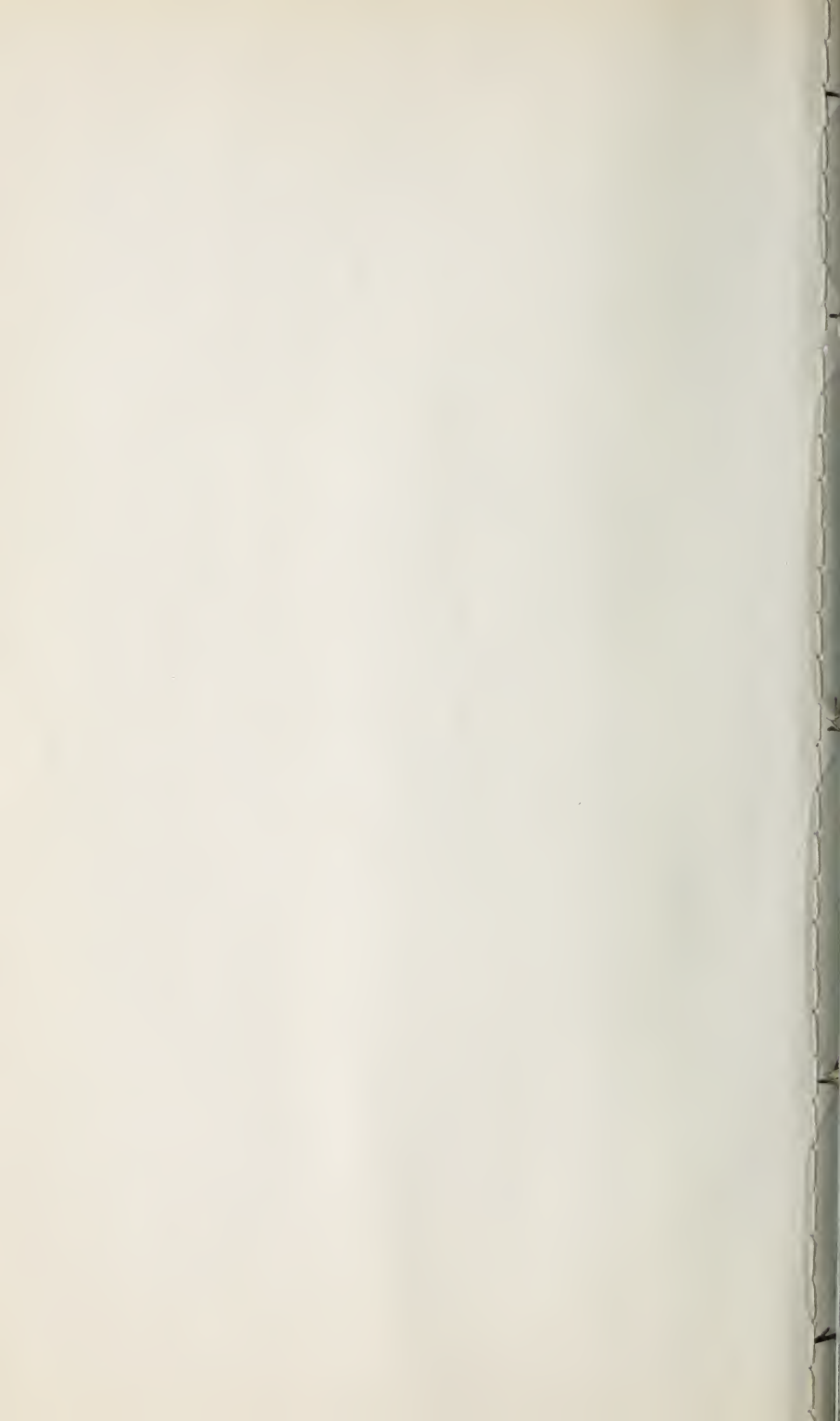

ARTICLES OF FAITH

We believe in the Being of God Almighty, eternal unchangeable, of infinite wisdom, power, justice, holiness, goodness, mercy and truth; and the God has revealed Himself in His word under the characters of The Father, Son and Holy Ghost.

We believe that Almighty God has made known His mind and will to the children of men in His Word; which Word we believe to be of Divine Authority and contains all things necessary to be known for the salvation of men and women. The same is comprehended as contained in The Books of the Old and New Testament as are commonly received.

We believe that God, before the Foundation of the World for a purpose of His own glory did elect a certain number of men and angels to eternal life, and that this election is particularly eternal and unconditional on the part of the creature.

We believe that Adam fell from this state of rectitude and he involved himself and all his natural offsprings in the state of death; and for that original transgression, we all are both Filthy and Guilty in the sight of a Holy God.

We also believe that it is utterly out of the power of man, as fallen creatures, to keep the Law of God perfectly and repent of their sins, truly as we believe in Christ, except that man be drawn by the Holy Spirit.

We believe in God's own appointed time and way by means which He has ordained. The elect shall be called justified, pardoned and sanctified; and that it is impossible that we can utterly refuse the call, but shall be made willing by divine grace to receive the offers of mercy.

We believe that Justification in the sight of God is only by the imputed Righteousness of Jesus Christ; received and applied by Faith Alone.

We believe in like manner, that God's elect shall not only be called and justified, but that they shall be converted, born again and changed by the effectual working of God's Holy Spirit.

We believe that such as are converted, justified and called by His Grace shall persevere in Holiness and never fall finally away.

We believe it to be a duty incumbent on all God's people to work religiously in God's work, not in the old covert way of seeking life and favor of the Lord by it, but only as a duty from a principle of Love.

We believe Baptism and the Lord's Supper are Gospel ordinances both belonging to the True Believers; and that persons who were sprinkled or dipped while in unbelief were not regularly baptised according to God's word, and that such ought to be baptised after they are savingly converted into the faith of Christ.

We believe that every church is independent in matters of discipline; and that associations, councils and conferences of several minis-

ters of churches are not to impose on the churches the keeping or maintaining of any principle or practice contrary to the church's judgment.

We believe in the Resurrection of the dead, both of the just and unjust and a general judgment.

We believe the punishment of the wicked is everlasting and the joys of the righteous eternal.

We believe that no ministers have a right to the administration of the ordinances only such as are regularly called and come under imposition of hands by the Presbytery.

We do believe for the mutual comfort, union and satisfaction of the several churches of the aforesaid faith and order, we ought to meet in an association way, wherein each church is to represent their case by their delegates, and attend as often as necessary to advise in such matters in such association as not to be imposed or in any wise binding on churches without their consent, but only to sit and act as advisory council.

ARTICLES 1 AND 7, CHAPTER 3, LONDON ARTICLES OF FAITH

God has (Isa. XLVI:10; Eph. I:11; Heb. VI:17; Rom IX:15-18) decreed Himself from all Eternity, by the most wise and holy counsel of His own will, freely, unchangeably. All things whatsoever come to pass; yet so as thereby is God neither the author of sin (James I:15-17; I John I:5) nor hath fellowship with any therein nor is violence offered to the will of the creature nor yet is liberty to continency of second cause taken but rather (Acts IV:27, 18; John XIX:11) established in which appears His wisdom in despairing all things and power and faithfulness (Num: XXIII:19; Eph. I:3,53) in accomplishing His decree.

The doctrine of this high mystery of predestination is to be handled with special prudence and care, that men attending the will of God revealed in His word and yielding obedience thereunto, may from the certainty of their effectual vocation be assured of their (I Thes. I:45; II Peters I:10) Eternal election so shall His doctrine afford matter (Eph. I:7; Rom. XI:33) of praise, reverence and admiration of God and (Rom. XI:5-6) of humiliation, diligence and abundant (Luke X:20) consolation to all that sincerely obey the Gospel

RULES OF DECORUM

The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.

Only one person may speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator in the beginning of his speech.

Every brother speaking shall adhere strictly to the subject under consideration and in no way reflect on any other brother.

No Messenger shall absent himself from the Association while in conference without permission.

No Messenger shall speak more than three times on the same subject without permission from the Association.

Messengers shall keep strict order while the business of the Association is being transacted.

No Messenger shall be interrupted while speaking unless he violates the rules of this decorum.

No Messenger shall address another in any other term or appellation other than the title of Brother.

The names of the members composing the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association desires.

The Moderator shall not speak on any question before the Association until all the other Messengers are through speaking, when he may give his views. After any Messenger having a right to speak may reply to any matter introduced by the Moderator.

Any Member who violates any of the Rules of the Association shall be dealt with by the Association as it deems proper.

We believe that Almighty God has made known His mind and will to the children of men in His Word; which Word we believe to be of Divine Authority and contains all things necessary to be known for the salvation of men and women. The same is comprehended as contained in The Books of the Old and New Testament as are commonly received.

We believe that God, before the Foundation of the World for a purpose of His own glory did elect a certain number of men and angels to eternal life, and that this election is particularly eternal and unconditional on the part of the creature.

We believe that Adam fell from this state of rectitude and he involved himself and all his natural offsprings in the state of death; and for that original transgression, we all are both Filthy and Guilty in the sight of a Holy God.

We also believe that it is utterly out of the power of man, as fallen creatures, to keep the Law of God perfectly and repent of their sins, truly as we believe in Christ, except that man be drawn by the Holy Spirit.

We believe in God's own appointed time and way by means which He has ordained. The elect shall be called justified, pardoned and sanctified; and that it is impossible that we can utterly refuse the call, but shall be made willing by divine grace to receive the offers of mercy.

We do believe for the mutual comfort, union and satisfaction of the several churches of the aforesaid faith and order, we ought to meet in an association way, wherein each church is to represent their case by their delegates, and attend as often as necessary to advise in such matters in such association as not to be imposed or in any wise binding on churches without their consent, but only to sit and act as advisory council.

ARTICLES 1 AND 7, CHAPTER 3, LONDON

ARTICLES OF FAITH

We believe in the Being of God Almighty, Eternal, Unchangeable, of Infinite Holiness, Goodness, Mercy and Truth, and that God has revealed Himself in His word under the characters of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost.

We believe that Almighty God has made known His mind and will to the children of men in His word which we believe to be of divine authority, and contains all things necessary to be known for salvation of men and women. The same is comprehended in the books of the Old and New Testament as are commonly received.

We believe that God before the foundation of the world for a purpose of His own glory, did elect a certain number of men and angels to eternal life, and that this election is particular, eternal and unconditional on the part of the creature.

We believe that Adam fell from this state of rectitude and he involved himself and all his natural offspring in the state of death, and for that original transgression we all are both filthy and guilty in the sight of a holy God.

We also believe that it is utterly out of the power of man as a fallen creature to keep the law of God perfectly and repent of their sins truly as we believe in Christ, except that man be drawn by the Holy Spirit.

We believe in God's own appointed time and way by means which He has ordained, the Elect shall be called, justified, pardoned, and sanctified; and that it is impossible that we can utterly refuse the call, but shall be made willing by divine grace to receive the offers of mercy.

We believe that Justification in the sight of God is only by the imputed Righteousness of Jesus Christ; received and applied by Faith alone.

We believe in like manner, that God's elect shall not only be called and justified, but that they shall be converted, born again and changed by the effectual working of God's Holy Spirit.

