

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I. This body shall be known as The Wake Baptist Association.

ARTICLE II. The object of this Association shall be the promotion of Christ's Kingdom among men and the means of accomplishing this shall be in strict conformity with the New Testament.

ARTICLE-III. This Association shall be composed of Delegates chosen by the Churches connected with it, each Church being entitled to at least one delegate, and one delegate for each hundred members or fraction thereof. Ministers who are members of the Churches connected with this body shall be considered members of the Association ex-officio, and ministers who are not in charge of or connected with churches within the bounds of this Association, who present testimonials of good standing in the Baptist denomination, may become members of this Association by payment of \$1.00 annually. Provided ministers who aided in the organization of this Association shall be considered members so long as they are in good standing in the Baptist Denomination. Also, any layman in good standing in the Baptist Church may become an annual member by the payment of \$1.00.

ARTICLE IV. The delegates from each church shall bear a letter certifying their appointment. Giving an account of the condition of the Church, and a Statement of all funds contributed for benevolent purposes during the year.

ARTICLE V. The Officers of this body shall be a Moderator, Vice Moderator, Clerk, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, and a Statistician, whose duties shall be such as are generally performed by such officers. In addition, there shall be appointed a Home Mission Board, Foreign Mission Board, Educational Board, Sunday School Board, and an Executive Board, which latter shall have charge of the work of the Association during the interim of its annual session and three members of the executive board shall constitute a quorum and the officers of the body shall be ex-officio members. The other boards shall have supervision of the work of the Association along their several lines, subject to the executive board of the Association, and shall so organize the territory of the Association as to accomplish the best results, but not contrary to the executive board of the Association.

ARTICLE VI. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside during the deliberations of the body, to enforce an observance of the Constitution, preserve the decorum, appoint committees, decide all questions of order, give his opinion concerning any subject under discussion after others have spoken or when called upon, and give the casting vote if a tie.

ARTICLE VII. It shall be the duty of the clerk to report the

proceedings of each annual session and superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes among the churches.

ARTICLE VIII. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds sent up by the Churches or collected during the session of the body, and distribute the same for the purpose for which they were sent or collected. He shall not pay any order on the treasurer except it be signed by the Moderator and the Clerk of the Association, subject to the provisions of the by-laws.

ARTICLE IX. Any church desiring to become a member of this body shall present her petition to an annual session of the Association through delegates appointed for that purpose and if the Association shall consent to receive her the moderator shall extend to the delegate the right hand of fellowship.

ARTICLE X. This association shall not maintain fellowship with any Church that does not preserve Gospel order.

ARTICLE XI. This Association may invite visiting brethren to seats, and extend to them all privileges of the body save that of voting. The Association shall meet on Wednesday before the third Sabbath in August at such place as the Association may select.

ARTICLE XII. All ministers composing the Association shall hold three ministerial meetings a year in such places as the brethren shall designate.

ARTICLE XIII. We shall receive no minister into the Association but those who have good moral character.

ARTICLE XIV. Any Baptist Sunday School or Missionary Society within the bounds of this Association may become a member of this Association by sending voluntary contributions. Each shall be entitled to one delegate.

ARTICLE XV. We shall withdraw the right hand of fellowship from every minister who walks disorderely or contrary to the Gospel rule.

ARTICLE XVI. Each Church connected with this Association can continue its membership by supporting this constitution.

ARTICLE XVII. By appointment of the Association there shall be preached during each session an introductory sermon.

ARTICLE XVIII. There shall be a Woman's Auxiliary to the Wake Baptist Association, both Junior and Senior Departments.

ARTICLE XIX. The object of the Auxiliary shall be to aid the Association in the extension of Christ's Kingdom.

Section 1. The officers of the Auxiliary shall be a President, Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, and treasurer of each department.

Section 2. All officers of the Auxiliary shall be elected annually.

