INFORMATION SHEET

CAMPUS LOCATIONS: See the Campus Directory on the back of your packet for the location of college buildings.

LOCATION OF MEETINGS: Meetings will be held in Herrick Auditorium, located at the southwest corner of the campus at N.W. 39th Expressway and Asbury Street.

DEPARTMENT OF RELIGION: The S. T. Ludwig Religion Building is located on College Street, across from the R. T. Williams Library. During "free" time between WTS sessions, you are invited to come by the offices of the Religion faculty and get better acquainted.

MEALS: Meals will be available in the college dining hall located in the West wing of the Memorial Student Union. Hours and prices are as follows:

BANQUET LOCATION: The Banquet on Friday evening at 6:15 will be in the Peniel Room, located in the East wing of the Student Union.

BOOKSTORE: The Bethany Book Store (operated by the Nazarene Publishing House) is located diagonally across the corner from Herrick Auditorium on the corner of Asbury and N.W. 39th Expressway. You will be welcome to go in and browse.

RESTROOMS: From the front foyer of Herrick Auditorium, the Men's Room is located at the bottom of the east stairway. The Ladies' Room is at the bottom of the west stairs.

BETHANY FIRST CHURCH OF THE NAZARENE: You may wish to see the new 2500-seat sanctuary and the beautiful chapel of the church, which is just across Asbury Street from Herrick Auditorium. Temporary church offices are located in the office wing of Herrick, on the west, along Asbury Street. Someone in the office will be glad to show you the building.
