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#### PROCEEDINGS

Black Creek Church, 1932

The Contentnea Primitive Baptist Association met in session with Black Creek church, Wilson county. N. C., commencing on Friday before the 4th Sunday in October, 1932. The meeting was opened by Elder Thomas Bunch, who sang hymn No. 529. Prayer was offered by Elder Wm. K. Taylor. Elder Thomas Bunch came forth and preached the introductory sermon, taking his text from Romans 9:30-33. Elder Paul Bunch came forth and sang hymn No. 76, and preached the alternate sermon, taking his text from St. John 6:31. Elder Thomas Bunch closed by singing hymn No. 355. Recess for an hour.

#### Friday Afternoon Session

The association assembled with the moderator present. Hymn No. 68 was lined by Elder Wm. K. Taylor, after which he offered prayer. The law was read by Elder T. B. Bunch from the 18th chapter of St. Matthew. Delegates from the different churches chose Elder T. B. Bunch moderator, Elder Wm. K. Taylor assistant moderator, Brother L. H. Harris clerk, Elder Robert Revis assistant clerk and Brother Debro Bunch association treasurer.

1 On motion we invited brethren and messengers to seat with us and feel themselves at home.

2 On motion agreed a committee of arrangement of preaching be appointed, and the association appointed Brothers Davie and Fate Newsom and Elder T. B. Bunch.

5 On motion the list of churches be called and the messengers names be enrolled. Black Creek, Brothers S. L. Woodard and Debro Bunch; Bellamy chapel, Elder Wm. K. Taylor and Brother Ellis Vick; Piney Grove, Brothers Davie Newsom, Fate Colls; Simms chapel, Bro. Raner; Bellamy Grove, Elder Jonah, Fate Newsom; Contentnea chapel, Bros. Freeman White, Will Tabron; Little Nahunta, Bros. Hurcel Barnes, Jim Rasberry; Shady Grove, Elder Robt. Revis, Bro. S.L. Woodard

6 On motion agreed the letters from several

churches be read.

7 On motion agreed the letters were received.

8 On motion agreed corresponding messengers make their report. Little River association was represented by Elder C. M. Steward and Bro. J. E. Everett, being in peace and desiring that friendly correspondence continue; next session to convene at Mt. Moriah, Smithfield, N. C., commencing Friday before the 2nd Sunday in October, The Union association of North Carolina was represented by Elder Robt. Edwards as being in peace and love and desiring that our friendly correspondence continue; next association to convene at Oaky Grove church commencing on Friday before the first Sunday in October, 1933. The Radicue association was represented by Elder W. J. Moore as being in peace and love and desiring that friendly correspondence continue; the next association to convene at Cabin Level commencing on Friday before the first Sunday in October, 1933.

The Corresponding association was represented by Elder Arthur Cherry as being in peace and love and desiring to keep up friendly correspondence; next session to convene at St. Paul

church (get off at Robersonville) commencing on Friday before the 2nd Sunday in October, 1933. Loving association was represented by Elder John W. Delio Hunt as being in peace and love and desired to keep up friendly correspondence; next session to convene at Forge chapel church (get off at Veronie) commencing on Friday before the 4th Sunday in September, 1933.

9 On motion the messengers were received by the moderator extending the right hand of fel-

lowship.

10 On motion agreed that petitionary letters

be called for.

11 On motion agreed we assign Elder Jonah Bunch to assist the Little River association at

Cool Spring church in 1933.

12 On motion agreed delegates from the several churches retire and select a place for the meeting of the next association, and Bellamy Chapel (get off at Sharpsburg, N. C.)

13 On motion agreed conference adjourn with

16 On motion Friday proceedings be read. 17 On motion same received and adopted. 18 On motion committee of arrangements of preaching make its report. Committee appointed Elder Paul Bunch to the stand, followed by Elder John W. Delio Hunt and Elders Robert Revis and Robert Edwards.

19 On motion agreed circular letters be read. 20 On motion agreed circular letters be received

aud adopted.

21 On motion agreed old treasurer make his report. \$4.50.

22 On motion agreed report be received.

23 On motion agreed that under the supervision of the moderator and clerk there shall be 500 copies of the minutes printed and distributed.

24 On motion agreed that finance committee

make its report.

25 On motion agreed, committee reported \$46.93

26 On motion agreed the abstract of principles and rules of decorum and church government be printed in the minutes.

27 On motion agreed names of elders, deacons clerks and their postoffices be printed in minutes.

28 On motion agreed the conference adjourn by singing hymn No. 505.

be read.

32 On motion agreed same be received.

33 On motion agreed the arrangement committee make their report. Committee appointed Bro. Jethro Dixon to the stand to open meeting to be followed by Elders Isaac Williams and Arthur Cherry.

34 On motion agreed take up unfinished business

35 On motion agreed that Sims chapel remain in the hands of the moderator until the church becomes satisfied.

36 On motion agreed we pay our clerk the sum

of \$3.00 for his services.

37 On motion agreed the moderator appoint messengers to visit the sister associations with whom we correspond. Little River association Elder Thomas Bunch, Loving association Elder Paul Bunch, Union association Elder Jonah Bunch, Radicue association Elder Robert Revis, Corresponding association Elder Wm. K. Taylor.

## Rules of Decorum and Church Government CONTENTNEA CIRCUIT

Article 1, That members comprising this church shall assemble themselves together at their respective churches Sunday and the Saturday before unless prevented by unavoidable necessity. Heb. 10:10 "And not forsake the assembling of our. selves together as the matter of some is."

2, The members of the church shall meet in conference on Saturday before the first Sunday in each month. Acts 15:6, "And the Apostles and Elders came together to consider of this matter."

3, Conference shall be opened and closed with

prayer to Almighty God. 1 Tim. 2:1, "I exhort, therefore, that first of all prayer and intercession and giving of thanks be made for all men." 1st Thes. 1:17-18, "Pray without ceasing, and everything give thanks for this the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you."

4. The pastor of the church shall be moderator or nominate one who is present. When absent, the conference shall appoint one and after the conference shall be agreed. On motion visiting brethren from sister churches may be invited to take seats with us. Psalms 133:1, "Behold how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity,"

5, It shall be the duty of the moderator to preserve order and harmony in the conference according to these rules or others which may be subsequently adopted. He shall fairly state every question, according to the majority and report accordingly. 1 Cor. 16:10, "Let everything be done

decently and in order."

6. The conference shall appoint a clerk, whose duty it shall be to record faithfully, in a well bound book, purchased by the conference, all of their proceedings and to do and perform all other such things as usually devolve upon such officers.

7. The members' names shall be enrolled distinctly, called over and a significant mark attached to their names which may be absent. Acts 1:15 "The number of their names together were about 120." When any member shall be absent three conferences it shall be the duty of the clerk to give notice thereof to the church, who thereupon shall order notice to be issued to the delinquent to be served by one of the deacons and upon which the conference may take such measures as to them may appear consonant with brotherly love and gospel order. Hebrews 10:25, "Not forsake the

assembling together."

8, A door shall be opened for the admission of new members who before admission shall verbally relate their experience, and when unanimous satfaction is offered the church in conference, that God has wrought a work of grace in their souls, it shall be the duty of the moderator to give them the right hand of fellowship in behalf of the church. And said candidate, shall after being baptized by immersion, become a member of the church, and not before. Peter 8:15, "Be ready always to give an answer to every man that ask you the reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear." Mat. 28:19, "Baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost."

9, If any member of the church bring a complaint of a private trespass having been committed upon him by one of his brethren, before he shall have complied with the requisition of the great head of the church, prescribed in the 8th chapter of Matthew, the church shall disregard it and shall be deemed disorderly, "Whereof if thy

brother trespass against thee, etc."
10, It shall be deemed disorder to any member of the church who shall speak illiberally of one of his brethren or otherwise than is laid down in the recited 18th chapter of Matthew, "And who may join the world caluminating or traducing their character. Rom. 1:39, "Let love be without dissimulation." Gal. 6:12, "Brethren if a man be overtaken in fault, ve which are spiritual, restore such a one in the spirit of meekness, considering thyself less thou also be tempted." "Bear yea one another's burdens and so fulfil the law of Christ."

11. All public offenses against morality shall be

noted by the church publicly and the offenders dealt with according to gospel order. Mat. 5:16, "Let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your Father

which is in Heaven."

