Dear Mildred:

Your letter and enclosures are before me. I'll answer one by one--

First, the JOURNAL is still in the hands of the printer. I've pressured all I dare, and still expect a good job. They are striving for the end of this coming week, as their date for the first release of it.

Second, the matter of Dieter's paper at Chapel Hour, I think, could be resolved by giving him 25 minutes to present it, and each of two scholars 8 minutes to critique it, following the paper. That would allow for an opening hymn and prayer, and still keep it within the 50 minutes for Chapel.

You should know that Chapels on Friday here are more of the Forum type, and not the inspirational and/or worship cast. So his paper would fit right into the format we are accustomed to here. I do not know whether or not Dr. Stanger conveyed this to you in his letter, but that is the nature of most of our Friday sessions.

I would say, just build your program so that the WTS group can move right into the Chapel or sanctuary and start their session at 10:00 a.m. sharp there. Then following the Chapel we could have one more paper with discussion before the noon-break--possibly staying on in the Chapel for that session.

Your letter from Dr. Blaney leads me to believe that he thought of your outline as one of the College Seminar sessions instead of looking upon it as the initial planning for the Annual Meeting of one and one-half days here at ATS next November. Just a case of "misplaced reference," I think. You can clear that up with him during your visit to New England, IF not before.

Say, in your traveling from here on to New England, will you have any extra space in your car? Here's the question: We assembled as complete a file as possible of the old CHRISTIAN WITNESS & ADVOCATE OF BIBLE HOLINESS as

was possible in order to have it microfilmed. The latter is now in process at the Univ. of Michigan microfilming center.

In assembling those volumes of the WITNESS we had to borrow several volumes of it from the EASTERN NAZARENE COLLEGE Library. In returning them we have found that the UPS (United Parcel Service) will not take them because they are rare, unreplacable materials. And we hesitate to send them back by parcel post because of the terribly rough handling that they would be given. So, I am inquiring--all unknown to our librarian--as to whether or not you might be able to transport some (if not all) of these rare copies back to ENC. Please feel very free to be frank in your reply.

Shall we plan definitely on meeting at our house for an adjourned WTS Executive Committee Meeting? If so, we ought to get word to Bro. Lovell so that he can plan to be with us.

We haven't as yet received that promised copy of your book from B.H.Press of Kansas City. We're anxious to receive it.

Thanks for keeping me informed on your progress to date.
