ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. We believe in only one true and living God, and that there are three persons in the Godhead, the Father, Son and Holy Ghost.
- 2. We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testament are the Words of God and the only rule of faith and practice.
 - 3. We believe in the doctrine of eternal and particular election.
 - 4. We believe in the doctrine of original sin.
- 5. We believe in man's incompetency to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by nature of his own free will and ability.
- 6. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ.

- 7. We believe that God's elect are called, converted, regenerated and sanctified by the Holy Spirit.
- 8. We believe the saints are preserved in Christ Jesus and called and shall never fade away.
- 9. We believe that full baptism and the Lord's Supper are ordinances of Jesus Christ, and that true believers are the only subjects of these ordinances—that the true mode of baptism is by immersion.
 - 10. We believe in the resurrection of the dead and a general judgment.
- 11. We believe the joys of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked will be eternal.
- 12. We believe that no minister has the right to administer the ordinances only such as are regularly called and come under the imposition of hands by the presbytery.

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
- 2. A Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.
- 3. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall arise from his seat and address the Moderator when he is about to make his speech.
- 4. The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by any except the Moderator till he is done speaking.
- 5. He shall strictly adhere to the subject, and in no wise reflect on the person who spoke before, so as to make remarks on his slips, failings or imperfections; but shall fairly state the matter as nearly as he can so as to convey his light or ideas.
- 6. No person shall abruptly break off or absent himself from the Association without liberty obtained from it.
- 7. No person shall rise and speak more than three times on one subject without liberty obtained from the Association.
- 8. No member of the Association shall have liberty of laughing during the sitting of the same, nor whispering in the time of public speech.
- 9. No member of the Association shall address another in any appellation but the title of Brother.
- 10. The Moderator shall not interrupt any member in his speech or prohibit him from speaking till he gives his light on the subject except he break the rules of this Decorum.
- 11. The names of the several members of the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association requires.
- 12. The Moderator shall be entitled to the same privilege of speech as any other member, provided the chair be filled, and he shall not vote unless the Association be equally divided.
- 13. That any member who shall wilfully and knowingly break these rules shall be reproved by the Association as they shall think proper.



CONSTITUTION

1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different churches in our union, and duly sent to represent them in the Association who shall be members whom they judge best qualified for that purpose, and producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, shall be entitled to a seat.

2. In the letters from the different churches there shall be expressed their number in full fellowship, those baptised, received by letter, dis-

missed, excommunicated and dead since the last Association.

3. The members thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord it over God's heritage, nor shall they have any ecclesiastical power over the churches, nor shall they infringe on any of the internal rights of any church in the union.

4. The Association, when convened, shall be governed by a proper

Decorum.

5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk who shall be

chosen by the suffrage of the members present.

6. Any church may be admitted into this union, who shall petition by letter and delegates, and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly, shall be received by the Association, and manifested by the Moderator giving the delegates the right hand of fellowship.

7. Every church in the union shall be entitled to representation in

the Association.

8. Every query presented by any member of the Association shall be once read, and before it be debated the Moderator shall put it to a vote, and, if there be a majority for its being debated, it shall be taken into consideration and be deliberated; but, if there be a majority against it, it shall be withdrawn.

9. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association, except it be withdrawn by the member who

made it.

10. The Association shall endeavor to furnish the churches with the minutes of the Association, the best method for effecting that purpose

shall be at the discretion of the future associations.

11. We think it absolutely necessary that we should have an Associational fund for defraying the expenses of the same, for the raising and supporting of which we think it the duty of each church in the union to contribute voluntarily such sums as they think proper, and send by the hands of their delegates to the Association, and the money thus

contributed by the churches and received by the Association shall be deposited in the hands of a treasurer by the Association who shall be accountable to the Association for all money by him received and paid out according to the direction of the Association.

12. There shall be an Associational Book kept, wherein the proceedings of every Association shall be regularly recorded by a secretary appointed by the Association, who may receive a compensation yearly

for his trouble.

13. The minutes of the Association shall be read and corrected, if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association arises.

