

Lenten Dinner Series March 17 & 24

Dr. Mickey Efird, professor of biblical interpretation at Duke Divinity School since 1962, will lead us in a two-part Lenten series on "Portraits of Christ" in the Bible. Dr. Efird has led our study for the past few years by comparing the Passion narratives in the gospel accounts, and by focusing on the prayers of Christ. Professor Efird has concentrated on making biblical scholarship understandable and useful to seminary students and lay people alike. His broad background in both Old and New Testaments is reflected in thirteen books and numerous articles in various journals and Bible dictionaries.

Kids Klub Offering for Palm Sunday

Our children's church (4s-5s, 1st-2nd) kids have each received a special 'fish bank.' This is a special Kids Klub offering project during this 40 day period of Lent leading up to Palm Sunday and Easter. Children in Presbyterian churches all around the world will join together to put together these "Fish Banks," fill them with coins, and bring them to church on Palm Sunday, March 28, 1999. This offering is called "One Great Hour of Sharing" as we join with other churches around the world. We will collect the 'fish banks' in a special net during Sunday School since both children's choirs will sing.

Parents, we hope you take time not only to help your child(ren) put together their banks, but also to teach a lesson in sacrificial giving. For example, you might ask them to give part of an allowance to their Fish Bank, or to save money for their bank rather than buying a soda, dessert or piece of candy one day Just as Christ modeled a life of giving to us as witnessed in the Scriptures, it is important that we model 'giving' to our children. 10K CROP WALK SUNDAY, MARCH 28 2:30 PM

The 1999 Durham CROP Walk for Hunger will be held on Sunday, March 28, at Duke Chapel. Final registration will begin at 1:30 PM that day and the walk begins at 2:30 PM.

WHO WALKS?

In 1996, about 1,700 people walked in Durham. Anyone who can walk the distance and who wants to make a difference in the lives of hungry people is invited. The Durham walk in 1995 was the 4th largest in the United States, raising almost \$117,000. In 1998, TAPC raised \$1,629.50!

WHY 10 KILOMETERS?

Ten kilometers (6.2 miles) is the typical distance hungry people in developing countries walk every day to get food, water, fuel and take their goods to market. Thus the motto, "We walk because they walk."

HOW IS THE MONEY SPENT?

75% is distributed by Church World Service, which since 1946 has carried out global hunger education and provided money for refugees, disaster relief, and self-help projects in more than 80 countries. 25% of the money stays in Durham and is distributed by Durham Congregations in Action to local agencies such as Community Shelter for HOPE, Genesis Home, Meals on Wheels and Phoenix House.

HOW CAN I HELP?

You can participate in one or more of three ways:

- 1 by walking and getting sponsors
- 2. by being a sponsor
- 3. by helping to serve at the Walk (such as at a water station)



You are expected to volunteer at least one day.

Reduce your fee by \$5.00 for each day a parent helps with VCS

e.g. If a parent works three days, the fee will be \$40.00 for each child in the family

if you will be helping for all five days pay \$30.00 per child; etc.

(Scholarships are available as needed: See your church staff person)

Please Note:

Due to our concerns for the safety of the children and the sanity of the leaders, space available will again be strictly limited proportionately to the number of "family" group leaders actually signed up.

e.g. four and five year olds will be accepted in the ratio of 4 children to each leader; first through third graders will be grouped in the ratio of 6 children to each leader. "Family" groups this year will be more closely age-graded, rather than mixed as in the past few years. Registration for members of participating churches will be from March 9 through March 23; and open registration will begin Mar. 24. Children of parents working at VCS will have priority. Should the proportion of leaders to children become too small, a waiting list will be created, with priority established according to the date each registration is received in the WPC office.

About Swimming

Swimming is included in the daily activities. The pool at Camp New Hope has a large area of shallow water and only children who pass a swimming test conducted by the lifeguards on duty are allowed out of the shallow area.


