G. W. Moore, of Raleigh, a Committee on Moderator’s Address was named. (See Committee.)

“Church Ordinances, Their Significance and Importance” was discussed in an able way by Rev. W. C. Somerville. Rev. H. D. Eaton, Dr. G. W. Moore and Rev. C. F. Pope made some remarks on the subject.

Motion prevailed that the topic, “The Relation of Baptist Organizations,” be discussed Thursday a.m. at 10:30 o’clock.

After some announcements, Rev. P. H. Hedgepeth pronounced the benediction.

## WEDNESDAY EVENING SESSION

Beginning at 7:30 o'clock an interesting program of one hour length, was rendered by the Woman's Auxiliary of the Association. Long live the Auxiliary.

Rev. T. J. Foster then conducted a short praise service, read for a lesson a part of II Tim. 1 chapter; following which, Bro. Luke Jones offered prayer.

Rev. J. H. Clanton was presented to preach the Doctrinal Sermon, by Rev. W. C. Somerville, the presiding officer for the evening. The text of the message was found II Tim. 1:12.

The message of the speaker was effectively delivered to a large audience.

Mrs. Finch sang "There Is a Happy Land Beyond," and an offering of \$2.25 was taken.

Mrs. J. H. Clanton was introduced to the audience and made some remarks.

THURSDAY MORNING SESSION

Beginning at 10:00 o'clock Bros. E. L. Crudup and T. B. Smith conducted an impressive song service. Thirteen verses of Matt. 5th chapter were read by Brother Smith, and Brother Luke Jones offered prayer.

Brothers Chas. Young, of Wake Chapel; and Smith, of Elevation, spoke in the interest of their churches to the body.

"What Youth Expects of the Church" was ably discussed by Miss Ann Bass, a recent graduate of Shaw University. Among other things Miss Bass stressed (1) "Adequate instruction, (2) Activity and service, and (3) Opportunity to participate in its rights and activities."

Rev. W. C. Somerville also set forth, on the subject, among other things, (1) "Education, (2) Self-Expression, (3) The proper example."

On motion made by Rev. C. H. Williamson the paper outlined by Miss Bass was voted to go into the minutes.

Our Relation to Baptist Organizations (a) The minister's was discussed by Rev. C. C. Jones. (b) "The minister of the church should know of the workings of the State Convention and present himself at each meeting and work for the cause," averred the speaker.

The message was timely and ably delivered.

A Committee on Publication was named. (See Committee.)

The Deacon's Relations were set forth by Dr. Geo. W. Moore. "The deacon should open the service when the pastor is absent," declared Dr. Moore.

After singing "More Like Jesus," Rev. D. P. Lewis spoke on the general church member's relation. "The member should follow the leader, study the church program, the Association and general Convention."

"Support the church financially and spiritually." The message was strong and thoughtful.

"Everybody Will Be Happy Over There," was sung by Mrs. Finch.

Mrs. Cora Pair Thomas, returned missionary from Africa, then came to the floor and made a strong appeal for the work of Missions, relating some of her experiences on the Mission Field.

Three classes of people were named by Mrs. Thomas, (1) Those who are partly trained by attending schools, such as are there (2) Those who are desirous to become Christians, and (3) Those who know nothing about God.

"Take the Name of Jesus With You" was sung, then the report of the Foreign Mission Board was made by Rev. D. P. Lewis, and an offering taken for Missions amounting to \$9.47.

Rev. D. P. Lewis, Rev. W. C. Somerville, and Rev. M. W. Williams, each paid \$1.00 in the offering. Rev. P. H. Hedgepeth, 50c; Rev. Wm. Smith, 25c, while many others gave smaller sums of money.

## THURSDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

Dr. Geo. W. Moore conducted a touching song service and Rev. Chas. A. Marriott read the 24th Psalm as a scripture lesson, then offered prayer.

The Treasurer, Rev. C. C. Clark, made his report. (See report.) Adopted.

A report on Education was given. (See report.) Adopted.

The following named committees then made their reports: Officers, Temperance, Place of Next Meeting. (See reports.)

The report of the Committee on Place recommended "Olive Branch" Church, Wake Forest, N. C., as the next meeting place of the Annual Session. A letter was presented to the House from Mt. Bright Church, Hillsboro, N. C., asking for the session. Then a standing vote was taken on the two named places. For Hillsboro, the number was 25. For "Olive Branch," 31. Olive Branch was declared as the place of next meeting.

(1) The Home, (2) Sunday School, (3) A strong institution to train youth.

The message was powerfully delivered and joyfully received by all present.

"A Charge to Keep I Have," was sung by the congregation.

The Woman's Auxiliary made its report of \$44.00 and many garments for the Mission Field. "Many young people have come into the Auxiliary," declared Mrs. N. A. Hunter.

The report was adopted with many thanks to the faithful women.

The Committee on Finance made its report and the Committee on Moderator's Address. (See reports.) Adopted.

A closing song, "Till We Meet at Jesus' Feet," was sung and Rev. P. H. Hedgepeth pronounced the benediction.

### THE EXTRA SESSION

The Extra Session of the Wake Baptist Association met with the Tupper Memorial Baptist Church, Raleigh, N. C., Sunday, March 20, 1932, at 10:30 a.m.

Moderator Williams called the House to order and Bros. C. A. Marriott and C. C. Jones conducted devotionals with the church choir rendering music.

Following some congratulatory remarks by the Moderator and thanking God for His care and keeping power, Mrs. B. E. Barrett, President of the Woman's Auxiliary, urged the delegations to give more liberally to Missions and thus enrich the Kingdom of God.

Mrs. M. N. Perry declared, the purpose of the Auxiliary is "to make soldiers for Christ."

Many of them after going to their mission fields and seeing the great needs facing them from day to day have not only given their all but lives. Mrs. Cora Pair Thomas is in the State now urging the Baptists to rally to the support of our mission station in Liberia.

In view of the many urgent and pathetic appeals for help from all of the foreign fields and especially from Africa: We recommend the following:

1. That the Association record its feeling that the preaching of the Gospel to all the world should be the primary emphasis of the church and that this be kept constantly in mind, especially during these days when decreasing appropriations are necessitating the radical curtailment of the Foreign Mission work.

2. That churches, societies, and individuals assume, wherever possible definite responsibility for definite parts of the Foreign Mission work.

3. That ministers and other church leaders be encouraged to use their facilities and influence, in impressing Foreign Mission work upon their people.

4. That all Sunday Schools be urged this year to assume some part of the Foreign Mission work as their specific responsibility.
