

The purpose of this meeting is for the election of elders and deacons for the class of 2002, and to approve the pastors terms of call.





Dress rehearsals will be on the following dates: Sat. April 29th in the morning, Sunday April 30th during the afternoon, and Sat. May 6th in the morning.



On January 9th we returned to a more traditional classroom setting, with the children reporting to the same classrooms and teachers each Sunday. Also, the Pre-K and Kindergarten classes have been divided to allow for a better teacher/child ratio and more "space to grow." Parents will now be able to drop off and pick up their children at the same classroom before and after church. All Sunday School classrooms are now upstairs, with the exception of the 2 & 3 year olds. The teachers assigned to each class are as follows:

Our new Sunday School curriculum, titled "Belonging to God: A First Catechism", will introduce the children to fundamental aspects of the Christian faith. They will learn about and discover new insights and truths about the Bible and the Christian faith. The 60 questions of the catechism workbook cover six important aspects of our faith: Who Am I (Questions 1-6); Creation and Fall (7-13); The Covenant with Israel (14-21); Jesus Christ (22-29); The Vork of the Spirit (30-45); and The Lord's Prayer (46-60). The object of this curriculum is summed up well by William Placher: "Studying this catechism, we learn a story - the biggest and most fundamental story of all. It is a story of how God keeps loving us and never abandons us in spite of all our sins. Part of what it means to be a Christian is to locate ourselves in that story - to know that, most fundamentally, we are children of God, to remember that we have been joined to Abraham's family, to accept Jesus as our Savior, to understand that we belong to the church that began at Pentecost, and to share in the Christian hope. If this really is our story, then we must try to live lives worthy of it, lives of gratitude to God manifested in worshipping God, loving others, and respecting what God has created. It is not enough to learn the language of faith; we must also live the life of faith. But the study of a catechism can be one valuable part of such a life.

Bill Breeze and Steve Yova will be leading the 3rd and 4th graders in an independent study of the New Testament. The children will look in depth at the stories and characters found within these pages through creative and exciting activities.

I hope that the children, and the church, will be enriched by all of these changes. Please talk with the children about what they are learning and discovering about their relationship with God and all of God's children.



9:00 AM COMMUNION PREPARATION

Before the service: Unlock the communion closet with key #22 and take the box labeled "9 am communion." Set table with cloth, chalice (goblet), ewer (pitcher) with enough juice in it to half-fill the goblet, and the tray with about 40 to 45 Matzo crackers. Put cover on tray. Be sure there is an elder to help serve.

After the service: Wash and replace silver in box and closet. Put juice in refrigerator and Matzo crackers back in box labeled "9 am communion." Return key #22 to key box. Record the number taking communion and the number in attendance in the book in the bureau in the narthex.

Hearts and Hands February - April 2000

USHERS

Ushering is an important duty in the church. Good ushering makes a definite contribution to the worship service. This information is intended to acquaint you with the duties of ushers so that the church may enjoy consistent and organized ushering service. The following are the responsibilities of all ushers.

- 1. Ushers are scheduled to serve for a full calendar month. Upon notification that you have been scheduled, please arrange to be present each service during the month when ushers are required. If you are unable to be present for any occasion, it would be greatly appreciated if you would get a replacement usher who is scheduled for a different month. If unable to obtain a substitute, it is very important that you provide as much notice as possible to the usher-in-charge.
- 2. Ushers for the 9:00 AM service are also responsible for UNLOCKING the building at 8:00 AM so that communion can be prepared and unlocking the school parking lot if it is locked. Ushers for the 11:00 AM Sunday morning services are to be in the narthex by 10:30 AM. Be in the narthex 30 minutes in advance of the starting time for any other services.
- 3. Put on a happy face. Smile and be friendly. Your job is structured; however, there is plenty of time available for you to be helpful and supportive of the congregation. You, as an usher, make a big impression on those in the pews. Do your best to make that a good impression.
- 4. Put on an usher pocket insert. This has proven to be valuable to church members in getting to know who is ushering.
- 5. Help keep the narthex clear for members and visitors to enter the sanctuary.
- 6. Advise visitors with small children of the availability of the nursery.
- 7 In seating those in attendance, remember the following:
 - Observe any reserved seats.
 - Do seat latecomers during the prelude and lighting of the candles. Do not seat anyone during the prayers or scripture/responsive readings. Notations will appear in the bulletin designating appropriate times for seating latecomers.
 - If you cannot spot vacant seats from the rear of the sanctuary, go forward to locate vacant seats and then return to usher the attendees.
 - Distribute as required 'large-print" hymnals and bulletins, which are kept in the narthex.
- 8. Record attendance in the book in the bureau in the narthex.
- 9. Ensure that any offering (e.g., Pennies for Hunger) and extra bulletins left in the narthex at the end of the service are delivered office.

Additional responsibilities for the 9:00 AM ushers and the 11:00 AM USHER-IN-CHARGE can be found in the church office and in a top drawer of the bureau in the narthex.

SUNDAY MORNING OFFICE & ACCOUNTING

It was mainly a medical and dental mission (500 teeth were extracted) and Paul, Tom and the others helped the doctors. They report having a great time - Paul did not even want to go home to Singapore. (Please see the picture of the group on the Outreach Bulletin Board).

Our gift of \$1,120.00 through TAPC's Global Missions Fund made this trip possible for Tom and Paul.

Tom teaches at Trinity Theological College (TTC), in both English and Chinese. Judy offers a class in English as a second language to the wives of the college students, many of whom do not speak English.

Joe (grade 7), Paul (grade 6) and Emma (grade 1) attend the Christian international school. Emma says she does not like weekends because she doesn't get to go to school. Tom and Judy serve as mentors ("wardens" they are called) for married students living on the campus of TTC.

Judy invites us to come to see them in February when Singapore goes all out with decorations, parades, and events for the Chinese New Year.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT BIBLE STUDY GROUP


