### **TRANSPORTATION**

Shuttle. Chattanooga Airport is located about 25 miles from Cleveland, Tennessee, and the Church of God Theological Seminary campus. Airport shuttle service from the baggage claim area to conference hotels and back will be available for a charge of \$25 per person. It is important to pay this fee with your preregistration and to indicate on the form your flight arrival and departure times. # MEALS

Friday and Saturday lunches (\$4.50) and the Saturday evening banquet (\$25) can be taken at the seminary. #### DIRECTIONS
