CONSTITUTION

Article 1. This Association shall be known as the Yadkin Philadelphia Missionary Baptist Association of N. C.

Art. 2. This Association shall be composed of of regular Baptist churches, ministers and delegates in good standing

and in full practice of the doctrines and faith.

Art. 3 The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, vice moderator, secretary, cor. sec., treasurer, auditor and executive board. Their duties respectively shall be such as are commonly exercised by these officers until their successors are chosen.

Art. 4, The object of this Association shall be to build up Baptist churches in its bounds, foster the educational and spiritual work of its members and cooperate with the State Convention in doing home mission work and thus

help take the world for Christ.

Art. 5. This Association shall meet annually and shall be composed of not more than 3 delegates from each church with a letter containing 10c per capita of its membership and giving the condition of its membership of the church. The said meeting shall convene on Thursday at 11 a.m. before the 2nd Sunday in Oct. with an annual sermon, and continue until the business of the Association is completed.

Art. 6. All the visiting ministers and corresponding delegates who are in good standing in their churches shall be

Art. 7. The treasurer must give bond for the amount of

money and valuable papers in his hands.

Art. 8. This Association will give any minister of the Association \$10,00 for each six weeks of school to be paid after he enters shool.

Art, 9. Each pastor will pay \$1,00 for education and \$1.00

for foreign missions.

Art. 10. Each preacher that is not pastoring will pay 50c. for education and 50c for foreign missions.

CONTITUTION

Article 1. The name of this body shall be the Yadkin Philadelphia Missionary Baptist S S Convention. It shall be composed of all ministers of the Association and the Supt. of the S. S. Not more than three delegates from each church.

Article 2. The object of this convention shall be to establish and improve the \$ \$ convention and all the churches throughout the bounds of this Association and to awaken the general instruction in the religious and literary training of the young men and women, and to co-operate with the State S S convention in doing edu-

cational and missionary work,

Article 3. Officers of this convention shall be a president, vice president, rec. sec., cor. sec., treasurer, auditor and board of managers. No one shall be an officer of this convention unless he is a member in good standing in some missionary Baptist church in the field. No person shall be sent as a delegate to this convention who is not a member of a missionary Baptist S S in the field.

Art. 4. This convention shall meet on Friday before the 4th Sunday in July in each year at such place as may be agreed upon.

Art. 5. Each school belonging to this convention shall collect and send annually at each sitting 10c. per scholar. New schools may be represented upon the same terms.

Art. 6. This constitution may be altered or amended by a vote of two-thirds of the members present at any annual

meeting,

Art. 7. No member or members of this convention shall be allowed to stand around on the church yard during the service hour except he or she have been excused. If they do, they shall pay a fine of 10c,

Art, 8. We recommend that the letters of the SS be read before the open house, and be received and approved

with the full vote of house.
