CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I. This body shall be known as the Wake Baptist Association.

ARTICLE II. The object of this Association shall be the promotion of Christ's Kingdom among men, and the means of accomplishing this shall be in strict conformity with the New Testament.

ARTICLE III. This Association shall be composed of Delegates chosen by the Churches connected with it, each Church being entitled to at least one delegate, and one delegate for each hundred members of the Churches connected with this body shall be considered members of this Association. Ex-officers and ministers who are not in charge of or connected with Churches within the bounds of this Association who present testimonials of good standing in the Baptist Denomination and any layman in good standing may become annual members by the payment of \$1.00.

ARTICLE IV. The delegates from each church shall bear a letter certifying their appointment giving an account of the condition of the church, and a statement of all funds contributed for benevolent purposes during the year.

ARTICLE V. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Vice Moderator, Clerk, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, Auditor and Historian.

Section 1. The Boards of this Association shall be an Executive, consisting of twelve members; including the officers of the Association, a Ministerial Board; also, such committees as may be authorized by the Association.

ARTICLE VI. The officers and Board Members shall be elected at the Annual meeting of the Association.

Section 1. The Members of the Executive Board shall assume their duties at the close of the Annual Meeting.

Section 2. The Ministerial Board Members shall serve as occasion may require.

ARTICLE VII. The Moderator shall open all meetings punctually, and preside during the deliberations of the Body; enforce the observance of the constitution, decide all questions of order; give his opinion concerning any subject under discussion after others have spoken or when called upon, and give the casting vote in the event of a tie.

ARTICLE VIII. The Vice Moderator shall discharge the duties of the Moderator in his absence.

ARTICLE IX. The Clerk shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Association; superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes; keep on file the printed minutes and other important papers of the Association, and shall serve as the Secretary of the Executive Board.

ARTICLE X. The Treasurer shall receive all money contributed by the member churches, make disbursements as authorized by the Association. He shall not pay any order on the Treasury except it be signed by the Moderator and Clerk. He shall make his annual report to the Association.

ARTICLE XI. The auditor shall audit the Treasurer's book and attest his annual report to the Association.

ARTICLE XII. The Corresponding Secretary, as directed by the Moderator, shall communicate with the churches and serve as the Secretary of the Ministerial Board.

ARTICLE XIII. The Historian shall collect facts of interest of the Association and member Churches and shall make a report to each annual meeting of the Association.

ARTICLE XIV. Any Baptist Church or organization seeking membership in this Association must present a petition to the Association in session through delegates appointed for that purpose.

Section 1. Upon the reception of such Church or organization the Moderator shall extend to the delegate the right hand of fellowship, on behalf of the Association. This Association shall not maintain the fellowship with any Church or organization that is not in Gospel order.

ARTICLE XV. The Association shall meet on Wednesday and Thursday before the Third Sunday in August each year with the Church or Institution which invites it unless otherwise designated by the Executive Board.

ARTICLE XVI. We shall withdraw the right hand of fellowship from any minister who walks disorderly or contrary to the Gospel rule.

ARTICLE XVII. Each Church connected with this Association may continue its membership by supporting this Constitution.

ARTICLE XVIII. The Wake Baptist Sunday School Convention, The Wake Baptist Missionary Union, The Woman's Auxiliary and the Ministers' and Deacon's Union are Auxiliaries of the Association.

ARTICLE XIX. There shall be a Ministers' and Deacons' Union as an Auxiliary of the Parent Body of the Wake Baptist Association.

Section 1. The object of the Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall be primarily to better acquaint Ministers and Deacons, also other members of the Baptist Denomination with the Christian Way of Life.

Section 2. The officers of the Ministers' and Deacon's Union shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer.

Section 3. The Officers of said Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall be elected at each annual session of the Wake Association.

Section 4. Ministers, Deacons and members of Churches of the Association in good and regular standing, and supporting the objectives of the Association, shall be counted members of the Union.

