What is Pentecost?

When you come into the sanctuary on Pentecost Sunday you'll find that the paraments have been changed to the color Red. The color reminds us of the fire of the Holy Spirit which came and rested upon all who were gathered in Jerusalem.

In the Jewish tradition Pentecost comes 50 days after Passover and is a day to celebrate the reception of the Law by Moses from God. You'll remember there was a lot of shaking going on back then too (Exodus

In the Church Pentecost comes 50 days after the resurrection of Christ, and celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2).

We believe that the Christian life is a life in the Spirit! Come to worship on Pentecost Sunday when we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. We will celebrate the baptism of Mary Bowen Barringer and Anna Teer Barringer, and ordain and install our elders and deacons.



Recently I had to put together a small piece of furniture that consisted of 5 pieces and eight screws. The simplicity of the piece required me to disregard the direction. Directions would simply be a waste of time for what was obviously a simple task. I struggled with lining up holes and screws. Pressing. Squeezing. Straining. I questioned under my breath the craftsman who drilled the holes ½" off center.

Finally after much blood, sweat and coercion the screws were all in and the piece was finished. When I stood back to admire my handiwork, I noticed that what I constructed wasn't matching up to the picture on the box. One piece was upside down and in order to correct it, I had to take the whole thing apart again. I groaned and did what the directions required. It was amazing how well the holes lined up when I followed the directions. The screws went in without an argument.

I don't know about you, but I spend a lot of time pressing and straining at life, trying to make things work the way I see fit, and when I step back to look at what I did..... what I did was make a mess.

Over the summer months I challenge you to read the directions. Find a time to read the Bible every day. Challenge yourself to read one of the gospels over the summer. Don't read for speed. Instead, take your time. Think about what is going on in the text and look for the truths that might apply to your life.

Who knows you may find that following the directions might actually make your life fit together better.
