

Lenten Dinner Series Thursday, March 30, April 6 & 13

Dr. Mickey Efird, professor of biblical interpretation at Duke Divinity School since 1962, will lead us in a three part Lenten series on the Corinthian Correspondances. Looking at passages from First and Second Corinthians, he will focus on the death of Christ, Resurrection, and Suffering. Dr. Efird has led our study for the past few years by comparing the Passion narratives in the gospel accounts, by focusing on the prayers of Christ, and by looking at the portraits of Christ in the Bible. Professor Efird has concentrated on making biblical scholarship understandable and useful to seminary students and lay people alike. His broad background in both Old and New Testaments is reflected in thirteen books and numerous articles in various journals and Bible dictionaries.





Outreach Reaches Out

At Home

- \$2,000 to Durham's Genesis House. This is a half-way house for homeless families struggling to get on their feet. Janene Tompkins, a member of TAPC, is a volunteer with Genesis House.
- A Habitat for Humanity House. We have funds in hand, and Habitat Chairman Bill Drummond is planning TAPC's partnership with another church to erect a "blitz house" (one built in a very short time) before the end of 2000.
- \$600.00 to Marc Tillett for the Young Life missions trip to the Dominican Republic in March. Marc and his parents, Noell and Kathy Tillett, are all TAPC members. Marc is a graduate of Riverside High, and a freshman this year at UNC-Chapel Hill.

Overseas

- \$2,650.00 to fund two projects in the Philippines. We asked Beth Drake's parents, John C. and Carolyn Beran, Presbyterian missionaries (now retired), to suggest projects we might help fund in or near Midsayap, the area of the Philippines where they formerly worked. Of the many excellent causes they recommended, the Outreach Committee chose:
 - 1 Support for two pastors who work with Manobo tribal people in a mountain area. (Could you believe \$2,000 a year pays both salaries?)

2. Funding of five scholarships @ \$130.00 each = \$650.00 for "work scholars" at Southern Christian College in Midsayap. Persons who receive these scholarships attend school and work ten hours a week.

You made possible all of these gifts by your generosity to Harvey Global Missions Fund.