We believe that such as are converted, justified and called by His grace shall persevere in holiness and never fall finally away.

We believe it to be a duty incumbent on all God's people to work religiously in God's work, not in the covenant way of seeking life and favor of the Lord by it, but only as a duty from a principle of love.

We believe Baptism and the Lord's Supper are Gospel ordinances both belonging to the true believer; and that persons who were sprinkled or dipped while in unbelief were not regularly baptized after they are savingly converted into the faith of Christ.

We believe that every church is independent in matters of discipline; and that associations, councils and conferences of several ministers or churches are not to impose on the churches the keeping or maintaining of any principle or practice contrary to the church's judgement.

We believe the punishment of the wicked is everlasting, and the joys of the righteous eternal.

We believe that no ministers have a right to the administration of the ordinances only such as are regularly called and come under imposition of hands by the Presbytery.

We do believe for the mutual comfort, union and satisfaction of the several churches of the aforesaid faith and order, we ought to meet in an association way, wherein each church is to represent their case by their delegates, and attend as often as necessary to advise in such matters in such association as not to be imposed or in any wise binding on churches without their consent, but only to sit and act as advisory council.

ARTICLES 1 AND 7, CHAPTER III, LONDON CONFSSION OF FAITH

1. God has (Isa. 45:10; Eph. 1:11; Heb. 6:17; Rom. 9:15-17) decreed in Himself from all eternity by the most wise and holy counsel of His will freely and unchangeably, all things whatsoever come to pass; yet so as thereby is God neither the author of sin (Jas. 1:15,17; 1 Jn. 1:5), nor hath fellowship with any therein; nor is violence offered to the will of the creature, nor yet is the liberty or contingency of second causes taken away, but rather (Acts 4:27, 28; Jn. 19:11) established, in which appears His wisdom in disposing all things, and power and faithfulness (Num. 23:19; Eph. 1:3-5) in accomplishing His decree.

7. The doctrine of this high mystery of predestination is to be handled with special prudence and care; that men, attending the will of God revealed in His word, and yielding obedience thereunto, may from the certainty of their effectual vocation be assured of their (1 Thess. 1:4,5; 2 Pet. 1:10) eternal election; so shall this doctrine afford matter (Eph. 1:7; Rom. 11:33) of praise, reverence and admiration of God and (Rom. 11:5,6) of humility, diligence and abundant (Luke 10:20) consolation to all that sincerely obey the gospel.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

We believe in the Being of God Almighty, Eternal, Unchangeable, of Infinite Holiness, Goodness, Mercy and Truth, and that God has revealed Himself in His word under the characters of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost.

We believe that Almighty God has made known His mind and will to the children of men in His word which we believe to be of divine authority, and contains all things necessary to be known for salvation of men and women. The same is comprehended in the books of the Old and New Testament as are commonly received.

We believe that God before the foundation of the world for a purpose of His own glory, did elect a certain number of men and angels to eternal life, and that this election is particular, eternal and unconditional on the part of the creature.

We believe that Adam fell from this state of rectitude and he involved himself and all his natural offspring in the state of death, and for that original

transgression we all are both filthy and guilty in the sight of a holy God.

We also believe that it is utterly out of the power of man as a fallen creature to keep the law of God perfectly and repent of their sins truly as we believe in Christ, except that man be drawn by the Holy Spirit.

We believe in God's own appointed time and way by means which He has ordained, the Elect shall be called, justified, pardoned, and sanctified; and that it is impossible that we can utterly refuse the call, but shall be made willing by divine grace to receive the offers of mercy.

We believe that Justification in the sight of God is only by the imputed Righteousness of Jesus Christ; received and applied by Faith alone.

We believe in like manner, that God's elect shall not only be called and justified, but that they shall be converted, born again and changed by the effectual working of God's Holy Spirit.

We believe that such as are converted, justified and called by His grace shall persevere in holiness and never fall finally away.

We believe it to be a duty incumbent on all God's people to work religiously in God's work, not in the covenant way of seeking life and favor of the Lord by it, but only as a duty from a principle of love.

We believe Baptism and the Lord's Supper are Gospel ordinances both belonging to the true believer; and that persons who were sprinkled or dipped while in unbelief were not regularly baptized after they are savingly converted into the faith of Christ.

We believe that every church is independent in matters of discipline; and that associations, councils and conferences of several ministers or churches are not to impose on the churches the keeping or maintaining of any principle or practice contrary to the church's judgement.

We believe the punishment of the wicked is everlasting, and the joys of the righteous eternal.

We believe that no ministers have a right to the administration of the ordinances only such as are regularly called and come under imposition of hands by the Presbytery.

We do believe for the mutual comfort, union and satisfaction of the several churches of the aforesaid faith and order, we ought to meet in an association way, wherein each church is to represent their case by their delegates, and attend as often as necessary to advise in such matters in such association as not to be imposed or in any wise binding on churches without their consent, but only to sit and act as advisory council.

ARTICLES 1 AND 7, CHAPTER III, LONDON CONFESSION OF FAITH

1. God has (Isa. 45:10; Eph. 1:11; Heb. 6:17; Rom. 9:15-17) decreed in Himself from all eternity by the most wise and holy counsel of His will freely and unchangeably, all things whatsoever come to pass; yet so as thereby is God neither the author of sin (Jas. 1:15,17; 1 Jn. 1:5), nor hath fellowship with any therein; nor is violence offered to the will of the creature, nor yet is the liberty or contingency of second causes taken away, but rather (Acts 4:27, 28; Jn. 19:11) established, in which appears His wisdom in disposing all things, and power and faithfulness (Num. 23:19; Eph. 1:3-5) in accomplishing His decree.

7. The doctrine of this high mystery of predestination is to be handled with special prudence and care; that men, attending the will of God revealed in His word, and yielding obedience thereunto, may from the certainty of their effectual vocation be assured of their (1 Thess. 1:4,5; 2 Pet. 1:10) eternal election; so shall this doctrine afford matter (Eph. 1:7; Rom. 11:33) of praise, reverence and admiration of God and (Rom. 11:5,6) of humility, diligence and abundant (Luke 10:20) consolation to all that sincerely obey the gospel.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
2. Only one person may speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator in the beginning of his speech.
3. Every brother speaking shall adhere strictly to the subject under consideration and in no way reflect on any other brother.
4. No Messenger shall absent himself from the Association while in conference without permission.
5. No Messenger shall speak more than three times on the same subject without permission from the Association.
6. Messengers shall keep strict order while the business of the Association is being transacted.
7. No Messenger shall be interrupted while speaking unless he violates the rules of decorum.
8. No Messenger shall address another in any other term or appellation other than the title of Brother.
9. The names of the members composing the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association desires.
10. The Moderator shall not speak on any question before the Association until all the other Messengers are through speaking, when he may give his views. After any Messenger having a right to speak may reply to any matter introduced by the Moderator.
11. Any Member who violates any of the Rules of the Association shall be dealt with by the Association as it deems proper.

1. The doctrine of this high mystery of predestination is to be handled with special prudence and care; that men, attending the will of God revealed in His word, and yielding obedience thereunto, may from the certainty of their effectual vocation be assured of their (I Thes. 1:4-5; II Pet. 1:10) eternal election; so shall this doctrine afford matter (Eph. 1:7; Rom. 11:33) of praise, reverence and admiration of God and (Rom. 11:5-6) of humility, diligence and abundant (Luke 10:20) consolation to all that sincerely obey the gospel.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
2. Only one person may speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator in the beginning of his speech.
3. Every brother speaking shall adhere strictly to the subject under consideration and in no way reflect on any other brother.
4. No Messenger shall absent himself from the Association while in conference without permission.
5. No Messenger shall speak more than three times on the same subject without permission from the Association.
6. Messengers shall keep strict order while the business of the Association is being transacted.
7. No Messenger shall be interrupted while speaking unless he violates the rules of decorum.
8. No Messenger shall address another in any other term or appellation than the title of Brother.
9. The names of the members composing the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association desires.
10. The Moderator shall not speak on any question before the Association until all the other Messengers are through speaking, when he may give his views. After any Messenger having a right to speak may reply to any matter introduced by the Moderator.
11. Any Member who violates any of the Rules of the Association shall be dealt with by the Association as it deems proper.

