On June 14, at 6:00 A.M. the first leg of our trip begins as we leave RDU for Atlanta and then to Jamaica. Nineteen youth and three adults will be heading to Jamaica to spend 10 days working, caring, worshipping, sweating, and sleeping.

Our group is assigned to the Moorlands Camp in Spurtee. The camp will have approximately 110 people. We are told that our work projects will be based in and around the community of Mandeville and at the Manchester infirmary. We will also take part in a children's outreach program at the Ebenezer Basic School next to the camp.

# MUSICAL NOTES

## ORGAN CRAWL

**MUSIC ACTIVITY** at Trinity outside of Sunday morning has consisted of several recent noteworthy items. On Monday, May 17<sup>th</sup> the combined **Raleigh** and **Durham/Chapel Hill** chapters of the **American Guild of Organists** included Trinity Avenue in their annual spring meeting. (Harry Jansen is currently **Sub-Dean** of the Durham/Chapel Hill chapter).

The **Bedient** pipe organ here continues to draw outside interest and, on this occasion, was visited by some 20 area organists/organ enthusiasts who were treated to a demonstration/performance by Harry Jansen. AGO members were also able to play and inspect the instrument.

## TRINITY CHAMBER ORCHESTRA

Since **Easter** the music program has developed a new perspective, one that will certainly enrich our church for a long time. The **Barringer Music Endowment** has provided for the participation in worship of orchestral instruments several times a year. What will now be known as the **Trinity Chamber Orchestra** has been consolidated with a permanent roster of professional musicians who will be regular participants in our music program. This has been a goal of mine for some time and I feel it will add a new dimension to our overall program! We also hope to add them more frequently in musical services and events in the future.

## JR. HIGH/SR. HIGH CHOIR

Speaking of growth and additions, we will be adding a fourth choir to our music program this Fall. Since a number of our children are moving up to become the youth, they need a choral program to participate in as well. A **Jr. High/Sr. High Choir** will commence in **August** along with the other choirs in our program. The age group will be from **6<sup>th</sup> grade** and up. Most of the members will already be graduates of the **Chapel Choir** program.

## ANGELUS & CHAPEL CHOIR PLACEMENT

Since we are expanding the choir program, the age/grade groupings of each choir will be different next Fall than during the past choir year.

As of **August** the **Angelus Choir** will mainly consist of **1<sup>st</sup>** and **2<sup>nd</sup>** graders and the **Chapel Choir** will include children in **3<sup>rd</sup>** through **5<sup>th</sup>** grade.

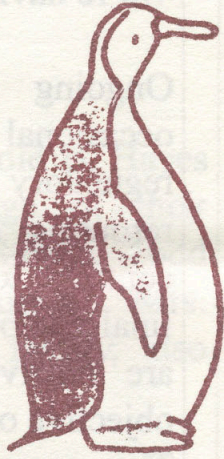

## Building Committee Update

We're having fun now!

Ongoing filings, discussions, interpretations and occasional approvals with Federal, State, and City regulatory groups around the piping of the stream, rerouting of the sewer, and closing of the alley continue to challenge the building project plan. The final site plan cannot be determined until these issues are resolved but we still expect to achieve our objective of maximizing the use of our property.

The current efforts of the building committee are to utilize this time to clearly define the functional/program requirements of our Church. We need to provide the maximum amount of detailed information to the architects for the design phase of the project. Bill Waddell and other committee members are gathering this information from a series of structured meetings with a large cross-section (ten groups) of the congregation. Current, planned, and needed programs are being analyzed to determine needed layout, size, adjacency, and accessibility requirements. This phase will be complete by mid-June.

Some much needed repair work to the Sanctuary roof is scheduled to begin in late June. The replacement heating system for the basement will also be managed on an independent time-line to ensure completion before cold weather returns.

Many challenges remain ahead for this project, but thanks to the efforts of many of you, the future is exciting. Stay tuned for regular updates.