12, Every motion made and seconded shall be taken under consideration of the conference, upless withdrawn by the mover and making it open for discussion or debate, but one person shall speak at a time, who shall arise from his seat and address the moderator by the appellation of Bro. Moderator, and when two or more shall arise at the same time, he shall decide without argument between them. 1 Cor. 14:40, "Let everything be done decently and in order."

13, Every query presented shall be thrice read before it is open for debate and it shall not be received unless a majority of those present concur in its reception and its decision a majority shall

govern.

14, In all cases except in the admission of members into the church, a majority of those present shall govern whose decisions shall be final, except two-thirds of the members of the next conference agrees to consider the matter and two-thirds shall so agree the subject matter shall again come before the conference and this decision shall be final.

15, Implicit obedience shall be yielded to the decision of the conference, but every member that is dissatisfied with the proceedings of the conference shall express themselves before adjourning of the conference and not thereafter. Rom. 13:1, "Let every soul be subject to a higher power."

16, The minutes of the conference shall be read

before it adjourns and all errors corrected.

17, The following are prohibited: Whispering or laughing during time of public speaking with

the appearance of wrath, or in a degrading manner, speaking more than 3 times without leave.

18, It shall be deemed disorderly in any member who openly and avowedly denies the fundamental doctrine contained in the church covenant and they shall be dealt which accordingly. Jude 1:3, "Earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints." Be of one mind, how can two walk together except they be agreed.

19, As intemperance is one of the worst evils • which can effect the members of any society, either civil or religious, and more especially the latter, it being in direct violation of the Word of God, wounding the cause of Jesus Christ, hurting feelings of the sober brethren and exposing the individual so commission of sin of the most abominable cast of character, we do declare and agree that when any member of this church shall so far forget what he owes to the great head of the church, to himself, the feeling of his brethren and to mortals and to well being of society generally, as to get drunk and become known to the church, he shall be notified to attend our church conference, and on failing to render entire satisfaction, to be considered as an excommunicant and not entitled to any privilege thereafter until such offender shall bring forth fruits meet for repentance. Mat. 5:16 "Let your lights so shine before men," etc. The following amendment to the above article was adopted in conference and read thus, "And we fur ther agree and declare in the duty of every member of this church. that when he knows of a member of this church getting drunk as above stated in this article to make it known to the church.

20, If upon issuing a notice to any delinquent member as is required in the 7th Article of this

Decorum, the deacons returns "Not to be found within the limits of the church," that the conference shall then proceed as if the notice had been served.

21, A majority of the members of this church in conference shall have power to alter or to amend any of the rules of this Decorum, which they have adopted for their government or to add any new rules which said majority may deem necessary.

Motion made and seconded and agreed that no church shall hold any member who will not pay an honest debt,

Motion made and seconded that we will not have nor hold members with us belonging to secret societies, Odd Fellows, Masons or Sunday School.

Motion made and seconded that no elder or deacon shall have the power to carry any of Contentnea property to any other circuit.

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#### **Abstracts of Principles**

We believe in one true and living God, the Father the Word and the Holy Ghost.

We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are the words of God and the only rules of faith and practice.

We believe in one Superior Eternal God, the creator and upholder of all beings and the disposer of all events, for there are three that bear record in Heaven, the Father, the Word and the Holy Ghost, and these three are one. I John 2:5.

We believe in the total depravity and just condemnation of all the fallen race of Adam.

We believe in original sin and that the punishment of the wicked shall be everlasting and the joys of the righteous eternal. We believe that God's elect shall be called, converted, regenerated, sancified by the holy Ghost.

We believe that the saint shall always preserve in grace and never finally fall away.

We believe that baptism, the Lord's Supper and the washing of the saints' feet are ordinances of Jesus Christ and that true believers in Jesus Christ are the only subjects entitled to these privileges.

We believe that the mode of baptism is by immersing in water.

We believe that God chose His people in Christ Jesus before the world began.

We believe that no minister has a right to the administration of ordinances only such as are regularly baptized, called and come under the imposition of the hands presbyter.

We believe that none but regularly baptized members have the right to commune at the Lord's table.

#### **Proceedings**

### OF THE SIXTY-NINTH ANNUAL SESSION OF THE CONTENTNEA PRIMITIVE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION HELD AT BLACK CREEK CHURCH, BLACK CREEK, N. C.

Services began at 11:00 o'clock. Deacon Thomas Hillard arose to open. Sang hymn 530 and offered prayer. Elder Robert Revis sang hymn 393 and chose for his text John 14:1 and preached the Introductory Sermon. Elder Jonah Bunch sang hymn 433 and preached from John 14:1, the alternate sermon. Elder Robert Revis sang hymn 73 and closed for recess of one hour. Benediction by Elder J. H. Dickerson.

#### FRIDAY EVENING SESSION.

The Association assembled with the Moderator present and sang hymn 18 for opening of the conference. Prayer was offered by Deacon Brutus Hooks. The Moderator announced the conference open for business. On motion the delegates retired and chose their Moderator and other officers. They chose Elder Robert Revis for their Moderator. Elder F. L. Coley for their Clerk and Brother Thomas Best for their Assistant Clerk. They chose Deacon Julius Simons to record the ministers' texts from day to day and Deacon Thomas Hillard as the Association Treasurer.

On motion, the scripture lesson was read. It pleased the mind of the Moderator to read Matt. 18:1-19. On motion delegates and brethren be invited to sit with us and feel themselves at home.

On motion the committee for arranging the preaching was appointed. They appointed Elders Jonah Bunch, S. L. Woodard, Lawrence Reid.

On motion, Deacons L. H. Harris, Thomas Hillard and Brutus Hooks were appointed as Finance Committee.

On motion the Arrangement Committee make their report. They reported to send to the stand to open: Brother Earl Holt, Elder Cutler Sauls to follow and Elder J. F. Taylor.

On motion the list of the churches was called and the messengers names enrolled. (See Statistical Table).

On motion, the letters from the different churches were read. They all reported in peace and love. On motion, corresponding delegates made their report. On motion, the letters be received and adopted.

Little River: Elder J. D. Stuart reported peace and desired correspondence to continue. He brought a file of minutes. Their next session will convene with the Union Hill Church on the highway 15A between Raleigh and Fuqua Springs, Friday before the second Sunday in October, 1954.

Radicue: Elder J. H. Morning came forward desiring correspondence to continue; he brought a file of minutes. The next session will convene with Mt. Zion Church in Tarboro, N. C., beginning on Friday before the first Sunday in October, 1954.

Sandy Ridge: Elder Andrew Taylor, with a file of mintes, reported desiring correspondence to continue. The next session convenes with Jefferson Street Church in Roanoke, Va., beginning Friday before the third Sunday in October, 1954.

Bethlehem: Elder Willis Ellis, with a file of minutes, reported desiring correspondence. Next session to be held with the Few in Number Church near Pine Top, N. C., beginning Friday before the second Sunday in October, 1954.

On motion the Abstract of Principles and Rules of Decorum and Church Government be printed in the minutes. On motion, elders, deacons, and clerks names be printed in the minutes. #### ASSOCIATION GOVERNMENT

- 1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the churches in the Contentnea Primitive Baptist Association, who shall be members supposed to be the best qualified for that purpose, and those producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, shall be entitled to seats in the Association provided the church is in peace at the time the appointment is made.
- 2. In these letters presented by said members shall be recorded the number of members in full fellowship, how many received, how many dismissed or excluded, and those who died since last Association convened.

- 3. Members thus chosen and convened shall denominate the Contentnea Primitive Baptist Association.
- 4. The Association when convened shall be governed and ruled by a regular and proper decorum.
- 5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk, who shall be of the body chosen by the members that compose the Association; they shall hold their offices until their successors are elected.
- 6. The names of the members that constitute the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association may require.
- 7. In case a new church desires to be admitted to this union, they shall petition by letter and legal representatives and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly, they shall be received by the Association and manifested by the Moderator extending to the messenger the right hand of fellowship.
- 8. It shall not be the duty of the Moderator to vote in the Association, but in the case of a division in the Association the Moderator shall appoint a committee to investigate and shall execute his own judgment according to the report of the committee as to who is in order or disorder.
- 9. If any minister is not found adhering to the orthodox doctrines and principles that demonstrate the original Primitive Baptist cause, the messengers that constitute the Association shall be authorized by the Moderator to investigate this matter at any time available.
- 10. Visiting brethren may be invited to assist in the Association in every way except to vote.
- 11. If any church of this Association shall become grievous, failing to report, it shall be under the immediate censure of the Association.
- 12. The Association shall furnish the churches of the union with Minutes of the proceedings.
- 13. Clerk shall have a book in which shall be recorded the proceedings of each Association and when and where the Association will be held at the different churches in the union.
- 14. We believe it to be absolutely necessary to have a fund for defraying expenses of the Association and recommend that each church composing it, voluntarily contribute such sum as they think proper and send it by the messenger to the Association, which money shall be placed in the hands of the Treasurer, who shall account for the same and pay it out as directed by the Association.
- 15. Every query presented by any messenger in the Association shall be read and before it shall be debated, the Moderator shall put it to a vote as to whether it shall be debated, otherwise the query must be withdrawn.
- 16. No member shall abruptly break off or absent himself from the Association without first obtaining permission from the Moderator.
- 17. The Association shall provide a general union among the churches, shall preserve inviolably a chain of communion among the same, shall give the churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty, shall have power to withdraw from any church composing the union which violates the rules of the Association, or deviates from the orthodox principles by a majority vote.