14. Amendments to this plan or form of government may be made at any time by a majority of the union, when they deem it necessary.

15. The Association shall have power (1) To provide for the general union of the churches; (2) To endeavor to preserve inviolably a chain of communion among the churches; (3) To give the churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty; (4) To inquire into the cause why churches fail to represent themselves at any time in the Association; (5) To appropriate the means contributed by the churches for an Associational Fund to any purpose they may think proper; (6) To withdraw from any church in the union which shall violate the rules of this decorum or deviate from the orthodox principles of our religion; (7) To admit any of the distant brethren in the ministry who may be present, to assist in the transaction of business during their setting; (8) To adjourn themselves to any future time and place they may think most convenient to the churches in the union.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 2. We believe that the scriptures of the Old and New Testament is the written word of God and the only rule of faith and practice.
 - 3. We believe in the doctrine of eternal and particular election.
 - 4. We believe in the doctrine of original sin.
- 5. We believe in man's impotency to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by nature of his own free will and ability.
- 6. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ.
- 7. We believe that God's elect are called, converted, regenerated and sanctified by the Holy Spirit.
- 8. We believe the saints are preserved in Jesus Christ and called and shall never fall finally away.

CONSTITUTION

1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different churches in our union, and duly sent to represent them in the Association who shall be members whom they judge best qualified for that purpose, and producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, shall be entitled to a seat.

2. In the letters from the different churches there shall be expressed their number in full fellowship, those baptised, received by letter, dis-

missed, excommunicated and dead since the last Association.

3. The members thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord it over God's heritage, nor shall they have any ecclesiastical power over the churches, nor shall they infringe on any of the internal rights of any church in the union.

4. The Association, when convened, shall be governed by a proper

Decorum.

5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk who shall be

chosen by the suffrage of the members present.

6. Any church may be admitted into this union, who shall petition by letter and delegates, and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly, shall be received by the Association, and manifested by the Moderator giving the delegates the right hand of fellowship.

7. Every church in the union shall be entitled to representation in

the Association.

8. Every query presented by any member of the Association shall be once read, and before it be debated the Moderator shall put it to a vote, and, if there be a majority for its being debated, it shall be taken into consideration and be deliberated; but, if there be a majority against it, it shall be withdrawn.

9. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association, except it be withdrawn by the member who

made it.

10. The Association shall endeavor to furnish the churches with the minutes of the Association, the best method for effecting that purpose

shall be at the discretion of the future associations.

11. We think it absolutely necessary that we should have an Associational fund for defraying the expenses of the same, for the raising and supporting of which we think it the duty of each church in the union to contribute voluntarily such sums as they think proper, and send by the hands of their delegates to the Association, and the money thus contributed by the churches and received by the Association shall be deposited in the hands of a treasurer by the Association who shall be accountable to the Association for all money by him received and paid out according to the direction of the Association.

12. There shall be an Associational Book kept, wherein the proceedings of every Association shall be regularly recorded by a secretary appointed by the Association, who may receive a compensation yearly

for his trouble.

13. The minutes of the Association shall be read and corrected, if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association arises.

14. Amendments to this plan or form of government may be made at any time by a majority of the union, when they deem it necessary.

15. The Association shall have power (1) To provide for the general union of the churches; (2) To endeavor to preserve inviolably a chain of communion among the churches; (3) To give the churches all necess-

ary advice in matters of difficulty; (4) To inquire into the cause why churches fail to represent themselves at any time in the Association; (5) To appropriate the means contributed by the churches for an Associational Fund to any purpose they may think proper; (6) To withdraw from any church in the union which shall violate the rules of this decorum or deviate from the orthodox principles of our religion; (7) To admit any of the distant brethren in the ministry who may be present, to assist in the transaction of business during their setting; (8) To adjourn themselves to any future time and place they may think most convenient to the churches in the union.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe in only one true and living God, and that there are three persons in the Godhead, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost.

2. We believe that the scriptures of the Old and New Testament is the written word of God and the only rule of faith and practice.

3. We believe in the doctrine of eternal and particular election.

4. We believe in the doctrine of original sin.

5. We believe in man's impotency to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by nature of his own free will and ability.

6. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only

b ythe imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ.

7. We believe that God's elect are called, converted, regenerated and sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

8. We believe the saints are preserved in Jesus Christ and called and

shall never fall finally away.

9. We believe that baptism and the Lord's Supper are ordinances of Jesus Christ, and that true believers are the only subjects of these ordinances, and that the true mode of baptism is by immersion.

10. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both of just and the unjust, and a general judgment and the punishment of the wicked will

be everlasting and the joys of the righteous will be eternal.

11. We be eve that no minister has the right to administer the ordinances only such as are regularly called and come under the imposition of hands by the presbytery, and in fellowship with a church of our faith and order.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.

2. A Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.

3. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall arise from his seat and address the Moderator when he is about to make his speech.

4. The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by

any except the Moderator till he is done speaking.

5. He shall strictly adhere to the subject, and in no wise reflect on the person who spoke before, so as to make rmarks on his slips, failings or imprfections; but shall fairly state the matter as nearly as he can so as to convey his light or ideas.

6. No person shall abruptly break off or absent himself from the

Association without liberty obtained from it.

7. No person shall rise and speak more than three times on one subject without liberty obtained from the Association.

8. No member of the Association shall have liberty of laughing

during the the sitting of the same, nor whispering in the time of public speech.

9. No member of the Association shall address another in any appellation but the title of Brother.

10. The Moderator shall not interrupt any member in his speech or prohibit him from speaking till he gives his light on the subject except he break the rules of this Decorum.

11. The names of the several members of the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association

requires.

12. The Moderator shall be entitled to the same privilege of speech as any other member, provided the chair be filled, and he shall not vote unless the Association be equally divided.

Surviving besides her 12 children, one brother, H. G. Billings, 28 grandchildren, 41 great grandchildren and one great, great grandchild, a number of nieces and nephews and many, many friends to mourn her passing.

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Her funeral was conducted by Elders C. B. Kilby, R. N. Joines and the writer, her unworthy pastor at Union, in the presence of a large crowd of sad and sorrowing relatives and friends, her body was laid to rest in the church cemetery to await the adoption, yes the redemption of her body at the resurrection of the dead, and join her disembodied spirit and be translated in her entirety amid the inconceivable glories of an eternal day, where she will enjoy beauties and splendors never imagined on earth in the land of heavenly glory, the eternal and abiding city, by reason of the electing grace of God, the firm and everlasting covenant, the redeeming blood, the high, holy, and effectual calling having been made partaker of divine nature. Yes, where all of God's vessels of mercy will be carried some sweet and happy day. Our home is lonely now, since you have gone away,

1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different churches in our union, and duly sent to represent them in the Association who shall be members whom they judge best qualified for that purpose, and producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, shall be entitled to a seat.

2. In the letters from the different churches there shall be expressed their number in full fellowship, those baptised, received by letter, dis-

missed, excommunicated and dead since the last Association.

3. The members thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord it over God's heritage, nor shall they have any ecclesiastical power over the churches, nor shall they infringe on any of the internal rights of any church in the union.

4. The Association, when convened, shall be governed by a proper

Decorum.

5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk who shall be

chosen by the suffrage of the members present.

6. Any church may be admitted into this union, who shall petition by letter and delegates, and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly, shall be received by the Association, and manifested by the Moderator giving the delegates the right hand of fellowship.

7. Every church in the union shall be entitled to representation in

the Association.

8. Every query presented by any member of the Association shall be once read, and before it be debated the Moderator shall put it to a vote, and, if there be a majority for its being debated, it shall be taken into consideration and be deliberated; but, if there be a majority against it, it shall be withdrawn.

9. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association, except it be withdrawn by the member who

made it.

10. The Association shall endeavor to furnish the churches with the minutes of the Association, the best method for effecting that purpose

shall be at the discretion of the future associations.

