Pending our congregation's approval and final approval by the Presbytery, Trinity Avenue Presbyterian Church should have a new Associate Pastor in Cathy Church Norman. I am pleased with the choice of Cathy by the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee and I believe that you will be too. Currently, in the Presbyterian Church (USA), there are more churches than there are pastors, and Associate Candidates are in high demand. I was worried that my hair would either be totally gray or falling out by the time help arrived. We have found not just an Associate Candidate, but I believe an exceptional candidate in Cathy. I have found her to be a very bright, warm and personable individual, and I believe she has many gifts to offer our congregation.

Cathy will be coming to us from Princeton Theological Seminary, and brings to our congregation her husband, Bart, who also graduated from PTS. Bart is attending law school at UNC (I guess that can be called one's

continuing education).

When I was called to First Presbyterian in Morganton right out of seminary, I was ordained in that church by people who were strangers. Meet Cathy Church Norman

Cathy Church Norman is a native North Carolinian, growing up in Lexington and moving to Raleigh during junior high school. Cathy received her B.A. in English with a minor in Religion from North Carolina State University in 1994. While in college Cathy was privileged to lead Young Life, an outreach ministry to high school students, at Cary High School, and to serve as a Stephen Minister at Saint Andrews Presbyterian Church in Raleigh.

It was during their freshman year at NC State that Cathy and Bart Norman met and began dating; they were married on May 4, 1996. Bart is also a North Carolinian (from Raleigh), and has a B.A. In English (and a Business Minor) from NCSU

After being married in May 1996, Cathy and Bart moved to Princeton, NJ to expand their horizons and to start seminary in September. Both Cathy and Bart graduated with Masters of Divinity from Princeto Theological Seminary in May 1999. Bart has decided to use his gifts and experience in the public sphere, and is a first year law student at UNC - Chapel Hill.

Some of Cathy's most memorable and rewarding experiences during seminary were her internship at First Presbyterian Church in Houston, Texas, and her chaplaincy at JFK Hospital in Edison, New Jersey. Cathy is excited about being back in the Triangle with family both in the Raleigh and Burlington areas; she hopes to be the Associate Pastor in ministry with us at Trinity Avenue. Cathy looks forward to us growing, learning, worshipping and serving together.

MUSICAL NOTES

It is always interesting to me to hear the great variety of responses from people when they are asked about whether they sing or might be interested in singing in the choir, or even whether they like to sing at all. Most often, the response goes something like this: "You wouldn't want me to sing in your choir, they would all run away"!, or "Everyone in your choir is such a good singer, you certainly wouldn't want me". Other comments: "I'm not a soloist" (hmm!), "I can't carry a tune in a bucket" (they didn't say what kind of bucket!!), "Ho, ho, you must be joking"!, and more. Surely, (you ask) how do you end up with a choir after all that?

First, I will dispel a few myths by saying that everyone who sings in the choir (or a choir) is not a soloist, usually begins with a *bucket* somewhere, are all wanted and loved in their original state (!) and can usually be trained to make some very wonderful sounds!

You see, it is not just the voice that really counts in singing in a choir, but the singular desire to enjoy music, singing, learning and, in our program, leading in worship through music. (By the way, have I told you that this is not a public service announcement for the Chancel Choir?!)

I believe that it is our increasingly busy/passive existence that has fostered a decline in vocal participation by young and old alike. When is the last time you heard an impromptu sing-a-long, sang songs with your friends, sang with the radio/CD player, sang more that 2 or 3 hymns in church (oops, better fix that!) or just enjoyed singing, period?

On another note, I also believe that, within <u>everybody</u> there exists a potential instrument for praise! The psalmist exhorts us to continually sing to the Lord, every day! There is nothing I love more that to get together with a hesitant, apologetic, but willing person and help them discover that they <u>do</u> have a voice with which to sing. It is a gift every person should have. Let <u>your</u> voice be tuned to praise the next time you stand to join in our congregational music!
