Dear Dr. Harris:

This is our new letterhead. I expect to get some of it in the mail to you next week.

I think it is wise for Bishop Boyd to state to our Execu-SEC.-TREAS., Wilber T. Dayton Asbury Theological Seminary lationship between the NHA and the WTS. We certainly should consider the matter from every angle before preparing a constitution for the WTS.

I hesitate to cast my vote for allowing some of our articles from the Journals to be incorporated in a book by the NHA. We still are having quite a sale for all the Journals. At the moment we are in the process of getting the 1968 Journal reprinted. I wonder if this will diminish our sales noticibly. It seems to me that if the NHA felt that to allow us to publish the papers by Dr. Taylor and Dr. Arnette would hurt the sale of their publication, the same argument would hold if the situation were reversed. Later on, when 4200 South East Jennings Avenue our Journals are no longer in demand, if they should want to bring some of our articles before the public in book form, such a move would have real value. If the rest of the brethren favor permitting the NHA to use some of our materials at this point, I do not wish to oppose the desire of the group. I am not convinced, however, of the wisdom of giving this permission.