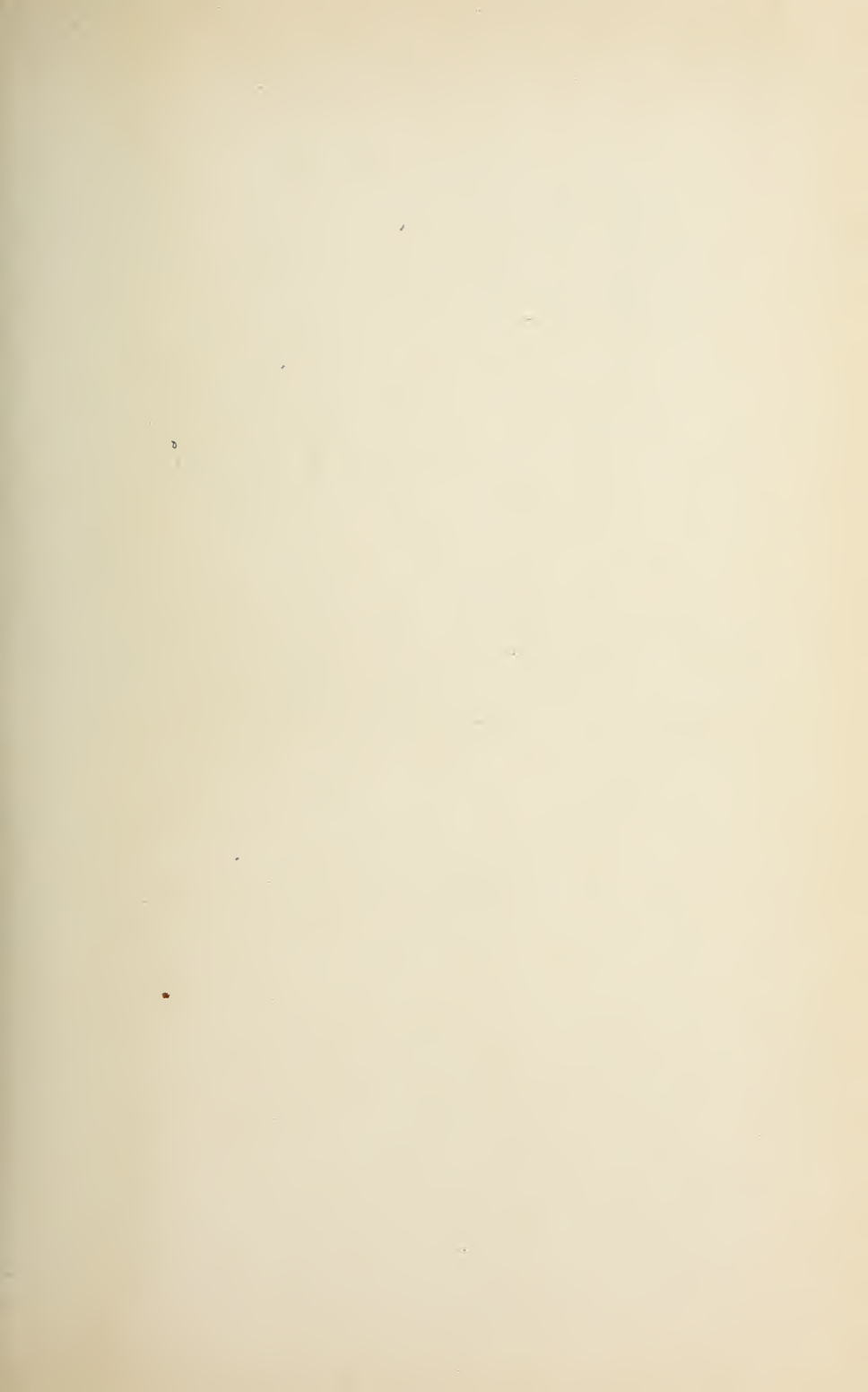

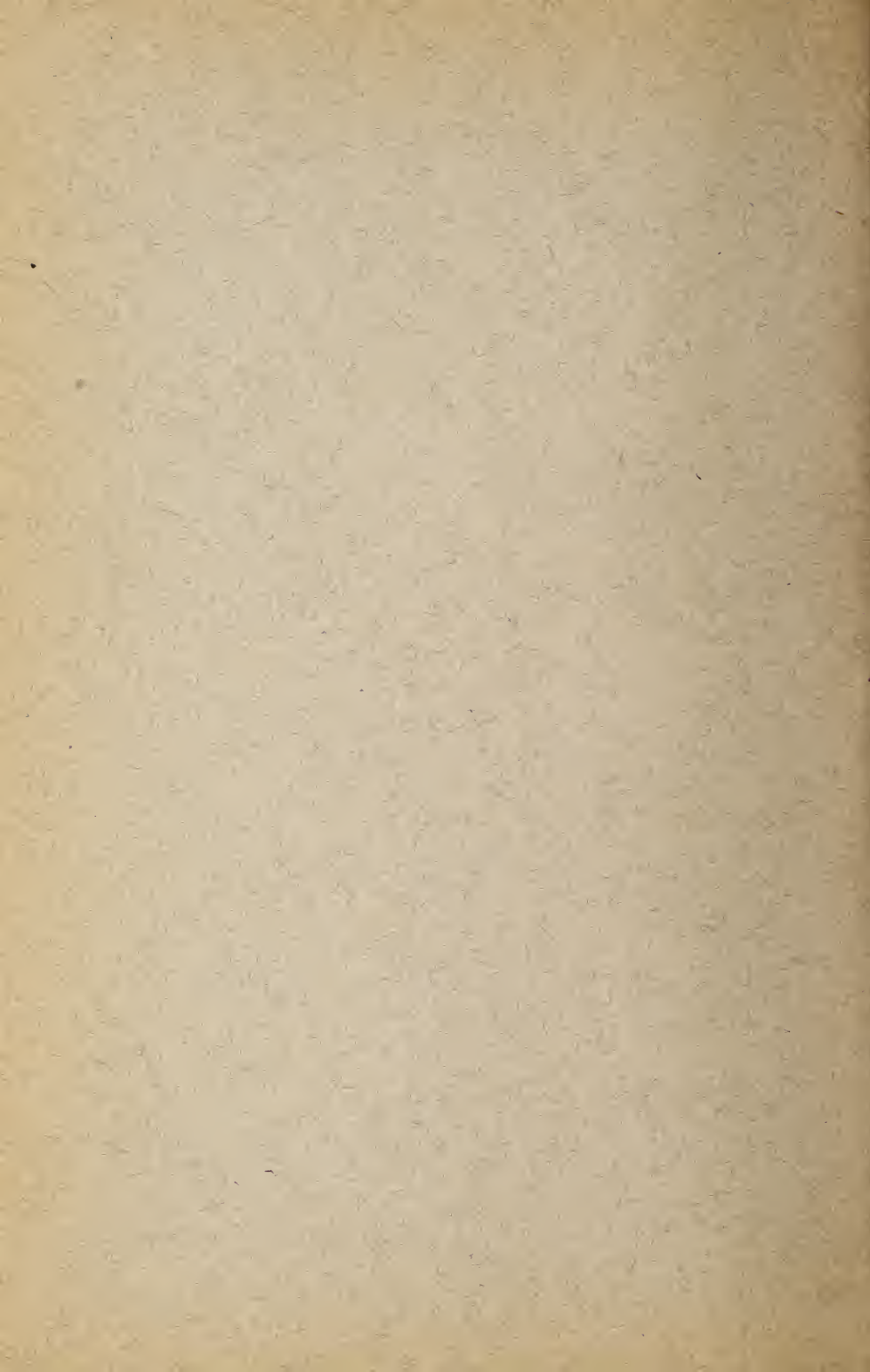

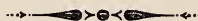

ARTICLES OF FAITH

We believe in the Being of God Almighty, eternal, unchangeable, of Infinite holiness, goodness, mercy, and truth and that God has revealed Himself in His word under the character of Father, Son and Holy Ghost.

We believe that Almighty God has made known His mind and will to the children of men in His word, which we believe to be of divine authority, and contains all things necessary to be known for salvation of men and women. The same is comprehended in the books of the Old and New Testaments as are commonly received.

We believe that God before the foundation of the world, for a purpose of His own glory, did elect a certain number of men and angels to eternal life, and that this election is particular, eternal and unconditional on the part of the creature.

We believe that Adam fell from this condition of rectitude and he involved himself and his natural offspring in the state of death, and for that original transgression, we are both filthy and guilty before a holy God.

We also believe that it is utterly out of the power of man as a fallen creature to keep the law of God perfectly and repent of their sins truly as we believe in Christ, except man be drawn by the Holy Spirit.

We believe in God's appointed time and way by means which He has ordained, the elect shall be called, justified, pardoned, and sanctified; and that it is impossible that we can utterly refuse the call, but shall be made willing by divine grace to receive the offers of mercy.

We believe that justification in the sight of God is only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ; received and applied by faith alone.

We believe in like manner, that God's elect not only shall be called and justified, but that they shall be converted, born again, and changed by the effectual workings of God's Holy Spirit.

We believe that such as are converted, justified and called by His grace shall persevere in holiness and never finally fall away.

We believe it to be a duty incumbent upon God's people to work religiously in God's work, not in the covenant way of seeking life and favor of the Lord by it, but only as a duty from a principle of love.

We believe baptism and the Lord's Supper are gospel ordinances, both belonging to the true believer; and that persons who were sprinkled or dipped while in unbelief were not regularly baptised after they are savingly converted into the faith of Christ.

We believe that every church is independent in matters of discipline; and that Associations, Councils, and conferences of several ministers or churches are not to impose on the churches the keeping or

maintaining of any principle or practice contrary to the church's judgment.

We believe the punishment of the wicked is everlasting, and the joys of the righteous eternal.

We believe that no ministers have a right to the administration of the ordinances only such as are regularly called and come under the imposition of hands of the presbytery.

We do believe for the mutual comfort, union and satisfaction of the several churches of the aforesaid faith and order, we ought to meet in an Association way, wherein each church is to represent their case by their delegates, and attend as often as necessary to advise in such matters in such Associations as not to be imposed or in any wise binding on churches without their consent, but only to sit as an advisory council.

ARTICLES 1 and 7 CHAPTER 3, LONDON CONFESSION OF FAITH

1. God has (Isa. 45:10; Eph. 1:11; Heb. 6:17; Rom. 9:15-17) decreed in Himself from all eternity by the most wise and holy counsel of His will freely and unchangeably, all things whatsoever come to pass; yet thereby is God neither the author of sin (Jas. 1:15-17; 1 John 1:5), nor hath fellowship with any therein; nor is violence offered to the will of the creature, nor yet is the liberty or contingency of second causes taken away, but rather (Acts 4:27; John 19:11) established, in which appears His wisdom in disposing all things, and power and faithfulness (Num. 23:19; Eph. 1:3-5) in accomplishing His decree.

7. The doctrine of this high mystery of predestination is to be handled with special prudence and care; that men, attending the will of God revealed in His word, and yielding obedience thereunto, may from the certainty of their effectual vocation be assured of their (1 Thess. 1:4, 5; 1 Peter 1:10) eternal election; so shall this doctrine afford matter (Eph. 1:7; Rom. 11:33) of praise, reverence and admiration of God and (Rom 11:5, 6), of humility diligence and abundant (Luke 10:20) consolation to all that sincerely obey the gospel.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. The Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
2. Only one person may speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator in the beginning of his speech.
3. Every brother speaking shall adhere strictly to the subject under consideration and in no way reflect on any other brother.
4. No messenger shall absent himself from the Association while in conference without permission.
5. No messenger shall speak more than three times on the same subject without permission from the Association.
6. Messengers shall keep strict order while the business of the Association is being transacted.
7. No messenger shall be interrupted while speaking unless he violates the Rules of Decorum.
8. No messenger shall address another in any other term or appellation than that of "Brother."
9. The names of the members composing the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association desires.
10. The Moderator shall not speak on any question before the Association until all the other messengers are through speaking, when he may give his views. After any messenger having the right to speak may reply to any matter introduced by the Moderator.
11. Any member who violates any of the rules of the Association shall be dealt with by the Association as it deems proper.

