Dear Dr. Taylor:

I am in receipt of a letter from the Rev. Armor D. Peisker, as also a copy of the receipt from the Wesleyan Book Room, showing that he paid the sum of \$349.22, minus 10%, or \$296.48 net, for the work done by Wesley Press on the 1972 Journal. I believe that you and President Mattke both received copies of this receipt. Brother Peisker's letter is in response to my last letter concerning this matter, and is very gracious, as I would expect from him. However, he does not say in his letter whether he expects or is susceptible to a refund of this amount which he has paid.

In any event, my position is as stated in my last letter to you men, that is that it would be very unfair and unjust to allow Brother Peisker to pay this sum. ^{THIS} extra expense was incurred in good faith and it is not his responsibility to pay it in any sense of the word. Therefore, I think we should reimburse him for this amount. If you men do not agree with me in this decision, then I shall plan to make a settlement personally with Brother Peisker. Since I have had no word from any of you in reply to my last letter I do not know your thoughts in the matter. I shall appreciate your reactions in this.

While you stated in a previous letter, Brother Taylor, that it had been necessary to borrow money to meet the WTS expenses, you did not state how much it was necessary to borrow, or where we stand financially. I should be very grateful for such a statement from you. I would hope that we are not too bad off financially.

I am remaining in Taiwan to teach in the Graduate Summer Pastors' Seminar June 19-July 8. Mrs. Carter and I expect to return to America immediately following that and should be home by about the middle of July. We may spend a few days in Alaska enroute. I am scheduled to preach in two large camps in August- one in South Carolina and the other at Fairmount, Indiana. I should hope to sell some Journals at both of these camps, but it has been my past experience that campmeetings are not the most conducive to the sale of scholarly literature. So I am not sure how this may go. I shall do my best. What we shall do following the summer is yet undecided. I am being pressed to return and continue teaching here at China Evangelical Seminary. We shall decide when home.

We expect to organize the Taiwan Chapter of the WTS during the Summer Pastors' Seminar. It seems the best time to get the men together.

Trusting that you and Mrs. Taylor are now enjoying improved health, and anticipating an early reply, I am