On motion agreed that no elder or deacon shall have the power to carry any of Contentnea property to any other circuit or Association.

#### ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. We believe that there is one true and living God.
- 2. We believe in His divinity and God-head.
- 3. We believe that there are three distinct persons composing His characters, God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Ghost, and that these three are one.
- 4. We believe that He is a God of purpose and that all His purposes are carried into effect by Him.
  - 5. We believe in His foreknowledge of all things.
- 6. We believe that the soul of man is saved by the grace of God through our Lord Jesus Christ, unmerited by anything that man can do, but is alone the gift of God to man, freely bestowed on him by God through our Lord Jesus Christ.
- 7. We believe that the secret faith is made known by revelation, being revealed to man by Almighty God.
  - 8. We believe in experience of grace.
  - 9. We believe in baptism by immersion.
- 10. We believe that the happiness of the saints is eternal and the punishment of the wicked is everlasting.
- 11. We believe in the everlasting covenant entered into between the Father and Son.
- 12. We believe in the atonement made by Jesus for all the elect of God that were given to Jesus Christ before the world was.
  - 13. We believe in the Lord's Supper and washing the saints' feet.
  - 14. We believe in the perseverance of the saints.
  - 15. We believe it is impossible for them to fall away.
  - 16. We believe in the resurrection of the dead.
- 17. We believe in Judgment Day, and that the Judge of the whole earth will do right.
- 18. We believe that the Holy Bible is the word of God, and is a sufficient guide for all believers through time.

#### RULES OF MINISTERS

- 1. He shall bring his gift before conference and stand upon the floor and have Exhorting License and when he improves his license, then give him Minister's License. He is not to baptize any member until he is ordained.
- 2. That we recommend to the church composing the same that no one is ordained to the Ministry of the Word, unless some church requests his ordination as her pastor, or that the church of which he is a member would be willing to have him as her pastor and that if she has none she actually chooses him as such.
- 3. If any minister violates these rules he must be tried before the church with Elders and Decorum.

#### RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. We agree to hold conference four times a year and as often as we see fit.
  - 2. A Moderator and Clerk shall be appointed.
  - 3. Conference shall be opened by praise and prayer.
- 4. The door of the church shall be opened for reception of members of fellowship.
  - 5. The state and standing of the church shall be inquired into.
- 6. No member shall leave the conference without permission of the Moderator.
- 7. The minority shall submit to the majority in all cases except receiving members to fellowship and to office; this shall be unanimous.
- 8. Any business brought up in the church shall be read three times before acted upon.
- 9. We agree that if any member shall violate these rules, such member shall be dealt with according to gospel order.
  - 10. We agree to commune four times a year when all is well.
  - 11. We agree to wash feet once a year at each church.
- 12. No member shall have any right to contract any business of the church without the liberty of the church to do so.
- 13. If any member of the church become dissatisfied with the rules of the church they shall be excluded from fellowship until they can give satisfaction and then restored.
- 14. If any member shall wilfully absent himself from communion he shall make his reasons known to the church.
- 15. If any member violates any of these rules he shall be brought to trial. He must first be tried by his own church.
- 16. If any minister, deacon, or clerk transgress these rules, the church shall have power to call help from other churches to aid in settling it.
- 17. We agree not to commune with any person unless they are baptised in our faith and order.
- 18. We agree to commune with Predestinarian Baptists who are of good standing.
- 19. If any member sees another transgress the rules of the church and does not bring it to the church after applying the 18th chapter of Matthew, they are liable to be tried before the church themselves.
- 20. No exhorting minister shall be admitted to the stand only by preaching his trial sermon, only in a union or association.

On motion male members pay \$10.00, females pay \$5.00.

- 21. No ordination shall be done only in a union or an association.
- 22. No traffic or trade shall be nearer than 150 yards of the church ground.
- 23. No minister or member shall have a right to carry any of Contentnea Association property to any other association.

#### ASSOCIATION GOVERNMENT

- 1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the churches in the Contentnea Primitive Baptist Association, who shall be members supposed to be the best qualified for that purpose, and those producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, shall be entitled to seats in the Association provided the church is in peace at the time the appointment is made.
- 2. In these letters presented by said members shall be recorded the number of members in full fellowship, how many received, how many dismissed or excluded, and those who died since last Association convened.
- 3. Members thus chosen and convened shall denominate the Contentnea Primitive Baptist Association.
- 4. The Association when convened shall be governed and ruled by a regular and proper decorum.
- 5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk, who shall be of the body chosen by the members that compose the Association; they shall hold their offices until their successors are elected.
- 6. The names of the members that constitute the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association may require.
- 7. In case a new church desires to be admitted to this union, they shall petition by letter and legal representatives and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly, they shall be received by the Association and manifested by the Moderator extending to the messenger the right hand of fellowship.
- 8. It shall not be the duty of the Moderator to vote in the Association, but in the case of a division in the Association the Moderator shall appoint a committee to investigate and shall execute his own judgment according to the report of the committee as to who is in order or disorder.
- 9. If any minister is not found adhering to the orthodox doctrines and principles that demonstrate the original Primitive Baptist cause, the messengers that constitute the Association shall be authorized by the Moderator to investigate this matter at any time available.
- 10. Visiting brethren may be invited to assist in the Association in every way except to vote.
- 11. If any church of this Association shall become grievous, failing to report, it shall be under the immediate censure of the Association.
- 12. The Association shall furnish the churches of the union with Minutes of the proceedings.
- 13. Clerk shall have a book in which shall be recorded the proceedings of each Association and when and where the Association will be held at the different churches in the union.
- 14. We believe it to be absolutely necessary to have a fund for defraying expenses of the Association and recommend that each church composing it, voluntarily contribute such sum as they think proper and send it by the messenger to the Association, which money shall be placed in the hands of the Treasurer, who shall account for the same and pay it out as directed by the Association.
- 15. Every query presented by any messenger in the Association shall be read and before it shall be debated, the Moderator shall put it to a vote as to whether it shall be debated, otherwise the query must be withdrawn.

- 16. No member shall abruptly break off or absent himself from the Association without first obtaining permission from the Moderator.
- 17. The Association shall provide a general union among the churches, shall preserve inviolably a chain of communion among the same, shall give the churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty, shall have power to withdraw from any church composing the union which violates the rules of the Association, or deviates from the orthodox principles by a majority vote.

On motion agreed that no elder or deacon shall have the power to carry any of Contentnea property to any other circuit or Association.

#### ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. We believe that there is one true and living God.
- 2. We believe in His divinity and God-head.
- 3. We believe that there are three distinct persons composing His characters, God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Ghost, and that these three are one.
- 4. We believe that He is a God of purpose and that all His purposes are carried into effect by Him.
  - 5. We believe in His foreknowledge of all things.
- 6. We believe that the soul of man is saved by the grace of God through our Lord Jesus Christ, unmerited by anything that man can do, but is alone the gift of God to man, freely bestowed on him by God through our Lord Jesus Christ.
- 7. We believe that the secret faith is made known by revelation, being revealed to man by Almighty God.
  - 8. We believe in experience of grace.
  - 9. We believe in baptism by immersion.
- 10. We believe that the happiness of the saints is eternal and the punishment of the wicked is everlasting.
- 11. We believe in the everlasting covenant entered into between the Father and Son.
- 12. We believe in the atonement made by Jesus for all the elect of God that were given to Jesus Christ before the world was.
  - 13. We believe in the Lord's Supper and washing the saints' feet.
  - 14. We believe in the perseverance of the saints.
  - 15. We believe it is impossible for them to fall away.
  - 16. We believe in the resurrection of the dead.
- 17. We believe in Judgment Day, and that the Judge of the whole earth will do right.
- 18. We believe that the Holy Bible is the word of God, and is a sufficient guide for all believers through time.