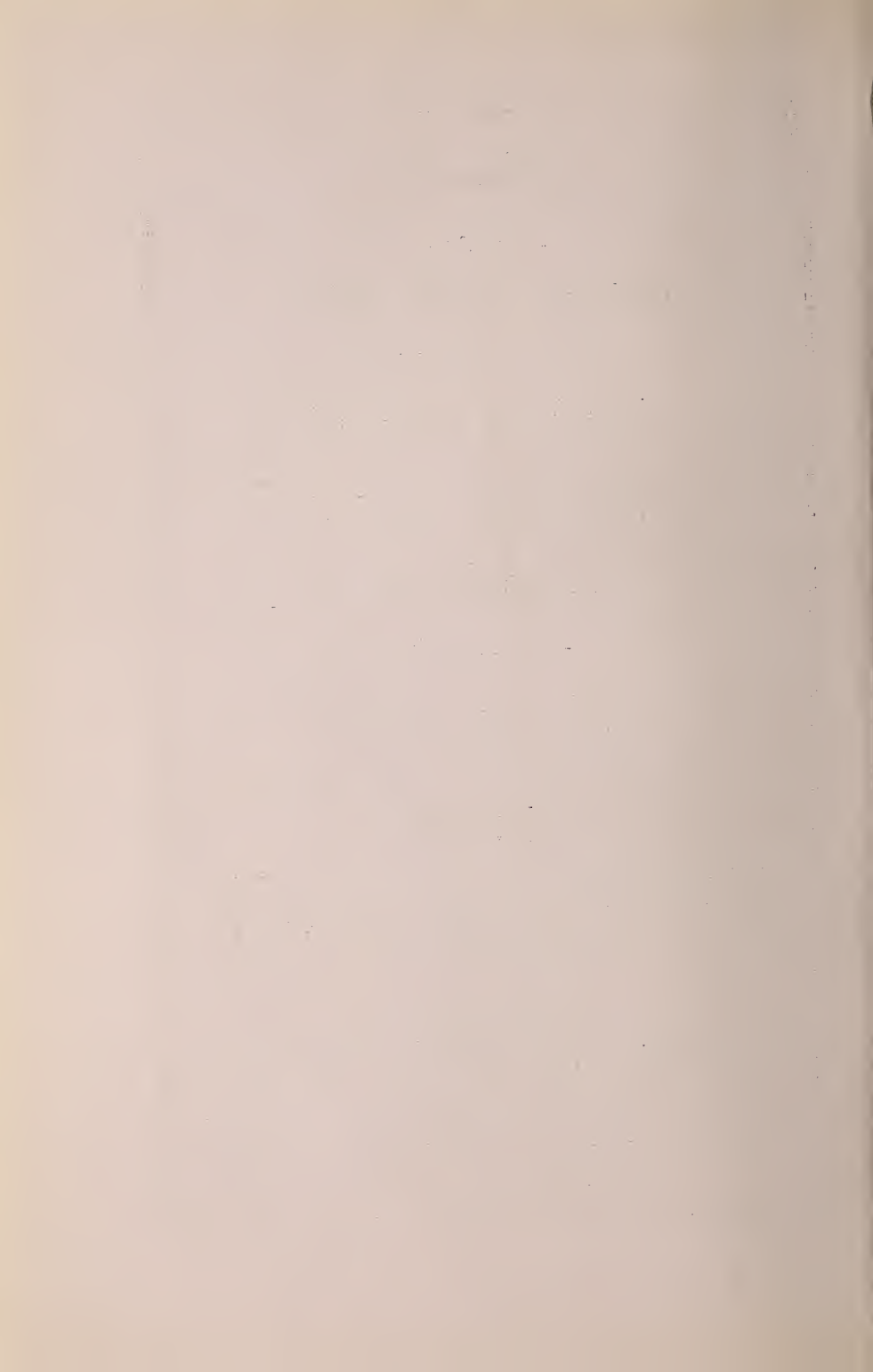

ARTICLES OF FAITH

We believe in the Being of God Almighty, eternal, unchangeable, of infinite holiness, goodness, mercy, and truth and that God has revealed Himself in His word under the character of Father, Son and Holy Ghost.

We believe that Almighty God has made known His mind and will to the children of men in His word, which we believe to be of divine authority, and contains all things necessary to be known for salvation of men and women. The same is comprehended in the books of the Old and New Testaments as are commonly received.

We believe that God before the foundation of the world, for a purpose of His own glory, did elect a certain number of men and angels to eternal life, and that this election is particular, eternal and unconditional on the part of the creature.

We believe that Adam fell from this condition of rectitude and he involved himself and his natural offspring in the state of death, and for that original transgression, we are both filthy and guilty before an holy God.

We also believe that it is utterly out of the power of man as a fallen creature to keep the law of God perfectly and repent of their sins truly as we believe in Christ, except man be drawn by the Holy Spirit.

We believe in God's appointed time and way by means which He has ordained, the elect shall be called, justified, pardoned, and sanctified; and that it is impossible that we can utterly refuse the call, but shall be made willing by divine grace to receive the offers of mercy.

We believe that justification in the sight of God is only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ; received and applied by faith alone.

We believe in like manner, that God's elect not only shall be called and justified, but that they shall be converted, born again, and changed by the effectual workings of God's Holy Spirit.

We believe that such as are converted, justified and called by His grace shall persevere in holiness and never finally fall away.

We believe it to be a duty incumbent upon God's people to work religiously in God's work, not in the covenant way of seeking life and favor of the Lord by it, but only as a duty from a principle of love.

We believe baptism and the Lord's Supper are gospel ordinances, both belonging to the true believer; and that persons who were sprinkled or dipped while in unbelief were not regularly baptised after they are savingly converted into the faith of Christ.

We believe that every church is independent in matters of discipline; and that Associations, Councils, and conferences of several ministers or churches are not to impose on the churches the keeping or maintaining of any principle or practice contrary to the church's judgment.

We believe the punishment of the wicked is everlasting, and the joys of the righteous eternal.

We believe that no ministers have a right to the administration of the ordinances only such as are regularly called and come under the imposition of hands of the presbytery.

We do believe for the mutual comfort, union and satisfaction of the several churches of the aforesaid faith and order, we ought to meet in an Association way, wherein each church is to represent their case by their delegates, and attend as often as necessary to advise in such matters in such Associations as not to be imposed or in any

wise binding on churches without their consent, but only to sit as an advisory council.

ARTICLES 1 and 7 CHAPTER 3, LONDON CONFESSION OF FAITH

1. God has (Isa. 45:10; Eph. 1:11; Heb. 6:17; Rom. 9:15-17) decreed in Himself from all eternity by the most wise and holy counsel of His will freely and unchangeably, all things whatsoever come to pass; yet thereby is God neither the author of sin (Jas. 1:15-17; 1 John 1:5), nor hath fellowship with any therein; nor is violence offered to the will of the creature, nor yet is the liberty or contingency of second causes taken away, but rather (Acts 4:27; John 19:11) established, in which appears His wisdom in disposing all things, and power and faithfulness (Num. 23:19; Eph. 1:3-5) in accomplishing His decree.

7. The doctrine of this high mystery of predestination is to be handled with special prudence and care; that men, attending the will of God revealed in His word, and yielding obedience thereunto, may from the certainty of their effectual vocation be assured of their (1 Thess. 1:4, 5; 1 Peter 1:10) eternal election; so shall this doctrine afford matter (Eph. 1:7; Rom. 11:33) of praise, reverence and admiration of God and (Rom 11:5, 6), of humility diligence and abundant (Luke 10: 20) consolation to all that sincerely obey the gospel.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. The Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
2. Only one person may speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator in the beginning of his speech.
3. Every brother speaking shall adhere strictly to the subject under consideration and in no way reflect on any other brother.
4. No messenger shall absent himself from the Association while in conference without permission.
5. No messenger shall speak more than three times on the same subject without permission from the Association.
6. Messengers shall keep strict order while the business of the Association is being transacted.
7. No messenger shall be interrupted while speaking unless he violates the Rules of Decorum.
8. No messenger shall address another in any other term or appellation than that of "Brother."
9. The names of the members composing the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association desires.
10. The Moderator shall not speak on any question before the Association until all the other messengers are through speaking, when he may give his views. After any messenger having the right to speak may reply to any matter introduced by the Moderator.
11. Any member who violates any of the rules of the Association shall be dealt with by the Association as it deems proper.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe in the being of God Almighty, eternal, unchangeable, of infinite wisdom, power, justice, holiness, goodness, mercy and truth; and this God has revealed Himself in His Word under the characters of Father, Son and Holy Ghost.

2. We believe that Almighty God has made known His mind and will to the children of men in His Word; which word we believe to be of divine authority, and contains all things necessary to be known for the salvation of men and women. The same is comprehended as contained in the Books of the Old and New Testaments as are commonly received.

3. We believe that God before the foundation of the world for the purpose of His own glory, did elect a certain number of men and angels to eternal life, and unconditional an the part of the creature.

4. We believe that Adam fell from his state of rectitude and he involved himself and all his natural offspring in the state of death; and for that original transgression, we all are both filthy and guilty in the sight of a holy God.

5. We also believe that it is utterly out of the power of men as fallen creatures, to keep the law of God perfectly, and repent of their sins truly, as we believe in Christ, except that man be drawn by the Holy Spirit.

6. We believe in God's own appointed time and way by means which He has ordained, the elect shall be called, justified, pardoned and sanctified; and that it is impossible that we can utterly refuse he call, but shall be made willing by divine grace to receive the offers of mercy.

7. We believe that justification in the sight of God is only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ; received and applied by faith alone.

8. We believe in like manner, that God's elect shall not only be called and justified, but that they shall be converted, born again and changed by the effectual working of God's Holy Spirit.

9. We believe that such as are converted, justified, and called by His grace, shall persevere in holiness and never fall finally away.

We believe it to be a duty incumbent on all of God' people to walk religiously in God's works, not in the old covenant way of seeking life and favor of the Lord by it, but only as a duty from a principle of love.

11. We believe baptism and the Lord's Supper are gospel ordinances, both belonging to the true believers; and that persons who are sprinkled or dipped while in unbelief were not regularly baptised accordding to God's Word, and that such ought to be baptised after they are savingly converted into the faith of Christ.

12. We believe that every church is indendent in matters of discipline, and that Associations, Councils, and Conferences of several ministers or churches are not to impose on the churches the keeping or maintaining of any principle or practice contrary to the church's judgment.

13. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both of the just and the unjust, and a general judgment.

14. We believe the punishment of the wicked is everlasting and the joys of the righteous eternal.

15. We believe that no ministers have a right to the administration of the ordinances only such as are regularly called and come under imposition of hands by the Presbytery.

16. We believe for the mutual comfort, union and satisfaction of several churches of the aforesaid faith and order ought to meet in an association way, wherein each church is to represent their case by their delegates, and attend as often as necessary to advise in such matters, but Associations, as such, are to be in no wise binding on churches without their consent, but only to sit and act as an advisory council.

Articles 1 and 7, Chapter 3, London Confession of Faith: "God has (Isa. 46:10; Eph. 1:11; Heb. 6:7; Rom. 9:15-18) decreed in Himself from all eternity, by the most wise and holy counsel of His own will, freely and unchangeably, all things what soever come to pass; yet so as thereby God is neither the author of sin (James 1:15-17; 1 John 1:5) nor hath fellowship with any therein, nor is violence offered to the will of the creature; nor yet is the liberty or contingency of second causes taken away, but rather (Acts 4:27, 28; John 19:11) established, in which appears His wisdom in disposing all things, and power and faithfulness (Num. 23:19; Eph. 1:3-5) in accomplishing His decree."

