CONSTITUTION AND FORM OF GOVERNMENT OF THE BLACK CREEK PRIMITIVE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

From a long series of experience, we, the Church of Jesus Christ, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Christ, are convinced of the necessity of the constitution of churches in order to perpetuate a union and communion with each other in union. We, therefore, propose to maintain and keep the order and rules of our Association, according to the following plan or form of government, viz:

- 1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different churches in our union, duly sent to represent them in this Association, who shall be members whom they judge best qualified for the purpose and upon producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, they shall be entitled to a seat, provided they shall not violate the rules laid down in the constitution.
- 2. In letters from the different churches shall be expressed their number in full fellowship, those baptized, received by letter, restored, dismissed by letter, excommunicated, and dead since our last Association.
- 3. The members thus chosen and convened shall not have any ecclesiastical power over the churches, nor shall they infringe on any of the internal rights of any church in this union.
- 4. The Association when convened shall be governed and ruled by a regular and proper decorum.
- 5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk who shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.
- 6. New churches may be admitted into this union who shall petition by letter and messengers, and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly they shall be received by the Association and manifested by the Moderator giving the members the right hand of fellowship.
- 7. Every church in the union shall be entitled to representation in this Association but not to exceed three of its members.
- 8. Every query presented by any member of the Association shall be twice read and if there be a majority for it being debated, it

shall be taken into consideration and debated, but if there be a majority against it, it shall be withdrawn.

- 9. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association except it be withdrawn by the member who made it.
- 10. The Association shall endeavor to furnish the churches with the Minutes of this Association. The best method of effecting the purpose shall be at the discretion of the Association.
- 11. We think it absolutely necessary that we should have an Association fund, for defraying the expenses of the same for the raising and supporting of which we think it the duty of every church in this union to contribute voluntarily such sums as they think proper and send by the hand of their messengers to this Association and the money thus contributed by the churches and received by this Association, who shall be accountable to the Association.
- 12. The Minutes of the Association, when printed, shall be read and corrected, if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association rises.
- 13. Amendments of this plan or form of government may be made at any time by majority of the union, when they deem it necessary.
- 14. The Association shall have the power (1) to provide for the general rule of churches; (2) to preserve inviolably, a chain of communication among the churches; (3) to give the churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty; (4) to inquire into the cause why the churches fail to represent themselves at any time in this Association; (5) to appropriate the monies by the churches contributed for any Association fund to any purpose strictly connected with this Association; (6) to appoint any member by and with his or her consent to contract any business which may see necessary; (7) the Association shall have the power to withdraw from any church in the union which violate the rules of this Association or deviates from the orthodox principles of religion; (8) to admit any of the distant brethren in the ministry who may be present at the time of its sitting whom it shall judge necessary; (10) the Association shall have the power to adjourn itself to any future time or place it may think most convenient to the churches of the Union.
- 15. We shall not hold in our churches any person who is in the practice of visiting Masonic lodges or other lodges or any and all secret societies or who on any occasion conforms to their custom or parades, nor will we countenance any such individual who may reside or come to reside among us in the character of a preacher. We will not countenance any preacher who shall travel within the bounds of our Association establishing societies for the collecting of money, or who himself be collecting money to support any institution whatever. We will not fellowship any member or members of Missionary Bible Tract or Sunday School union societies, nor advocate theological schools, nor any persons who do fellowship with them, nor will we hold any such in our churches.

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. This Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
- 2. The Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.
- 3. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator when he is about to make his speech.
- 4. The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by any except the Moderator until he has finished speaking.
- 5. He shall strictly adhere to the subject and in no wise reflect on the person who spoke before, so as to make remarks on his slips of imperfection, but shall fairly state the case and matter as nearly as he can so as to convey his light and ideas.
- 6. No person shall abruptly break off or absent himself from the Association without liberty obtained from it.
- 7. No person shall rise and speak more than three times on one subject without liberty from the Association.
- 8. No member of the Association shall have the liberty of laughing during the sitting of same, nor whisper in the time of public speech.
- 9. No member of the Association shall address another in any term or appelation other than that of brother.
- 10. The Moderator shall not interrupt any member in or prohibit him from speaking until he gives his light on the subject, except he break the rules of decorum.
- 11. The names of the several members of this Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association requires.
- 12. The Moderator shall be the last person who shall speak on the subject, who may give his opinion if he choses before he puts the matter to a vote, but shall not vote himself unless the Association be equally divided.