#### RULES OF MINISTERS

- 1. He shall bring his gift before conference and stand upon the floor and have Exhorting License and when he improves his license, then give him Minister's License. He is not to baptize any member until he is ordained.
- 2. That we recommend to the church composing the same that no one is ordained to the Ministry of the Word, unless some church requests his ordination as her pastor, or that the church of which he is a member would be willing to have him as her pastor and that if she has none she actually chooses him as such.
- 3. If any minister violates these rules he must be tried before the church with Elders and Decorum.

#### RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. We agree to hold conference four times a year and as often as we see fit.
  - 2. A Moderator and Clerk shall be appointed.
  - 3. Conference shall be opened by praise and prayer.
- 4. The door of the church shall be opened for reception of members of fellowship.
  - 5. The state and standing of the church shall be inquired into.
- 6. No member shall leave the conference without permission of the Moderator.
- 7. The minority shall submit to the majority in all cases except receiving members to fellowship and to office; this shall be unanimous.
- 8. Any business brought up in the church shall be read three times before acted upon.
- 9. We agree that if any member shall violate these rules, such member shall be dealt with according to gospel order.
  - 10. We agree to commune four times a year when all is well.
  - 11. We agree to wash feet once a year at each church.
- 12. No member shall have any right to contract any business of the church without the liberty of the church to do so.
- 13. If any member of the church become dissatisfied with the rules of the church they shall be excluded from fellowship until they can give satisfaction and then restored.
- 14. If any member shall wilfully absent himself from communion he shall make his reasons known to the church.
- 15. If any member violates any of these rules he shall be brought to trial. He must first be tried by his own church.
- 16. If any minister, deacon, or clerk transgress these rules, the church shall have power to call help from other churches to aid in settling it.
- 17. We agree not to commune with any person unless they are baptised in our faith and order.
- 18. We agree to commune with Predestinarian Baptists who are of good standing.

20. No exhorting minister shall be admitted to the stand only by preaching his trial sermon, only in a union or association.

On motion male members pay \$10.00, females pay \$5.00.

- 21. No ordination shall be done only in a union or an association.
- 22. No traffic or trade shall be nearer than 150 yards of the church ground.
- 23. No minister or member shall have a right to carry any of Contentnea Association property to any other association.
- 19. If any member sees another transgress the rules of the church and does not bring it to the church after applying the 18th chapter of Matthew, they are liable to be tried before the church themselves.

#### ASSOCIATION GOVERNMENT

1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the churches in the Contentnea Primitive Baptist Association, who shall be members supposed to be the best qualified for that purpose, and those producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, shall be entitled to seats in the Association provided the church is in peace at the time the appointment is made.

2. In these letters presented by said members shall be recorded the number of members in full fellowship, how many received, how many dismissed or excluded, and those who died since last Association

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3. Members thus chosen and convened shall denominate the Contentnea Primitive Baptist Association.

4. The Association when convened shall be governed and ruled by a

regular and proper decorum.

5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk, who shall be of the body chosen by the members that compose the Association; they shall hold their offices until their successors are elected.

6. The names of the members that constitute the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association

may require.

7. In case a new church desires to be admitted to this union, they shall petition by letter and legal representatives and upon examination. if found orthodox and orderly, they shall be received by the Association and manifested by the Moderator extending to the messenger the right hand of fellowship.

8. It shall not be the duty of the Moderator to vote in the Association, but in the case of a division in the Association the Moderator shall appoint a committee to investigate and shall execute his own judgment according to the report of the committee as to who is

in order or disorder.

9. If any minister is not found adhering to the orthodox doctrines and principles that demonstrate the original Primitive Baptist cause, the messengers that constitute the Association shall be authorized by the Moderator to investigate this matter at any time available.

10. Visiting brethren may be invited to assist in the Association

in every way except to vote.

11. If any church of this Association shall become grievous, failing to report, it shall be under the immediate censure of the Association.

12. The Association shall furnish the churches of the union with

Minutes of the proceedings.

13. Clerk shall have a book in which shall be recorded the proceedings of each Association and when and where the Association will be

held at the different churches in the union.

14. We believe it to be absolutely necessary to have a fund for defraying expenses of the Association and recommend that each church composing it, voluntarily contribute such sum as they think proper and send it by the messenger to the Association, which money shall be placed in the hands of the Treasurer, who shall account for the same and pay it out as directed by the Association.

15. Every query presented by any messenger in the Association shall be read and before it shall be debated, the Moderator shall put it to a vote as to whether it shall be debated, otherwise the query

must be withdrawn.

16. No member shall abruptly break off or absent himself from the Association without first obtaining permission from the Moderator. 17. The Association shall provide a general union among the churches, shall preserve inviolably a chain of communion among the same, shall give the churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty, shall have power to withdraw from any church composing the union which violates the rules of the Association, or deviates from the orthodox principles by a majority vote.

On motion agreed that no elder or deacon shall have the power to carry any of Contentnea property to any other circuit or Association.

#### ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe that there is one true and living God.

2. We believe in His divinity and God-head.

3. We believe that there are three distinct persons composing His characters, God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Ghost, and that these three are one.

4. We believe that He is a God of purpose and that all His purposes

are carried into effect by Him.

5. We believe in His foreknowledge of all things.

6. We believe that the soul of man is saved by the grace of God through our Lord Jesus Christ, unmerited by anything that man can do, but is alone the gift of God to man, freely bestowed on him by God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

7. We believe that the secret faith is made known by revelation,

being revealed to man by Almighty God.

8. We believe in experience of grace. 9. We believe in baptism by immersion.

10. We believe that the happiness of the saints is eternal and the punishment of the wicked is everlasting.

11. We believe in the everlasting covenant entered into between

the Father and Son.

12. We believe in the atonement made by Jesus for all the elect of God that were given to Jesus Christ before the world was.

13. We believe in the Lord's Supper and washing the saints' feet.

14. We believe in the perseverance of the saints. 15. We believe it is impossible for them to fall away.

16. We believe in the resurrection of the dead.
17. We believe in Judgment Day, and that the Judge of the whole earth will do right.

18. We believe that the Holy Bible is the word of God, and is a sufficient guide for all believers through time.

#### RULES OF MINISTERS

1. He shall bring his gift before conference and stand upon the floor and have Exhorting License and when he improves his license, then give him Minister's License. He is not to baptize any member until he is ordained.

2. That we recommend to the church composing the same that no one is ordained to the Ministry of the Word, unless some church requests his ordination as her pastor, or that the church of which he is a member would be willing to have him as her pastor and that if she has none she actually chooses him as such.

3. If any minister violates these rules he must be tried before the

church with Elders and Decorum.

#### RULES OF DECORUM

1. We agree to hold conference four times a year and as often as we see fit.

2. A Moderator and Clerk shall be appointed.

- 3. Conference shall be opened by praise and prayer.
- 4. The door of the church shall be opened for reception of members of fellowship.

5. The state and standing of the church shall be inquired into.

- 6. No member shall leave the conference without permission of the Moderator.
- 7. The minority shall submit to the majority in all cases except receiving members to fellowship and to office; this shall be unanimous.

8. Any business brought up in the church shall be read three times

before acted upon.

- 9. We agree that if any member shall violate these rules, such member shall be dealt with according to gospel order.
  - 10. We agree to commune four times a year when all is well.11. We agree to wash feet four times a year at each church.

12. No member shall have any right to contract any business of the

church without the liberty of the church to do so.

13. If any member of the church become dissatisfied with the rules of the church they shall be excluded from fellowship until they can give satisfaction and then restored.

14. Be it resolved that we will withdraw fellowship from any member

that will not pay his or her honest debt, if they are able to work.

15. If any member shall wilfully absent himself or herself from communion, he or she shall make their reasons known to the church.

16. If any member violates any of these rules they shall be brought

to trial. They must be first tried by their own church.

17. If any member sees another transgress the rules of the church and does not bring it to the church after complying with Matthew 18, they are liable to be tried before the church themselves.

18. If any minister, deacon, or clerk transgress these rules, the church shall have power to call help from other churches to aid in settling it.

