

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE 1. This body shall be known as The Wake Baptist Association

ARTICLE II. The object of this Association shall be the promotion of Christ's Kingdom among men and the means of accomplishing this shall be in strict conformity with the New Testament.

ARTICLE III. This Association shall be composed of Delegates chosen by the Churches connected with it, each Church being entitled to at least one delegate, and one delegate for each hundred members or fraction thereof. Ministers who are members of the Churches connected with this body shall be considered members of this Association. Ex-officers and ministers who are not in charge of or connected with churches within the bounds of this Association who present testimonials of good standing in the Baptist Denomination and any layman in good standing may become an annual member by the payment of \$1.00.

ARTICLE IV. The delegates from each church shall bear a letter certifying their appointment giving an account of the condition of the Church, and a statement of all funds contributed for benevelont purposes during the year.

ARTICLE V. The officers of this body shall be a Moderator, Vice Moderator, Clerk, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, and a Statistician, whose duties shall be such as are generally performed by such officers. In addition, there shall be appointed a Home Mission Board, Foreign Mission Board, Educational Board, Sunday School Board, and an Executive Board which later shall have charge of the work of the Association during the intermin of its annual session and three members of the executive board shall constitute a quorum and the officers of the body shall be ex-officio members. The other boards shall have supervision of the work of the Association along their several lines, subject to the executive board of the Association, and shall so organize the territory of the Association as to accomplish the best results, but not contrary to the executive board of the Association.

ARTICLE VI. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside during the deliberations of the body, to inforce an observance of the Constitution, preserve the decorum, appoint committees, decide all questions of order, give his opinion concerning any subject under discussion after others have spoken or when called upon and give the casting vote in the event of a tie.

ARTICLE VII. It shall be the duty of the clerk to report the proceedings of each annual session and superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes among churches.

ARTICLE VIII. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds sent up by the Churches or collected during the session of the body, and distribute the same for the purposes for which they were sent or collected.

He shall not pay any order on the Treasurer except it be signed by the Moderator and the Clerk of the Association, subject to the provisions of the by-laws.

APTICLE IX. Any Baptist Church or organization seeking membership in this Association must present a petition to the Association in session through delegates appointed for that purpose.

Section 1. Upon the reception of such Church or organization the Moderator shall extend to the delegate the right hand of fellowship, on behalf of the Association. This Association shall not maintain the fellowship with any Church or Organization that is not in Gospel Order.

ARTICLE X. The Association shall meet on Wednesday and Thursday before the third Sunday in August, each year with the Church or Institution unless otherwise designated by the Executive Board.

ARTICLE XI. We shall withdraw the right hand of fellowship from any minister who walks disorderly or contrary to the Gospel rule.

ARTICLE XII. Each Church connected with this Association may continue its membership by supporting this Constitution.

AFTICLE XIII. The Wake Baptist Sunday School Convention, The Wake Baptist Missionary Union, The Woman's Auxiliary and the Ministers' And Deacon's Union are Auxiliaries of the Association.

ARTICLE XIV. There shall be a Ministers and Deacons Union as an auxiliary of the Parent Body and the Wake Baptist Association.

Section 2. The object of the Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall be primarily to better acquaint Ministers and Deacons, also, other members of the Baptist denomination with the Christian Way of Life

Section 3. The officers of the Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall be, a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer.

Section 4. The officers of the said Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall be elected at each annual session of the Wake Association.

Section 5. Ministers, Deacons and members of Churches of the Association in good and regular standing, and supporting the objectives of the Association, shall be counted members of the Union.

Section 6. A free will offering will be given in the Ministers' and Deacons' Union by each member, to help spread the gospel and its teachings.

Section 7. The Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall submit a written report to each Annual Session, of all its programs, activities and funds.

Section 8. The Association shall provide necessary funds to lawfully and reasonably support the said Union programs as directed by the Parent Body.

Section 9. The Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall meet each fifth Saturday and Sunday unless otherwise advised by the Association.

ARTICLE XV. The object of the Auxiliary shall be to aid the Association in the extension of Christ's Kingdom.

Section 1. The officers of the Auxiliary shall be President, Vice President, Recording Secretary and Treasurer of each department.

Section 2. All officers of the Auxiliary shall be elected annually.

Section 3. All moneys collected by the Auxiliary shall be turned over to the finance committee of the Association in session and a receipt taken for same.

Section 4. All the reasonable expenses of the Auxiliary shall be paid by the Association.

Section 5. The time of meeting of the Auxiliary shall be simultaneous with the meeting of the Association.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE XVII. This constitution may be amended at any annual session of the Association by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.

