I am enclosing three checks totalling \$63.00 for the sale of WTS Journals. They are: James A. Bradshaw \$21.00; Wesley D. Oden \$21.00; and Mark Wilson \$21.00.

The arrival of the two boxes of WTS Journals and the smaller package with your letter and the WTS programs was just right. I came home after my eight o'clock class yesterday (Thurs.), wrote you a letter, then went back to the seminary chapel service at ten.
