

DAILY PROCEEDINGS

FIRST DAY

Thursday, October 21, 1909.

The Thirteenth Annual Session of the Atlantic Mission Conference convened in Parmele Methodist Episcopal Church at Parmele, N. C., Thursday, October 21, 1909, at 2 p.m. Bishop David H. Moore, D. D., in the chair.

After singing from the Methodist Hymnal, "And are we yet alive!" Dr. O. S. Baketel read the first chapter of Saint John and led the Conference in prayer.

"A charge to keep I have!" was sung and the Bishop assisted by Dr. Baketel and the District Superintendent administered the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper to the Members and congregation present.

The former Secretary called the Roll and the following Members responded;—T. S. Davis, M. L. Chappell, W. H. Luther, J. J. Lewis, D. D. Bailey, W. J. Plint.

Probationers; — J. H. Garriss, W. C. Baines, W. R. Woodell, L. N. Booth, W. F. Graham.

- W. F. Graham and W. J. Plint were nominated as candidates for Secretary. W. J. Plint was elected and named W. F. Graham as his Assistant.
- D. D. Bailey was elected Statistical Secretary and named L. N. Booth as Assistant.
- W. H. Luther was elected Treasurer and named M. L. Chappell as Assistant.

The following Committees were appointed:—

On motion of T. S. Davis the Conference hours were fixed at 9.30 a.m. to 12. and afternoon sessions as ordered, and the first three seats were made the Conference Bar.

Dr. O. S. Baketel, representing the Board of Sunday Schools, Dr. Fowles, representing the Board of Foreign Missions and Dr. Tomkinson of the Wilmington Conference, were introduced to the Conference. Brothers Autree and Farrell, of the M. E. Church, South, were introduced.

Question 14 was called; the Superintendent read his report and his character was passed.

W. H. Luther was called, his character passed and report given.

J. J. Lewis called, character passed and report given. Dr. Graham was called and his character passed.

The following made their reports and on motion of T. S. Davis their characters passed:— L. N. Booth, W. C. Baines, W. J. Plint, W. F. Graham, J. H. Garriss.

Questions 16, 17, 18, 19, 20 and 21 were called, the answer to each being 'none.'

Question 7 was called and on motion of District Superintendent Davis, James A. Morris, a Probationer of the First Year was Discontinued.

W. J. Plint was given charge of the accounts of the

Book Concern and J. J. Lewis was appointed Canvasser for the Methodist Review.

W. H. Luther, D. D. Bailey and W. J. Plint were appointed a committee on Conference Relations.

On motion of T. S. Davis Conference adjourned.

Announcements were made and the Benediction pronounced by Dr. Tomkinson.

SECOND DAY

Friday, October 22, 1909.

Conference convened at 9.30 a.m. Bishop Moore led the devotional services reading the fourth chapter of First John and commenting on the same. The Bishop also read from the Discipline, paragraphs 105-117 "The Call to Preach" and "Rules for Conduct" and made appropriate comment as he read.

The journal of Thursday was read, corrected and approved.

Dr. Graham was made chairman of the committee on Periodicals in the place of Brother Luther.

A communication from the Treasurer of the Episcopal Fund was read and on motion of W. J. Plint the Conference Stewards were authorized to apportion the \$31. requested among the various charges.

On motion of the Secretary, our draft on the Book Concern for \$72.00 was ordered payable to W. H. Luther, Treasurer of the Conference Relief Fund.

Brothers Woodell and Moore made their reports.

M. L. Chappell rendered his report and Dr. Graham made his report as President of our Conference School.

Question 11-b was called, after favorable report of the

Examiners, on motion of the Superintendent, W. J. Plint was graduated.

Question 8-b was taken up. W. F. Graham and L. N. Booth, having answered the Disciplinary Questions and the Bishop having addressed them, after proper recommendation on motion of T. S. Davis they were Received into Full Connection and advanced to the Studies of the Third Year.

Question 6 was taken up, W. C. Baines was called, his character passed and, on motion of the Superintendent, he was Continued on Trial and advanced to the Studies of the Second Year conditioned on the Divine Library of the Old Testament.

W. R. Woodell was called, his character passed and, on motion of T. S. Davis, he was Continued on Trial in Studies of the Second Year.

Question 7 was recalled and, on motion of T. S. Davis, J. H. Garriss was Discontinued. On motion of W. H. Luther, representing the Committee on Conference Relations, \$100. was granted Brother Garriss out of the Conference Relief Fund.

