#### **General Assembly News**

Freda Gardner Elected Moderator on Second Ballot

The only woman candidate for Moderator of the 211th General Assembly, Elder Freda A. Gardner, was elected on the second ballot with 270 votes. She led the voting on the first ballot, but attained the majority needed on the second.

A former Princeton Seminary professor of Christian education, she was applauded along with the other three candidates for doing an outstanding job of addressing concerns of the Assembly through statements and responses to questions. The other candidates, Frank Diaz, Charles Kim and Walter Ungerer, received significant support in the voting process, but Freda Gardner was the clear choice to lead the denomination in the coming year.

Speaking to the Assembly, Gardner said that if elected she would tell the "amazing story of the Presbyterian Church...not the story that divides us but the stories of the many ways in which Christian ministry is being carried out." She also promised to encourage renewed commitment to prayer "to gather in stillness to hear the voice that can lead us to wholeness, the glory that is Christ's and our privilege to witness to it"

#### **Assembly Approves Church Growth Strategy Report**

Fort Worth—By voice vote June 23 the 211th General Assembly approved the report of the Church Growth Strategy Team. Team chair, Ginny Miller, presented the report and its themes of mission, diversity and spiritual enrichment and encouragement for presbyteries and congregations to strategize for growth. For 39 years she said, the Presbyterian Church has been losing members. The Church Growth Strategy Report provides four challenges to churches asking if they want to be well (grow), if they are willing to change, if they dare take risks and will they take responsibility for themselves, rather than blaming their losses on other factors. This report will free churches from unnecessary structure and enable them to engage in mission and strategies which will provide growth spiritually and numerically.



#### 9:00 AM COMMUNION PREPARATION

Before the service: Unlock the communion closet with key #22 and take the box labeled "9 am communion." Set table with cloth, chalice (goblet), ewer (pitcher) with enough juice in it to half-fill the goblet, and the tray with about 40 to 45 Matzo crackers. Put cover on tray. Be sure there is an elder to help serve.

After the service: Wash and replace silver in box and closet. Put juice in refrigerator and Matzo crackers back in box labeled "9 am communion." Return key #22 to key box. Record the number taking communion and the number in attendance in the book in the bureau in the narthex. -Bob and Hildur Blake (490-6750)

#### USHERS

Ushering is an important duty in the church. Good ushering makes a definite contribution to the worship service. This information is intended to acquaint you with the duties of ushers so that the church may enjoy consistent and organized ushering service. The following are the responsibilities of all ushers.

- 1. Ushers are scheduled to serve for a full calendar month. Upon notification that you have been scheduled, please arrange to be present for each service during the month when ushers are required. If you are unable to be present for any occasion, it would be greatly appreciated if you would get a replacement usher who is scheduled for a different month. If unable to obtain a substitute, it is very important that you provide as much notice as possible to the usher-in-charge.
- 2. Ushers for the 9:00 AM service are also responsible for UNLOCKING the building at 8:00 AM so that communion can be prepared and unlocking the school parking lot if it is locked. Ushers for the 11:00 AM Sunday morning services are to be in the narthex by 10:30 AM. Be in the narthex 30 minutes in advance of the starting time for any other services.
- 3. Put on a happy face. Smile and be friendly. Your job is structured; however, there is plenty of time available for you to be helpful and supportive of the congregation. You, as an usher, make a big impression on those in the pews. Do your best to make that a good impression.
- 4. Put on an usher pocket insert. This has proven to be valuable to church members in getting to know who is ushering.
- 5. Help keep the narthex clear for members and visitors to enter the sanctuary.
- 6. Advise visitors with small children of the availability of the nursery.
- 7 In seating those in attendance, remember the following:
  - Observe any reserved seats.
  - Do seat latecomers during the prelude and lighting of the candles. Do not seat anyone during the prayers or scripture/responsive readings. Notations will appear in the bulletin designating appropriate times for seating latecomers.
  - If you cannot spot vacant seats from the rear of the sanctuary, go forward to locate vacant seats and then return to usher the attendees.
  - Distribute as required 'large-print" hymnals amd bulletins, which are kept in the narthex.
- 8. Record attendance in the book in the bureau in the narthex.
- 9. Ensure that any offering (e.g., Pennies for Hunger) and extra bulletins left in the narthex at the end of the service are delivered to the office.

Additional responsibilities for the 9:00 AM ushers and the 11:00 AM USHER-IN-CHARGE can be found in the church office and in a top drawer of the bureau in the narthex.

August Abraham/Isaac


September Daniel

#### **BUILDING COMMITTEE UPDATE**

Site plan development and functional requirement analysis have remained the major focal areas since my last update.

We have pulled back the original application to the NC Dept. of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources (NC DENHR) for our plans to enclose the creek and re-submitted a new one. This was done based on new regulations that went into effect on July 1 and eliminated us from the jurisdiction of the Neuse River regulations. The new application includes a plan to provide the required storm water management system for the newly created impervious services. We are in hopes that this plan will be accepted in the next few weeks and we can finalize the site plan.

We have also been required to submit preliminary plans to the NC Dept. of Cultural Resources to demonstrate that we plan to uphold the architectural and land use responsibilities of residing in an historic district.

Bill Waddell has completed an extraordinary effort in compiling a document that clearly defines the functions of our Church's mission. This document describes size, functionality, and adjacencies of space that are required to meet our current and future needs. It was developed through meetings with an extended group of about forty members that represent the various functions of TAPC. It provides the Architects with a much more comprehensive view of our needs and will greatly enhance the design process. We are fortunate to have the use of Bill's talents.

Finally, from all of the Building Committee, a gracious thanks to Susan Ross, Becky Bowden and all of the Capital Campaign team for a great job. We also wish to thank all of you that have contributed and/or pledged to this campaign. We have experienced a lot of challenges in preparing for the renovation and expansion of a campus that is located in a tightly restricted urban area. However, our challenges would be much more significant if we did not have such a strong financial commitment from all of you. Thanks again.

The winning name should reflect the mission of the "Neighborhood Care" ministry This multi-purposed ministry is designed to reach out to all of TAPC's members and provide them with an avenue of communication, care and fellowship. The ministry will foster for each family and individual within our congregation a small caring community of church members within our growing congregation. These small communities, or groups, will be geographically based and will consist of all the church's members. The groups will be relatively stable over time and small enough so that each member can come to know the others on a personal level. The following is a brief description of each of the ministry's goals.

- Communication- Through the small community groups, each member of the church will be connected to the church staff through a leadership chain. This chain will ensure church contact with ALL the congregation's members. This contact chain will provide an easy medium for members to share feedback with the church. It will also provide each member, especially new members, with an additional way to learn about church events (such as the Spring Retreat) and special services (such as the Love Feast). The chain will also serve to alert the church staff in times of need or family crisis.
- Care- The community groups will ensure that all church members will be cared for in times of personal or family need. These needs will be communicated to the church staff so that they can be appropriately cared for by the Pastor or Stephen's ministers. In addition, members of the group may assist with meals, emergency child care or with a visit.
- Fellowship- Community groups will have social gatherings to provide an opportunity for members of the congregation to share in Christian fellowship. Through social gatherings (twice per year is suggested), members will come to know one another on a personal level. This can also be a time of celebration when members can share in rejoicing. This fellowship will also facilitate new members' introduction and fulfillment in the church.