CONSTITUTION AND FORM OF GOVERNMENT OF THE BLACK CREEK PRIMITIVE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

From a long series of experience, we, the Church of Jesus Christ, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Christ, are convinced of the necessity of the constitution of churches in order to perpetuate a union and communion with each other in union. We, therefore, propose to maintain and keep the order and rules of our Association, according to the following plan or form of government, viz:

1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different churches in our union, duly sent to represent them in this Association, who shall be members whom they judge best qualified for the purpose and upon producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, they shall be entitled to a seat, provided they shall not violate the rules laid down in the constitution.

certifying their appointment, they shall be entitled to a seat, provided they shall not violate the rules laid down in the constitution.

2. In letters from the different churches shall be expressed their number in full fellowship, those baptized, received by letter, restored, dismissed by letter, excommunicated, and dead since our last Association.

3. The members thus chosen and convened shall not have any ecclesiastical power over the churches, nor shall they infringe on any of the internal rights of any church in this union.

4. The Association when convened shall be governed and ruled by

a regular and proper decorum.

5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk who shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.

6. New churches may be admitted into this union who shall petition by letter and messengers, and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly they shall be received by the Association and manifested by the Moderator giving the members the right hand of fellowship.

7. Every church in the union shall be entitled to representation in

this Association but not to exceed three of its members.

8. Every query presented by any member of the Association shall be twice read and if there be a majority for it being debated, it shall be taken into consideration and debated, but if there be a majority against it, it shall be withdrawn.

9. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the state of

eration of the Association except it be withdrawn by the member

who made it.

10. The Association shall endeavor to furnish the churches with the Minutes of this Association. The best method of effecting the

purpose shall be at the discretion of the Association.

11. We think it absolutely necessary that we should have an Association fund, for defraying the expenses of the same for the raising and supporting of which we think it the duty of every church in this union to contribute voluntarily such sums as they think proper and send by the hand of their messengers to this Association and the money thus contributed by the churches and received by this

Association, who shall be accountable to the Association.

12. The Minutes of the Association, when printed, shall be read and corrected, if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk

before the Association rises.

13. Amendments of this plan or form of government may be made

at any time by majority of the union, when they deem it necessary.

14. The Association shall have the power (1) to provide for the general rule of churches; (2) to preserve inviolably, a chain of communication among the churches; (3) to give the churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty; (4) to inquire into the cause why the churches fail to represent themselves at any time in this Association; (5) to appropriate the monies by the churches contributed for any Association fund to any purpose strictly connected with this Association; (6) to appoint any member by and with his or her consent ciation; (6) to appoint any member by and with his or her consent to contract any business which may see necessary; (7) the Association shall have the power to withdraw from any church in the union which violate the rules of this Association or deviates from the orthodox principles of religion; (8) to admit any of the distant brethren in the principles of religion; (9) to admit any of the distant brethren in the ministry who may be present at the time of its sitting whom it shall judge necessary; (10) the Association shall have the power to adjourn itself to any future time or place it may think most convenient to the churches of the Union think most convenient to the churches of the Union.

CONSTITUTION AND FORM OF GOVERNMENT OF THE BLACK CREEK PRIMITIVE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

From a long series of experience, we, the Church of Jesus Christ. being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Christ, are convinced of the necessity of the constitution of churches in order to perpetuate a union and communion with each other in union. We, therefore, propose to maintain and keep the order and rules of our Association, according to the following plan or form of government,

1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different churches in our union, duly sent to represent them in this Association, who shall be members whom they judge best qualified for the purpose and upon producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, they shall be entitled to a seat, provided they shall not violate the rules laid down in the constitution.

2. In letters from the different churches shall be expressed their number in full fellowship, those baptized, received by letter, restored, dismissed by letter, excommunicated, and dead since our last Asso-

ciation.

3. The members thus chosen and convened shall not have any ecclesiastical power over the churches, nor shall they infringe on any of the internal rights of any church in this union.

4. The Association when convened shall be governed and ruled by

a regular and proper decorum.

5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk who shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.

6. New churches may be admitted into this union who shall petition by letter and messengers, and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly they shall be received by the Association and manifested by the Moderator giving the members the right hand of fellowship.

7. Every church in the union shall be entitled to representation in

this Association but not to exceed three of its members.

8. Every query presented by any member of the Association shall be twice read and if there be a majority for it being debated, it shall be taken into consideration and debated, but if there be a majority against it, it shall be withdrawn.

9. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association except it be withdrawn by the member

who made it.

10. The Association shall endeavor to furnish the churches with the Minutes of this Association. The best method of effecting the

purpose shall be at the discretion of the Association.