Announcements were made, the Doxology sung and Benediction pronounced by Dr. Graham.

THIRD DAY

Saturday, October 23, 1909.

Conference was called to order at 9.45 a.m. Bishop Moore in the chair.

After devotional services the Bishop read paragraphs 118-125, "Spiritual Qualifications," from the Discipline making appropriate remarks as he read.

The Missionary Appropriations for 1909-1910 were read and accepted. The journal of Friday was read, corrected and approved, and the Disciplinary Questions were taken up 'Seriatim.'

Questions 1 and 2, 'none.'

Question 3. Evan J. Midgett was Re-admitted in Studies of the Second Year.

Question 4, 'none.'

Question 5. W. L. Moore, a Local Elder, was Received on Trial in Studies of First Year.

Questions 6, 7, 9, 10, 11, 'none.'

Question 12-a. Upon recommendation of Parmele Quarterly Conference, Joseph H. Bundy was Elected to Deacon's Orders.

Question 20. J. B. Bridgers was allowed to Withdraw under Complaints.

Question 32. Invitations were received from Ocracoke, Rowlands and Marshallberg. Upon vote, Ocracoke was selected as the seat of our next session.

On motion of T. S. Davis, question 5 was reconsidered and W. L. Moore was Received in Full Connection upon his Credentials from the Methodist Protestant Church and advanced to the Studies of Third Year.

On motion of Dr. Graham the rule requiring a minimum of 70 was suspended in the case of W. R. Woodell, and he was admitted into full connection and advanced to the Studies of the Third year.

On motion of W. J. Plint the Secretary of the Trustees of the Conference Relief Fund was requested to lay before the Conference, the minutes of the last two sesions of that Board.

The following Committees read reports: which were

adopted; viz, Auditing Committee, Conference Stewards, Education, Freedman's Aid and Foreign Missions.

On motion of W. J. Plint, our Commission on Boundaries be revised and instructed to meet with a similar Commission from the Blue Ridge Conference as soon as practical.

On motion of M. L. Chappell, Conference adjourned to meet at 8.30 to-night. Announcements were made, Doxology was sung; the benediction was pronounced by the Bishop.

EVENING SESSION.

Conference convened at 8.30 P. M. The Journal of the morning session was read and approved.

W. L. Moore, J. J. Lewis and C. S. Davis were elected Trustees of the G. C. I., term to expire in 1912.

The Episcopal Fund apportionment was read and approved.

W. L. Moore and W. R. Woodell. having answered the Disciplinary questions, were received into Full Connection.

The Committee on Temperance made report, which was adopted.

On motion of T. S. Davis, Dr. Graham was authorized to prepare reports on Sunday Schools and Periodicale to be included in our printed minutes.

The Statistician made his report. On motion it was adopted.

The Treasurer reported \$371 as the amount of the collections.

On motion of W. H. Luther, the \$251. in the hands

of Treasurer of the Relief Fund was ordered divided among the full members according to the years of service in full connection.

The Secretary of the Trustees of the Relief Fund read the minutes of their meeting, and the Articles of Incorporation.

On motion of W. J. Plint two members of this Board are elected; terms to expire in 1910, two in 1911, and the fifth in 1912. Dr. Graham asked to be excused as a Trustee and M. L. Chappell was elected.

A resolution of thanks to the citizens of Parmele was adopted by rising vote.

On motion of T. S. Davis the Superintendent and Secretary were authorized to edit and publish the minutes, and on motion, each member and supply was assessed \$2.50 to defray the expenses.

The following were appointed as Committee to confer with the Blue Ridge Conference; T. S. Davis, W. J. Plint, W. H. Luther, M. L. Chappell, D. D. Bailey

On motion of W. H. Luther, after the reading of the minutes, and the appointments by the Bishop, the Conference stand adjourned "sine die".

FREEDMAN'S AID.

We, your Committee on Freedman's Aid, respectfully submit the following report.

As a church, we feel thankful to Almighty God that we are enabled to realize that our labors have not been in vain, nor our monies misspent that have been employed in helping the colored people of the South in obtaining an education: not only to prepare them for the pursuits of life, but also for teachers, and other leaders among their own people.

There are 350.000 of these people who are members of our own church. They have twenty schools out of which have gone forth teachers, ministers, lawyers and doctors who are doing efficient work in training their people for the duties of life. We believe that the time is not far distant when they will reach the point of Christian Education that will elevate them to the trust and respect of all men.

Therefore, let us go to our different fields of labor determined to raise the amount for that cause at least 25 percent above this years collection.