"The doctrine of this high mystery of predestination is to be handled with special prudence and care; that men, attending the will of God revealed in His Word, and yielding obedience thereunto, may from the certainty of their effectual vocation be assured of their (Thess. 1:4, 5; 2 Pet. 1:10) eternal election; so shall this doctrine afford matter (Eph. 1:7; Rom. 11:33) of praise, reverence and admiration of God, and (Rom. 11:5, 6,) of humility, diligence and abundant (Luke 1:20) consolation to all that sincerely obey the gospel.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
2. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator in the beginning of his speech.
3. Every brother speaking shall adhere strictly to the subject under consideration and in no way reflect on any other brother.
4. No messenger shall absent himself from the Association while in conference without permission.
5. No messenger shall speak more than three times on the same subject without permission from the Association.
6. Messengers shall keep strict order while the business of the Association is being transacted.
7. No messenger shall be interrupted while speaking unless he violates the Rules of this Decorum.
8. No messenger shall address another in any term or appellation other than the title of brother.
9. The names of the members composing the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association

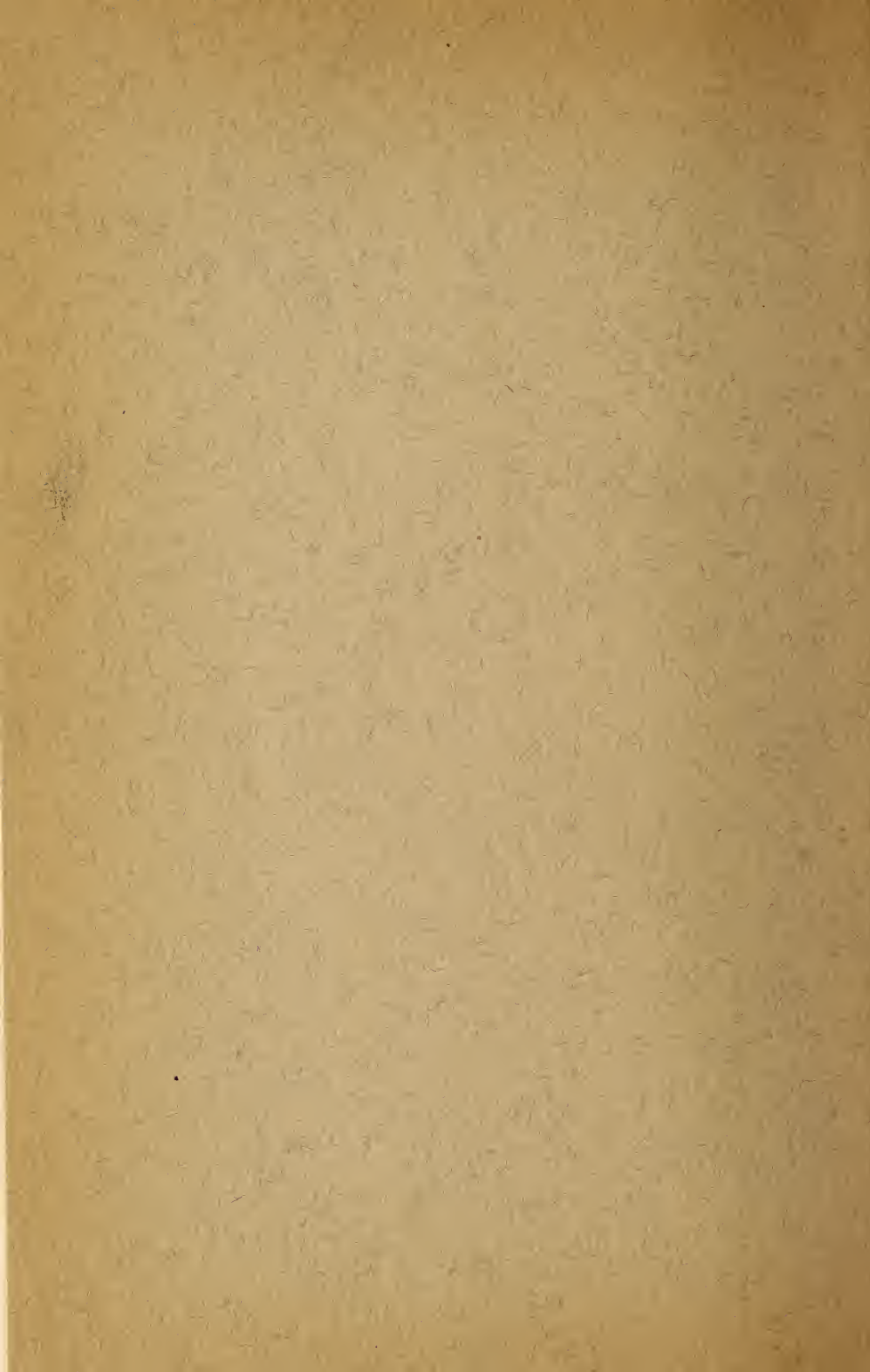
desires.

10. The Moderator shall not speak on any question before the Association until all the other messengers are through speaking, when he may give his views. After which any messenger having a right to speak may reply to any matter introduced by the Moderator.

11. Any member who violates any of the Rules of the Association shall be dealt with by the Association as it deems proper.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

2. Articles 1 and 7, Chapter 3, London Confession of Faith: "God has (Isa. 46:10; Eph. 1:11; Heb. 6:7; Rom. 9:15-18) decreed in Himself from all eternity, by the most wise and holy counsel of His own will, freely and unchangeably, all things what soever come to pass; yet so as thereby God is neither the author of sin (James 1:15-17; 1 John 1:5) nor hath fellowship with any therein, nor is violence offered to the will of the creature; nor yet is the liberty or contingency of second causes taken away, but rather (Acts 4:27, 28; John 19:11) established, in which appears His wisdom in disposing all things, and power and faithfulness (Num. 23:19; Eph. 1:3-5) in accomplishing His decree."

"The doctrine of this high mystery of predestination is to be handled with special prudence and care; that men, attending the will of God revealed in His Word, and yielding obedience thereunto, may from the certainty of their effectual vocation be assured of their (Thess. 1:4, 5; 2 Pet. 1:10) eternal election; so shall this doc-

trine afford matter (Eph. 1:7; Rom. 11:33) of praise, reverence and admiration of God, and (Rom. 11:5, 6,) of humility, diligence and abundant (Luke 1:20) consolation to all that sincerely obey the gospel.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
2. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator in the beginning of his speech.
3. Every brother speaking shall adhere strictly to the subject under consideration and in no way reflect on any other brother.
4. No messenger shall absent himself from the Association while in conference without permission.
5. No messenger shall speak more than three times on the same subject without permission from the Association.
6. Messengers shall keep strict order while the business of the Association is being transacted.

BROTHER WILLIAM ANDREW (BILLY) FREEMAN

With sadness and sorrow I undertake to write the obituary of our beloved brother in the Lord, Brother Billy Freeman.

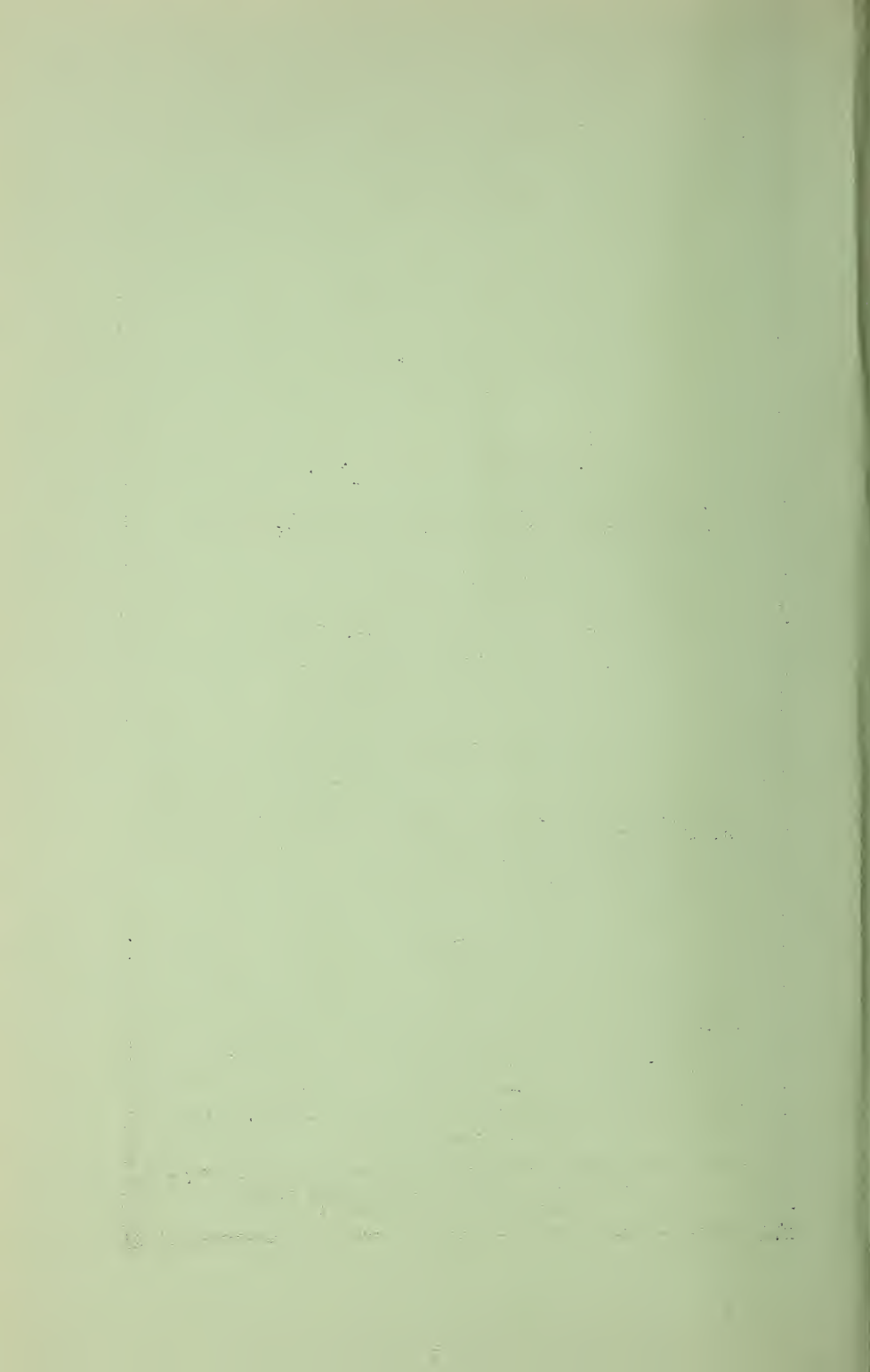

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe in the being of God Almighty, eternal, unchangeable, of infinite wisdom, power, justice, holiness, goodness, mercy and truth; and this God has revealed Himself in His Word under the characters of Father, Son and Holy Ghost.
2. We believe that Almighty God has made known His mind and will to the children of men in His Word; which word we believe to be of divine authority, and contains all things necessary to be known for the salvation of men and women. The same is comprehended as contained in the Books of the Old and New Testaments as are commonly received.
3. We believe that God before the foundation of the world for the purpose of His own glory, did elect a certain number of men and angels to eternal life, and unconditional an the part of the creature.
4. We believe that Adam fell from his state of rectitude and he involved himself and all his natural offspring in the state of death; and for that original transgression, we all are both filthy and guilty in the sight of a holy God.
5. We also believe that it is utterly out of the power of men as fallen creatures, to keep the law of God perfectly, and repent of their sins truly, as we believe in Christ, except that man be drawn by the Holy Spirit.
6. We believe in God's own appointed time and way by means which He has ordained, the elect shall be called, justified, pardoned and sanctified; and that it is impossible that we can utterly refuse he call, but shall be made willing by divine grace to receive the offers of mercy.

10. We believe it to be a duty incumbent on all of God's people to walk religiously in God's works, not in the old covenant way of seeking life and favor of the Lord by it, but only as a duty from a principle of love.

11. We believe baptism and the Lord's Supper are gospel ordinances, both belonging to the true believers; and that persons who are sprinkled or dipped while in unbelief were not regularly baptised according to God's Word, and that such ought to be baptised after they are savingly converted into the faith of Christ.

12. We believe that every church is independent in matters of discipline, and that Associations, Councils, and Conferences of several ministers or churches are not to impose on the churches the keeping or maintaining of any principle or practice contrary to the church's judgment.

13. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both of the just and the unjust, and a general judgment.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
2. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator in the beginning of his speech.
3. Every brother speaking shall adhere strictly to the subject under consideration and in no way reflect on any other brother.
4. No messenger shall absent himself from the Association while in conference without permission.
5. No messenger shall speak more than three times on the same subject without permission from the Association.
6. Messengers shall keep strict order while the business of the Association is being transacted.
7. No messenger shall be interrupted while speaking unless he violates the Rules of this Decorum.
8. No messenger shall address another in any term or appellation other than the title of brother.
9. The names of the members composing the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association desires.
10. The Moderator shall not speak on any question before the As-

sociation until all the other messengers are through speaking, when he may give his views. After which any messenger having a right to speak may reply to any matter introduced by the Moderator.

11. Any member who violates any of the Rules of the Association shall be dealt with by the Association as it deems proper.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe in the being of God Almighty, eternal, unchangeable, of infinite wisdom, power, justice, holiness, goodness, mercy and truth; and this God has revealed Himself in His Word under the characters of Father, Son and Holy Ghost.

2. We believe that Almighty God has made known His mind and will to the children of men in His Word; which word we believe to be of divine authority, and contains all things necessary to be known for the salvation of men and women. The same is comprehended as contained in the Books of the Old and New Testaments as are commonly received.

3. We believe that God before the foundation of the world for the purpose of His own glory, did elect a certain number of men and angels to eternal life, and unconditional an the part of the creature.

4. We believe that Adam fell from his state of rectitude and he involved himself and all his natural offspring in the state of death; and for that original transgression, we all are both filthy and guilty in the sight of a holy God.

5. We also believe that it is utterly out of the power of men as fallen creatures, to keep the law of God perfectly, and repent of their sins truly, as we believe in Christ, except that man be drawn by the Holy Spirit.

6. We believe in God's own appointed time and way by means which He has ordained, the elect shall be called, justified, pardoned and sanctified; and that it is impossible that we can utterly refuse he call, but shall be made willing by divine grace to receive the offers of mercy.

7. We believe that justification in the sight of God is only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ; received and applied by faith alone.

8. We believe in like manner, that God's elect shall not only be called and justified, but that they shall be converted, born again and changed by the effectual working of God's Holy Spirit.

9. We believe that such as are converted, justified, and called by His grace, shall persevere in holiness and never fall finally away.

10. We believe it to be a duty incumbent on all of God's people to walk religiously in God's works, not in the old covenant way of seeking life and favor of the Lord by it, but only as a duty from a principle of love.

11. We believe baptism and the Lord's Supper are gospel ordinances, both belonging to the true believers; and that persons who are sprinkled or dipped while in unbelief were not regularly baptised according to God's Word, and that such ought to be baptised after they are savingly converted into the faith of Christ.

12. We believe that every church is indendent in matters of discipline, and that Associations, Councils, and Conferences of several ministers or churches are not to impose on the churches the keeping or maintaining of any principle or practice contrary to the church's

judgment.

13. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both of the just and the unjust, and a general judgment.

14. We believe the punishment of the wicked is everlasting and the joys of the righteous eternal.

15. We believe that no ministers have a right to the administration of the ordinances only such as are regularly called and come under imposition of hands by the Presbytery.

16. We believe for the mutual comfort, union and satisfaction of several churches of the aforesaid faith and order ought to meet in an association way, wherein each church is to represent their case by their delegates, and attend as often as necessary to advise in such matters, but Associations, as such, are to be in no wise binding on churches without their consent, but only to sit and act as an advisory council.

Articles 1 and 7, Chapter 3, London Confession of Faith: "God has (Isa. 46:10; Eph. 1:11; Heb. 6:7; Rom. 9:15-18) decreed in Himself from all eternity, by the most wise and holy counsel of His own will, freely and unchangeably, all things what soever come to pass; yet so as thereby God is neither the author of sin (James 1:15-17; 1 John 1:5) nor hath fellowship with any therein, nor is violence offered to the will of the creature; nor yet is the liberty or contingency of second causes taken away, but rather (Acts 4:27, 28; John 19:11) established, in which appears His wisdom in disposing all things, and power and faithfulness (Num. 23:19; Eph. 1:3-5) in accomplishing His decree."

"The doctrine of this high mystery of predestination is to be handled with special prudence and care; that men, attending the will of God revealed in His Word, and yielding obedience thereunto, may from the certainty of their effectual vocation be assured of their (Thess. 1:4, 5; 2 Pet. 1:10) eternal election; so shall this doctrine afford matter (Eph. 1:7; Rom. 11:33) of praise, reverence and admiration of God, and (Rom. 11:5, 6,) of humility, diligence and abundant (Luke 1:20) consolation to all that sincerely obey the gospel.

5. No messenger shall speak more than three times on the same subject without permission from the Association.
6. Messengers shall keep strict order while the business of the Association is being transacted.
7. No messenger shall be interrupted while speaking unless he violates the Rules of this Decorum.
8. No messenger shall address another in any term or appellation other than the title of brother.
9. The names of the members composing the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association desires.
10. The Moderator shall not speak on any question before the Association until all the other messengers are through speaking, when he may give his views. After which any messenger having a right to speak may reply to any matter introduced by the Moderator.
11. Any member who violates any of the Rules of the Association shall be dealt with by the Association as it deems proper.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe in the being of God Almighty, eternal, unchangeable, of infinite wisdom, power, justice, holiness, goodness, mercy and truth; and this God has revealed Himself in His Word under the characters of Father, Son and Holy Ghost.
2. We believe that Almighty God has made known His mind and will to the children of men in His Word; which word we believe to be of divine authority, and contains all things necessary to be known for the salvation of men and women. The same is comprehended as contained in the Books of the Old and New Testaments as are commonly received.
3. We believe that God before the foundation of the world for the purpose of His own glory, did elect a certain number of men and angels to eternal life, and unconditional an the part of the creature.
4. We believe that Adam fell from his state of rectitude and he involved himself and all his natural offspring in the state of death; and for that original transgression, we all are both filthy and guilty in the sight of a holy God.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
2. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator in the beginning of his speech.
3. Every brother speaking shall adhere strictly to the subject under consideration and in no way reflect on any other brother.
4. No messenger shall absent himself from the Association while in conference without permission.
5. No messenger shall speak more than three times on the same subject without permission from the Association.
6. Messengers shall keep strict order while the business of the Association is being transacted.
7. No messenger shall be interrupted while speaking unless he violates the Rules of this Decorum.
8. No messenger shall address another in any term or appellation other than the title of brother.
9. The names of the members composing the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association desires.
10. The Moderator shall not speak on any question before the Association until all the other messengers are through speaking, when he may give his views. After which any messenger having a right to speak may reply to any matter introduced by the Moderator.
11. Any member who violates any of the Rules of the Association shall be dealt with by the Association as it deems proper.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe in the being of God Almighty, eternal, unchangeable, of infinite wisdom, power, justice, holiness, goodness, mercy and truth; and this God has revealed Himself in His Word under the characters of Father, Son and Holy Ghost.
2. We believe that Almighty God has made known His mind and will to the children of men in His Word; which word we believe to be of divine authority, and contains all things necessary to be known for the salvation of men and women. The same is comprehended as contained in the Books of the Old and New Testaments as are commonly received.
3. We believe that God before the foundation of the world for the purpose of His own glory, did elect a certain number of men and angels to eternal life, and unconditional an the part of the creature.
4. We believe that Adam fell from his state of rectitude and he involved himself and all his natural offspring in the state of death; and for that original transgression, we all are both filthy and guilty in the sight of a holy God.
5. We also believe that it is utterly out of the power of men as fallen creatures, to keep the law of God perfectly, and repent of their sins truly, as we believe in Christ, except that man be drawn by the Holy Spirit.

6. We believe in God's own appointed time and way by means which He has ordained, the elect shall be called, justified, pardoned and sanctified; and that it is impossible that we can utterly refuse he call, but shall be made willing by divine grace to receive the offers of mercy.

7. We believe that justification in the sight of God is only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ; received and applied by faith alone.

8. We believe in like manner, that God's elect shall not only be called and justified, but that they shall be converted, born again and changed by the effectual working of God's Holy Spirit.

9. We believe that such as are converted, justified, and called by His grace, shall persevere in holiness and never fall finally away.

10. We believe it to be a duty incumbent on all of God's people to walk religiously in God's works, not in the old covenant way of seeking life and favor of the Lord by it, but only as a duty from a principle of love.

11. We believe baptism and the Lord's Supper are gospel ordinances, both belonging to the true believers; and that persons who are sprinkled or dipped while in unbelief were not regularly baptised according to God's Word, and that such ought to be baptised after they are savingly converted into the faith of Christ.

12. We believe that every church is indendent in matters of discipline, and that Associations, Councils, and Conferences of several ministers or churches are not to impose on the churches the keeping or maintaining of any principle or practice contrary to the church's judgment.

13. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both of the just and the unjust, and a general judgment.

14. We believe the punishment of the wicked is everlasting and the joys of the righteous eternal.

15. We believe that no ministers have a righte to the administration of the ordinances only such as are regularly called and come under imposition of hands by the Presbytery.

16. We believe for the mutual comfort, union and satisfaction of several churches of the aforesaid faith and order ought to meet in an association way, wherein each church is to represent their case by their delegates, and attend as often as necessary to advise in such matters, but Associations, as such, are to be in no wise binding on churches without their consent, but only to sit and act as an advisory council.

Articles 1 and 7, Chapter 3, London Confession of Faith: "God has (Isa. 46:10; Eph. 1:11; Heb. 6:7; Rom. 9:15-18) decreed in Himself from all eternity, by the most wise and holy counsel of His own will, freely and unchangeably, all things what soever come to pass; yet so as thereby God is neither the author of sin (James 1:15-17; 1 John 1:5) nor hath fellowship with any therein, nor is violence offered to the will of the creature; nor yet is the liberty or contingency of second causes taken away, but rather (Acts 4:27, 28; John 19:11) established, in which appears His wisdom in disposing all things, and power and faithfulness (Num. 23:19; Eph. 1:3-5) in accomplishing His decree."