11. We think it absolutely necessary that we should have an Association fund, for defraying the expenses of the same for the raising and supporting of which we think it the duty of every church in this union to contribute voluntarily such sums as they think proper and send by the hand of their messengers to this Association and the money thus contributed by the churches and received by this

Association, who shall be accountable to the Association.

12. The Minutes of the Association, when printed, shall be read and corrected, if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk

before the Association rises.

13. Amendments of this plan or form of government may be made at any time by majority of the union, when they deem it necessary.

14. The Association shall have the power (1) to provide for the

general rule of churches; (2) to preserve inviolably, a chain of com-(6)

munication among the churches; (3) to give the churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty; (4) to inquire into the cause why the churches fail to represent themselves at any time in this Association; (5) to appropriate the monies by the churches contributed for any Association fund to any purpose strictly connected with this Association; (6) to appoint any member by and with his or her consent to contract any business which may see necessary; (7) the Association shall have the power to withdraw from any church in the union which violate the rules of this Association or deviates from the orthodox principles of religion; (8) to admit any of the distant brethren in the principles of religion; (9) to admit any of the distant brethren in the ministry who may be present at the time of its sitting whom it shall judge necessary; (10) the Association shall have the power to adjourn itself to any future time or place it may

15. We shall not hold in our churches of the Union.

15. We shall not hold in our churches any person who is in the practice of visiting Masonic lodges or other lodges or any and all secret societies or who on any occasion conforms to their custom or parades, nor will we countenance any such individual who may reside or come to reside among us in the character of a preacher. We will not countenance any preacher who shall travel within the bounds of our Association establishing societies for the collecting of money, or who himself be collecting money to support any institution whatever. We will not fellowship any member or members of Missionary Bible Tract or Sunday School union societies, nor advocate theological schools, nor any persons who do fellowship with them, nor will we

hold any such in our churches.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. This Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.

2. The Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.

3. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator when he is about to make his speech.

4. The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by any except the Moderator until he has finished speaking.

5. He shall strictly adhere to the subject and in no wise reflect

on the person who spoke before, so as to make remarks on his slips of imperfection, but shall fairly state the case and matter as nearly as he can so as to convey his light and ideas.

6. No person shall abruptly break off or absent himself from the

Association without liberty obtained from it.

7. No person shall rise and speak more than three times on one

subject without liberty from the Association.

8. No member of the Association shall have the liberty of laughing during the sitting of same, nor whisper in the time of public speech.

9. No member of the Association shall address another in any

term or appelation other than that of brother.

10. The Moderator shall not interrupt any member in or prohibit him from speaking until he gives his light on the subject, except he break the rules of decorum.

11. The names of the several members of this Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association

requires.

12. The Moderator shall be the last person who shall speak on the subject, who may give his opinion if he choses before he puts the matter to a vote, but shall not vote himself unless the Association be equally divided.

CONSTITUTION AND FORM OF GOVERNMENT OF THE BLACK CREEK PRIMITIVE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

From a long series of experience, we, the Church of Jesus Christ, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Christ, are convinced of the necessity of the constitution of churches in order to perpetuate a union and communion with each other in union. We, therefore, propose to maintain and keep the order and rules of our Association, according to the following plan or form of government,

1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different churches in our union, duly sent to represent them in this Association, who shall be members whom they judge best qualified for the purpose and upon producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, they shall be entitled to a seat, provided they shall not violate the rules laid down in the constitution.

2. In letters from the different churches shall be expressed their number in full fellowship, those baptized, received by letter, restored, dismissed by letter, excommunicated, and dead since our last Asso-

3. The members thus chosen and convened shall not have any ecclesiastical power over the churches, nor shall they infringe on any of the internal rights of any church in this union.

4. The Association when convened shall be governed and ruled by

a regular and proper decorum.

5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk who shall

be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.

6. New churches may be admitted into this union who shall petition by letter and messengers, and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly they shall be received by the Association and manifested by the Moderator giving the members the right hand of fellowship.

7. Every church in the union shall be entitled to representation in

8. Every query presented by any member of the Association shall be twice read and if there be a majority for it being debated, it shall be taken into consideration and debated, but if there be a majority against it, it shall be withdrawn.

9. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association event it be withdrawn by the member.

eration of the Association except it be withdrawn by the member

who made it.
10. The Association shall endeavor to furnish the churches with the Minutes of this Association. The best method of effecting the

purpose shall be at the discretion of the Association.

