REPORT OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT by P.P. Phillips

Last Sunday was Rally Day in the Sunday School and a day for checking up on our work for last year. It was somewhat disappointing to find out that with 343 names on our roll, we had an average attendance of only 178 -- about one-half. We also discovered that there were 245 manbers of our church who do not attend Sunday School. We believe that most of these are Adults and suggest that the Adult Classes find out who they are and try to get them to attend Sunday School.

Next Sunday, October 5, is the first Sunday of the new Sunday School Year, Many of the children have been promoted and are in new departments and will need the help of their parents in getting adjusted to new teachers and new lessons. Remember, the Sunday School has your child for only one hour each week; and to develop his Christian life, he must have the help and encouragement of his parents. What the child learns in the home overshadows anything that can be given to him at Sunday School.

You will be contributing much to the success of the Sunday School

if you resolve to do the following:

(1) Read the Bible and have family prayers daily, with the children

if there are any in the household.

(2) Study with the children. Read their papers and quarterlies when they bring them home, Have a regular time for studying the lesson for the following Sunday with them,

(3) Find out who is teaching your children and ask this teacher for suggestions on how you can help. Give the teacher all the help and encouragement you can. They need and appreciate your continued interest in their work.

(4) Bring your children to Sunday School by 9:30 A.M. Remember that children comming late disturb the Devotion and Study Periods and make the work of the teachers much more difficult.

(5) If you are qualified to teach Sunday School Classes, volunteer your services to the Superintendent.