Section 5. A free will offering will be given in the Ministers' and Deacons' Union by each member to help spread the gospel and its teachings.

Section 6. The Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall submit a written report to each Annual Session, of all its programs, activities and funds.

Section 7. The Association shall provide necessary funds to lawfully and reasonably support the said Union Programs as directed by the Parent Body.

Section 8. The Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall meet each fifth Saturday and Sunday unless otherwise advised by the Association.

ARTICLE XX. The Object of the Auxiliary shall be to aid the Association in the extension of Christ's Kingdom.

Section 1. The Officers of the Auxiliary shall be President, Vice President, Recording Secretary and Treasurer of each department.

Section 2. All officers of the Auxiliary shall be elected annually.

Section 3. All moneys collected by the Auxiliary shall be turned over to the Finance Committee of the Association in session and a receipt taken for same.

Section 4. All reasonable expenses of the Auxiliary shall be paid by the Association.

Section 5. The time of meeting of the Auxiliary shall be simultaneous with the meeting of the Association.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE XXI. This Constitution may be amended at any Annual Session of the Association by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.

Section 1. Schools, Societies and Individuals shall be acknowledged in the minutes of the Association.

Section 2. Before the final adjournment of the Association all the funds, notes, etc., shall be counted by the Financial Committee and Treasurer. The Treasurer shall give the Finance Committee a receipt for the amount placed in his hands.

Section 3. The Treasurer shall pay out no money except on order written by the Clerk and signed by the Moderator and Clerk.

Section 4. After the expense of the Association shall have been paid the remaining funds shall be applied to such purposes as the Association may direct. The Executive Board shall execute plans adopted by the Association.

Section 5. The Auditor shall audit the accounts of the Treasurer and make annual reports to the Association.

Section 6. The duties of the Boards provided for in the Constitution shall be such as are usually performed by such boards in other similar bodies.

**PROCEEDINGS OF MID-YEAR SESSION OF THE WAKE
BAPTIST ASSOCIATION HELD WITH THE
PLEASANT GROVE BAPTIST CHURCH
WENDELL, NORTH CAROLINA**

The Semi-Annual Session of the Wake Baptist Association met with the Pleasant Grove Baptist Church, the Reverend George S. Stokes, pastor on Sunday, March 29th, 1953. The local Sunday School had charge of that phase of the work. After the close of the Sunday School, Reverend Stokes stated that the church and community were happy to have the Association to meet in their new building. The pastor and the good people of Pleasant Grove have wrought a great work in building such a modern plant. It is a credit to the church and community and we praise God for such wonderful Blessings.

After the remarks by our moderator, the Reverend C. R. Trotter, accompanied with his senior choir from Good Hope Baptist Church came forward to bring the message of the hour. The speaker announced his text from Thessalonians 3rd chapter and 10th verse, using as a theme: "The Place of Christian Education In Our Age." The speaker pictured the conditions of ancient Israel as described by Isaiah, "From the sole of the foot even to the head there is no soundness in it; but wounds, and bruises, and putrifying sores: they have not been closed, neither bound up. — Your country is desolate, your cities are burned with fire: your land, strangers devour it in your presence."

He liken our own age to that of Israel with our secular education being controlled by Christian principles. Education has been defined as "acquisition of certain skills and knowledge; it is the possession of certain verifiable facts". Christian is the acquisition of certain skills and facts plus the control of Christian Standards.

Reverend Trotter suggested three major problems in Christian Education: "We have mistaken secular education for that which is distinctive Christian." Second: "There is a growing worldness among the leaders of education." Third: "We have soft peddled the major doctrine of the church like sin". As a result, our Christian Education is lacking in much that would make it Christian.

The speaker concluded by saying that Jesus gave to the world the major blueprint for a Christian world, the "Kingdom of God". It is the duty of every Christian to build his life by the Master's plan; it is the duty of nations to build lives by the plan and will of God.