11. We think it absolutely necessary that we should have an Association fund, for dcfraying the expenses of the same for the raising and supporting of which we think it the duty of every church in this union to contribute voluntarily such sums as they think proper and send by the hand of their messengers to this Association and the money thus contributed by the churches and received by this

Association, who shall be accountable to the Association.

12. The Minutes of the Association when printed shall be read and corrected, if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk

before the Association rises.

13. Amendments of this plan or form of government may be made

at any time by majority of the union, when they deem it necessary.

14. The Association shall have the power (1) to provide for the general rule of churches; (2) to preserve inviolably, a chain of communication among the churches; (3) to give the churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty; (4) to inquire into the cause why the churches fail to represent themselves at any time in this Association; (5) to appropriate the monies by the churches contributed for any Association fund to any purpose strictly connected with this Association; (6) to appoint any member by and with his or her consent to contract any business which may see necessary; (7) the Association shall have the power to withdraw from any church in the union which violate the rules of this Association or deviates from the orthodox principles of religion; (8) to admit any of the distant brethren in the principles of religion; (9) to admit any of the distant brethren in the ministry who may be present at the time of its sitting whom it shall judge necessary; (10) the Association shall have the power to adjourn itself to any future time or place it may think most convenient to the churches of the Union.

15. We shall not hold in our churches any person who is in the practice of visiting Masonic lodges or other lodges or any and all secret societies or who on any occasion conforms to their custom or parades, nor will we countenance any such individual who may reside or come to reside among us in the character of a preacher. We will not countenance any preacher who shall travel within the bounds of our Association establishing societies for the collecting of money, or who himself be collecting money to support any institution whatever. We will not fellowship any member or members of Missionary Bible Tract or Sunday School union societies, nor advocate theological schools, nor any persons who do fellowship with them, nor will we

hold any such in our churches.

RULES OF DECORUM

 This Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
 The Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.

3. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his

seat and address the Moderator when he is about to make his speech.

4. The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by any except the Moderator until he has finished speaking.

5. He shall strictly adhere to the subject and in no wise reflect on the person who spoke before, so as to make remarks on his slips of imperfection, but shall fairly state the case and matter as nearly as he can so as to convey his light and ideas.

6. No person shall abruptly break off or absent himself from the

Association without liberty obtained from it.

7. No person shall rise and speak more than three times on one

subject without liberty from the Association.

8. No member of the Association shall have the liberty of laughing during the sitting of same, nor whisper in the time of public speech.

9. No member of the Association shall address another in any term or appelation other than that of brother.

10. The Moderator shall not interrupt any member in or prohibit him from speaking until he gives his light on the subject, except he break the rules of decorum.

11. The names of the several members of this Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association

requires.

12. The Moderator shall be the last person who shall speak on the subject, who may give his opinion if he choses before he puts the matter to a vote, but shall not vote himself unless the Association be equally divided.

CONSTITUTION AND FORM OF GOVERNMENT OF THE BLACK CREEK PRIMITIVE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

From a long series of experience, we, the Church of Jesus Christ, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Christ, are convinced of the necessity of the constitution of churches in order to perpetuate a union and communion with each other in union. We, therefore, propose to maintain and keep the order and rules of our Association, according to the following plan or form of government, viz:

- 1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different churches in our union, duly sent to represent them in this Association, who shall be members whom they judge best qualified for the purpose and upon producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, they shall be entitled to a seat, provided they shall not violate the rules laid down in the constitution.
- 2. In letters from the different churches shall be expressed their number in full fellowship, those baptized, received by letter, restored, dismissed by letter, excommunicated, and dead since our last Association.
- 3. The members thus chosen and convened shall not have any ecclesiastical power over the churches, nor shall they infringe on any of the internal rights of any church in this union.
- 4. The Association when convened shall be governed and ruled by a regular and proper decorum.
- 5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk who shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.
- 6. New churches may be admitted into this union who shall petition by letter and messengers, and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly they shall be received by the Association and manifested by the Moderator giving the members the right hand of fellowship.
- 7. Every church in the union shall be entitled to representation in this Association but not to exceed three of its members.
- 8. Every query presented by any member of the Association shall be twice read and if there be a majority for it being debated, it shall be taken into consideration and debated, but if there be a majority against it, it shall be withdrawn.
- 9. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association except it be withdrawn by the member who made it.
- 10. The Association shall endeavor to furnish the churches with the Minutes of this Association. The best method of effecting the purpose shall be at the discretion of the Association.