- 19. We agree to not commune with any person unless they are baptised in our faith and order.
- 20. We agree to commune with Predestinarian Baptists who are in good standing.
- 21. No exhorting minister shall be admitted to the stand only by preaching his trial sermon, only in a Union or an Association.
  - 22. On motion male members pay \$10.00; female members pay \$5.00.
    23. No ordination shall be done only in a Union or an Association.
- 23 No traffic or trade shall be nearer than 150 yards of the church round.
- 25. No minister, or member shall have a right to carry any of Contentnea Association property to any other Association.
  - 26. This done by order of the Association conference.

# ASSOCIATION GOVERNMENT

- 1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the churches in the Contentnea Primitive Baptist Association, who shall be members supposed to be the best qualified for that purpose, and those producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, shall be entitled to seats in the Association provided the church is in peace at the time the appointment is made.
- 2. In these letters presented by said members shall be recorded the number of members in full fellowship, how many received, how many dismissed or excluded, and those who died since last Association convened.
- 3. Members thus chosen and convened shall denominate the Contentnea Primitive Baptist Association.
- 4. The Association when convened shall be governed and ruled by a regular and proper decorum.
- 5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk, who shall be of the body chosen by the members that compose the Association; they shall hold their offices until their successors are elected.
- 6. The names of the members that constitute the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association may require.
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  - 16. We believe in the resurrection of the dead.
- 17. We believe in Judgment Day, and that the Judge of the whole earth will do right.
- 18. We believe that the Holy Bible is the word of God, and is a sufficient guide for all believers through time.

# RULES OF MINISTERS

- 1. He shall bring his gift before conference and stand upon the floor and have Exhorting License and when he improves his license, then give him Minister's License. He is not to baptize any member until he is ordained.
- 2. That we recommend to the church composing the same that no one is ordained to the Ministry of the Word, unless some church requests his ordination as her pastor, or that the church of which he is a member would be willing to have him as her pastor and that if she has none she actually chooses him as such.
- 3. If any minister violates these rules he must be tried before the church with Elders and Decorum.

# RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. We agree to hold conference four times a year and as often as we see fit.
  - 2. A Moderator and Clerk shall be appointed.
  - 3. Conference shall be opened by praise and prayer.
- 4. The door of the church shall be opened for reception of members to fellowship.
  - 5. The state and standing of the church shall be inquired into.
- 6. No member shall leave the conference without permission of the Moderator.
- 7. The minority shall submit to the majority in all cases except receiving members to fellowship and to office; this shall be unanimous.
- 8. Any business brought up in the church shall be read three times before acted upon.
- 9. We agree that if any member shall violate these rules, such member shall be dealt with according to gospel order.
  - 10. We agree to commune four times a year when all is well.
  - 11. We agree to wash feet once a year at each church.
- 12. No member shall have any right to contract any business of the church without the liberty of the church to do so.
- 13. If any member of the church become dissatisfied with the rules of the church they shall be excluded from fellowship until they can give satisfaction and then be restored.
- 14. Be it resolved that we will withdraw fellowship from any member that will not pay his or her honest debt, if they are able to work.
- 15. If any member shall wilfully absent himself or herself from communion, he or she shall make their reasons known to the church.
- 16. If any member violates any of these rules they shall be brought to trial. They must be first tried by their own church.
- 17. If any member sees another transgress the rules of the church and does not report it to the church after complying with Matthew 18, they are liable to be tried before the church themselves.
- 18. If any minister, deacon, or clerk transgress these rules, the church shall have power to call help from other churches to aid in settling it.

- 19. We agree to not commune with any person unless they are baptised in our faith and order.
- 20. We agree to commune with Predestinarian Baptists who are in good standing.
- 21. No exhorting minister shall be admitted to the stand only by preaching his trial sermon, only in a Union or an Association.
- 22. We agree male members pay \$10.00; female members pay \$5.00 Association fees.
- 23. No ordination shall be done unless it is in a Union or an Association.
- 24. No traffic or trade shall be nearer than 150 yards of the church ground.
- 25. No minister, or member shall have a right to carry any of Contentnea Association property to any other Association.
  - 26. This done by order of the Association conference.

# ASSOCIATION GOVERNMENT

1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the churches in the Contentnea Primitive Baptist Association, who shall be members supposed to be the best qualified for that purpose, and those producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, shall be entitled to seats in the Association provided the church is in peace at the time the appointment is made.

2. In these letters presented by said members shall be recorded the number of members in full fellowship, how many received, how many dismissed or excluded, and those who died since last Association

convened.

3. Members thus chosen and convened shall denominate the Contentnea Primitive Baptist Association.

4. The Association when convened shall be governed and ruled by a

regular and proper decorum.

5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk, who shall be of the body chosen by the members that compose the Association; they shall hold their offices until their successors are elected.

6. The names of the members that constitute the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association

may require.

7. In case a new church desires to be admitted to this union, they shall petition by letter and legal representatives and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly, they shall be received by the Association and manifested by the Moderator extending to the messenger the right hand of fellowship.

8. It shall not be the duty of the Moderator to vote in the Association, but in the case of a division in the Association the Moderator shall appoint a committee to investigate and shall execute his own judgment according to the report of the committee as to who is

in order or disorder.

9. If any minister is not found adhering to the orthodox doctrines and principles that demonstrate the original Primitive Baptist cause, the messengers that constitute the Association shall be authorized by the Moderator to investigate this matter at any time available.

10. Visiting brethren may be invited to assist in the Association

in every way except to vote.

11. If any church of this Association shall become grievous, failing to report, it shall be under the immediate censure of the Association.

12. The Association shall furnish the churches of the union with

Minutes of the proceedings.

13. Clerk shall have a book in which shall be recorded the proceedings of each Association and when and where the Association will be

held at the different churches in the union.

14. We believe it to be absolutely necessary to have a fund for defraying expenses of the Association and recommend that each church composing it, voluntarily contribute such sum as they think proper and send it by the messenger to the Association, which money shall be placed in the hands of the Treasurer, who shall account for the same and pay it out as directed by the Association.

15. Every query presented by any messenger in the Association shall be read and before it shall be debated, the Moderator shall put it to a vote as to whether it shall be debated, otherwise the query

must be withdrawn.

16. No member shall abruptly break off or absent himself from the Association without first obtaining permission from the Moderator.

17. The Association shall provide a general union among the chur-

ches, shall preserve inviolably a chain of communion among the same, shall give the churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty, shall have power to withdraw from any church composing the union which violates the rules of the Association, or deviates from the orthodox principles by a majority vote.

On motion agreed that no elder or deacon shall have the power to carry any of Contentnea property to any other circuit or Association.

### ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe that there is one true and living God.

2. We believe in His divinity and God-head.

3. We believe that there are three distinct persons composing His characters, God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Ghost, and that these three are one.

4. We believe that He is a God of purpose and that all His purposes

are carried into effect by Him.

5. We believe in His foreknowledge of all things.

6. We believe that the soul of man is saved by the grace of God through our Lord Jesus Christ, unmerited by anything that man can do, but is alone the gift of God to man, freely bestowed on him by God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

7. We believe that the secret faith is made known by revelation,

being revealed to man by Almighty God.

8. We believe in experience of grace.

- 9. We believe in baptism by immersion.
- 10. We believe that the happiness of the saints is eternal and the punishment of the wicked is everlasting.

11. We believe in the everlasting covenant entered into between

the Father and Son.

12. We believe in the atonement made by Jesus for all the elect of God that were given to Jesus Christ before the world was.

13. We believe in the Lord's Supper and washing the saints' feet.

14 We believe in the perseverance of the saints.15. We believe it is impossible for them to fall away.

16. We believe in the resurrection of the dead.

17. We believe in Judgment Day, and that the Judge of the whole earth will do right.

18. We believe that the Holy Bible is the word of God, and is a sufficient guide for all believers through time.

# RULES OF MINISTERS

- 1. He shall bring his gift before conference and stand upon the floor and have Exhorting License and when he improves his license. then give him Minister's License. He is not to baptize any member until he is ordained.
- 2. That we recommend to the church composing the same that no one is ordained to the Ministry of the Word, unless some church requests his ordination as her pastor, or that the church of which he is a member would be willing to have him as her pastor and that if she has none she actually chooses him as such.

3. If any minister violetes these rules he must be tried before the

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# RULES OF DECORUM

1. We agree to hold conference four times a year and as often as we see fit.

2. A Moderator and Clerk shall be appointed.

3. Conference shall be opened by praise and prayer.

4. The door of the church shall be opened for reception of members to fellowship.

5. The state and standing of the church shall be inquired into.

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- 7. The minority shall submit to the majority in all cases except receiving members to fellowship and to office; this shall be unanimous.

