



Lenten Dinner Series Thursday, March 30, April 6 & 13

Dr. Mickey Efird, professor of biblical interpretation at Duke Divinity School since 1962, will lead us in a three part Lenten series on the Corinthian Correspondances. Looking at passages from First and Second Corinthians, he will focus on the death of Christ, Resurrection, and Suffering. Dr. Efird has led our study for the past few years by comparing the Passion narratives in the gospel accounts, by focusing on the prayers of Christ, and by looking at the portraits of Christ in the Bible. Professor Efird has concentrated on making biblical scholarship understandable and useful to seminary students and lay people alike. His broad background in both Old and New Testaments is reflected in thirteen books and numerous articles in various journals and Bible dictionaries.

TAPC Partners with Pastors in the Philippines

John and Carolyn Beran, Beth Drake's parents, have made it possible for our Harvey Global Mission Fund to help a husband and wife pastor team preaching the gospel in a mountain area of the Philippines. The Berans are retired Presbyterian missionaries who worked for years in that part of the world

A recent letter from the Berans says in part:

"Dear Friends,

It was a great joy for us to receive a check from your church for \$2,650.00 for mission work in the Philippines. Thank you for this very generous gift and for your concern and thoughtfulness.

The pastor couple, Ramon and Shenanda Tutas (serving as pastors in four churches whose membership is largely comprised of Manobo tribal people in a mountain area), played a key role in three of those churches coming out of their tribal religion to profess faith in Jesus Christ and be baptized. It was our joy to share with them and with the people in that mountain area as the people joined in study of the Scriptures and rapidly grew in faith."

TAPC's \$2,000.00 provides the salary for the Tutas for a full year, the Berans report.

Scholarships, too

The other \$650.00 of our gift provided five work-study students at Southern Christian College with work scholarships of \$130.00 each. This pays about one-half of the cost of tuition. The Berans tell us that these work scholarships "mean the difference between being able to pursue a college degree and having to stop schooling after high school."




