

Dear Member of WTS:

The Wesleyan Theological Journal, Vol. II, has been received from the publisher and has been put in the mail. All members of the society who have paid their 1966-67 dues should have received their copy of the Journal by now. If you have not, and you have paid your 1966-67 dues, please let me know immediately.

There have been two questions raised with reference to dues and membership in Opportunity the society:

The membership year for WTS begins with the first of November. Therefore, dues for the membership year are payable after November 1 and must be paid before the Journal for the membership year can be sent out the following Spring. However, if dues for the current membership year have not been paid by the time the Journal is mailed, the dues can be paid up until the start of the following membership year and the Journal for that year will be sent.

Membership in the society is, therefore, from November to November. At its meeting last fall the Executive Committee voted that members who do not pay their dues during any given membership year will be dropped from the membership list before the commencement of another membership year; thus a charter member who paid his dues for 1965-66 membership year but who has not as yet paid his dues for the 1966-67 membership year will be dropped from the membership list unless his dues are paid before the start of the 1967-68 membership year next November.

Some applicants for membership to the society have been concerned about the status of their application. All persons who have applied for membership prior to January 17, 1967 have been admitted to membership to the society and should have received a notification to that effect from Dr. Paul Petticord, chairman of the Membership Committee for WTS. All such persons should, therefore, submit their dues to Dr. Ralph Thompson, Spring Arbor College, Spring Arbor, Michigan if they have not already done so.

One thousand of the 1967 Journals have been printed, so we have a sizable quantity available for sale. Of course, we have no sales organization so we depend upon the members of the society to assist us in this matter. Professors in colleges, leaders in denominational ministries, and pastors should be in a position to push the sale of this fine Journal. We will be happy to ship a supply to any member on consignment. They are priced at one-dollar per copy. We also have a few of the 1966 Journals left, and we would be happy to ship small consignments of these to anyone interested.
