8. Appointed a Committee on Finance as follows: Bros. J. H. Eldreth, T. E. Hartsog, J. M. Weaver.
9. Appointed a Committee on Arrangements as following: Elders Ed Davis, W. C. Carter, Bros. J. F. Hartsog, G. E. Kilby, P. C. Dixon, with moderator and clerk. Correspondents and visitors invited to sit with them.
10. Appointed a Committee to Appoint Correspondents to Sister Associations as follows: Bros. A. C. Sheets, Ben F. Roten, and F. O. Thompson.
11. For Committee on Arrangements to set at Elder Ed Davis's.
12. Adjourned until tomorrow morning at 10 o'closk.

14. That Clerk transcribe the Constitution and Rules of Decorum in new Association Book.
15. That we appoint Clerk as Treasurer and to superintend the printing of the minutes. Have 1,000 copies printed and distributed as usual.
16. Minutes read and received.
17. Resolved that we return thanks to God for his mercies, and to the bretheren and sisters and kind friends for their kind hospitality to us during this session; We now adjourn to the time and place of our next meeting.