Section 1. Schools, Societies, and individuals shall be acknowledged in the minutes of the Association.

Section 2. Before the final adjournment of the Association all the funds, notes, etc., shall be counted by the finance committee and treasurer. The Treasurer shall give the finance committee a receipt for the amount placed in his hands.

Section 3. The Treasurer shall pay out no money except on order written by the Clerk and signed by the Moderator and Clerk.

Section 4. After the expense of the Association shall have been paid the remaining Association funds shall be applied to such purposes as the Association may direct.

The Executive Board shall execute plans adopted by the Association.

Section 5. The Auditor shall audit the accounts of the Treasurer and make annual reports of the Association,

Section 6. The duties of the boards provided for in the constitution shall be such as are usually performed by such boards in other similar bodies.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE MID-YEAR SESSION OF THE WAKE ASSOCIATION

Held With the First Baptist Church Fuguay Springs, North Carolina

The Mid-Year Session of the Wake Baptist Association met with the First Baptist Church, Fuguay Springs, Sunday, April 29, 1951. The Moderator called the session to order at 11:00 A. M. The Senior Choir of Wake Baptist Grove, Garner, sang the opening Hymn. The 23rd Psalms was repeated in unison for the Scripture, after which the prayer, Jesus taught his disciples was recited in concert. "Jesus Keep Me Near the Cross," was the next selection. After the devotion, Mr. J. W. Yeargin came ferward and discussed the theme, "The Functioning Church Through the Sunday School." The speaker stated that he was glad the committee had included him on their Mid-Year Program. He further stated that the church is not adquately organized until it includes the Sunday School. The Sunday School officers and teachers have the great opportunity to win the lost to Christ. Mr. Yeargin presented a very informative and impressive address.

Mr. W. H. Quarles, Jr., was the next speaker who came before the Association. He stated that he brings greetings from the executive heads of the State Convention and the New President of Shaw University, William R. S'rassner. Mr. Quarles pointed out that if the 1700 Baptist churches of North Carolina would contribute \$1 per person annually to the objectives of our convention we would over raise enough money for our work. If we are to get the true missionary spirit, we must become apart of that Scripture which teaches us, "God so loved the world that He gave his only begotton Son that whosoever thus believeth in him shall not perish but have everlasting life."

After the conclusion of Mr. Quarles' talk, the choir sang, "I Am Bound For Higher Ground." Rev. Stokes presented the Rev. Nylus Avery, who was licensed and ordained at Wake Baptist Grove Church, but was leaving this Association to assume his new duties as minister of a Baptist Church in Asheville, North Carolina. Reverend Avery said that his heart was filled with grief and joy as he leaves the many friends in this vicinity. The speaker's text was: "Brethern, I count not myself to have

apprehended: but this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before."—Philippians 3:13. Reverend Avery built his message around the following propositions: (1) Singleness of Purpose, this one thing I do. (II) There must be ceasless effort on the part of the Punner. The speaker used the life of Paul to illustrate his message. A very high spirit was manifested as the choir sang. "He Is So Real To Me"

Peacons Jones and Robert Wilder were asked to lift

the offering, the amount realized was \$77.00.

The moderator called for visitors at this time and Brothers Whitted, Jones and Forest, of the Mt Bright Baptist Church of Hillsboro were presented to the body. The morning's session adjourned with, "God Be With You", and Reverend Avery pronounced the benediction.

The Woman's Auxiliary had charge of the afternoon's ssssion. The Rev. H. B. Floyd and Rev. John Parks conducted the devotion. Several selections were sung, after which Mrs. Perry presented Miss Eva Merritt who spoke on, "The Functioning Church Through the Missionary Department" The speaker pointed out that the church is a body of baptized believers, and there were too many Missionary departments interdependent of the church. They should be under the authority of the church for the missionary department has as its purpose bringing the Kingdom of God into the world.

Proceedings of the Eighty-Fifth Annual Session of the WAKE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

The Eighty-Fifth annual session of the Wake Baptist Association met with the Elizabeth Baptist Church, near Spring Hope, North Carolina. The devotionals were led by the Reverend Charles T. Jones and the Rev. A. L. Bridges. A portion of the 4th chapter of Romans was read for the Scripture. Reverend Bridges offered prayer, after which, "Jesus eKeps Me Near the Cross," was sung. A short discussion on the theme of the Association was led by Reverend Jones.

Moderator Stokes asked the Reverend D. Hargrove, the pastor of the host church to make the welcome address.
