

Building up the body to... be in touch!

The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory of the LORD, the majesty of our God. Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees. Say to those who are of a fearful heart, "Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God He will come with vengeance, with terrible recompense. He will come and save you " Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongue of the speechless sing for joy For waters shall break forth in the wilderness, and streams in the desert... (Isaiah 35)

When I was in Jerusalem a few years ago, our tour group took an excursion out into the desert. Our vehicle looked much like a lunar rover, which was appropriate because the desert was every bit like a moonscape. The grayish ground was dry, hard and sharp, like walking on barnacles.

Later that day we traveled down to the area where the Dead Sea scrolls were found, and while we were there the clouds grew dark and opened up. It rained, and I mean rained.

"This is highly unusual," said our guide, "One or two inches of rain a year at the most." The water poured off the desert and over the cliffs in instant waterfalls. When the rain passed, we returned up the mountain and through the desert to Jerusalem. It suddenly was a new creation! The desert had blossomed. Underneath that hard surface was life. We stopped our vehicle, got out, and someone in our group

read from Isaiah. "The wilderness and the dry land shall be made glad the desert shall rejoice...and blossom."

Isaiah speaks of the coming of the Lord. Words that we hold on to during the season of Advent when we wait expectantly for our Lord to come and make the dry and barren places of our lives fresh and new. Please take time out this season to read the scriptures and pray. Do this either alone or with your family Take time this season to ring a bell, cook a meal, offer love to someone in need, allow the grace of God to fall on your deserts and watch for joy to blossom.

Being in Touch with Advent!

December 3rd begins the season of Advent. Advent is the time to prepare for the One who comes as our Judge and Redeemer There is a voice of one crying in the wilderness, "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight." We believe that Christ is coming again and we are to prepare the way. The call of Advent is then to care about our world, our neighbors, our enemies- everyone.




BEAUTIFUL TAPC CUSTOM CHRISTMAS ORNAMENTS ON SALE

CONTRIBUTIONS & 2000 TAXES

Will Item Qualify? Donors must deliver or mail (and postmark) checks on or by December 31, 2000, in order to claim a charitable contribution deduction for 2000. Checks that are placed in the church offering on the first Sunday of the year, January 7, 2001, will NOT qualify for a charitable contribution deduction in 2000, even if the check is predated to 2000 or was actually written in 2000. However, checks that are written, mailed, and postmarked in 2000 will be deductible in 2000 though they are not received by the church until 2001

If your contribution is made in 2001 to pay off your 2000 pledge, it will appear on your 2001 contribution statement as applying to the previous year

Written receipts: To ensure the deductibility of your church contributions, please do not file your 2000 income tax return until you have received a written acknowledgment of your contributions from the church. You may lose a deduction for some contributions if you file your tax return before receiving a written acknowledgment of your contributions to the church. Our plan is to mail Trinity Avenue Presbyterian year-end contribution statements on or about January 15, with January 31 being the absolute deadline as mandated by the government.

END OF THE YEAR STOCK CONTRIBUTIONS


If you decide to pay your regular pledge or your Capital Campaign pledge by donating stock to the church, please do so through our Wachovia Investment Account. It is **VERY IMPORTANT** that you let the church bookkeeper, Tricia Truax (682-3865), know what type of stock you are donating and whether it is a regular contribution or a Capital Campaign contribution. The information you give Tricia will assure that your contribution is designated correctly

Caution! If your personal broker is not Wachovia, the documentation that Tricia receives from Wachovia about your donation will probably not have your name attached to it. If you do not let Tricia know that you contributed the stock, your 2000 contribution statement cannot show the contribution.

Please try to make this type of contribution in early December or your year-end contribution statement might be delayed until near the end of January. This is because the contribution statement cannot be written until after the receipt of the Wachovia report concerning your donation, which can take several weeks.

CONTRIBUTION ENVELOPES

On January 7, Sunday, use only 2001 contribution envelopes. It is **VERY IMPORTANT** that you throw away any left over 2000 envelopes. The contribution envelope numbers **changed** for 2001

Christmas Family Night: Sunday, December 17th "Warming of the Chrismon Tree"

And how is TAPC's Christmas tree – decorated with Chrismon ornaments (Christian symbols) "warmed", you may be asking? It is "warmed" by the children (and adults if they so wish to participate) bringing wrapped gifts to place under the tree for those less fortunate to have a more joyous Christmas.