8. Any business brought up in the church shall be read three times

before acted upon.

9. We agree that if any member shall violate these rules, such member shall be dealt with according to gospel order.

We agree to commune four times a year when all is well.

11. We agree to wash feet once a year at each church.
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13. If any member of the church become dissatisfied with the rules of the church they shall be excluded from fellowship until they can give satisfaction and then be restored.

14. Be it resolved that we will withdraw fellowship from any member

that will not pay his or her honest debt, if they are able to work.

# ASSOCIATION GOVERNMENT

1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the churches in the Contentnea Primitive Baptist Association, who shall be members supposed to be the best qualified for that purpose, and those producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, shall be entitled to seats in the Association provided the church is in peace at the time the appointment is made.

2. In these letters presented by said members shall be recorded the number of members in full fellowship, how many received, how many dismissed or excluded, and those who died since last Association

convened.

3. Members thus chosen and convened shall denominate the Contentnea Primitive Baptist Association.

4. The Association when convened shall be governed and ruled by a

regular and proper decorum.

5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk, who shall be of the body chosen by the members that compose the Association; they shall hold their offices until their successors are elected.

6. The names of the members that constitute the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association

may require.

7. In case a new church desires to be admitted to this union, they shall petition by letter and legal representatives and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly, they shall be received by the Association and manifested by the Moderator extending to the messenger the right

hand of fellowship.

8. It shall not be the duty of the Moderator to vote in the Association, but in the case of a division in the Association the Moderator shall appoint a committee to investigate and shall execute his own judgment according to the report of the committee as to who is in order or disorder.

9. If any minister is not found adhering to the orthodox doctrines and principles that demonstrate the original Primitive Baptist cause, the messengers that constitute the Association shall be authorized by the Moderator to investigate this matter at any time available.

10. Visiting brethren may be invited to assist in the Association

in every way except to vote.

11. If any church of this Association shall become grievous, failing to report, it shall be under the immediate censure of the Association.

12. The Association shall furnish the churches of the union with

Minutes of the proceedings.

13. Clerk shall have a book in which shall be recorded the proceedings of each Association and when and where the Association will be

held at the different churches in the union.

14. We believe it to be absolutely necessary to have a fund for defraying expenses of the Association and recommend that each church composing it, voluntarily contribute such sum as they think proper and send it by the messenger to the Association, which money shall be placed in the hands of the Treasurer, who shall account for the same and pay it out as directed by the Association.

15. Every query presented by any messenger in the Association shall be read and before it shall be debated, the Moderator shall put it to a vote as to whether it shall be debated, otherwise the query

must be withdrawn.

16. No member shall abruptly break off or absent himself from the Association without first obtaining permission from the Moderator.

17. The Association shall provide a general union among the churches, shall preserve inviolably a chain of communion among the same, shall give the churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty, shall have power to withdraw from any church composing the union which violates the rules of the Association, or deviates from the orthodox principles by a majority vote.

On motion agreed that no elder or deacon shall have the power to carry any of Contentnea property to any other circuit or Association.

# ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe that there is one true and living God.

2. We believe in His divinity and God-head.

3. We believe that there are three distinct persons composing His characters, God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Ghost, and that these three are one.

4. We believe that He is a God of purpose and that all His purposes

are carried into effect by Him.

5. We believe in His foreknowledge of all things.

6. We believe that the soul of man is saved by the grace of God through our Lord Jesus Christ, unmerited by anything that man can do, but is alone the gift of God to man, freely bestowed on him by God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

7. We believe that the secret faith is made known by revelation,

being revealed to man by Almighty God.

8. We believe in experience of grace.
9. We believe in baptism by immersion.

10. We believe that the happiness of the saints is eternal and the punishment of the wicked is everlasting.

11. We believe in the everlasting covenant entered into between

the Father and Son.

12. We believe in the atonement made by Jesus for all the elect of God that were given to Jesus Christ before the world was.

13. We believe in the Lord's Supper and washing the saints' feet.

14. We believe in the perseverance of the saints.

15. We believe it is impossible for them to fall away.

16. We believe in the resurrection of the dead.

17. We believe in Judgment Day, and that the Judge of the whole earth will do right.

18. We believe that the Holy Bible is the word of God, and is a sufficient guide for all believers through time.

# RULES OF MINISTERS

1. He shall bring his gift before conference and stand upon the floor and have Exhorting License and when he improves his license, then give him Minister's License. He is not to baptize any member until he is ordained.

2. That we recommend to the church composing the same that no one is ordained to the Ministry of the Word, unless some church requests his ordination as her pastor, or that the church of which he is a member would be willing to have him as her pastor and that if

she has none she actually chooses him as such.

3. If any minister violates these rules he must be tried before the church with Elders and Decorum.

# RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. We agree to hold conference four times a year and as often as we see fit.
  2. A Moderator and Clerk shall be appointed.

3. Conference shall be opened by praise and prayer.

4. The door of the church shall be opened for reception of members to fellowship.

5. The state and standing of the church shall be inquired into.

- 6. No member shall leave the conference without permission of the Moderator.
- 7. The minority shall submit to the majority in all cases except receiving members to fellowship and to office; this shall be unanimous.

8. Any business brought up in the church shall be read three times before acted upon.

- 9. We agree that if any member shall violate these rules, such member shall be dealt with according to gospel order.
  - 10. We agree to commune four times a year when all is well.

11. We agree to wash feet once a year at each church.
12. No member shall have any right to contract any business of the church without the liberty of the church to do so.

13. If any member of the church become dissatisfied with the rules of the church they shall be excluded from fellowship until they can give satisfaction and then be restored.

14. Be it resolved that we will withdraw fellowship from any member

that will not pay his or her honest debt, if they are able to work.

15. If any member shall wilfully absent himself or herself from communion, he or she shall make their reasons known to the church.

16. If any member violates any of these rules they shall be brought

to trial. They must be first tried by their own church.

17. If any member sees another transgress the rules of the church and does not report it to the church after complying with Matthew 18, they are liable to be tried before the church themselves.

18. If any minister, deacon, or clerk transgress these rules, the church shall have power to call help from other churches to aid in settling it. 19. We agree to not commune with any person unless they are baptised in our faith and order.

20. We agree to commune with Predestinarian Baptists who are in

good standing.

21. No exhorting minister shall be admitted to the stand only by preaching his trial sermon, only in a Union or an Association.

22. We agree male members pay \$5.00; female members pay \$2.00

Association fees.

- 23. No ordination shall be done unless it is in a Union or an Association.
- 24. No traffic or trade shall be nearer than 150 yards of the church ground.
- 25. No minister, or member shall have a right to carry any of Contentnea Association property to any other Association.

26. This done by order of the Association conference.

# ASSOCIATION GOVERNMENT

1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the churches in the Contentnea Primitive Baptist Association, who shall be members supposed to be the best qualified for that purpose, and those producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, shall be entitled to seats in the Association provided the church is in peace at the time the appointment is made.

2. In these letters presented by said members shall be recorded the

number of members in full fellowship, how many received, how many dismissed or excluded, and those who died since last Association

convened.

3. Members thus chosen and convened shall denominate the Contentnea Primitive Baptist Association.

4. The Association when convened shall be governed and ruled by a

regular and proper decorum.

5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk, who shall be of the body chosen by the members that compose the Association; they shall hold their offices until their successors are elected.

6. The names of the members that constitute the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association

may require.

- 7. In case a new church desires to be admitted to this union, they shall petition by letter and legal representatives and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly, they shall be received by the Association and manifested by the Moderator extending to the messenger the right hand of fellowship.
- 8. It shall not be the duty of the Moderator to vote in the Association, but in the case of a division in the Association the Moderator shall appoint a committee to investigate and shall execute his own judgment according to the report of the committee as to who is in order or disorder.
- 9. If any minister is not found adhering to the orthodox doctrines and principles that demonstrate the original Primitive Baptist cause, the messengers that constitute the Association shall be authorized by the Moderator to investigate this matter at any time available.

10. Visiting brethren may be invited to assist in the Association

in every way except to vote.

11. If any church of this Association shall become grievous, failing to report, it shall be under the immediate censure of the Association. 12. The Association shall furnish the churches of the union with

Minutes of the proceedings.

13. Clerk shall have a book in which shall be recorded the proceedings of each Association and when and where the Association will be

held at the different churches in the union.

14. We believe it to be absolutely necessary to have a fund for defraying expenses of the Association and recommend that each church composing it, voluntarily contribute such sum as they think proper and send it by the messenger to the Association, which money shall be placed in the hands of the Treasurer, who shall account for the same and pay it out as directed by the Association.