"The doctrine of this high mystery of predestination is to be handled with special prudence and care; that men, attending the will of God revealed in His Word, and yielding obedience thereunto, may from the certainty of their effectual vocation be assured of their (Thess. 1:4, 5; 2 Pet. 1:10) eternal election; so shall this doctrine afford matter (Eph. 1:7; Rom. 11:33) of praise, reverence and admiration of God, and (Rom. 11:5, 6,) of humility, diligence and abundant (Luke 1:20) consolation to all that sincerely obey the gospel.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
2. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator in the beginning of his speech.
3. Every brother speaking shall adhere strictly to the subject under consideration and in no way reflect on any other brother.
4. No messenger shall absent himself from the Association while in conference without permission.
5. No messenger shall speak more than three times on the same subject without permission from the Association.
6. Messengers shall keep strict order while the business of the Association is being transacted.
7. No messenger shall be interrupted while speaking unless he violates the Rules of this Decorum.
8. No messenger shall address another in any term or appellation other than the title of brother.
9. The names of the members composing the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association desires.
10. The Moderator shall not speak on any question before the Association until all the other messengers are through speaking, when he may give his views. After which any messenger having a right to speak may reply to any matter introduced by the Moderator.
11. Any member who violates any of the Rules of the Association shall be dealt with by the Association as it deems proper.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe in the being of God Almighty, eternal, unchangeable, of infinite wisdom, power, justice, holiness, goodness, mercy and truth; and this God has revealed Himself in His Word under the characters of Father, Son and Holy Ghost.
2. We believe that Almighty God has made known His mind and will to the children of men in His Word; which word we believe to be of divine authority, and contains all things necessary to be known for the salvation of men and women. The same is comprehended as contained in the Books of the Old and New Testaments as are commonly received.
3. We believe that God before the foundation of the world for the purpose of His own glory, did elect a certain number of men and angels to eternal life, and unconditional an the part of the creature.
4. We believe that Adam fell from his state of rectitude and he involved himself and all his natural offspring in the state of death; and for that original transgression, we all are both filthy and guilty in the sight of a holy God.
5. We also believe that it is utterly out of the power of men as fallen creatures, to keep the law of God perfectly, and repent of their sins truly, as we believe in Christ, except that man be drawn by the Holy Spirit.
6. We believe in God's own appointed time and way by means which He has ordained, the elect shall be called, justified, pardoned and sanctified; and that it is impossible that we can utterly refuse he call, but shall be made willing by divine grace to receive the offers of mercy.
7. We believe that justification in the sight of God is only by the

imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ; received and applied by faith alone.

8. We believe in like manner, that God's elect shall not only be called and justified, but that they shall be converted, born again and changed by the effectual working of God's Holy Spirit.

9. We believe that such as are converted, justified, and called by His grace, shall persevere in holiness and never fall finally away.

10. We believe it to be a duty incumbent on all of God's people to walk religiously in God's works, not in the old covenant way of seeking life and favor of the Lord by it, but only as a duty from a principle of love.

11. We believe baptism and the Lord's Supper are gospel ordinances, both belonging to the true believers; and that persons who are sprinkled or dipped while in unbelief were not regularly baptised according to God's Word, and that such ought to be baptised after they are savingly converted into the faith of Christ.

12. We believe that every church is indendent in matters of discipline, and that Associations, Councils, and Conferences of several ministers or churches are not to impose on the churches the keeping or maintaining of any principle or practice contrary to the church's judgment.

13. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both of the just and the unjust, and a general judgment.

14. We believe the punishment of the wicked is everlasting and the joys of the righteous eternal.

15. We believe that no ministers have a righte to the administration of the ordinances only such as are regularly called and come under imposition of hands by the Presbytery.

16. We believe for the mutual comfort, union and satisfaction of several churches of the aforesaid faith and order ought to meet in an association way, wherein each church is to represent their case by their delegates, and attend as often as necessary to advise in such matters, but Associations, as such, are to be in no wise binding on churches without their consent, but only to sit and act as an advisory council.

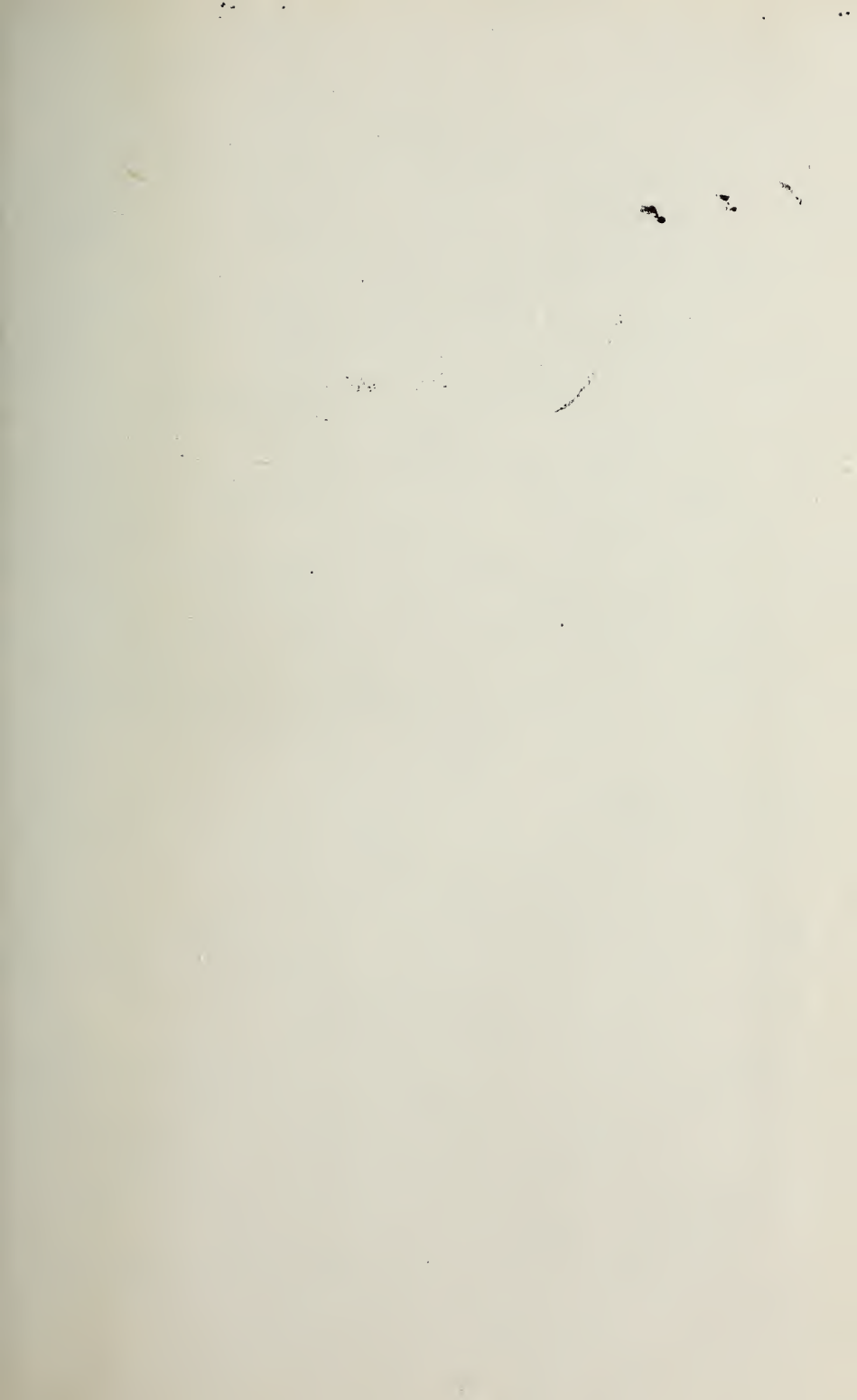
Articles 1 and 7, Chapter 3, London Confession of Faith: "God has (Isa. 46:10; Eph. 1:11; Heb. 6:7; Rom. 9:15-18) decreed in Himself from all eternity, by the most wise and holy counsel of His own will, freely and unchangeably, all things what soever come to pass; yet so as thereby God is neither the author of sin (James 1:15-17; 1 John 1:5) nor hath fellowship with any therein, nor is violence offered to the will of the creature; nor yet is the liberty or contingency of second causes taken away, but rather (Acts 4:27, 28; John 19:11) established, in which appears His wisdom in disposing all things, and power and faithfulness (Num. 23:19; Eph. 1:3-5) in accomplishing His decree."

"The doctrine of this high mystery of predestination is to be handled with special prudence and care; that men, attending the will of God revealed in His Word, and yielding obedience thereunto, may from the certainty of their effectual vocation be assured of their (Thess. 1:4, 5; 2 Pet. 1:10) eternal election; so shall this doctrine afford matter (Eph. 1:7; Rom. 11:33) of praise, reverence and admiration of God, and (Rom. 11:5, 6,) of humility, diligence and abundant (Luke 1:20) consolation to all that sincerely obey the gospel.

1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
2. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator in the beginning of his speech.
3. Every brother speaking shall adhere strictly to the subject under consideration and in no way reflect on any other brother.
4. No messenger shall absent himself from the Association while in conference without permission.

10. The Moderator shall not speak on any question before the Association until all the other messengers are through speaking, when he may give his views. After which any messenger having a right to speak may reply to any matter introduced by the Moderator.
11. Any member who violates any of the Rules of the Association shall be dealt with by the Association as it deems proper.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe in the being of God Almighty, eternal, unchangeable, of infinite wisdom, power, justice, holiness, goodness, mercy and truth; and this God has revealed Himself in His Word under the characters of Father, Son and Holy Ghost.

6. We believe in God's own appointed time and way by means which He has ordained. the elect shall be called, justified, pardoned and sanctified; and that it is impossible that we can utterly refuse he call, but shall be made willing by divine grace to receive the offers of mercy.

7. We believe that justification in the sight of God is only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ; received and applied by faith alone.

8. We believe in like manner, that God's elect shall not only be called and justified, but that they shall be converted, born again and changed by the effectual working of God's Holy Spirit.

9. We believe that such as are converted, justified, and called by His grace. shall persevere in holiness and never fall finally away.

10. We believe it to be a duty incumbent on all of God's people to walk religiously in God's works, not in the old covenant way of seeking life and favor of the Lord by it, but only as a duty from a principle of love.

11. RULES OF DECORUM

1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
2. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator in the beginning of his speech.
3. Every brother speaking shall adhere strictly to the subject under consideration and in no way reflect on any other brother.
4. No messenger shall absent himself from the Association while in conference without permission.
5. No messenger shall speak more than three times on the same subject without permission from the Association.
6. Messengers shall keep strict order while the business of the Association is being transacted.
7. No messenger shall be interrupted while speaking unless he violates the Rules of this Decorum.
8. No messenger shall address another in any term or appellation other than the title of brother.
9. The names of the members composing the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association desires.
10. The Moderator shall not speak on any question before the Association until all the other messengers are through speaking, when he may give his views. After which any messenger having a right to speak may reply to any matter introduced by the Moderator.
11. Any member who violates any of the Rules of the Association shall be dealt with by the Association as it deems proper.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe in the being of God Almighty, eternal, unchangeable, of infinite wisdom, power, justice, holiness, goodness, mercy and truth; and this God has revealed Himself in His Word under the characters of Father, Son and Holy Ghost.
2. We believe that Almighty God has made known His mind and will to the children of men in His Word; which word we believe to be of divine authority, and contains all things necessary to be known for the salvation of men and women. The same is comprehended as contained in the Books of the Old and New Testaments as are commonly received.
3. We believe that God before the foundation of the world for the purpose of His own glory, did elect a certain number of men and angels to eternal life, and unconditional an the part of the creature.
4. We believe that Adam fell from his state of rectitude and he involved himself and all his natural offspring in the state of death; and for that original transgression, we all are both filthy and guilty in the sight of a holy God.
5. We also believe that it is utterly out of the power of men as fallen creatures, to keep the law of God perfectly, and repent of their sins truly, as we believe in Christ, except that man be drawn by the Holy Spirit.
6. We believe in God's own appointed time and way by means which He has ordained, the elect shall be called, justified, pardoned and sanctified; and that it is impossible that we can utterly refuse he call, but shall be made willing by divine grace to receive the offers of mercy.
7. We believe that justification in the sight of God is only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ; received and applied by faith

alone.

