Dr. McCant said he could not see Entire Sanctification as a second work of grace in Romans 6 through 8. At least, that is what I thought I heard him say near the end of his paper. But how can we be free from sin (Romans 6:7, 18, & 22) without implicating Entire Sanctification as a second work of grace? What about Romans 8? Dr. Larry Wood said he had a brief chat with McCant. I understand he is very sympathetic with the Bultmannian position and is a graduate of Emory. I wonder about the screening process in some of our holiness schools. I see that he is on the faculty of Point Doma College. When a teacher is not solid the result is the sowing of a lot of doubts among students. And it is easier to entertain doubt than it is to affirm our solid convictions, or so it seems.

The Search Committee is at work, or at least beginning its work for the quest for a new \$T\$ president. Mel Dieter is our faculty representative on the Board of Trustees and is a member of the committee. It is holding its first meeting this next Monday in Chicago. There are about eight members on the committee, with another $\underline{\text{Ex}}$ Officio member.

Today is the fall meeting of the Board of Trustees at Bethany hildren's Home, so I must be on my way to Bethany, Ky., in about an hour. It was so good to see the CALDWELLS again at the annual meetingl
