CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I This body shall be known as the Wake Baptist Association.

ARTICLE II The objective of this Association shall be the promotion of Christ's Kingdom among men, and the means of accomplishing this shall be in strict conformity with the New Testament.

ARTICLE III This Association shall be composed of Delegates chosen by the Churches connected with it, each church being entitled to at least one delegate, and one delegate for each hundred members of the churches connected with this body shall be considered members of this Association. Ex-officers and members who are not in charge of or connected with churches within the bounds of this Association who present testimonials of good standing may become annual members by the payment of \$1.00.

ARTICLE IV. The delegates of each church shall bear a letter certifying their appointment giving an account of the condition of the church, and a statement of all funds contributed for benevolent purposes during the year.

ARTICLE V. The Officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Vice Moderator, Clerk, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, Auditor and **Historian**.

Section 1. The Board of this Association shall be an Executive, consisting of twelve members; including the officers of the Association, a Ministerial Board; also such committees as may be authorized by the Association.

ARTICLE VI The Officers and the Board Members shall be elected at the Annual meeting of the Association.

Section 1. The Members of the Executive Board shall assume their duties at the close of the Annual Meeting.

Section 2. The Ministerial Board Members shall serve as occasion may require.

ARTICLE VII The Moderator shall open all meetings punctually, and preside during the deliberation of the body; enforce the observance of the constitution, decide all questions of order; giving his opinion concerning any subject under discussion after others have spoken or when called upon, and give the casting vote in the event of a tie.

ARTICLE VIII The Vice Moderator shall discharge the duties of the Moderator in his absence.

ARTICLE IX The Clerk shall keep a record of the Proceedings of the Association; superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes;

keep on file the printed minutes and other important papers of the Association.

ARTICLE X The Treasurer shall receive all money contributed by the member churches, make disbursements as authorized by the Association. He shall not pay any order on the Treasurer except it be signed by the Moderator and Clerk. He shall make his annual report to the Association.

ARTICLE XI The Auditor shall audit the Treasurer's book and attest his annual report to the Association.

ARTICLE XII The Corresponding Secretary, as directed by the Moderator shall communicate with the churches and serve as the secretary of the Ministerial Board.

ARTICLE XIII The Historian shall collect facts of interest of the Association and member churches and make a report to each annual meeting of the Association.

ARTICLE XIV Any Baptist Church or organization seeking membership in this Association must present a petition to the Association in session through delegates appointed for that purpose.

Section 1. Upon reception of such Church or organization the Moderator shall extend to the delegates the right hand of fellowship, on behalf of the Association. This Association shall not maintain the fellowship with any Church or organization that is not in Gospel order.

ARTICLE XV The Association shall meet on Wednesday and Thursday before the Third Sunday in August each year with the Church or Institute which invites it unless otherwise designated by the Executive Board.

ARTICLE XVI We shall withdraw the right hand of fellowship from any minister wh walks disorderly or contrary to the Gospel rule.

ARTICLE XVII Each Church connected with the Association may continue its membership by supporting this Constitution.

ARTICLE XVIII The Wake Baptist Sunday School Convention, The Wake Baptist Missionary Union, the Woman's Auxiliary and the Ministers' and Deacons' Union are auxiliaries of the Association.

ARTICLE XIX There shall be a Minister's and Deacon's Union as an Auxiliary of the Parent Body of the Wake Baptist Association.

Section 1. The object of the Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall be primarily to better acquaint Ministers and Deacons also other members of the Baptist Denomination with the Christian Way of Life.

Section 2. The Officers of the Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer.

Section 3. The officers of the said Ministers' and Deacon's Union shall be elected at each annual session of the Wake Association.

Section 4. Ministers, Deacons and Members of the Churches of the Association in good and regular standing, and supporting the objectives of the Association, shall be counted members of the Union.

Section 5. A free will offering will be given in the Ministers' and Deacons' Union by each member to help spread the gospel and its teachings.

Section 6. The Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall submit a written report to each Annual Session, of its programs, activities and funds.

Section 7. The Association shall provide necessary funds to lawfully and reasonably support the said Union Programs as directed by the Parent Body.

Section 8. The Ministers' and Deacons' Union shall meet each fifth Saturday and Sunday unless otherwise advised by the Association.

ARTICLE XX The object of the Auxiliary shall be to aid the Association in the extension of Christ's Kingdom.

Section 1. The Officers of the Auxiliary shall be President, Vice President, Recording Secretary and Treasurer of each department.

Section 2. All officers of the Auxiliary shall be elected annually.

Section 3. All moneys collected by the Auxiliary shall be turned over to the Finance Committee of the Association in session and a receipt taken for the same.