11. We think it absolutely necessary that we should have an Associational fund for defraying the expenses of the same, for the raising and supporting of which we think it the duty of each church in the union to contribute voluntarily such sums as they think proper, and send by the hands of their delegates to the Association, and the money thus contributed by the churches and received by the Association shall be deposited in the hands of a treasurer by the Association who shall be accountable to the Association for all money by him received and paid out according to the direction of the Association.

12. There shall be an Associational Book kept, wherein the proceedings of every Association shall be regularly recorded by a secretary appointed by the Association, who may receive a compensation yearly

for his trouble.

13. The minutes of the Association shall be read and corrected, if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association arises.

14. Amendments to this plan or form of government may be made at any time by a majority of the union, when they deem it necessary.

15. The Association shall have power (1) To provide for the general union of the churches; (2) To endeavor to preserve inviolably a chain of communion among the churches; (3) To give the churches all necess-

ary advice in matters of difficulty; (4) To inquire into the cause why churches fail to represent themselves at any time in the Association; (5) To appropriate the means contributed by the churches for an Associational Fund to any purpose they may think proper; (6) To withdraw from any church in the union which shall violate the rules of this decorum or deviate from the orthodox principles of our religion; (7) To admit any of the distant brethren in the ministry who may be present, to assist in the transaction of business during their setting; (8) To adjourn themselves to any future time and place they may think most convenient to the churches in the union.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe in only one true and living God, and that there are three persons in the Godhead, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost.

2. We believe that the scriptures of the Old and New Testament is the written word of God and the only rule of faith and practice.

3. We believe in the doctrine of eternal and particular election.

4. We believe in the doctrine of original sin.

5. We believe in man's impotency to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by nature of his own free will and ability.

6. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only

b vthe imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ.

7. We believe that God's elect are called, converted, regenerated and sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

8. We believe the saints are preserved in Jesus Christ and called and

shall never fall finally away.

9. We believe that baptism and the Lord's Supper are ordinances of Jesus Christ, and that true believers are the only subjects of these ordinances, and that the true mode of baptism is by immersion.

10. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both of just and the unjust, and a general judgment and the punishment of the wicked will

thjust, and a general judgment and the punsiment of the wicked will be everlasting and the joys of the righteous will be eternal.

11. We believe that no minister has the right to administer the ordinances only such as are regularly called and come under the imposition of hands by the presbytery, and in fellowship with a church of our faith and order.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.

2. A Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.

3. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall arise from his seat and address the Moderator when he is about to make his speech.

4. The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by

any except the Moderator till he is done speaking.

5. He shall strictly adhere to the subject, and in no wise reflect on the person who spoke before, so as to make rmarks on his slips, failings or imprfections; but shall fairly state the matter as nearly as he can so as to convey his light or ideas.

6. No person shall abruptly break off or absent himself from the

Association without liberty obtained from it.

7. No person shall rise and speak more than three times on one subject without liberty obtained from the Association.

8. No member of the Association shall have liberty of laughing during the the sitting of the same, nor whispering in the time of public speech.

9. No member of the Association shall address another in any appellation but the title of Brother.

10. The Moderator shall not interrupt any member in his speech or prohibit him from speaking till he gives his light on the subject except he break the rules of this Decorum.

11. The names of the several members of the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association

requires.

12. The Moderator shall be entitled to the same privilege of speech as any other member, provided the chair be filled, and he shall not vote unless the Association be equally divided.

13. That any member who shall wilfully and knowingly break these

rules shall be reproved by the Association as they think proper.

CONSTITUTION

1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different churches in our union, and duly sent to represent them in the Association who shall be members whom they judge best qualified for that purpose, and producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, shall be entitled to a seat.

2. In the letters from the different churches there shall be expressed their number in full fellowship, those baptised, received by letter, dis-

missed, excommunicated and dead since the last Association.

3. The members thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord it over God's heritage, nor shall they have any ecclesiastical power over the churches, nor shall they infringe on any of the internal rights of any church in the union.

4. The Association, when convened, shall be governed by a proper

Decorum.

5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk who shall be

chosen by the suffrage of the members present.

6. Any church may be admitted into this union, who shall petition by letter and delegates, and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly, shall be received by the Association, and manifested by the Moderator giving the delegates the right hand of fellowship.