We think it absolutely necessary that we should have an Association fund, for defraying the expenses of the same for the raising and supporting of which we think it the duty of every church in this union to contribute voluntarily such sums as they think proper and send by the hand of their messengers to this Association and the money thus contributed by the churches and received by this Association, who shall be accountable to the Association.

CONSTITUTION AND FORM OF GOVERNMENT OF THE BLACK CREEK PRIMITIVE ASSOCIATION

From a long series of experience, we, the Church of Jesus Christ, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Christ, are convinved of the necessity of the constitution of churches in order to perpetuate a union and communion with each other in union. We, therefore, propose to maintain and keep the order and rules of our Association, according to the following plan or form of government, viz:

- 1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different churches in our union, duly sent to represent them in this Association, who shall be members whom they judge best qualified for the purpose and upon producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, they shall be entitled to a seat, provided they shall not violate the rules laid down in the constitution.
- 2. In letters from the different churches shall be expressed their number in full fellowship those baptized, received by letter, restored, dismissed by letter, excommunicated, and dead since our last Association.
- 3. The members thus chosen and convened shall not have any ecclesiastical power over the churches, nor shall they infringe on any of the internal rights of

any church in this union.

- 4. The Association when convened shall be governed and ruled by a regular and proper decorum.
- 5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk who shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.
- 6. New churches may be admitted into this union who shall petition by letter and messengers, and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly they shall be received by the Association and manifested by the Moderator giving the members the right hand of fellowship.
- 7. Every church in the union shall be entitled to representation in this Association but not to exceed three of its members.
- 8. Every query presented by any member of the Association shall be twice read and if there be a majority for it being debated, it shall be taken into consideration and debated, but if there be a majority against it, it shall be withdrawn.
- 9. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association except it be withdrawn the member who made it.
- 10. The Association shall endeavor to furnish the churches with the Minutes of this Association. The best method of effecting the purpose shall be at the discretion of the Association.
- 11. We think it absolutely necessary that we should have an Association fund, for defraying the expenses of the same for the raising and supporting of which we think it the duty of every church in this union to contribute voluntarily such sums as they think proper and send by the hand of their messengers to this Association and the money thus contributed by the churches and received by this Association, who shall be accountable to the Association.
- 12. The Minutes of the Association, when printed, shall be read and corrected, if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association rises.
- 13. Amendments of this plan or form of government may be made at any time by majority of the union, when they deem it necessary.
- 14. The Association shall have the power (1) to provide for the general rule of the churches; (2) to preserve inviolably, a chain of communication among the churches; (3) to give the churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty; (4) to inquire into the cause why the churches fail to represent themselves at any time in this Association; (5) to appropriate the monies by the churches contributed for any Association fund to any purpose strictly connected with this Association; (6) to appoint any member by and with his or her consent to contact any business which may see necessary; (7) the Association shall have the power to withdraw from any church in the union which violate the rules of this Association or deviates from the orthodox principles of religion; (8) to admit any of the distance brethren in the ministry who may be present at the time of its sitting whom it shall judge necessary;)10) the Association shall have the power to adjourn itself to any future time or place it may think most convenient to the Churches of the Union.
- 15. We shall not hold in our churches any person who is in the practice of visiting Masonic lodges or other lodges or any and all secret socieities or who on any occasion conforms to their custom or parades, nor will be countenance any preacher who shall travel within the bounds of our Association establishing societies for the collecting of money, or who himself be collecting money to support any institution whatever. We will not fellowship with any member or

members of Missionary Bible Tract or Sunday School union societies, nor advocate theological schools, nor any persons who do fellowship with them, nor will we hold any such in our churches.

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. This Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
- 2. The Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.
- 3. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator when he is about to make this speech.
- 4. The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by any except the Moderator until he has finished speaking.
- 5. He shall strictly adhere to the subject and in no wise reflect on the person who spoke before, so as to make remarks on his slips of imperfection, but shall fairly state the case and matter as nearly as he can so as to convey his light and ideas.
- 6. No person shall abruptly break off or absent himself from the Association without liberty obtained from it.
- 7. No person shall rise and speak more than three times on one subject without liberty from the Association.
- 8. No member of the Association shall have the liberty of laughing during the sitting of same, nor whisper in the time of public speech.
- 9. No member of the Association shall address another in any term or appelation other than that of brother.
- 10. The Moderator shall not interrupt any member in or prohibit him from speaking until he gives his light on the subject, except he break the rules of decorum.
- 11. The names of the several members of this Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association requires.
- 12. The Moderator shall be the last person who shall speak on the subject, who may give his opinion if he chooses before he puts the matter to a vote, but shall not vote himself unless the Association be equally divided.