The minister brought the Association an interesting as well as an inspiring message.

The Reverend O. L. Sherrill, the Executive Secretary of the General Baptist State Convention brought us greetings from that body.

The Moderator called for visitors, the Reverend J. B. Crandel, the new pastor of Pilot Baptist Church was presented to the body.

The Eighty-Seventh Annual Session of the Wake Baptist Association met with the Jones Hill Baptist Church, near Spring Hope, North Carolina. The Vice Moderator, Reverend C. H. Heath called the Association together at 10:15 o'clock Wednesday morning, August 12th, 1953. The audience joined in singing, "Jesus Keeps Me Near The Cross", for the opening selection. The Scripture was read by the Reverend Millard Jones and Deacon R. B. Rayford offered the prayer. After another selection, Reverend Heath turned the meeting over to Moderator Stokes who made some remarks and asked the pastor, the Reverend C. C. Jones to make the Welcome Address. Reverend Jones stated in a humorous way the association was meeting at Jones Hill Church, Rev. Jones was the pastor. He said Jones was a great name so the body might expect a great Session. He stated also, that the good people of Jones Hill had gone to great expense for the comfort of the Association. Mr. B. O. Wilcox gave the response on behalf of the body.

The Moderator asked for echoes of the field. Expressions were made by Mr. R. B. Rayford of St. Matthew; Mr. Fred Debnam, Good Hope; C. S. Dunn, New Bethel and others.

The Reverend Stokes presented the speaker, The Reverend Clyde R. Walton, who was scheduled to discuss the topic: "Responsibility of the Wake Baptist Association to the Community". The speaker defined the word "Community" as a group of people who are governed by the same laws with same interest". A Christian is the name given person who follow the principles and teachings of Jesus Christ. The Wake Association seeks to fit one to live in community as a better Christian.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The Association re-assembled at 2:00 p. m. with devotionals conducted by the Reverend J. H. Cooke and Reverend L. B. Hockaday. The moderator's message was the next item to claim our attention. After some introductory remarks, the moderator set forth his message in the following recommendations:

1. That the Church will unceasingly strive to make all people Christians.

2. That Pastors will teach the Baptist Church Covenant to their Church Members more often.

3. The need of knowing the Doctrine of the Baptist Church is obvious. Therefore, I urge the churches of this As-

sociation to hold Leadership Training Courses during the year so as to indoctrinate the membership in the Beliefs and Practices of the Baptist Church.

4. Vacation Bible Schools are vital to the religious intelligence of the Church. May I persuade you therefore, that the Bible School be conducted in our churches.

5. That the Standard of \$1.00 per member of each church of this body be maintained, and that all pastors and churches earnestly strive to raise the same, for missions and Christian Education and report the same through your Association.

6. For the benefit of our members who may not qualify to enter college at Shaw University, I recommend that a Bible Institute be established by this Body under the guidance and approval of the General Baptist Convention of North Carolina, to be held this fall.

7. That the Institute be held at such a time and place most suitable to all concerned.

8. Because of changing conditions in living, that makes it extremely inconvenient for many Brethern to attend their beloved Association in August, I most humbly ask that the 1954 Annual Session, be held Wednesday and Thursday after the second Sunday in July, not changing, however, the constitution now.

9. That this body adopt a tentative budget and earnestly strive to raise the money and reach the goal.

10. The fact that General Baptist Convention of North Carolina convenes in Rocky Mount, I urge us to attend in large numbers to get a better knowledge of our Baptist Church doings with the State.

11. Some churches are talking two Sunday services but are not supporting one. Where the church wants two regular preaching services per month and will support them, I recommend two regular services.

12. That this body will meet in Extra-Session at such time as the Executive Board designate and to the church we may be invited.

The remainder of the afternoon was used for various reports and a joint session with the Woman's Auxiliary. SEE REPORTS.