7. Every church in the union shall be entitled to representation in

the Association.

8. Every query presented by any member of the Association shall be once read, and before it be debated the Moderator shall put it to a vote, and, if there be a majority for its being debated, it shall be taken into consideration and be deliberated; but, if there be a majority against it, it shall be withdrawn.

9. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association, except it be withdrawn by the member who

made it.

10. The Association shall endeavor to furnish the churches with the minutes of the Association, the best method for effecting that purpose

shall be at the discretion of the future associations.

11. We think it absolutely necesssary that we should have an Associational fund for defraying the expenses of the same, for the raising and supporting of which we think it the duty of each church in the union to contribute voluntarily such sums as they think proper, and send by the hands of their delegates to the Association, and the money thus contributed by the churches and received by the Association shall be deposited in the hands of a treasurer by the Association who shall be accountable to the Association for all money by him received and paid out according to the direction of the Association.

12. There shall be an Associational Book kept, wherein the proceed-

12. There shall be an Associational Book kept, wherein the proceedings of every Association shall be regularly recorded by a secretary appointed by the Association, who may receive a compensation yearly

for his trouble.

13. The minutes of the Association shall be read and corrected, if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association arises.

14. Amendments to this plan or form of government may be made at any time by a majority of the union, when they deem it necessary.

15. The Association shall have power (1) To provide for the general union of the churches; (2) To endeavor to preserve inviolably a chain of communion among the churches; (3) To give the churches all necess-

ary advice in matters of difficulty; (4) To inquire into the cause why churches fail to represent themselves at any time in the Association; (5) To appropriate the means contributed by the churches for an Associational Fund to any purpose they may think proper; (6) To withdraw from any church in the union which shall violate the rules of this decorum or deviate from the orthodox principles of our religion; (7) To admit any of the distant brethren in the ministry who may be present, to assist in the transaction of business during their setting; (8) To adjourn themselves to any future time and place they may think most convenient to the churches in the union.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe in only one true and living God, and that there are three persons in the Godhead, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost.

2. We believe that the scriptures of the Old and New Testament is the written word of God and the only rule of faith and practice.

3. We believe in the doctrine of eternal and particular election.

4. We believe in the doctrine of original sin.

5. We believe in man's impotency to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by nature of his own free will and ability.

6. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only

b ythe imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ.

7. We believe that God's elect are called, converted, regenerated and sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

8. We believe the saints are preserved in Jesus Christ and called and

shall never fall finally away.

9. We believe that baptism and the Lord's Supper are ordinances of Jesus Christ, and that true believers are the only subjects of these ordinances, and that the true mode of baptism is by immersion.

10. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both of just and the unjust, and a general judgment and the punishment of the wicked will

be everlasting and the joys of the righteous will be eternal.

11. We believe that no minister has the right to administer the ordinances only such as are regularly called and come under the imposition of hands by the presbytery, and in fellowship with a church of our faith and order.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.

2. A Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.

3. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall arise from his seat and address the Moderator when he is about to make his speech.

4. The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by

any except the Moderator till he is done speaking.

5. He shall strictly adhere to the subject, and in no wise reflect on the person who spoke before, so as to make rmarks on his slips, failings or imprfections; but shall fairly state the matter as nearly as he can so as to convey his light or ideas.

6. No person shall abruptly break off or absent himself from the

Association without liberty obtained from it.

7. No person shall rise and speak more than three times on one

subject without liberty obtained from the Association.

8. No member of the Association shall have liberty of laughing during the the sitting of the same, nor whispering in the time of public speech.

9. No member of the Association shall address another in any appellation but the title of Brother.

10. The Moderator shall not interrupt any member in his speech or prohibit him from speaking till he gives his light on the subject except he break the rules of this Decorum.

11. The names of the several members of the Association shall be

enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association

requires.

12. The Moderator shall be entitled to the same privilege of speech as any other member, provided the chair be filled, and he shall not

vote unless the Association be equally divided.

13. That any member who shall wilfully and knowingly break these rules shall be reproved by the Association as they think proper.
