

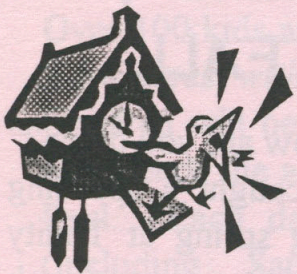

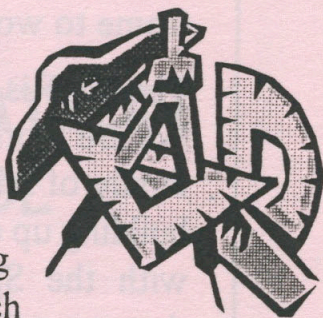
## IMPROVING OUR FACILITIES!

## POWER OF PRAYER

*Be devoted to one another in brotherly love; give preference to one another in honor; not lagging behind in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord; rejoicing in hope, persevering in tribulation, devoted to prayer...*

Romans 12: 10-12

We're starting a telephone prayer chain at our church. Its purpose is to provide supplemental prayer support to members of Trinity Avenue and their immediate families in times of urgent or extraordinary need. Currently we have 14 people who have agreed to be a part of the prayer chain. If you have a heart to pray for others, we still have room for you.

### **How do I get a request to the prayer chain?**

Call the church office (682-3865) and specifically request that the prayer chain be activated. If you do not specifically request that the prayer chain be activated, your need will remain in the church office and will be prayed for by the minister. If it is a weekend, you may call Jane Eakle (479-7012) who has agreed to oversee the prayer chain.

### **When should I consider using the prayer chain?**

- Whenever there is a medical emergency
- When there is an important medical need that is not an emergency
- When there is a significant emotional stress

### **Can I activate the prayer chain for someone else?**

Only with their permission! Please protect the privacy of others.

### **What happens after I call for the prayer chain?**

The office will inform the pastor and then call Jane Eakle who initiates requests to the prayer chain. Those who have agreed to serve on the prayer chain will pray immediately after receiving a prayer request. Prayer chain participants have agreed to discuss only information pertinent to the request and to keep the information confidential.

## DISCIPLESHIP GROUPS

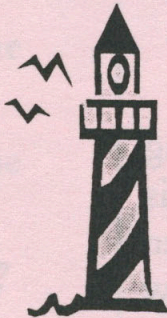