8. We believe in like manner, that God's elect shall not only be called and justified, but that they shall be converted, born again and changed by the effectual working of God's Holy Spirit.

9. We believe that such as are converted, justified, and called by His grace, shall persevere in holiness and never fall finally away.

10. We believe it to be a duty incumbent on all of God's people to walk religiously in God's works, not in the old covenant way of seeking life and favor of the Lord by it, but only as a duty from a principle of love.

11. We believe baptism and the Lord's Supper are gospel ordinances, both belonging to the true believers; and that persons who are sprinkled or dipped while in unbelief were not regularly baptised according to God's Word, and that such ought to be baptised after they are savingly converted into the faith of Christ.

12. We believe that every church is independent in matters of discipline, and that Associations, Councils, and Conferences of several ministers or churches are not to impose on the churches the keeping or maintaining of any principle or practice contrary to the church's judgment.

13. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both of the just and the unjust, and a general judgment.

14. We believe the punishment of the wicked is everlasting and the joys of the righteous eternal.

15. We believe that no ministers have a righte to the administration of the ordinances only such as are regularly called and come under imposition of hands by the Presbytery.

16. We believe for the mutual comfort, union and satisfaction of several churches of the aforesaid faith and order ought to meet in an association way, wherein each church is to represent their case by their delegates, and attend as often as necessary to advise in such matters, but Associations, as such, are to be in no wise binding on churches without their consent, but only to sit and act as an advisory council.

Articles 1 and 7, Chapter 3, London Confession of Faith: "God has (Isa. 46:10; Eph. 1:11; Heb. 6:7; Rom. 9:15-18) decreed in Himself from all eternity, by the most wise and holy counsel of His own will, freely and unchangeably, all things what soever come to pass; yet so as thereby God is neither the author of sin (James 1:15-17; 1 John 1:5) nor hath fellowship with any therein, nor is violence offered to the will of the creature; nor yet is the liberty or contingency of second causes taken away, but rather (Acts 4:27, 28; John 19:11) established, in which appears His wisdom in disposing all things, and power and faithfulness (Num. 23:19; Eph. 1:3-5) in accomplishing His decree."

"The doctrine of this high mystery of predestination is to be handled with special prudence and care; that men, attending the will of God revealed in His Word, and yielding obedience thereunto, may from the certainty of their effectual vocation be assured of their (Thess. 1:4, 5; 2 Pet. 1:10) eternal election; so shall this doctrine afford matter (Eph. 1:7; Rom. 11:33) of praise, reverence and admiration of God, and (Rom. 11:5, 6,) of humility, diligence and abundant (Luke 1:20) consolation to all that sincerely obey the gospel.

3. Every brother speaking shall adhere strictly to the subject under consideration and in no way reflect on any other brother.
4. No messenger shall absent himself from the Association while in conference without permission.
5. No messenger shall speak more than three times on the same subject without permission from the Association.
6. Messengers shall keep strict order while the business of the Association is being transacted.
7. No messenger shall be interrupted while speaking unless he violates the Rules of this Decorum.
8. No messenger shall address another in any term or appellation other than the title of brother.
9. The names of the members composing the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association desires.
10. The Moderator shall not speak on any question before the Association until all the other messengers are through speaking, when he may give his views. After which any messenger having a right to speak may reply to any matter introduced by the Moderator.
11. Any member who violates any of the Rules of the Association shall be dealt with by the Association as it deems proper.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe in the being of God Almighty, eternal, unchangeable, of infinite wisdom, power, justice, holiness, goodness, mercy and truth; and this God has revealed Himself in His Word under the characters of Father, Son and Holy Ghost.
2. We believe that Almighty God has made known His mind and will to the children of men in His Word; which word we believe to be of divine authority, and contains all things necessary to be known for the salvation of men and women. 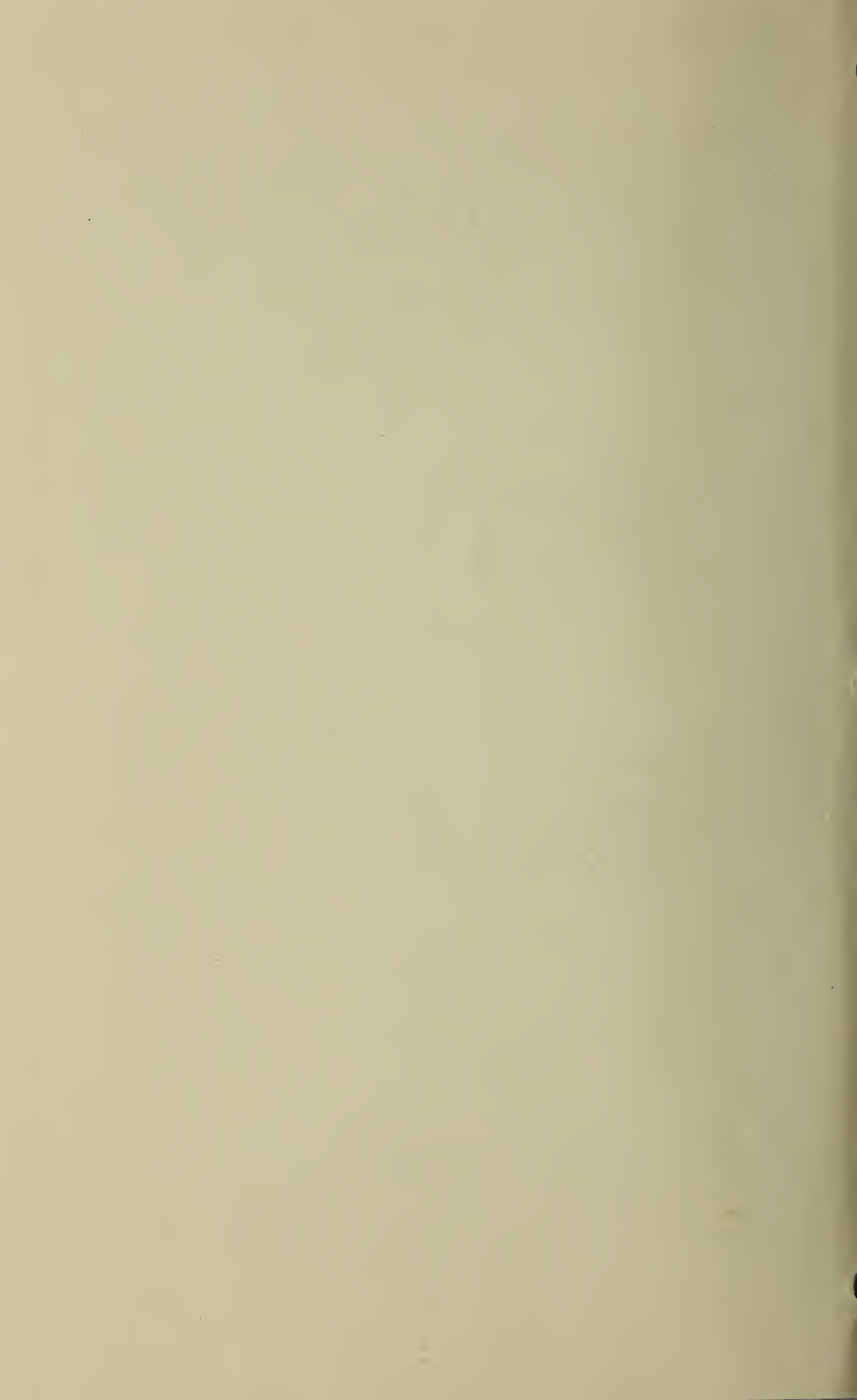

13. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both of the just and the unjust, and a general judgment.

14. We believe the punishment of the wicked is everlasting and the joys of the righteous eternal.

15. We believe that no ministers have a righte to the administration of the ordinances only such as are regularly called and come under imposition of hands by the Presbytery.

16. We believe for the mutual comfort, union and satisfaction of several churches of the aforesaid faith and order ought to meet in an association way, wherein each church is to represent their case by their delegates, and attend as often as necessary to advise in such matters, but Associations, as such, are to be in no wise binding on churches without their consent, but only to sit and act as an advisory council.

10. The Moderator shall not speak on any question before the Association until all the other messengers are through speaking, when he may give his views. After which any messenger having a right to speak may reply to any matter introduced by the Moderator.
11. Any member who violates any of the Rules of the Association shall be dealt with by the Association as it deems proper.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe in the being of God Almighty, eternal, unchangeable, of infinite wisdom, power, justice, holiness, goodness, mercy and truth; and this God has revealed Himself in His Word under the characters of Father, Son and Holy Ghost.
2. We believe that Almighty God has made known His mind and will to the children of men in His Word; which word we believe to be of divine authority, and contains all things necessary to be known for the salvation of men and women. RULES OF DECORUM

1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
2. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator in the beginning of his speech.
3. Every brother speaking shall adhere strictly to the subject under consideration and in no way reflect on any other brother.
4. No messenger shall absent himself from the Association while in conference without permission.
5. No messenger shall speak more than three times on the same subject without permission from the Association.
6. Messengers shall keep strict order while in business of the association is being transacted.
7. No messenger shall be interrupted while speaking unless he violates the rules of decorum.
8. No messenger shall address another in any term or appellation other than the title of brother.
9. The names of the members composing the Association shall be enrolled by the clerk and called over as often as the Association desires.
10. The Moderator shall not speak on any question before the Association until all the other messengers are through speaking, when he may give his views. After which any messenger having a right to speak may reply to any matter introduced by the Moderator.
11. Any member who violates any of the Rules of the Association shall be dealt with by the Association as it deems proper.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe in the being of God Almighty, eternal, unchangeable, of infinite wisdom, power, justice, holiness, goodness, mercy and truth; and this God has revealed himself in His Word under the character of Father, Son and Holy Ghost.
2. We believe that Almighty God has made known His mind and will to the children of men in His Word; which word we believe to be of divine authority, and contains all things necessary to be known for the salvation of men and women. The same is comprehended as contained in the Books of the Old and New Testaments as are commonly received.
3. We believe that God before the foundation of the world for the purpose of His own glory, did elect a certain number of men and angels to eternal life, and unconditional an the part of the creature.
4. We believe that Adam fell from his state of rectitude and he involved himself and all his natural offspring in the state of death, and for that original transgression, we all are both filthy and guilty in the sight of a holy God.
5. We also believe that it is utterly out of the power of men as fallen creatures, to keep the laws of God perfectly, and repent of their sins truly, as we believe in Christ, except that man be drawn by the Holy Spirit.
6. We believe in God's own appointed time and way by means which He has ordained, the elect shall be called, justified, pardoned and sanctified; and that it is impossible that we can utterly refuse the call, but shall be made willing by divine grace to receive the offers of mercy.
7. We believe that justification in the sight of God is only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ; received and applied by faith alone.
8. We believe in like manner, that God's elect shall not only be called and justified, but that they shall be converted, born again and changed by the effectual working of God's Holy Spirit.
9. We believe that such as are converted, justified, and called by His grace shall persevere in holiness and never fall finally away.