Section 3. All moneys collected by the Auxiliary shall be turned over to the finance committee of the Association in session and a receipt taken for same.

Section 4. All the reasonable expenses of the Auxiliary shall be paid by the Association.

Section 5. The time of the meeting of the Auxiliary shall be simultaneous with the meeting of the Association.

ARTICLE XX. This constitution may be amended at any annual session of the Association by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. Schools, societies and individuals shall be acknowledged in the minutes of the Association.

Section 2. Before the final adjournment of the Association all the funds, notes, etc., shall be counted by the finance committee and treasurer. The treasurer shall give the finance committee a receipt for the amount placed in his hands.

Section 3. The treasurer shall pay out no money except on order written by the clerk and signed by the moderator and clerk.

Section 4. After the expense of the Association shall have been paid the remaining Association funds shall be applied to such purposes as the Association may direct.

The Executive Board shall execute plans adopted by the Association.

Section 5. The Auditor shall audit the accounts of the Treasurer and make annual reports of the Association.

Section 6. The duties of the boards provided for in the constitution shall be such as are usually performed by such boards in other similar bodies.

MODERATOR'S RECOMMENDATIONS

1. That all people exercise more faith in Jesus Christ, and unceasingly strive to practice His teachings as found in the New Testament.

2. That the church will ever encourage people everywhere to be law-abiding, good citizens, honest, trustworthy, truthful and industrious.

3. That these days of prosperity will not last always, I recommend that the Church will teach people to be more economical, spend money wisely, looking forward to be where they are not, homeowners.

4. The fact that the cost of living is higher in the advance of prices and that church officials are touched by the higher prices of commodities, the church therefore will do well to increase its giving money to its pastor, the poor, Missions and Christian Education.

5. That each pastor in the confines of this Association will ever see to it that the "Sovereignty" of the church is upheld and earnestly watch so that no external force by State Body or National may enter unlawfully, to disrupt its program and divert its interests and means.

A. That the "Mission Circle," the lawful and Baptist Directory, recognized name now exists in most of our churches of this Body. I do earnestly urge each pastor and church official to work with that branch of the church, especially during these times of transition and new development; and see that, if you please, first, that you have a Mission Circle in your church and other branches that belong there ,too. Secondly, that the Mission Circle represents into the Woman's Auxiliary of this Association; thus making a strong Department of the Woman's Auxiliary, ever cooperating and working with the brethren as hitherto for many years.

6. That the Woman's Auxiliary of this Association be advised and encouraged to represent into the Woman's Home and Foreign Mission Convention of North Carolina, using the procedure as the brethren do.

7. That pastors and all officials of the church attend the Institue held each year at Shaw, to more fully acquaint ourselves with the Bible, the doctrine, ancient and modern practices of the Baptist and other churches.

A. That this Body support the said Institute held in the Spring at Shaw, financially as much as it is reasonable to do.

8. To those churches that are ready to pay for service rendered by the pastor—two Sundays per month, and want to have them, I recommend the start, and full support in every way by all church members the two regular Sunday Services per month, and every Sunday if possible.

9. That we as a Body increase our giving money to the support of Shaw, our great Baptist College, especially placing in the Student Loan Fund money for worthy young men of our churches preparing for the ministry.

10. The Home and Foreign Fields of Missions need added money. I therefore urge all church members to give more money than a penny per Sunday for Missions and Christian Education.

11. That the Standard of one dollar per member of each Baptist Church be our financial goal for the next fiscal year of this Association for Missions and Christian Education.

12. That this Body will support as far as our strength will allow the program of the State Baptist Convention of North Carolina, and further encourage, if may the able efforts of Rev. Thomas A. Kilgore, the Executive Secretary.

13. We urge our churches to buy literature sold by the Book Store in the Baptist Headquarters, Raleigh. A. We further urge that all people subscribe for, pay, and read the "Baptist Informer" regularly.

