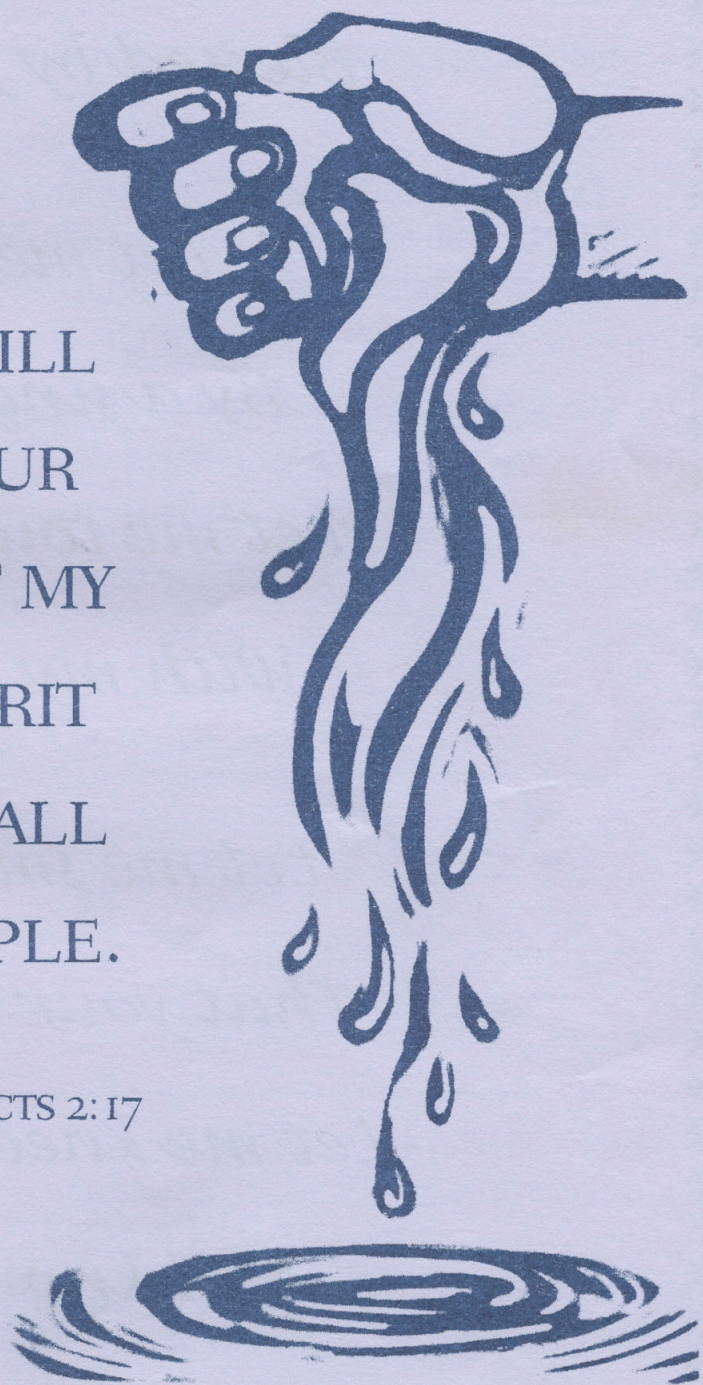

## MEET THE CHANCEL CHOIR!!

So, by now everyone knows that for at least 38 Sundays out of each year, there are a group of singers in green robes at the front of the church who lead the congregation in song, sing wonderful choral music and make an invaluable contribution to Trinity Avenue Presbyterian Church. They are known as the **Chancel Choir** and we would like you (the congregation) to get to know them a little better!

As in any chorus, there are four voice parts: **soprano, alto, tenor** and **bass**. (Sometimes, these are divided into first and second within each part, prompting endless jokes about first and second basses!) Each voice part sings in a different range, and each one has a different “personality” You may ask, “Why should singing different notes make people act differently?”, and indeed this is a mysterious question and has not been adequately studied, especially since scientists who study musicians have all the peculiar complexes that go along with their kind! However, this is beside the point; the fact remains that the four voice parts can be easily distinguished.

The **sopranos** are the ones who sing the highest (and, because of this, they think they rule the world). You can recognize them by the fact that they sit to Harry’s left (when he has his back to us, which is most of the time!) This year the sopranos are: **Kirstin Berlin, Joyce Bumann, Kathy Cates, Caroline Graham, Sandy Johnston, Lisa Joyner, Linda Moore, Pam Morrison, Linda Ross-Thaxton** and **Barbara VanDewoestine**.

Next are the **Altos**. They are the salt of the earth – in their opinion at least. They are seated on the right side of the organ (if you face the front, which you should be doing during worship!) and rarely look around at the other singers. This section includes: **Amy Daniels-Freeman, Jean Findlay, Jenny Hirtz, Esther Krigbaum, Leslie Lobaugh, Jane Tuttle, Gail Vander Weide** and **Karen Welty-Wolf**.

Seated behind the sopranos are the **tenors** who, at least in this choir, remain a distinct minority! They are spoiled. That’s all there is to it. It is a little known fact that tenors move their eye brows more than anyone else while singing. Our “4” tenors are: **Bob Clarke, Sandy Freeman, Tom Hadzor** and **Nick Staffa**.

Lowest, but certainly not the least are the **basses**. They are solid, dependable people who feel perpetually unappreciated, but they have a deep (sic) conviction that they are the most important part. You will recognize these men by the long line they form in the back of the choir loft. ## **SUMMER CHILDREN'S SUNDAY SCHOOL**

We have an exciting Sunday School program planned for our children this summer. The theme of our summer curriculum is "TAKING RESPONSIBILITY". The thirteen Bible based lessons give the children an in depth look at taking responsibility for "My Relationship with God", (4 lessons), "My Feelings", (4 lessons), and "My Relationship with Others", (5 lessons). The program will be a combined classroom situation for children in Pre-K through fifth grade and all lessons will be taught using hands-on, active learning techniques. ## COMMUNITY SHELTER FOR HOPE – SOUP KITCHEN

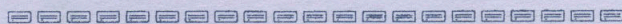
**WHO:** TAPC – ordinary folks

(except November)

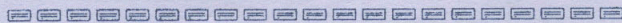
**WHERE:** The Community Shelter for Hope (412 Liberty Street)

The Community Shelter for Hope where, as you can see from Joanne's request for help printed above, TAPC is responsible one night a month for serving a hot meal to homeless persons will soon merge with St. Philip's Community Kitchen and the United Methodist Mission Society to become the Urban Ministries of Durham, Inc. The merger is expected by July 1, 2001

In the early 1980s a number of religious leaders in Durham came together to try to coordinate emergency services for the poor. Although many persons have labored tirelessly, some duplication of services and inefficiencies have resulted from each group having its own separate board and sources of financial support. The planned merger should make it easier to fulfill the original vision of different faith traditions working shoulder to shoulder to serve the poor in downtown Durham.