Section 4. All reasonable expenses of the Auxiliary shall be paid by the Association.

Section 5. The time of meeting of the Auxiliary shall be simultaneous with the meeting of the Association.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE XXI This Constitution may be amended at any Session of the Association by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.

Section 1. Schools, Societies and Individuals shall be acknowledged in the minutes of the Association.

Section 2. Before the final adjournment of the Association all the funds notes, and etc., shall be counted by the Finance Committee and Treasurer. The Treasurer shall give the Finance Committee a receipt for the amount placed in his hands.

Section 3. The Treasurer shall pay out no money except on order written by the Clerk and signed by the Moderator and Clerk.

Section 4. After the expense of the Association shall have been paid the remaining funds shall be applied to such purposes as the Association may direct. The Executive Board shall execute plans adopted by the Association.

Section 5. The Auditor shall audit the accounts of the Treasurer and make annual report to the Association.

Section 6. The duties of the Board provided for the Constitution shall be such as are usually performed by such boards in other similar **bodies.**

PROCEEDINGS

The Ninety-Second Annual Session of the Wake Baptist Association and the Fortieth Annual Session of the Woman's Auxiliary met with the Pilot Baptist Church. The devotional services were conducted by the Reverend C. H. Heath and the Reverend Odell Wright. "Jesus Keep Me Near the Cross" was the opening Hymn. The Scripture was taken from the Psalms, read by Reverend Heath; the Reverend Wright offered the prayer. "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms" and "I Am Thine O' Lord" were also sung.

Moderator Stokes came forward and declared the meeting opened for business. In the absence of the pastor, Deacon Clemons gave us brief words of welcome. Dr. C. E. Askew gave the response.

The next item to claim our attention was a topic, "The Doctrine of Sin." This topic was suppose to have been discussed by the Reverend Garland Wiggins, but in his stead, the Reverend A. M. Wiggins ascended the rostrum and stated that a person would not know how to avoid a thing unless he knew something about the thing. We should learn all we can about sin so we will know how to avoid it. Sin is any thing that makes us revolt against the Will of God. The speaker called our attention to the Genesis account of sin. He said that although man went against the Will of God, God made provisions for his return. This was done, first by the aid of the Law and then by the aid of the prophets. Finally, God sent His only begotten Son into the world to save mankind from sin.

By this time the pastor had arrived. He stated that the Pilot Baptist Church was fifty years old, and in all of that time the Wake Association had never convened with them. In view of that fact, the members and friends of the community were extremely happy to have the Association to be their guest.

Moderator Stokes had expressions from the Reverend J. W. Jones, the leader of the Johnston Association. Several laymen made remarks: Brothers A. C. Parrish, Oak City; Robert Haskins, Wilson; U. G. Jones, Wakefield; Smith, Juniper; Clemons, Gethsemane; Corinna Dunn, Good Hope and others.

The time had arrived for the morning sermon, the Reverend T. A. Watkins accompanied the Reverend G. E. Jones to the pulpit. Reverend Watkins made a few remarks and presented Reverend Jones to bring the message. He announced his text from Matthew's Gospel, 17th Chapter and 5th verse. "While he yet spake, behold, a bright cloud overshadowed them: and behold a voice out of the cloud, which said, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased; hear ye him," The speaker's theme was "Hear The Lord." Reverend Jones said That man must be able to hear God. We can hear God through the Scripture; we can hear him through nature. Every creature seems willing to hear the voice of

God except man, but if we are to be true people of God, we must hear, said the minister.

After the sermon, brother U. G. Jones of Wakefield called for the offering.

Moderator Stokes presented the new pastors and visitors. Reverend J. E. Bond was presented to the Association as the new pastor of New Liberty Baptist Church. Dr. Sherrill brought greetings from the General Baptist State Convention. Reverend J. W. Fleming of the Department of Religious Education of the Convention also brought greetings. The Reverend W. R. Griggs was presented to our body. He heads the work of Inter-racial Cooperation of the Southern Baptist Convention. Brother Griggs stated that he was available to work with the Wake Association to preach and teach. He further pointed out some of the qualities of a good leader. He said a good leader knows where he is going and he will take some one with him. There are three hundred thousand Negroes between the ages of 8-10 unsaved in the southland. Reverend Jones gave the benediction.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon session of the Wake Baptist Association opened at 2:00 P.M. with singing "Glory to His Name." The Scripture was the 133rd Psalm. The prayer was offered by Deacon Clemons. Deacon R. C. Wheelless led in singing, "Leaning on the Everlasting Arm."

After the devotionals, Dr. C. E. Askew came before the body to discuss the topic: "Regeneration or the New Birth." The speaker set forth the following ideas: 1. Conviction, 2. Godly Sorry, 3. Decision, 4. Regeneration or New Creature, 5. Justification, 6. Sanctification.