14. That the Association meet in a one-day Extra Session in some church to which we may be invited to assemble, some time in the early spring of 1947. The details to be left to the Executive Board.

15. That the pastors and churches in general will ever welcome home the returning Servicemen from the Army, and help them in every way possible to become Christian soldiers. Help them get jobs with equal pay for the same work done by anybody.

16. Let us urge church membebrs everywhere—first to stop using strong drink, stop attending games, playing ball and going to movie picture shows on the Sabbath Day.

17. That a joint committee on officers and finance be appointed and function, beginning today at this session, thus carrying ou the theme of this program.

PROCEEDINGS

After a spiritual selection was sung, an offering was raised. followed with the presentation of visitors by Rev. H. O. Eaton. Adjournment.

The Wednesday afternoon session was led by Revs. T. J. Foster, H. B. Floyd, and followed with an address "The Layman's Place In Kingdom Building," by Prof. C. W. Foster, Wilson, N. C. He pointed out (1) A layman must be a Christian, (2) bring others to the Kingdom, (3) Infuence others of the community.

Rev. H. D. Eaton, Vice-Moderator, then presented Rev. Geo. S. Stokes, Moderator, to give his annual message.

The address was filled with appreciation for the work that the pastors and churches are doing, with inspiring, practical and Christian truths to build a better world. (See Moderator's recommendations). After which, a Committee on Moderator's Address was appointed.

"United In Kingdom Building" was discussed as follows: The Woman's Auxiliary, Mrs. B. E. Barrett; The Woman's Missionary Union, Mrs. Ellen T. Powell; Wake County Missionary Union, Bro. O. P. Dunn: Ministers' and Deacons' Union, Rev. A. A. Morrisey. All these organizations showed improvement spiritually and financially and more determined spirit to unite in Kingdom Building.

Rev. Thomas A. Kilgore, Executive Secretary for Baptists of North Carolina gave a brief report of the Association's contribution to the unified program with the total amount \$7728.34.

After this report, Bro. C. L. Laws, terasurer, made his report, attested by Rev. A. A. Anderson, auditor. Adopted. The report of Committee on Officers was then made. Adopted. (See report).

Adjournment.

In the Wednesday evening session, 8:00 P. M., with the Woman's Auxiliary in charge, a most enjoyable program was presented by the local Mission Circle, followed with a sermon.

Adjournment.

Thursday, 10:00 A. M. — The praise service was led by Bros. Albritton and Pulley, and followed by a discussion "United In Kingdom Building Through the Relationship of Church Officials," by Dr. O. S. Bulock. Dr. Bullock stated "A God-called preacher has something that a school cannot give but he needs training just like the doctor or teacher. The minister is the administrator of the church. If the deacons and pastor can't work together the church is a failure. The deacon's place is not to dictate to the preacher. Every officer is elected by the church. If the church has the Holy Ghost it will select officers of the same."

Rev. G. E. Cheek represented Shaw in the absence of Dr. R. P. Daniel at which time he spoke on "Constructive Cooperation, An Irresistible Weapon." Rev. Cheek spoke briefly and pointedly and he very well represented Shaw University.

Rev. J. W. White, director of B. T. U. Training of the General Baptist Convention next addressed the association. His subject was two-fold: (1) What about your B. T. U.? (2) Have You Got Good Religion?

Next, Rev. V. T. Williams, wife and son brought greetings to the body from Baltimore, Md.

Adjournment.

The Thursday afternoon praise service was led by Rev. Mc-Keiver, after which Prof. Garrett Laws, Garner, N. C., addressed the group on "The Layman's Place in United Kingdom Building," and he spoke informingly and pointedly.

6. That the churches in this Association encourage the respective families to maintain daily Eible reading and prayer—to the end that home-life of the constituencies of the Wake Association may become more Christ-like.

Whereas, the opportunities and demands for obtaining an education are so great we make this report calling attention to parents and leaders of the church to use their influence to further the training program of the church and the public school in every way.
