### MINUTES

### OF SIXTEENTH ANNUAL SESSION

## N. C. FREE WILL BAPTIST SUNDAY SCHOOL CONVENTION-INSTITUTE

The sixteenth annual session of the N. C. Free Will Baptist Sunday School Convention-Institute convened with Mount Allen Junior College, Mount Olive, N. C., Thursday and Friday, March 17 and 18, 1955. The theme of this session was "In His Steps." The text used was 1 Peter 2:21, "For even hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps."

### THURSDAY MORNING, MARCH 17, 1955

Registration of delegates, visitors, ministers and officers was held from 9 o'clock until 10 o'clock.

The morning session was opened with congregational singing directed by Rev. Albert Coates. Rev. Herman Hersey, vice-president, presided over the morning session with Rev. Wayne Smith giving the invocation. The welcome address was given by Rev. Burkette Raper, president of Mount Allen Junior College. The response was by Mr. Hayes Pait.

Morning devotions were conducted by Rev. Wilbert Everton, using John 4:19-24 as his Scripture text. His subject was "In His Steps in Worship."

At this time Rev. Hersey called the convention into a short, introductory business session.

Minutes of Executive Board meetings of September 15, 1954, and January 27, 1955, were read and approved by motion duly made and carried. Also the minutes of Executive Board meeting of March 16, 1955, were read and approved.

The president's message was delivered by the president, Rev. Raymond Sasser. He used as his theme "Forward In His Steps," using Numbers 13:25 for his Scripture text. Rev. Sasser listed four ways in which we might go forward "In His Steps":

- 1. Forward "In His Steps" with a Spiritual Awakening.
- 2. Forward "In His Steps" with Education.
- 3. Forward "In His Steps" with Missions.
- 4. Forward "In His Steps" with the Sunday School United Program.

The morning worship service was opened with the congregation singing "Take My Life and Let It Be," followed with a solo, "Teach Me to Pray," by Mrs. Frank Hawkins, music instructor for Mount Allen College.

The convention message was delivered by Rev. Cecil Campbell, pastor of St. Mary's Free Will Baptist Church in New Bern, N. C. He was introduced by Rev. J. R. Davidson of Goldsboro, N. C. Rev. Campbell used Scripture from Psalm 1 for his text; Subject, "In His Steps."

There was an offering received in the amount of \$145.93 for Mount Allen College. Rev. Burkette Raper blessed the offering and offered grace for the noon meal.

The convention was adjourned until 2 o'clock.

#### THURSDAY AFTERNOON

The afternoon devotional was conducted by Rev. Willie Renfrow whose subject was "In His Steps in Praise." The congregation sang "Praise Him! Praise Him!" followed with prayer by Rev. Chester Phillips.

Rev. Lloyd Vernon, past president of the North Carolina State Convention of Churches, brought greetings from the State Convention.

Rev. C. H. Overman, secretary of the North Carolina League Convention, made some remarks concerning the League Convention. He urged each church with a league to be represented at the State League Convention this year which convenes with Mount Allen College.

Rev. S. A. Smith, superintendent of the Free Will Baptist Orphanage at Middlesex, N. C., brought a very inspiring and sad message to the convention. He stated that he was leaving his work at the orphanage in May, 1955. Rev. R. H. Jackson, the incoming superintendent, brought a few words of greeting.

Mrs. Raymond Sasser, secretary of the North Carolina Woman's Auxiliary Convention, gave a brief report from the Auxiliary Convention.

At this time Rev. Burkette Raper made a request for the Sunday schools to pledge to pay for the seats in the auditorium at Mount Allen College. The response was great with more than enough pledges to pay for the seats. Rev. Raper stated that if they received more than enough to pay for the seats, they would use the amount to repair them.

Rev. Joe Fort, editor of Free Will Baptist publications, brought greetings from the Press at Ayden, N. C. He gave to the convention some interesting information concerning the writing of the Sunday school literature. We were also urged to purchase the needed material for our Sunday schools from the Free Will Baptist Press.

Benediction was pronounced by Rev. Wayne Smith, and we were dismissed until the evening service at 7:30 o'clock.

#### THURSDAY EVENING

The evening service was opened with congregational singing. Rev. J. B. Starnes conducted the devotional period using "In His Steps in Evangelistic Endeavor" as his subject. We were favored with a solo by Rev. Starnes, followed with a duet by Miss Barbara Woodall and Rev. Jack Paramore, students of Mount Allen College.

Rev. Roy Rikard of Cramerton, N. C., brought the message of the evening.

The closing hymn, "Jesus Is Calling," was sung and the benediction was pronounced by Rev. Herman Hersey.

### FRIDAY MORNING, MARCH 18, 1955

The morning session was opened with congregational singing. The morning devotions were conducted by Rev. Daniel Merkh of Durham, N. C. He used as his subject "In His Steps in Prayer." Rev. Jack Paramore sang a solo, "No One Cares Like Jesus."

Rev. J. E. Wooten, resident manager of Cragmont Assembly, Inc., Black Mountain, N. C., gave a report about the work at Cragmont. He named several items that are much needed and stated that any items contributed by individuals or Sunday schools would be greatly appreciated. Rev. J. A. Evans, president of Cragmont, delivered a copy of the auditor's report for our files.