The time had now arrived for the Moderator's Address. Vice Moderator C. H. Heath presented Reverend Stokes who announced his subject: "The Opportunities and Duties of the Wake Baptist Association." Reverend Stokes set forth his message in the form of recommendations. They are as follows:

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. That all Christians strive to obtain more of the riches of God's grace through daily Bible study and prayer.
2. That winning souls to Christ and a life consecrated and dedicated to His service will be the unceasing practice of the church.
3. That the pastor will stress, the high importance of each member of his church taking the Training Courses now offered by your Association, dealing with the Baptist Church Covenant; emphasizing the doctrines, Bible teachings and practices of the Baptist Church.

4. That the pastors and all officials of each Church of this Association will gird themselves like men, be strong in the Lord, stress the sovereignty of the Church, with Christ to lead, humbly, admonish, but loudly sound the words of Jesus' prayer, "That they all maybe one," (John 17-21) Let the Executive Board of this Association and the Executive Board of the Wake County Sunday School Convention work out together, if you please, a united program of training for the constituency of this great body of Christian believers.

(a) That the entire department of Leadership Training will ever be tied into the State and Southern Baptist Conventions' Program of Religious Training for their approval.

5. Let us strongly urge every member of each church to give money for Missions and Christian Education the Bible way, "as God hath prospered him." I Cor. 16:2. May I declare unto you that every pastor, deacon, yea! all who have to do with leading any group of members in the church, should see to it that each member pay his or her \$1.00 per year through the church for the objectives of your Association. Send the money to Baptist Headquarters and bring it to this Association, too.

a. Let us consider Churches that need some help, put ourselves in their places and earnestly strive to give them aid, and their pastors too.

6. God is not pleased with the action of any Church or Convention allowing the people to gather thereabout on Sunday to carry on Commercialism and many forms of evil practices. May I therefore, appeal to Christian principles in the Church members of this Association to rise up in open condemnation of such existing conditions and do something to stop these evil practices.

7. Let us support Shaw University and earnestly strive to keep going a Christian College to train our youth.

8. The Woman's Auxiliary of this Association is doing a good work in reaching back to the local Church through the Mission Circles. Every pastor and the official staff of each church is hereby urged to see that an active mission circle is in your church. Let that circle represent into the Woman's Auxiliary of this Body with a large delegation and money. My position here is, if the Women pay \$50 in the total money for Missions in the Church, give their circle credit and the money to bring to the Auxiliary.

9. That this Body, and all Christians in these perilous times will exercise steadfast faith in Jesus Christ, pray earnestly and stay humbly before Almighty God for Divine Guidance in all things.

10. That the pastors and churches strive to conduct a Daily Vacation Bible School each year at their respective churches.

11. That we meet in Extra Session next spring at a church to which this body may be invited. That the Committee on Place of Meeting seek such a place and report please, at this session.

12. To help deserving members of this Association who need aid to study at Shaw University School of Religion, I recommend that \$500 be ear-marked for that purpose.

13. The proposed budget for the next fiscal year of this Association ending July 31, 1959 be as follows:

The Wednesday evening services were conducted by the Woman's Auxiliary. See Auxiliary Report.

THURSDAY MORNING SESSION

The devotionals were conducted by the Reverends Herman Fort and Clyde B. Walton. "Am I A Soldier of the Cross" was the opening selection. The Scripture was taken from I John 1-12. The prayer was offered by Brother Fort. After the devotionals a few expressions were made by several of the members of the Association.

In the absence of Dr. J. Neal Hughley, Reverend Walton was asked to discuss the theme "The Doctrinal Claims of Salvation in the Baptist Church" Reverend Walton defined salvation as being saved from something. He said that man was born into the world with certain inclinations. Man is hopeless without Christ. Man cannot be saved by reformation alone. There must be a change in his life.

An Associational choir was composed under the guidance of Mrs. McClain while the body made preparation to receive the message by our Executive Secretary of the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Missionary Convention, Dr. Wendell C. Sommerville. Dr. Sommerville was presented by Dr. Davis. The guest speaker announced his text from Acts 16th chapter and 10th verse: "And after he had seen the vision, immediately we endeavored to go into Macedonia assuredly gathering that the Lord had called us to reach the gospel unto them." The speaker emphasized three words in his discourse — He. We. Us. The speaker said that God had always been interested in the individual. The individual touches other individuals. It was so with Paul. Paul was willing to come down to Troas where there was work to be done. Finally, said the minister, "When we have seen the vision, we are ready to lend a hand to our fellowmen."