The next item on our program was the introductory sermon. In preparation for the message, the Springfield Baptist Church Choir came to the choir stand and sang, "The Church Is One Foundation". The Scripture was taken from 1 Cor. 13th Chapter. The prayer was offered by Reverend John Parks

while the choir sang softly, "Sweet Hour of Prayer." The Reverend J. H. Clanton, pastor of the speaker, the Reverend O. H. Broadie made the presentaton. Reverend Broadie came forward and asked his choir to sing, "I Love Thy Kingdom, Lord." The speaker announced his subject: "The Church Is Ready For Its World's Task". The speaker said the following things were needful for the church:

1. A Praying Church was needful.
2. A Practical Church is Needful — a Church which meets the needs of the people in a material way.
3. A Spiritual Church is Needful.
4. Through Christ all the members of the Church are joined together.

The minister brought a very thoughtful message to the body. After the sermon, Mrs. Odessa Lane sang: "Speak To My Heart, Lord Jesus."

The moderator introduced our visitors next. The following persons came forward: Reverend and Mrs. B. H. Gloss, Mrs. Rodgers and Reverend Leach.

After the presentation of our visitors the Wednesday's Morning Session adjourned for dinner.

THURSDAY MORNING SESSION

The devotional was led by Reverend Millard Jones and the Reverend A. A. Crum. Reverend Jones made a few remarks after which the choir from Baptist Grove led the Association in a few minutes of song service.

The topic, "The Responsibility of the Wake Association to the Local Church", was discussed by the Reverend John Parks. The speaker suggested some avenues in which the Association could pursue to help the Local Church. The Association could offer courses on how to build the best style and type of church in the rural community. The Association could sponsor an ideal worship services, with proper music, proper atmosphere. Finally, the speaker said the Association must hold up the Christian Standards as found in the New Testament.

The Doctor Grady Davis was presented at this time as the New Acting Dean of the School of Religion of Shaw University. Doctor Davis stated that the School was offering two new courses this semester—one for ministers who could not qualify for college credits and other for ministers who could. They were given at night so the men might take advantage of them.

The speaker proceeded to use 11th Chapter of Genesis and the sixth verse for his theme, "And the Lord said, Behold, the people is one, and they all have one language; and this they begin to do; and now nothing will be restrained from them which they have imagined to do." The speaker supported his theme by illustrating "Unity". Lincoln was cited as a great president who believed in unity. Segregation was cited to keep us from unity.

Because of the funeral of the Reverend C. F. Pope, a one time pastor in the Wake Association and a member of the body, the Moderator asked that all the remainder of work of the Woman's Auxiliary be held jointly with the Association. Next on the program was the lifting of the morning offering and adjournment for dinner.

After dinner the Association reassembled at 2:00 P. M. with the Woman's Auxiliary in charge of the service. Mrs. James A. Avery and Mrs. W. A. Perry gave a few timely remarks. Mrs. Perry said: The Association could have a representative to visit our churches. This would strengthen the interest in the work. She said further that each church should have at least two Sundays of worship service. The Association should have broader leadership training programs. Mrs. Avery said it is the job of the Association to make New Christian characters out of people. Miss Penny Perry was asked to make comments. She said the Association should give our churches the blueprint of Christian work.

The time now had arrived for the sermon, the Reverend A. A. Anderson presented the Reverend C. H. Heath our Vice Moderator who came forward and announced his text from the 6th Chapter of Isaiah and the 8th verse, "Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying whom shall I send, and who will go for us: Then said I, Here am I send me." His subject was "Ready For Service". The speaker said Isaiah saw himself as unworthy for God's task. By the power of God Isaiah was made ready for the job and finally he served the people for God. Reverend Heath gave us a splendid message.

An offering was lifted to the amount of \$44.53. The association adjourned to meet in its Mid-Year session with the New Liberty Baptist Church near Youngsville, North Carolina and the next annual session with the First Baptist Church, Franklinton, North Carolina.