The denominational enterprise period was directed by Rev. Hubert Burress. Rev. M. L. Johnson represented the Church Finance Association and the State Superannuation Board. He gave many interesting facts pertaining to the work of both boards.

Rev. Jack Paramore, a student at Mount Allen College, brought greetings from the college. He gave a personal testimony and told us "why he loved Mount Allen College." He also coveted the earnest prayers of the people for himself and the college.

Rev. Rashie Kennedy represented the State Mission Board with a brief report.

Mrs. H. L. Spivey, secretary of the Central Second Union Sunday School Convention, gave an interesting report from the convention.

Mr. W. P. Bunn, president of the Second Western Sunday School Convention, gave the district convention report.

There was special prayer at this time for Mr. Walter Sandlin, New Bern, N. C., who is sick. Mr. Sandlin has been a very active and faithful member of the Fifth Eastern Sunday School Convention and is now serving as its president.

### First Session: Annual Sunday School Institute

Subject, "In His Steps in Denominational Wide Sunday School Endeavor." Rev. Albert Coates, director of state field work, presided over this session. The convention was given a very detailed report of the work done by Rev. Ballard, the field secretary. (See report.) Rev. Ballard was given a unanimous rising vote of thanks for the splendid job he had done.

### Second Session: Annual Sunday School Institute

Subject, "In His Steps Toward Better Sunday Schools." Rev. Herman Hersey, vice-president of the convention, presided over this session.

Rev. Burkette Raper talked on the subject, "Christ-Centered Worship Programs," stressing the importance of the Sunday school devotional periods.

Rev. Rashie Kennedy used for his subject, "Christ-Exalting Teaching Methods." He suggested five methods to use in teaching which are very helpful, as follows: story telling, recitation, discussion, lecturing and research.

Mr. Milton Wiggs, convention treasurer, gave the treasurer's report. (See report.) Motion to accept report. Motion carried.

Mr. W. L. Brickhouse gave the finance report in the absence of Mr. S. M. McCoy, chairman of Finance Committee. Motion to accept report. Motion carried.

The report of the Resolutions Committee was read by Rev. Raymond Sasser, in the absence of the chairman. Motion to accept report. Motion carried.

The Digest of Reports Committee report was given by Mrs. W. P. Bunn, chairman of committee. (See report.) Motion to accept report. Motion carried.

Motion that all money sent to Sunday School Convention be sent by check or money order. Motion carried.

Report of Registration Committee by Mr. Dennis Wiggs. Motion to accept report. Motion carried.

Motion that the North Carolina State Sunday School Convention-Institute convene with Mount Allen Junior College for the 1956 session. Motion carried.

Motion that the Executive Board approve the minutes and have them printed. Motion carried.

Rev. W. E. Renfrow, chairman of the Nominating Committee, gave the committee's report. (See report.) Motion to accept the report. Motion carried.

Rev. J. C. Griffin conducted the installation service, giving the officers and directors of the convention a great challenge for the new year.

Rev. Earl Glenn conducted the closing devotions, his theme: "In His Steps In Service."

The closing hymn was "Blest Be The Tie." We were dismissed with prayer by Rev. Earl Glenn.

### Report of the Director of Field Secretary Work for 1954-55

Ministers, Delegates and Friends,

As the director of the field secretary work of your State Convention-Institute, I shall endeavor to bring you a brief summary of the work that has been done this year.

I know that we become very bored sometimes with a lot of figures, but I remind you that all the figures that I give you have a bearing upon our convention work. After I have finished this report I shall be glad to have you ask any question that you have in mind regarding our field work.

Brother Ballard and I have tried to plan a schedule of work for the field secretary to follow, which would reach the most of our Sunday schools wherein we had requests to come. If your Sunday school hasn't been reached through our clinics or study courses and you desire some help through our department, then we request you to make your desires known to us in writing so that we may schedule a meeting with you this year.

This is a summary of work done by your field secretary:

Office work, 60 hours per month; individual letters written (inquiries), 284; total pieces of mail sent out, 15,136; over 1,000 copies of The Sunday School Reporter sent out per month; Sunday school clinics held, 23; number attending Sunday school clinics and rallies, approximately 400; other visits and contacts, 58; held two youth conferences at Cragmont with 129 in attendance, (taught Sunday School Manual at both); did personal contact work regarding four mission Sunday schools; attended five fellowship suppers; attended National Convention in behalf of state Sunday school work; attended State Association; spoke at Central District Sunday School Convention; spoke at Second Western Sunday School Convention; and spoke at the Third Eastern District Sunday School Convention.

The treasurer's report shows that these services cost the convention the following:

Miscellaneous Expenses (Mailing Permits, Filing Cabinet and \$57.70 to
Rev. Raymond Sasser for Traveling Expenses) \$198.52
Salary \$1,375.00
Mailing Machine and Supplies \$71.80

Total Cost of Field Secretary and Field Equipment \$2,361.19

### Minutes of Executive Board Meetings

OF THE

NORTH CAROLINA SUNDAY SCHOOL CONVENTION-INSTITUTE

#### September 15, 1954

The Executive Board of the North Carolina Free Will Baptist Sunday School Convention-Institute met on Wednesday night, September 15, 1954, at the Free Will Baptist Orphanage, Middlesex, N.