CONSTITUTION AND FORM OF GOVERNMENT OF THE BLACK CREEK PRIMITIVE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

From a long series of experiece, we, the Church of Jesus Christ, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Christ, are convinced of the necessity of the constitution of churches in order to perpetuate a union and communion with each other in union. We, therefore, propose to maintain and keep the order and rules of our Association, according to the following plan or form of government, viz:

- 1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different churches in our union, duly sent to represent them in this Association, who shall be members whom they judge best qualified for the purpose and upon producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, they shall be entitled to a seat, provided they shall not violate the rules laid down in the constitution.
- 2. In letters from the different churches shall be expressed their number in full fellowship those baptized, received by letter, restored, dismissed by letter, excommunicated, and dead since our last Association.
- 3. The members thus chosen and convened shall not have any ecclesiastical power over the churches, nor shall they infringe on any of the internal rights of any church in this union.
- 4. The Association when convened shall be governed and ruled by a regular and proper decorum.
- 5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk who shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.
- 6. New churches may be admitted into this union who shall petition by letter and messengers, and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly they shall be received by the Association and manifested by the Moderator giving the members the right hand of fellowship.
- 7. Every church in the union shall be entitled to representation in this Association but not to exceed three of its members.
- 8. Every query presented by any member of the Association shall be twice read and if there be a majority for it being debated, it shall be taken into consideration and debated, but if there be a majority against it, it shall be withdrawn.
- 9. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association except it be withdrawn by the member who made it.
- 10. The Association shall endeavor to furnish the churches with the Minutes of this Association. The best method of effecting the purpose shall be at the discretion of the Association.
- 11. We think it absolutely necessary that we should have an Association fund, for defraying the expenses of the same for the raising and supporting of which we think it the duty of every church in this union to contribute voluntarily such sums as they think proper and send by the hand of their messengers to this Association and the money thus contributed by the churches and received by this Association, who shall be accountable to the Association.
 - 12. The Minutes of the Association, when printed, shall be read and cor-

rected, if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association rises.

13. Amendments of this plan or form of government may be made at

any time by a majority of the union, when they deem it necessary.

14. The Association shall have the power (1) to provide for the general rule of the churches; (2) to preserve inviolably, a chain of communication among the churches; (3 to give the churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty; (4) to inquire into the cause why the churches fail to represent themselves at any time in this Association; (5) to appropriate the monies by the churches contributed for any Association fund to any purpose strictly connected with this Association; (6) to appoint any member by and with his or her consent to contact any business which may see necessary; (7) the Association shall have the power to withdraw from any church in the union which violates the rules of this Association or deviates from the orthodox principles of religion; (8) to admit any of the distant brethren in the principles of religion; (9) to admit any of the distance brethren in the ministry who may be present at the time of its sitting whom it shall judge necessary; (10) the Association shall have the power to adjourn itself to any future time or place it may think most convenient to the Churches of the union.

15. We shall not hold in our churches any person who is in the practice of visiting Masonic lodges or other lodges or any and all secret societies or who on any occasion conforms to their custom or parades, nor will be countenance any preacher who shall travel within the bounds of our Association establishing societies for the collecting of money, or who himself be collecting money to support any institution whatsoever. We will not fellowship with any member or members of Missionary Bible Tract or Sunday School union societies, nor advocate theological schools, nor any persons who do fellowship with them, nor will we hold any such in our churches.

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. This Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
- 2. The Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.
- 3. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator when he is about to make this speech.
- 4. The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by any except the Moderator until he has finished speaking.
- 5. He shall strictly adhere to the subject and in no wise reflect on the person who spoke before, so as to make remarks on his slips of imperfection, but shall fairly state the case and matter as nearly as he can so as to convey his light and ideas.
- 6. No person shall abruptly break off or absent himself from the Association without liberty obtained from it.
- 7. No person shall rise and speak more than three times on one subject without liberty from the Association.
- 3. No member of the Association shall have the liberty of laughing during the sitting of same, nor whisper in the time of public speech.
 - 9. No member of the Association shall address another in any term or

appelation other than that of brother.

- 10. The Moderator shall not interrupt any member in or prohibit him from speaking until he gives his light on the subject, except he break the rules of decorum.
- 11. The names of the several members of this Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association requires.
- 12. The Moderator shall be the last person who shall speak on the subject, who may give his opinion if he chooses before he puts the matter to a vote, but shall not vote himself unless the Association be equally divided.