15. Every query presented by any messenger in the Association shall be read and before it shall be debated, the Moderator shall put it to a vote as to whether it shall be debated, otherwise the query

must be withdrawn.

16. No member shall abruptly break off or absent himself from the Association without first obtaining permission from the Moderator.

17. The Association shall provide a general union among the churches, shall preserve inviolably a chain of communion among the same, shall give the churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty, shall have power to withdraw from any church composing the union which violates the rules of the Association, or deviates from the orthodox principles by a majority vote.

On motion agreed that no elder or deacon shall have the power to carry any of Contentnea property to any other circuit or Association.

# ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe that there is one true and living God.

2. We believe in His divinity and God-head.

3. We believe that there are three distinct persons composing His characters, God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Ghost, and that these three are one.

4. We believe that He is a God of purpose and that all His purposes

are carried into effect by Him.

5. We believe in His foreknowledge of all things.

6. We believe that the soul of man is saved by the grace of God through our Lord Jesus Christ, unmerited by anything that man can do, but is alone the gift of God to man, freely bestowed on him by God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

7. We believe that the secret faith is made known by revelation.

being revealed to man by Almighty God.

8. We believe in experience of grace. 9. We believe in baptism by immersion.

10. We believe that the happiness of the saints is eternal and the punishment of the wicked is everlasting.

11. We believe in the everlasting covenant entered into between

the Father and Son.

- 12. We believe in the atonement made by Jesus for all the elect of God that were given to Jesus Christ before the world was.
  - 13. We believe in the Lord's Supper and washing the saints' feet.
    14. We believe in the perseverance of the saints.

15. We believe it is impossible for them to fall away.

16. We believe in the resurrection of the dead.

17. We believe in Judgment Day, and that the Judge of the whole earth will do right.

18. We believe that the Holy Bible is the word of God, and is a sufficient guide for all believers through time.

# RULES OF MINISTERS

1. He shall bring his gift before conference and stand upon the floor and have Exhorting License and when he improves his license, then give him Minister's License. He is not to baptize any member until he is ordained.

2. That we recommend to the church composing the same that no one is ordained to the Ministry of the Word, unless some church requests his ordination as her pastor, or that the church of which he is a member would be willing to have him as her pastor and that if she has none she actually chooses him as such.

3. If any minister violates these rules he must be tried before the

church with Elders and Decorum.

# RULES OF DECORUM

1. We agree to hold conference four times a year and as often as we see fit.

2. A Moderator and Clerk shall be appointed.

3. Conference shall be opened by praise and prayer.

4. The door of the church shall be opened for reception of members to fellowship.

5. The state and standing of the church shall be inquired into.

- 6. No member shall leave the conference without permission of the Moderator.
- 7. The minority shall submit to the majority in all cases except receiving members to fellowship and to office; this shall be unanimous.
- 8. Any business brought up in the church shall be read three times before acted upon.
- 9. We agree that if any member shall violate these rules, such member shall be dealt with according to gospel order.
  - 10. We agree to commune four times a year when all is well.

11. We agree to wash feet once a year at each church.

12. No member shall have any right to contract any business of the

church without the liberty of the church to do so.

13. If any member of the church become dissatisfied with the rules of the church they shall be excluded from fellowship until they can give satisfaction and then be restored.

14. Be it resolved that we will withdraw fellowship from any member that will not pay his or her honest debt, if they are able to work.

15. If any member shall wilfully absent himself or herself from communion, he or she shall make their reasons known to the church.

16. If any member violates any of these rules they shall be brought

to trial. They must be first tried by their own church.

17. If any member sees another transgress the rules of the church and does not report it to the church after complying with Matthew 18, they are liable to be tried before the church themselves.

18. If any minister, deacon, or clerk transgress these rules, the church shall have power to call help from other churches to aid in settling it.

19. We agree to not commune with any person unless they are baptised in our faith and order.

20. We agree to commune with Predestinarian Baptists who are in good standing.

21. No exhorting minister shall be admitted to the stand only by preaching his trial sermon, only in a Union or an Association.

22. We agree male members pay \$10.00, female members pay \$5.00 Association fees in 1962.

- 23. No ordination shall be done unless it is in a Union or an Association.
- 24. No traffic or trade shall be nearer than 150 yards of the church ground.
- 25. No minister, or member shall have a right to carry any of Contentnea Association property to any other Association.

26. This done by order of the Association conference.

# ASSOCIATION GOVERNMENT

1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the churches in the Contentnea Primitive Baptist Association, who shall be members supposed to be the best qualified for that purpose, and those producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, shall be entitled to seats in the Association provided the church is in peace at the time the appointment is made.

2. In these letters presented by said members shall be recorded the number of members in full fellowship, how many received, how many dismissed or excluded, and those who died since last Association

convened.

3. Members thus chosen and convened shall denominate the Contentnea Primitive Baptist Association.

4. The Association when convened shall be governed and ruled by a

regular and proper decorum.

5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk, who shall be of the body chosen by the members that compose the Association; they shall hold their offices until their successors are elected.

6. The names of the members that constitute the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association

may require.

7. In case a new church desires to be admitted to this union, they shall petition by letter and legal representatives and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly, they shall be received by the Association and manifested by the Moderator extending to the messenger the right hand of fellowship.

8. It shall not be the duty of the Moderator to vote in the Association, but in the case of a division in the Association the Moderator

shall appoint a committee to investigate and shall execute his own judgment according to the report of the committee as to who is in order or disorder.

and principles that demonstrate the original Primitive Baptist cause. the messengers that constitute the Association shall be authorized

- 9. If any minister is not found adhering to the orthodox doctrines by the Moderator to investigate this matter at any time available.
- 10. Visiting brethren may be invited to assist in the Association in every way except to vote.
- 11. If any church of this Association shall become grievous, failing to report, it shall be under the immediate censure of the Association.

12. The Association shall furnish the churches of the union with

Minutes of the proceedings.

13. Clerk shall have a book in which shall be recorded the proceedings of each Association and when and where the Association will be

held at the different churches in the union.

- 14. We believe it to be absolutely necessary to have a fund for defraying expenses of the Association and recommend that each church composing it, voluntarily contribute such sum as they think proper and send it by the messenger to the Association, which money shall be placed in the hands of the Treasurer, who shall account for the same and pay it out as directed by the Association.
- 15. Every query presented by any messenger in the Association shall be read and before it shall be debated, the Moderator shall put it to a vote as to whether it shall be debated, otherwise the query must be withdrawn.

16. No member shall abruptly break off or absent himself from the Association without first obtaining permission from the Moderator.

17. The Association shall provide a general union among the churches, shall preserve inviolably a chain of communion among the same, shall give the churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty, shall have power to withdraw from any church composing the union which violates the rules of the Association, or deviates from the orthodox principles by a majority vote.

On motion agreed that no elder or deacon shall have the power to carry any of Contentnea property to any other circuit or Association.

### ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe that there is one true and living God.

2. We believe in His divinity and God-head.

- 3. We believe that there are three distinct persons composing His characters, God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Ghost, and that these three are one.
- 4. We believe that He is a God of purpose and that all His purposes are carried into effect by Him.

5. We believe in His foreknowledge of all things.

- 6. We believe that the soul of man is saved by the grace of God through our Lord Jesus Christ, unmerited by anything that man can do, but is alone the gift of God to man, freely bestowed on him by God through our Lord Jesus Christ.
- 7. We believe that the secret faith is made known by revelation, being revealed to man by Almighty God.

8. We believe in experience of grace.

9. We believe in baptism by immersion.

10. We believe that the happiness of the saints is eternal and the punishment of the wicked is everlasting.

11. We believe in the everlasting covenant entered into between

the Father and Son.

12. We believe in the atonement made by Jesus for all the elect of God that were given to Jesus Christ before the world was.

13. We believe in the Lord's Supper and washing the saints' feet.

14. We believe in the perseverance of the saints.

15. We believe it is impossible for them to fall away.

16. We believe in the resurrection of the dead.
17. We believe in Judgment Day, and that the Judge of the whole earth will do right.

18. We believe that the Holy Bible is the word of God, and is a sufficient guide for all believers through time.

# RULES OF MINISTERS

1. He shall bring his gift before conference and stand upon the floor and have Exhorting License and when he improves his license, then give him Minister's License. He is not to baptize any member until he is ordained.

2. That we recommend to the church composing the same that no one is ordained to the Ministry of the Word, unless some church requests his ordination as her pastor, or that the church of which he is a member would be willing to have him as her pastor and that if she has none she actually chooses him as such.

3. If any minister violates these rules he must be tried before the

church with Elders and Decorum.

# RULES OF DECORUM

1. We agree to hold conference four times a year and as often as we see fit.

2. A Moderator and Clerk shall be appointed.

3. Conference shall be opened by praise and prayer.

4. The door of the church shall be opened for reception of members to fellowship.

5. The state and standing of the church shall be inquired into.

- 6. No member shall leave the conference without permission of the Moderator.
- 7. The minority shall submit to the majority in all cases except receiving members to fellowship and to office; this shall be unanimous.

8. Any business brought up in the church shall be read three times

before acted upon.

9. We agree that if any member shall violate these rules, such member shall be dealt with according to gospel order. 10. We agree to commune four times a year when all is well.

11. We agree to wash feet once a year at each church.

- 12. No member shall have any right to contract any business of the church without the liberty of the church to do so.
- 13. If any member of the church become dissatisfied with the rules of the church they shall be excluded from fellowship until they can give satisfaction and then be restored.
- 14. Be it resolved that we will withdraw fellowship from any member that will not pay his or her honest debt, if they are able to work.
- 15. If any member shall wilfully absent himself or herself from communion, he or she shall make their reasons known to the church.
- 16. If any member violates any of these rules they shall be brought They must be first tried by their own church.
- 17. If any member sees another transgress the rules of the church and does not report it to the church after complying with Matthew 18, they are liable to be tried before the church themselves.

18. If any minister, deacon, or clerk transgress these rules, the church shall have power to call help from other churches to aid in settling it.

19. We agree to not commune with any person unless they are bap-

tised in our faith and order.

20. We agree to commune with Predestinarian Baptists who are in good standing.

21. No exhorting minister shall be admitted to the stand only by

preaching his trial sermon, only in a Union or an Association.

- 22. We agree male members pay \$10.00, female members pay \$5.00 Association fees.
- 23. No ordination shall be done unless it is in a Union or an Association.
- 24. No traffic or trade shall be nearer than 150 yards of the church ground.
- 25. No minister, or member shall have a right to carry any of Contentnea Association property to any other Association.

26. This done by order of the Association conference.

### ASSOCIATION GOVERNMENT

1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the churches in the Contentnea Primitive Baptist Association, who shall be members supposed to be the best qualified for that purpose, and those producing letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointment, shall be entitled to seats in the Association provided the church is in peace at the time the appointment is made.

2. In these letters presented by said members shall be recorded the number of members in full fellowship, how many received, how many dismissed or excluded, and those who died since last Association

convened.

3. Members thus chosen and convened shall denominate the Contentnea Primitive Baptist Association.

4. The Association when convened shall be governed and ruled by a

regular and proper decorum.

5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk, who shall be of the body chosen by the members that compose the Association; they shall hold their offices until their successors are elected.

6. The names of the members that constitute the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the Association

may require.

- 7. In case a new church desires to be admitted to this union, they shall petition by letter and legal representatives and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly, they shall be received by the Association and manifested by the Moderator extending to the messenger the right hand of fellowship.
- 8. It shall not be the duty of the Moderator to vote in the Association, but in the case of a division in the Association the Moderator shall appoint a committee to investigate and shall execute his own judgment according to the report of the committee as to who is in order or disorder.

and principles that demonstrate the original Primitive Baptist cause, the messengers that constitute the Association shall be authorized

9. If any minister is not found adhering to the orthodox doctrines by the Moderator to investigate this matter at any time available.

10. Visiting brethren may be invited to assist in the Association

in every way except to vote.

11. If any church of this Association shall become grievous, failing to report, it shall be under the immediate censure of the Association.

12. The Association shall furnish the churches of the union with Minutes of the proceedings.

13. Clerk shall have a book in which shall be recorded the proceed-

ings of each Association and when and where the Association will be held at the different churches in the union.

14. We believe it to be absolutely necessary to have a fund for defraying expenses of the Association and recommend that each church composing it, voluntarily contribute such sum as they think proper and send it by the messenger to the Association, which money shall be placed in the hands of the Treasurer, who shall account for the same and pay it out as directed by the Association.

15. Every query presented by any messenger in the Association

shall be read and before it shall be debated, the Moderator shall put it to a vote as to whether it shall be debated, otherwise the query must be withdrawn.

16. No member shall abruptly break off or absent himself from the Association without first obtaining permission from the Moderator.

17. The Association shall provide a general union among the churches, shall preserve inviolably a chain of communion among the same, shall give the churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty, shall have power to withdraw from any church composing the union which violates the rules of the Association, or deviates from the orthodox principles by a majority vote.

On motion agreed that no elder or deacon shall have the power to carry any of Contentnea property to any other circuit or Association.

### ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe that there is one true and living God.

2. We believe in His divinity and God-head.

- 3. We believe that there are three distinct supreme characters, God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Ghost, and that these three are one.
- 4. We believe that He is a God of purpose and that all His purposes are carried into effect by Him.

5. We believe in His foreknowledge of all things.

6. We believe that the soul of man is saved by the grace of God through our Lord Jesus Christ, unmerited by anything that man can do, but is alone the gift of God to man, freely bestowed on him by God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

7. We believe that the secret faith is made known by revelation,

being revealed to man by Almighty God.

8. We believe in experience of grace.

9. We believe in baptism by immersion.

10. We believe that the happiness of the saints is eternal and the punishment of the wicked is everlasting.

11. We believe in the everlasting covenant entered into between

the Father and Son.

12. We believe in the atonement made by Jesus for all the elect of God that were given to Jesus Christ before the world was.

13. We believe in the Lord's Supper and washing the saints' feet.

14. We believe in the perseverance of the saints.

15. We believe it is impossible for them to fall away.

16. We believe in the resurrection of the dead.

- 17. We believe in Judgment Day, and that the Judge of the whole earth will do right.
- 18. We believe that the Holy Bible is the word of God, and is a sufficient guide for all believers through time.

RULES OF MINISTERS

1. He shall bring his gift before conference and stand upon the floor and have Exhorting License and when he improves his license, then give him Minister's License. He is not to baptize any member until he is ordained.

2. That we recommend to the church composing the same that no one is ordained to the Ministry of the Word, unless some church requests his ordination as her pastor, or that the church of which he is a member would be willing to have him as her pastor and that if she has none she actually chooses him as such.

3. If any minister violates these rules he must be tried before the

church with Elders and Decorum.

### RULES OF DECORUM

1 We agree to hold conference four times a year and as often as we see fit.

2. A Moderator and Clerk shall be appointed.

3. Conference shall be opened by praise and prayer.

4. The door of the church shall be opened for reception of members to fellowship.

5. The state and standing of the church shall be inquired into.

6. No member shall leave the conference without permission of the Moderator.

7. The minority shall submit to the majority in all cases except receiving members to fellowship and to office; this shall be unanimous.

8. Any business brought up in the church shall be read three times before acted upon.

9. We agree that if any member shall violate these rules, such member shall be dealt with according to gospel order.

10. We agree to commune four times a year when all is well.

11. We agree to wash feet once a year at each church.

12. No member shall have any right to contract any business of the

church without the liberty of the church to do so.

13. If any member of the church become dissatisfied with the rules of the church they shall be excluded from fellowship until they can give satisfaction and then be restored.

14. Be it resolved that we will withdraw fellowship from any member

that will not pay his or her honest debt, if they are able to work.

15. If any member shall wilfully absent himself or herself from communion, he or she shall make their reasons known to the church.

16. If any member violates any of these rules they shall be brought

to trial. They must be first tried by their own church.

17. If any member sees another transgress the rules of the church and does not report it to the church after complying with Matthew 18, they are liable to be tried before the church themselves.

18. If any minister, deacon, or clerk transgress these rules, the church shall have power to call help from other churches to aid in settling it.

19. We agree to not commune with any person unless they are baptised in our faith and order.

20. We agree to commune with Predestinarian Baptists who are in

good standing.

21. No exhorting minister shall be admitted to the stand only by preaching his trial sermon, only in a Union or an Association.

22. We agree male members pay \$10.00, female members pay \$5.00

Association fees.

- 23. No ordination shall be done unless it is in a Union or an Association.
- 24. No traffic or trade shall be nearer than 150 yards of the church ground.
- 25. No minister, or member shall have a right to carry any of Contentnea Association property to any other Association.

26. This done by order of the Association conference.
